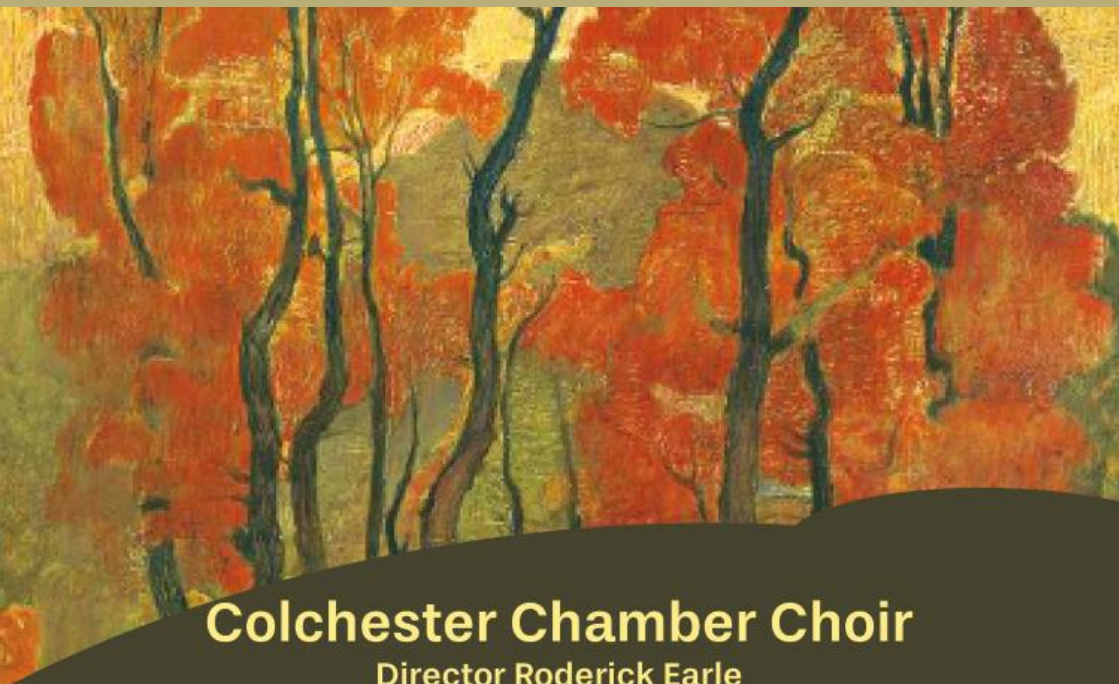

## RURAL MISSIONER

Dear friends,

I hope you have been able to enjoy a good break over the summer months!

While our children head back to (or start) school, memories of sunshine and family holidays can quickly fade away as we return to the routines that ensured our survival in busier times. I hope it's not all too overwhelming for you!

One thing we might not immediately prioritise at this time is space simply 'to be' – whether it's getting up slightly earlier to sit in the garden and breathe in some fresh air or taking a moment to listen to a soothing piece of music (I recently discovered 'A Song for Clara' by Shoshana Michel, which I can recommend). I often forget to do this amidst getting our four small children to and from school and nursery and getting on with work in our nine parishes, but when I do I am much better for it.

One verse I have found helpful in such moments is Psalm 46:10: "*Be still, and know that I am God*". Instead of trying to wish away the problems that invariably arise from our busyness and the complexity of our lives today, the voice of scripture calls us back to 'being' – to 'being' with the God who made us, the God who knows us better than we know ourselves.

"*Be still, and know that I am God*" seems like it was written for the so called 'anxious generation'. How often do we carry around burdens and anxieties, unfinished to do and bucket lists and unresolved tensions in our relationships, when the God who made us and knows us wants to grant us His peace! "*Cast all your anxiety on [God] because He cares for you*" we find in 1 Peter 5:7.

Why not try to take space simply 'to be' – to "be still, and know that [the Lord is] God"? Why not "cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you"?

Maybe this invitation is just what you need to help you navigate the busyness and complexity of our lives at this time. Now may the Lord of peace Himself give you peace at all times and in every way.

## September 2025

### September 14<sup>th</sup> 2025

The Deanery choir will be singing at St George's Church, Great Bromley CO7 7TS at the I am Communion service. The choir will sing 'How lovely are the messengers' by Felix Mendelssohn.

Mendelssohn enjoyed early success in Germany, and revived interest in the music of Johann Sebastian Bach, notably with his performance of the St Matthew Passion in 1829. He became well received in his travels throughout Europe as a composer, conductor and soloist; his ten visits to Britain, during which many of his major works were premiered, form an important part of his adult career.

His essentially conservative musical tastes set him apart from more adventurous musical contemporaries, such as Franz Liszt, Richard Wagner, Charles-Valentin Alkan and Berlioz. The Leipzig Conservatory, which he founded, became a bastion of this anti-radical outlook.

After a long period of relative denigration due to changing musical tastes and antisemitism in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, his creative originality has been re-evaluated. He is now among the most popular composers of the Romantic era.

## September 28<sup>th</sup> 2025

The Deanery choir will be singing at All Saints Church, Wrabness CO11 2TQ at the 6.30pm Choral evensong. The Anthem that they will be singing is 'A Prayer of St Richard of Chichester' by..... L.J. White.

Leonard J White was choirmaster at St Andrew's Willesden Green, London, until his death in the 1970s. This piece is thought to have been written around 1919 and was published in 1947. It sets a version of a prayer ascribed to the 13th-century Richard, Bishop of Chichester, which he is supposed to have recited on his death-bed.

RESTORATION OF DEDHAM CHURCH, ESSEX.

A considerable work of restoration has lately been carried out in the fine Perpendicular church of Dedham, of which the Rev. F. G. Given-Wilson is the vicar, under the advice and supervision of Mr. T. G. Jackson, R.A. This church with its noble flint-faced tower is a familiar feature in many of Constable's pictures.

The most important part was the restoration of the chancel, which was undertaken by Mr. W. W. Hewitt, of Lower Park, and his sister, as a memorial to their brother, Mr. James Hewitt. This included the reopening of four windows which have been closed for a hundred years or more, the laying down of a black and white marble pavement, and the substitution of carved oak altar rails in place of the old ones.

The battlements on the south wall of the chancel have also been restored, to the great improvement of the exterior appearance of the church. All the four restored windows have been filled with stained glass, designed and executed by Mr. Walter Tower, and are the gifts respectively of Dr. Ashwin, Lecturer of Dedham; Dr. Rendall, Head Master of Charterhouse School; Mrs. Medows Rodwell; the members of the family of the late Dr. Lermite, for many years Head Master of Dedham Grammar School; and Mr. N. Saunders. A legacy left to the church by the late Miss Eyre, and the gifts of other friends, including the Archbishop of Canterbury, have made possible other improvements.

The whole of the lead on the roofs of the chancel, nave, and south aisle has been stripped off and relaid after being recast on the spot, and lengths of deal timber have also been laid crosswise over the original oak rafters. At the west end of the church a structural improvement has been carried out by the removal of an unsightly screen which blocked out the handsome west door.

Yesterday, the Festival of St. Michael and All Angels, the Bishop of St. Albans visited Dedham, when a large and representative congregation, including a number of local clergy, were present at the reopening service, at which the Bishop preached.



### LORD'S PRAYER TOP OF THE RECOGNISABLE QUOTES

"Give us this day our daily bread" topped a poll for the most recognisable words in the UK narrowly beating "May the force be with you" from the Star Wars films. "Give us this day our daily bread" was recognised as coming from the Lord's Prayer by 80.3% of the 2,000 people polled. Surprisingly 89% of people said that they had prayed The Lord's Prayer at some point, including 88% of those who claimed they have no religion.

The Most Rev'd Stephen Cottrell, Archbishop of York, explained that the meaning is actually quite challenging, meaning 'give me what I need for today and stop me wanting more than my fair share' and that 'The whole human race urgently needs to learn what 'enough' looks like: so that the world is fed, but also in order for the planet to be saved'.

Other quotes included in the survey included Churchill's "Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few"; "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times" from A Tale of Two Cities by Charles Dickens; "You'll never walk alone" from the Rodgers and Hammerstein song popularised by Gerry and the Pacemakers and sung by Liverpool football fans; "Happy and glorious, long to reign over us" from the National anthem and "to be or not to be" from Shakespeare's Hamlet.

The polling was done by Thy Kingdom Come, a global ecumenical prayer movement.

## **MIGRATION FOR FREEDOM: The Price of a Dream and the Hope of New Beginnings**

In a world increasingly torn apart by wars, repression, and the absence of freedoms, thousands of refugees and migrants have found themselves with no choice but to flee their homelands in search of safety, freedom of expression, and a better future. Freedom was the driving force, the dream was the fuel for the journey—but the price was often devastating.

Migration is not a casual decision, nor a simple escape. It is a path lined with loss, filled with the pain of exile, the fading of identity, and sometimes even death—whether at sea, on borders, or in detention camps. Some have lost their families. Others have lost their faith, and many have disappeared without a trace. Migration is like a game of chance—you might gain a new life, or you might lose everything you have.

Still, every refugee and migrant carries a story deep in their heart. A story of pain and hope, of patience and ambition. The goal is the same for all: a life of dignity and safety. Yet the road differs, and the reality is often harsh—marked by struggle, rejection, and cruel words from societies that do not fully understand the cost of such journeys.

We ask only for peace. We seek to become part of our new communities, to be given a fair chance to show who we truly are and what we can offer. Yes, some migrants have exploited systems and caused strain. But it is unfair to judge the many by the mistakes of a few. Among us are the talented, the hardworking, and the determined—those who have become vital contributors to their new countries, including here in the UK.

It is time to recognise that we are not a burden—we are an added value. We are not strangers—we are human beings who seek life, dream of safety, and long to belong.

These words come from the heart of a migrant living in Britain, spoken with sincerity and hope. Let us build a society that embraces all people, regardless of language, colour, or religion. A society united by compassion, enriched by diversity, and strong in its shared humanity.

## **Dedham Parish Council Meeting Report – Monday, 7<sup>th</sup> July 2025**

### **Community Concerns and Updates**

#### **Munnings Dog Park**

A resident inquired about progress on the proposed dog park. While there were no recent updates, it was noted that the Munnings Museum had sold a sculpture to help raise funds.

#### **High Street Pavements**

Concerns were raised about tables and chairs obstructing pavements outside certain retail outlets. These obstructions are especially problematic for people with guide dogs or pushchairs. The Council Chair has spoken with the outlet owner, who is currently in discussion with the building's owner about potentially removing some fencing. The importance of having a licence to trade on public pavements was also highlighted.

#### **Speeding Through the Village**

Several residents voiced ongoing concerns about speeding vehicles, particularly agricultural traffic on Crown Street. The Council noted that such vehicles should adhere to a 25mph limit, and these issues are being followed up.

#### **Forest School Site**

Complaints were made about the untidy appearance of the forest school area near Castle Hill. The Chair committed to addressing the issue with the school.

#### **Parking on Pavements**

Continued concern was expressed about cars parking on pavements along the High Street. The Council will investigate the matter further.

### **Council Reports and Planning**

#### **Report from Councillor Barber**

A written report was submitted by Councillor Barber, detailing recent tree felling and vegetation clearing activities around the village.

#### **Parish Plan Consultation**

The first public consultation for the Parish Plan will be held on **Saturday, 19<sup>th</sup> July**, at the Duchy Barn. Further meetings with local groups are planned to gather additional input.

### **Financial Matters**

- A revised budget was approved.
- The internal audit findings were noted, and areas for improvement were agreed upon.
- A grant to repair the church clock was approved.
- A grant request from the school PTA for the Christmas market was supported in principle. However, a meeting will be scheduled to discuss details further.

### **Planning and Infrastructure**

#### **Planning Group**

The group met before the full Council session and presented its feedback on proposed planning applications.

#### **Footpath Maintenance**

Delays in footpath maintenance were acknowledged. The cutting schedule is now back on track and available online and on noticeboards.



## Traffic and Parking

- The Council agreed to continue pursuing a 20mph speed limit within the village.
- NEPP (North Essex Parking Partnership) is set to restore double yellow lines on High Street and Mill Road, and refresh faded white lines on High Street. DPC agreed to contribute 50% of the costs for this work.

## Toilet Block

DPC will fund restoration work to the toilet block in collaboration with Colchester City Council.

## Play Park Initiative

Support was given to establish a working group to review and improve the play park area and its facilities.

## Communications and Youth Engagement

### Website and Communications

The Council's new website is progressing well. A **photography competition** will be launched to gather high-quality images for the site. New email addresses for Council members will be available by the end of July.

### Young Visitors Strategy

A multi-stakeholder meeting will take place on **9<sup>th</sup> July** to address recent issues involving young visitors to the village. Problems were noted over the previous two weekends.

### School & Munnings Collaboration

A grant request for a 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary school project in partnership with the Munnings Museum was approved.

## Events and Future Meetings

### Youth Club Fun Day Proposal

The Youth Club has requested use of the Duchy Field on the August Bank Holiday for a fun day. Council members are asked to review and submit comments to the Chair and Clerk. Some concerns were raised about the short notice.

### Next Meeting

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on **Monday, 1<sup>st</sup> September 2025 at 6:30pm**, preceded by the Planning Group at 6:00pm.

### COMING UP THIS SEASON...

We hope you've had a great summer everyone. The garden right now is full of autumn colour. The dahlias have struggled a bit with the heatwaves and a lack of water but have started to catch up now.



I'd say they are still a bit shorter than they have been. They are complimented by clumps of hardy pink chrysanthemums, the feathery foliage of cosmos in white, pinks and reds, while little jewel-like flowers of salvias shine around the stems of roses.

If this sounds beautiful and perfectly planned well... about 70% of it is and was, but if you make a wrong turn you'll be smacked in the face by utterly out of control giant scabious, (not a scabious that is giant, but the buttery white *Cephalaria gigantea* that reaches about two metres) or clumps of *Miscanthus Malepartus* that really should not be quite so close to the path. The editing doesn't just happen in this article!

If you're not planning to move some plants around or stand about admiring your work, then what about learning something more about gardening. We'd love to welcome you to another season of events organised by the Dedham Horticultural Society.



We kicked off this month with our Autumn Flower Show (also fruit and veg, cooking and photography of course), kindly sponsored by Kingsleigh Estate Agents.

It's always great to see what people exhibit and catch up with members, friends and neighbours who come along on the day.

Then we get into our annual speaker evenings which are free for Society members and just £2 for everyone else. As well as a chance to catch up with other people from Dedham and surroundings, refreshments are included, and we have a small raffle.

We've got a great line-up that starts with Joanne Hull of Benton End Flower

Farm in Hadleigh. Alongside partner Carla, Joanne runs a chemical-free, wildlife-friendly cut-flower business just a few steps from Sir Cedric Morris's historic Benton End House. Come along to hear how she and Carla blend that historical legacy with modern floral artistry, whether it's creating floral installations like their 8-ft "Flower Stallion" or making plans for a lavender distillery and exclusive glamping later in 2025.

In November, Peter Miller from Kings Seeds presents a fascinating glimpse into Essex's centuries-long foundation in seed-growing and Kings' pivotal role since 1888.

Then we take a break until our traditional virtual meeting on Zoom in February. We'll be joined by Geoff Hodge who has been Web Editor for RHS Online and Gardening Editor of Garden Answers and Garden News magazines. We'll be picking his brains about combatting pests and diseases.

In March, we'll hear from a former member of Beth Chatto's team, Marc McHearne who was responsible for raising plants on the nursery's stock beds. He has a huge amount of knowledge and

In 1937 Gerald Rendall published a book entitled 'Dedham in History' which had three parts, Feudal Dedham, Industrial Dedham and Puritan Dedham. As it is more than 75 years since the author died, the book is out of copyright, we can now use it for articles in the magazine.

Initially the section on Industrial Dedham has been scanned and the text extracted from the images to form articles, the first one appears this month.

### **INDUSTRIAL DEDHAM - WOOL AND WEAVING INDUSTRY. REBUILDING OF CHURCH.**

The 14th Century sees the birth of industrial activities at Dedham; during the 15th and 16th momentum increases; but already in 1642 we find Dedham and Langham clothiers combining with those of Suffolk in petitioning his gracious Majesty to come to the rescue and relief of imminent disaster. They appeal as depressed areas " *The cries for food of many thousands of poore, who depend on this trade, do continuously press us, not without threats and some beginnings of mutinies; so that, if some speedy reliefs doe not intervene, we can expect no lesse than confusion*". Decline was precipitated into decay by the Civil Wars, and the siege of Colchester in 1648; and disastrous ravages of the Plague dealt the knock-out blow. Throughout this long stretch details of family history and enterprise abound; but we must be content with a bird's eye view of wool and weaving developments before and during these three centuries of local history.

The English wool-trade dates its rise from the Norman invasion. The Conqueror's marriage with Matilda of Flanders quickened trade intercourse with the continental centres-pre-eminently Ghent, Bruges and Ypres which had already gained the lead in the

manufacture of woven fabrics. Their prime need was raw material; and the Queen's followers were quick to perceive the advantages which England possessed in climate, pastures and breeds of sheep, for the production of wool. Access to the Eastern Counties was direct and easy; and the marshlands and river-flats of Essex were among the first to realise and close with their new opportunities. Norman Lords and Monasteries perceived a new source of profit in sheep-farming, and did much for the extension of grazing and improvement of stock. At Dedham, as one illustration, the number of sheep doubled between 1066 and 1086.

But in the earlier stages activity centred in the export trade in wool. Manufacture was in a different case. Flemish merchants clung jealously to the monopolies which their skill and enterprise commanded in the markets of Europe. Craft-guilds of fullers and weavers, modelled to some extent on the civic guilds of Flanders and Brabant make their appearance before 1150, but apart from home-spuns could not compete with the finer fabrics of foreign looms. Not till a century later do we hear of English cloths finding a market in Venice, or in Spain. Nor was it enough for Simon de Montfort and the great Council of Barons in 1258 to forbid all export of English wool; the self-denying embargo defeated its own ends, and produced decline instead of progress in native manufacture.

Both Henry III and Edward II made vain attempts to lure foreign artisans into England, and the 14th Century was well advanced before the protective enactments (1336 A.D.) of Edward III, coupled with his earlier marriage with Philippa of Hainault and his encouragement of foreign workmen, created new industrial activities; and transformed the export trade in wool



into a home market and manufacture, which next to agriculture rapidly stepped into a foremost place in the national economy.

The Eastern Counties reaped the harvest of the new departure. Next to London itself, Harwich, Ipswich, and to a less degree Yarmouth, were the ports of intercourse with the Low Countries. The first recorded immigrants were refugees from Bruges, who landed at Harwich in 1304. Their footsteps may be traced to East Bergholt, and thanks to them Kersey and Worstead became household words. But on the larger scale, Norwich, Ipswich, and Colchester became the leading centres of weaving industries, through which the stimulus extended to the whole countryside, e.g. to Hadleigh and Lavenham in Suffolk, and in Essex to Dedham, Langham, Halstead and the hinterland of Coggeshall and Braintree.

Thus in the 15th and 16th centuries, Dedham was converted from an agricultural village into a thriving industrial community and reached its high-water mark of population and prosperity. It moved always in the orbit of Colchester, and shared the fruits of the enlightened policy, which won for that town the primacy in textile enterprise.

The Flemish 'strangers' secured a foothold as "honest godly civil and well-ordered people"; from 1550 onwards the Duke of Alva's iron tyrannies brought new accessions of strength; by 1573, the Dutch community at Colchester outnumbered 500, and later rose to more than 1500. Incorporated as a 'congregation,' they were entrusted with the direction and oversight of the weaving trade; and the Dutch Bay-Hall became the administrative centre for 'search' and 'sealing' tests of all goods that bore the Colchester trade-mark. The supervision of standards, sizings, quality and prices was strict and exacting, and it

was the business of the aulnagers, local and central, to maintain high marketable prestige.

Under Flemish guidance, Colchester specialised in Bays and Says, the finer fabrics of 'new-draperies,' in contrast with the coarser wares of English 'cloth.' Consequently this was the type favoured at Dedham; and the so-called 'Flemish Houses' have retained the appellation of 'Bay and Say Mill.'

There is little or no trace of Flemish immigrants in Dedham. Vocational names such as Webbe and Sherman, are questionable evidence, but favour English nationality; and the descriptive names of customary tenants, and still more the 13th century conversion of the Mill to fulling, give clear proofs of home development, prior to any incursion of Flemish or Huguenot settlers: while, with the exception of Angier, no clothier families at Dedham show name-links of connexion with the Dutch roll at Colchester. And to the argument from names may be added the patriotic attachment to the national church, which becomes so conspicuous a feature of local history.

Glossary of weaving terms.

**Fuller** - was traditionally responsible for a process called fulling. Fulling is the process of: Cleansing the woven cloth to remove natural oils, dirt, and impurities (especially lanolin from sheep's wool). Thickening and felting the fibres to make the cloth stronger, denser, and more compact.

**Aulnager** - An aulnager was an English official whose primary role was to inspect wool and woollen cloth to ensure it met specific standards of quality and size. Upon verification, they would affix a seal to the cloth as a mark of its compliance.

- Elderly or disabled residents living alone
- People who smoke at home

These small signs can be clues that someone is vulnerable or isolated, and that's where we can step in. A simple referral for a free Home Safety Visit can make a world of difference. During these visits, our team can fit smoke alarms, offer fire safety advice, help with escape plans, and even link residents up with other services who can offer additional support.

online, or speak to the person yourself and encourage them to get in touch if you feel it's appropriate.

As my colleague Andrea MacAlister, our Head of Prevention, puts it:

"The fire service carries a trusted brand. People open their doors to us, they listen, and they value our advice. That trust gives us a rare opportunity to reach those who may be isolated or overlooked by other services. A simple Home Safety Visit could save their life."

Thank you for everything you do in your communities. Please keep looking out for one another, and don't hesitate to reach out to us if you think someone could use a little extra support.

## NATIONAL EMERGENCY ALERT TEST.

Mobile phones in the UK will be sent a test Emergency Alert at **around 3:00pm on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2025**, as part of plans to strengthen the country's preparedness.

The Emergency Alerts system is used to warn if there is a danger to life nearby, including extreme weather. It allows vital information and advice to be sent to people rapidly in an emergency.

During the test, mobile phones will vibrate and make a loud siren sound for roughly ten seconds, even if they are set to silent. A message will also appear on phone screens, making it clear the alert is only a test.

There are approximately 87 million mobile phones in the UK.

The test will be the second of its kind and follows a government commitment to test the system regularly to make sure it works optimally and familiarise the public with the alerts.



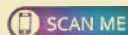

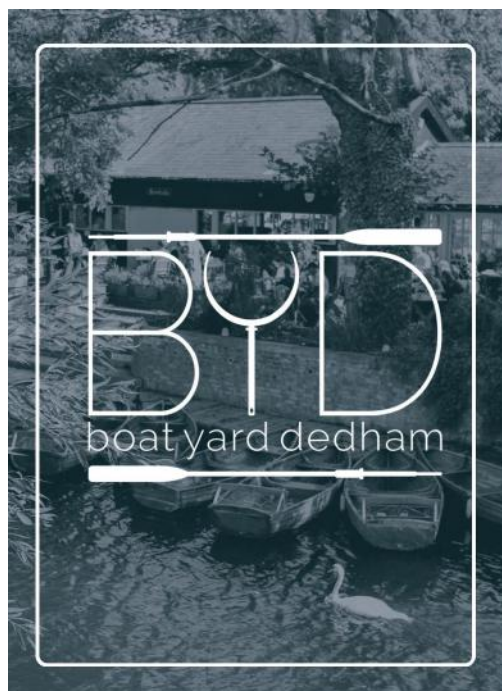
