

Special educational needs and disabilities



We believe in early identification of special educational needs which is done through a variety of specific screening tools. Attainment is assessed on entry to school so that the foundations during the pupil's pre-school years can be built on. Our special educational needs and disabilities coordinator (SENDCo) liaises and supports pupils and parents.





If a pupil has already been identified as having a special educational need, then the class teacher and SENDCo will use this information to:

- Provide starting points for the development of an appropriate curriculum
- Identify the correct provision and support for a pupil
- Use assessment processes to identify any learning difficulties
- Ensure ongoing observation and assessments and provide regular feedback about the pupil's achievements and experiences to form the basis for planning the next steps of the pupil's learning to secure good outcomes

Personal development



We nurture our pupils' personal development through a rich and varied curriculum that emphasises our core values of kindness, integrity, and tenacity. Our pupils benefit from activities including Forest School and special 'growing up great' lessons.


