



REXBURG SEEKS A POLICE STATION BOND

BOND DISCLOSURE: The interest rate anticipated on the proposed bond issue, based upon current market rates, is three and ninety-two hundredths percent (3.92%) per annum. The total amount estimated to be repaid over the life of the bonds, based on the anticipated interest rate, is \$22,589,638, consisting of \$16,750,000 in principal and \$5,839,638 of interest. The term of the bonds will not exceed fifteen (15) years from the date of issuance.

The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed bond levy is a tax of \$61.51 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions.

As of November 4, 2025, the water system will have debt in the amount of \$6,746,137 that is paid solely by water utility revenues and not by property taxes. The City currently has no other general obligation debt.

We invite residents to stay engaged throughout this process. Input helps ensure the project reflects our shared priorities of safety, efficiency, and community values.

PURPOSE OF THE BOND

To pay the cost of construction of a police station facility, together with related improvements and costs.

Areas of focus include:

- Enhancing staff safety
- Providing modern equipment
- Heightening security
- Offering spaces for victims and the public

ESTIMATED BOND PROPERTY TAX CALCULATION EXAMPLE

For a property with taxable property value of \$400,000:

- With Homeowners Exemption*
\$400,000 - \$125,000 =
\$275,000 taxable assessed value
◦ $(\$275,000 \div \$100,000) \times$
\$61.51 = **\$169.15 Annually**
▪ **\$14.10 Monthly**
- Without Homeowners Exemption
◦ $(\$400,000 \div \$100,000) \times$
\$61.51 = **\$246.04 Annually**
▪ **\$20.50 Monthly**

**Note: the homeowner's exemption is 50% of your home's value up to a maximum of \$125,000.*

REXBURG HOSTS IDOPL STATE CODE MEETINGS

In July, the City of Rexburg’s Building Department proudly hosted two important public hearings in partnership with the Idaho Department of Occupational and Professional Licensing (IDOPL). The meetings focused on proposed updates to state building codes—specifically, the potential adoption of the 2024 International Building Code (IBC), International Residential Code (IRC), International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), and the 2023 National Electrical Code (NEC). The building code hearing was held in the Hatchery Room, while the electrical hearing took place in the Council Chambers. These meetings offer contractors,

residents, and other stakeholders an opportunity to share input and ask questions before the state moves into the negotiated rulemaking process in August. Rexburg takes an active role in hosting events like these to ensure our community has a voice in shaping future regulations. We value our ongoing collaboration with IDOPL and remain committed to fostering strong relationships between the public, industry professionals, and state agencies.
