## Doxbridge Online World Schools Debating Championship 2024

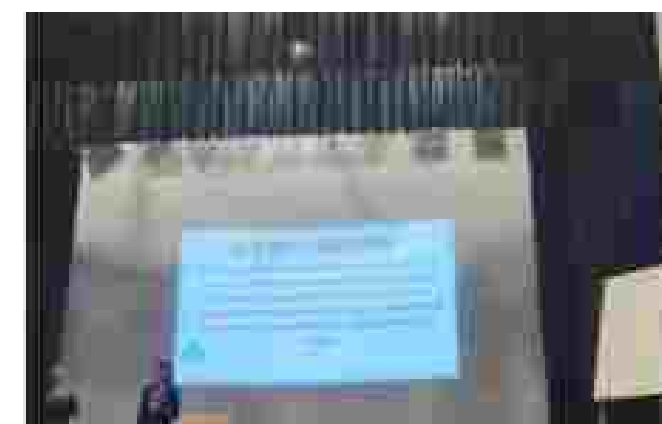
## AFS India Regional Meet Central Zone 2024

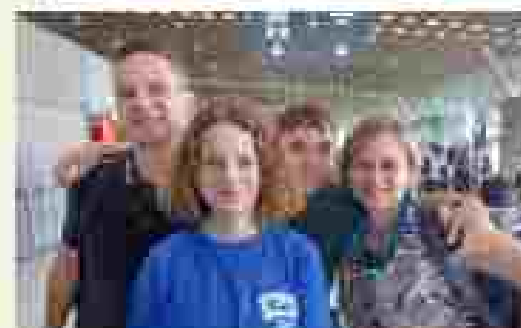

One significant challenge I faced during the exchange was the language barrier. To overcome this, I learned basic German, which helped me communicate with locals and navigate daily situations more effectively.

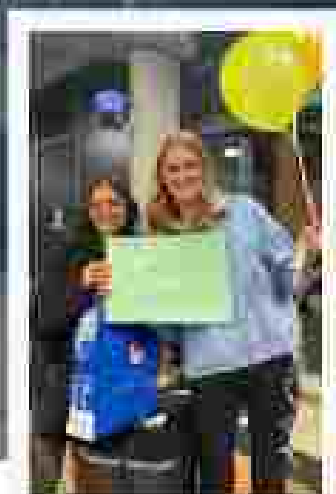

## My AFS Short Term Program Exchange: Denmark

I went to Ranum Efterskole, Denmark for one month in September 2024 for the AFS Short Term Program. This program was a transformative experience that broadened my horizons, enhanced my personal growth, and deepened my understanding of cultural diversity. This report provides an overview of my journey from the preparation process to the outcomes of my experience.

This AFS program began with a rigorous application process that included submitting essays, attending interviews, and participating in orientation sessions. These sessions prepared us for cultural adaptation, homesickness, and effective communication in a new environment.

On arrival, I was warmly welcomed by the local AFS volunteers. My initial impressions were a mix of excitement and nervousness.



The first day at the host school is often a mixture of excitement and anxiety and it marks the beginning of a journey. During my stay, I immersed myself in a new culture, met new people, and navigated a different educational environment. During the program I experienced many new activities including mountain biking, surfing, kayaking, windsurfing and many more.

Some of the hurdles for me were the language barrier and homesickness. I overcame them by staying in touch with parents through phone calls, building new relations and getting full support from the host school.

I had a fantastic experience with the AFS short-term program, spending a month in a new country and gaining valuable insights into its customs and traditions.

## AFS Hungary Trip and Home Stay

This report details the Short-term Program to Hungary, conducted from May 3 to June 2, 2024, to foster global understanding and mutual respect among individuals from diverse cultural backgrounds. The program commenced in Budapest, the capital of Hungary, with a delegation of 30 students representing various schools across India. One of the initial activities took place at the renowned City Park, Városliget, where participants engaged in a structured treasure hunt. This initiative encouraged exploration and facilitated a deeper appreciation of the culturally rich environment that served as our home for the duration of the program.

In the initial days, the group explored Budapest's prominent commercial hubs, including Váci Street and two of the largest shopping centres, Arena Mall and Westend to gain insights into the foreign brand culture. The itinerary also encompassed visits to significant landmarks such as St. Stephen's Basilica, the Hungarian Parliament Building, and the renowned Széchenyi Thermal Bath. Furthermore, the program included a series of day excursions to prominent cities and towns beyond Budapest.



The first of these excursions was to Lake Balaton, the largest freshwater lake in Central Europe, followed by a visit to Szentendre, a riverside town distinguished by its vibrant architecture, cobbled streets, and renowned art galleries. A key highlight was the visit to Visegrád, home to the historic Visegrád Citadel, a Renaissance-era castle complex situated atop a hill, offering opportunities for adventure activities such as bobsledding, archery, and paintball.

Additionally, the delegation visited Veszprém, one of Hungary's oldest urban settlements, known for its historic castle district, old town square, and well-preserved chapels. Other destinations included Székesfehérvár, Pécs, and Miskolc—each celebrated for its distinct historical significance, architectural beauty, and cultural heritage.





## Home Stay & Public School (15 DAYS)

The second half of the program was hosted by a carefully selected family, chosen through a rigorous evaluation process by APS to ensure the best match for both the students and the host families. This thoughtful selection aimed to provide a welcoming environment and create meaningful cultural exchange. I was placed in Hatvan, a small town near Budapest, and attended Hatvani Bajza József Gimnázium. The Hungarian families made exceptional efforts to ensure that Indian exchange students experienced an authentic Hungarian lifestyle.

As part of this experience, I attended school alongside my host and actively participated in various family activities. Together, we prepared traditional Hungarian dishes such as Goulash, a hearty stew, and Lángos, a deep-fried flatbread. In return, I introduced them to Indian cuisine by preparing Chicken Masala, Poha, and Chai. Cultural exchange extended beyond food—I presented my host family with a sari, taught them Hindi greetings such as "Namaste" and "Suprabhat", and shared insights into India's diverse religious and cultural heritage.



In addition to daily routines, I accompanied my host family to local festivals, including Children's Day and carnival celebrations, and participated in activities, such as dance and gym classes. I also had the opportunity to visit their ancestral villages, Hort and Boldog, where I met their grandparents, extended family, and friends. Magyar, commonly known as Hungarian, was the primary language spoken throughout the program. While I did not encounter any major challenges, I was initially concerned about the language barrier. However, this concern was quickly alleviated as most people spoke fluent English, and volunteers were always available to assist when needed.

Overall, this experience was both enriching and deeply personal. Over time, my host family became like my own, making it difficult to part ways. Their warmth and hospitality transformed an unfamiliar place into a second home, leaving a lasting impact that extended beyond cultural exchange. Participating in an exchange program with a host family was a transformative experience that fostered personal growth, expanded cultural awareness, and deepened empathy. It provided a greater appreciation for the diversity that shapes our world while offering the opportunity to form lifelong connections. Additionally, it allowed for firsthand exposure to different ways of life, offering a unique perspective on the daily experiences and traditions of another culture.

On the final day, all teacher delegates and students enjoyed an exhilarating jungle safari in the Panna Tiger Reserve, spotting a tiger and various other wild animals. # DUBAI

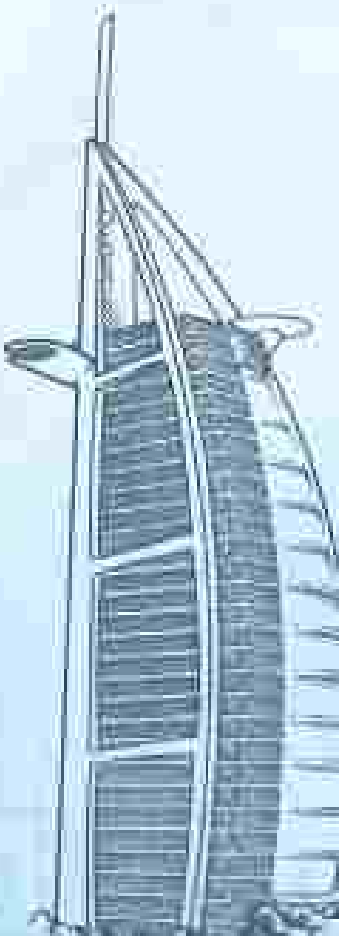

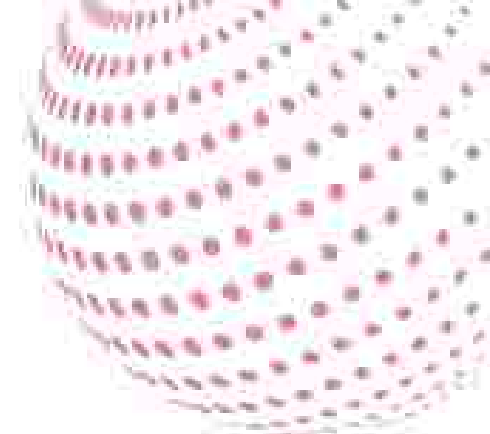
The day ended with a cozy dinner back at the hotel. Reflecting on all the experiences, I realized how much I was learning while enjoying every bit of this incredible journey.

The conference brought together over 224 delegates from across the nation, representing 19 schools from various states, fostering a spirit of intellectual engagement and cultural exchange. **Lok Sabha:** Considered reforms to India's electoral system in line with the Representation of People's Act 1951.

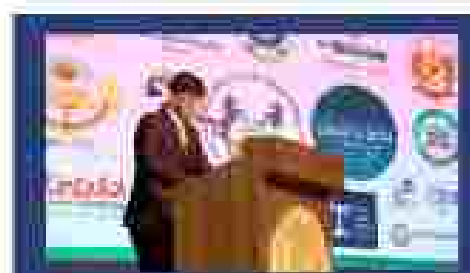
**International Press Corps:** Tasked with covering the event under the theme "Reporters Beyond Borders."

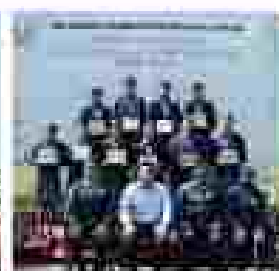

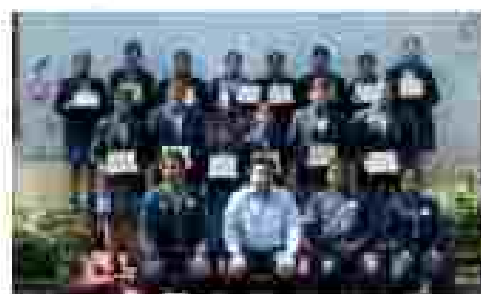

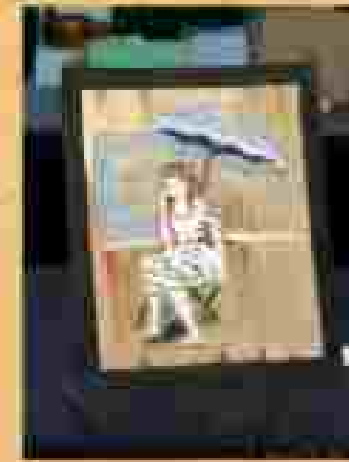


# ANNUAL VISUAL ARTS EXHIBITION EGYPTIAN ART

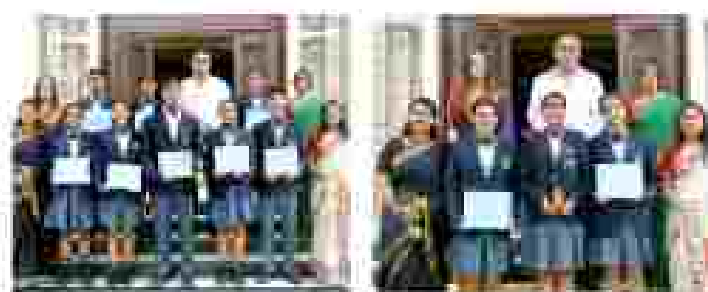

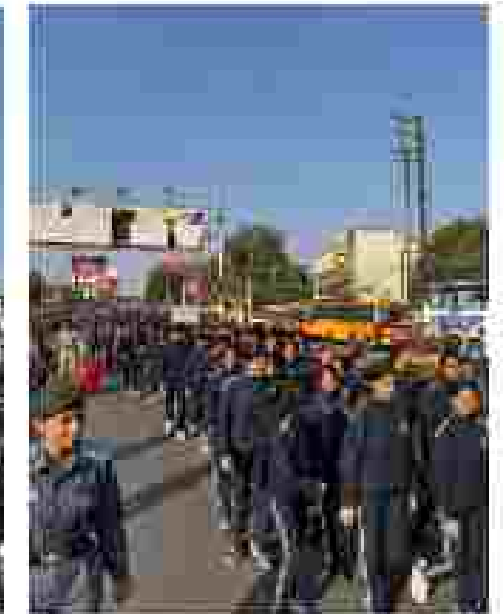

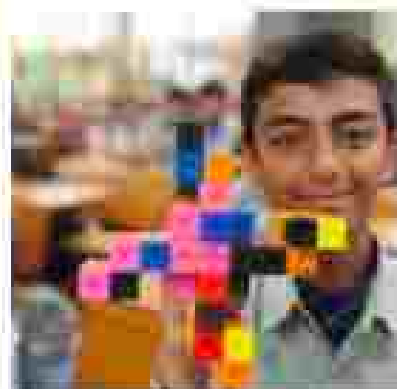
# STUDENT CLUBS

# ENVIRONMENT CLUB

A hands-on seed ball-making activity was conducted where students collected various seeds and created seed balls using a mixture of compost and soil. These seed balls were planted in various locations around the school campus to promote greenery and biodiversity. A successful tree plantation drive was conducted with enthusiastic participation from students and community members. Our group of 118 students embarked on an enlightening nature walk to Ralamandal guided by the esteemed environmentalist, Dr. Sunil Dubey, to understand the process of ecological succession and the critical role of plants and forests in maintaining ecological balance. The 'Eureka Kit' was demonstrated and installation of a rain gauge is done in the school premises. The club organized a hands-on workshop aimed at promoting sustainable practices by creating eco-friendly and chemical-free products.

The Club has taken steps to raise awareness about the harmful effects of plastic pollution. The club members prepared and presented a street play aimed at educating the community about the need to reduce plastic usage. A project was initiated to collect dry leaves from around the school campus. These leaves were stored in a leaf bank and used to create compost. Club tackle both pollution and waste management creatively by repurposing dry flowers into dhoop and camphor. Additionally, converting single-use plastic and T-shirts into reusable items like bags promotes sustainability and reduces waste. A compost-making activity was conducted on the school premises to promote sustainable waste management practices. The organic materials were carefully gathered and then layered in a designated composting area within the school.

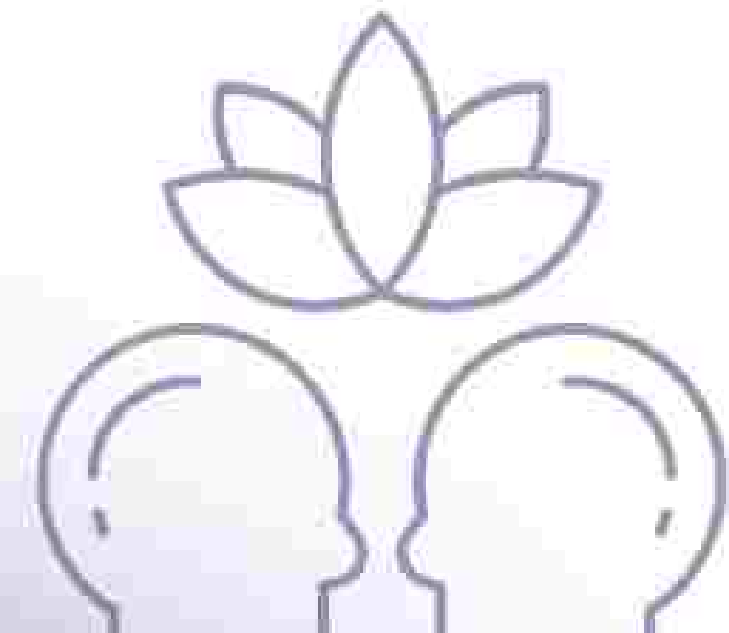
## Quiz Club

An innovative television activity tested the students' spontaneity and versatility. The audience acted as channel-switchers, prompting performers to adapt instantly to different genres. Through these thoughtfully designed sessions, Rangmanch has provided its members a comprehensive understanding of drama. The club efforts have laid a strong foundation for nurturing future thespians, encouraging skill and confidence on stage.

### MUN Club

The club activities began with several workshops facilitated by student mentors on the rules of procedure for participating in MUN conferences for the first few sessions. The club through this, equipped students with valuable insights in three such procedures, laying down the foundation for the concept of MUNs to novice delegates and introducing them to a new avenue of public speaking. Awareness was raised regarding matters of international importance by holding sessions in the club centred around specific International events like the Russia-Ukraine war and the crisis in Palestine and the US, allowing students an opportunity to find solutions to problems that affect so many globally. ## Talk by Ms. Prasiddhi Singh, 11 years old Impact Creator, Environmentalist and Social Entrepreneur

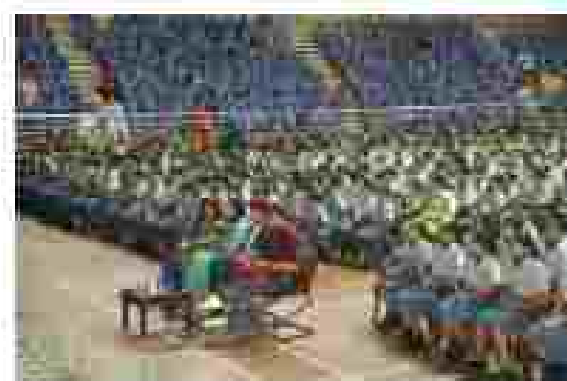

Students studying in private schools," mentions Kainat. Teaching second-grade Students in New Delhi was challenging for her. Low academic rigour, a lack of understanding of moral values, etc., greatly disturbed her. Kainat thought of putting together innovative techniques that are different from textbook learning.



Apart from implementing interactive learning modules, Kainat took small steps to make big strides for her Students. She started screening English movies with moral values, which was a great success in her second-grade classroom. She then started story-reading sessions to help them understand and bridge the gap between gender stereotypes — boys and girls can do the same work and are not different. She also designed sessions and workshops for developing critical thinking skills among her Students. Kainat recognises that her second-grade Students have a lot of potential. Despite facing adversity, she finds them remarkably resilient. "I've witnessed children overcoming extreme poverty and living in difficult conditions," she shares. "Their resilience is what drives and inspires me during challenging times."

One example of Kainat's dedication is her work with Maira, a student struggling with comprehension. Daily extra sessions have significantly improved Maira's reading skills and overall grades. Kainat's story exemplifies how small, consistent efforts can lead to significant change in education. We celebrate Kainat's commitment to empowering education.

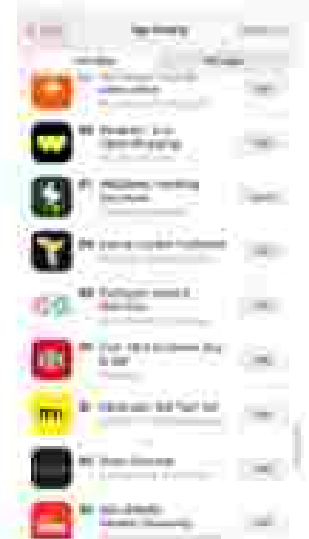

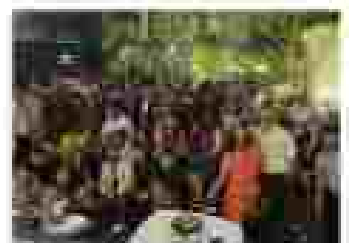
## *A Heart-warming Reunion of Emerald Heights' Mumbai and Pune Chapters*

This initiative aims to promote a safe, secure, and responsible use of technology within our school and parent's community to stay one step ahead of the cyber threats.

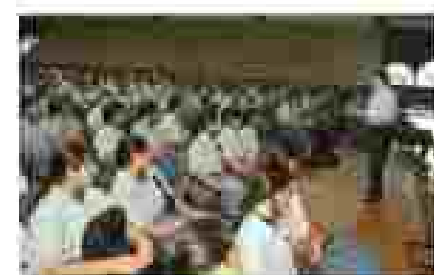

## Awareness Programme On Cyber Security: Mr. Rajesh Dandotiya (IPS)

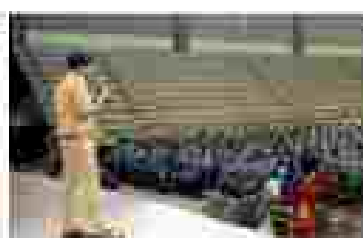
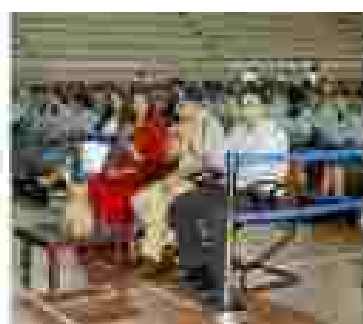

the workshop covered a wide spectrum of issues that are highly relevant to today's youth.

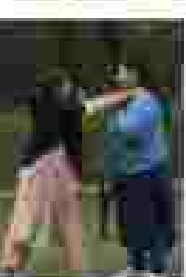
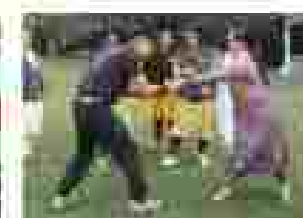

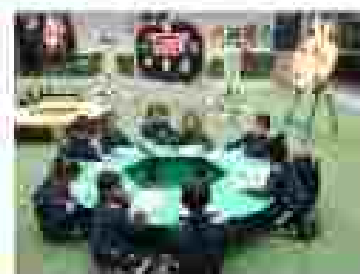
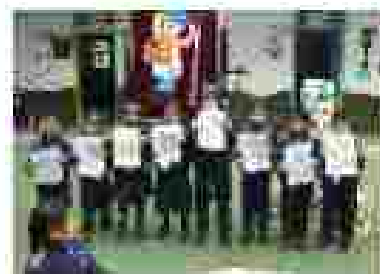
## Create your own Masterpiece

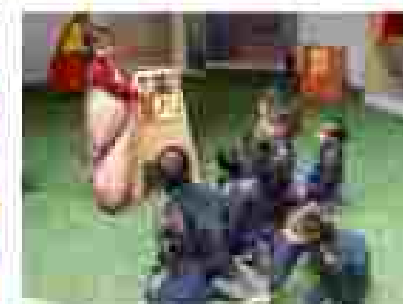


## Guru Purnima

## "Happy Teeth, Happy Smile"

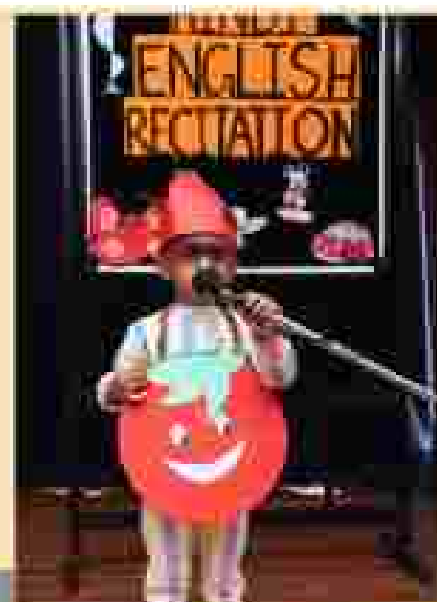
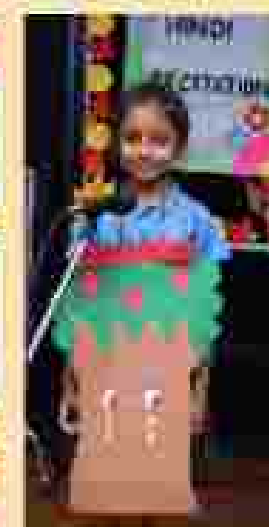

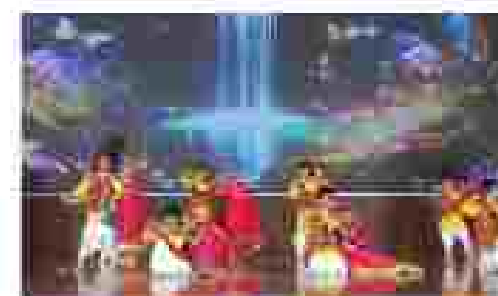


## Yoga Day

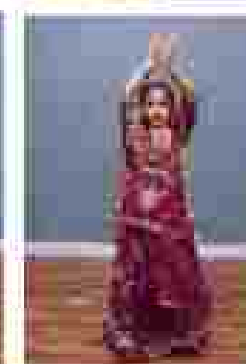
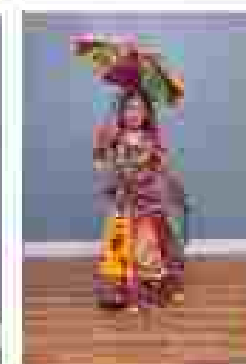

high-energy performances, complete with slick choreography and trendy music, left the crowd mesmerized.

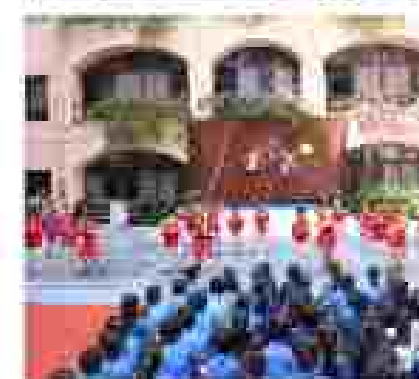
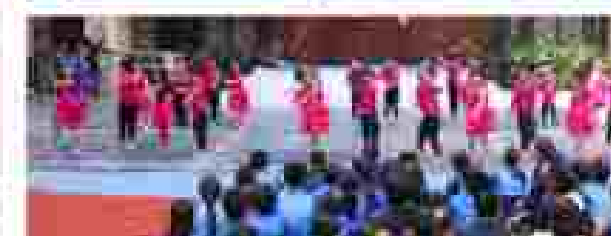

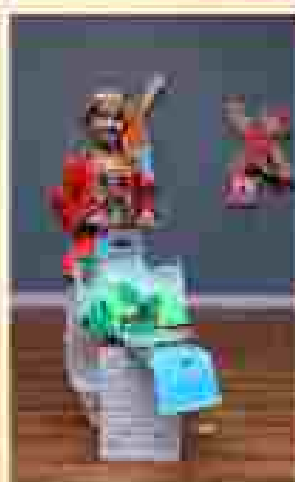
In conclusion the elocution competition was a great success and highlighted the remarkable talent within our school.

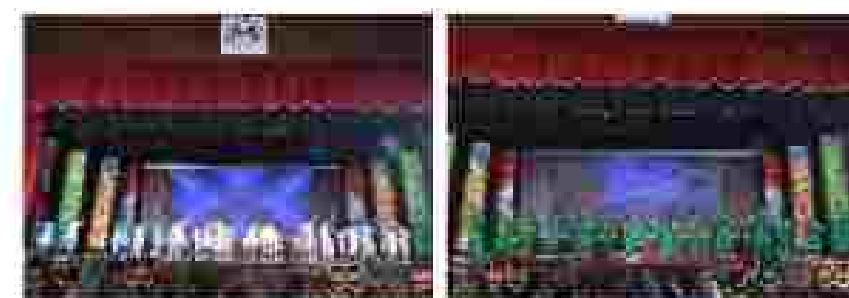
The event concluded with a prize distribution ceremony, where the students were congratulated on their achievements and were awarded trophies and certificates.

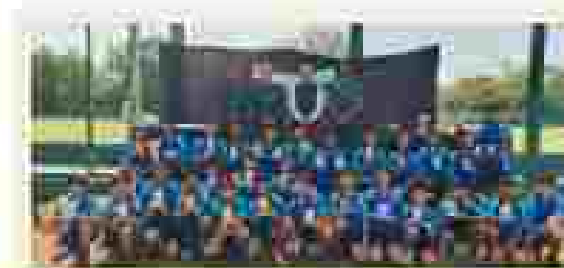


## SPORTS FEST

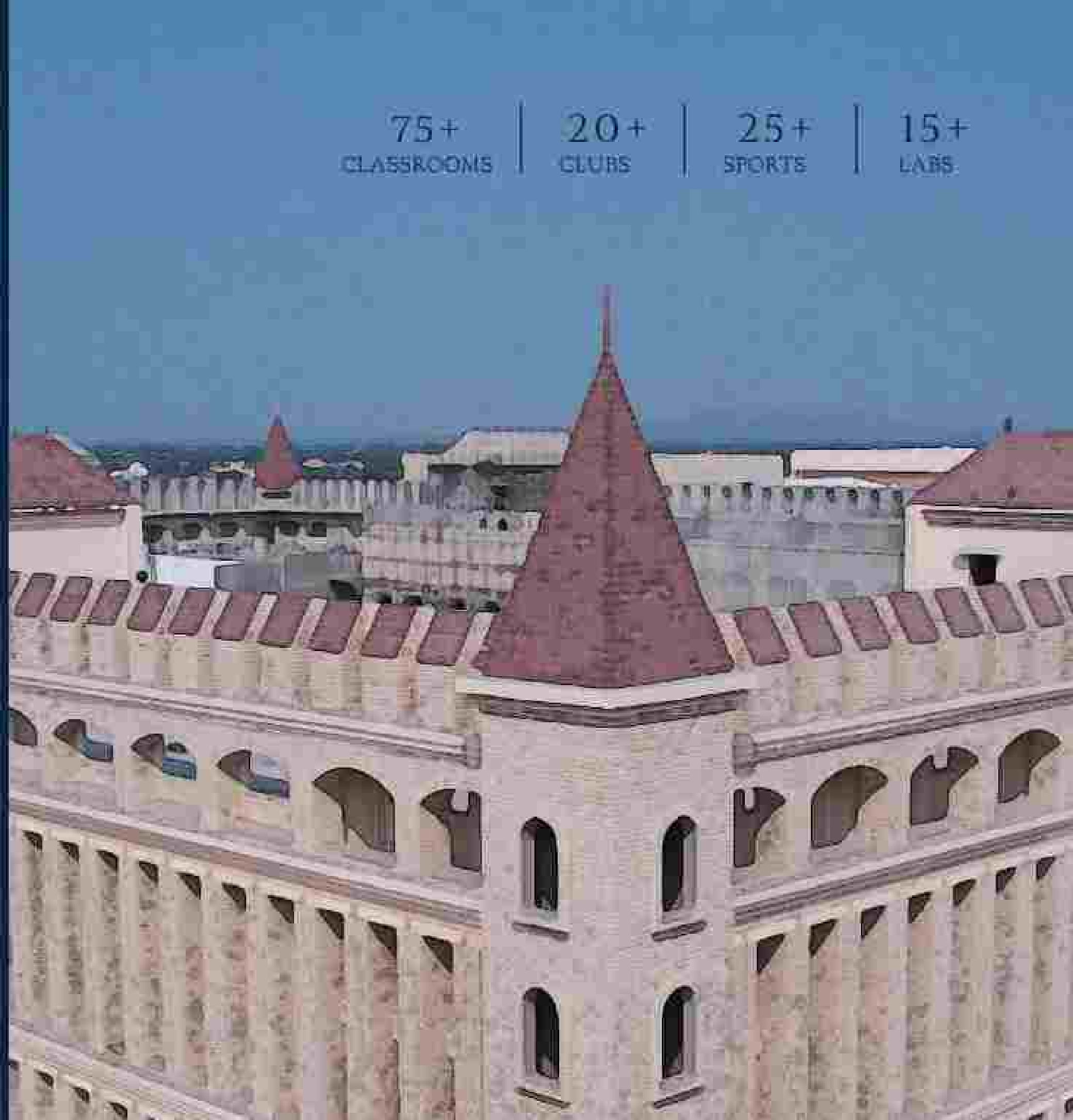

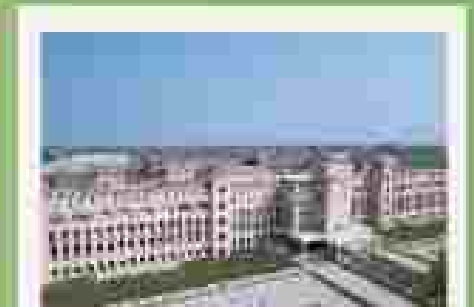
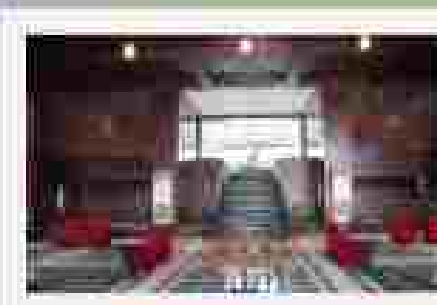
