Letter from the Artistic Director Benjamin Burdick

As we mentioned in our Season Announcement, this is a season of homecoming, home building, of crossing the threshold.

Three of these plays are returning home to BCT. They were all presented as readings last season and were so well received that we are moving them to the MainStage. One was developed at our BIPOC Playwrights Festival, which continues to foster some of the best art we make here at BCT. We are establishing ourselves as a home for World Premiere plays by some of the nation's most exciting emerging and established writers.

Two of these plays will be helmed by Off-Broadway Directors, who will cross our threshold for the first time.

These are stories that examine how where we come from informs who we will be in the world. They include conversations with our past selves, they examine our aspirations for family and community, and they celebrate the people who lift us up. And we can use some lift these days, especially in the theater.

We've heard the stories, and they are real. Theaters are shuttering across the country at an alarming rate; entire seasons are being postponed; storied institutions are laying off huge percentages of their staffs. But if there is one thing that theater itself is truly bad at, it is dying. It's been refusing to die for centuries, just as we refuse to believe that what we do isn't important. BCT has always believed in the importance of our Mission: to inspire our community to examine our perspectives and better understand ourselves, each other, and the world around us by creating thought-provoking stories of the human experience. From our educational programs to our reading series to our MainStage plays, we ask people to engage, and you do. We refuse to believe that what we do isn't important, because you keep showing up. We refuse to believe that what we do isn't important, because we watch the post-show conversations that move from the theater, to the lobby, to the parking lot, and out into the world.

The theater is not dying. BCT is here and thriving because of you. And we are ready, once again, to fling our doors wide and invite you to cross the threshold, back to these familiar red seats. Join us in our stubborn insistence that we are here, we will continue to thrive, and on the other side of this threshold, the best is yet to come.

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

What the Constitution Means to Me

Playwright Heidi Schreck's boundarybreaking play breathes new life into our Constitution and imagines how it will shape the next generation of Americans. Fifteen-year-old Heidi earned her college tuition by winning Constitutional debate competitions across the United States. In this hilarious, hopeful, and achingly human new play, she resurrects her teenage self in order to trace the profound relationship between four generations of women and the founding document that shaped their lives.

About the Playwright

Heidi Schreck is a writer and performer living in Brooklyn. Her critically acclaimed play What the Constitution Means to Me played an extended, sold-out run on Broadway in 2019, and was nominated for two Tony Awards. She is the recipient of three Obie Awards, a Drama Desk Award, a Theatre World Award, the Horton Foote Playwriting Award, and the Hull-Warriner Award from the Dramatists Guild. Schreck was awarded Smithsonian Magazine's 2019 American Ingenuity Award for her work in the Performing Arts. Grand Concourse won the Stacey Mindich Lilly Award for Best New Play in 2015 and was a finalist for the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize. Heidi's other plays have been produced by Berkeley Repertory Theatre, Long Wharf Theatre, Page 73, Seattle Public Theatre, New Georges. Rattlestick Theatre, and more. Heidi holds commissions from the Atlantic Theatre Company, Manhattan Theatre Club, and South Coast Repertory Theatre and she is working on a new translation of Three Sisters for NYTW. Heidi's screenwriting credits include "I Love Dick," "Billions" and "Nurse Jackie," and she is currently developing projects with Annapurna Pictures and Imagine Television. Heidi has also taught playwriting and screenwriting at NYU, Columbia, Kenyon College, and Primary Stages, and long ago worked as a journalist in Saint Petersburg, Russia.

This Drama Desk Award-winning piece by Benjamin Scheuer, directed by Off-Broadway Director and NY Times Critics Pick Sean Daniels, has redefined the genre of musical theatre. The Lion tells, sings, and plays the turbulent story of his family and his own brush with mortality, with his supporting cast of six guitars. The Lion's "...songs are awfully well-constructed; there's a hint of Paul Simon in Scheuer's easy, knowing lyrics and disciplined musicianship," says The Washington Post. Like its hero, The Lion roars.



About the Playwright

Benjamin Scheuer is a songwriter and performer. He is the recipient of the Kleban Prize for Lyrics.

His show A MOUNTAIN FOR ELODIE premiered at the 2023 Edinburgh Fringe Festival, directed by Olivier Award-winner Polly Findlay.

For his show *The Lion*, Scheuer won a Drama Desk Award for Outstanding Solo Performance, and an Off-West End Award for Best New Musical. The Lion toured the United States, and Scheuer performed the show over 500 times.

Scheuer is the author of two songs-turned-into-children's-books: Hibernate With Me and Hundred Feet Tall, both illustrated by his wife, Jemima Williams. The books are published by Simon & Schuster USA, and translated into French. German, and Welsh.

With playwright Melis Aker, Scheuer has adapted Hundred Feet Tall into a musical. With Rick Elice (Jersey Boys, Peter and the Star Catcher) Scheuer is writing a musical about Peter Roget, creator of the eponymous Thesaurus. Originally from New York, Scheuer lives in London.

About the Playwright

Daf James is a multidisciplinary queer artist: an award-winning playwright, screenwriter, composer and performer. He works across theatre, radio, television, and film in English and Welsh. Daf's work often explores and celebrates queerness, identity politics, marginalized voices, Welshness, and notions of family.

He holds a first class degree in English literature at Edinburgh University, trained in the Lecog pedagogy at the London International School of Performing Arts, and has a Ph.D in Theatre Studies from the University of Warwick.

He is the writer and executive producer for Lost Boys and Fairies, his first original screenplay for the BBC with filming starting this April. Current work includes: The Diana Chronicles (Royal Court, Sherman Theatre and Theatr Clwyd); Margaret & Clive (S4C/Fiction Factory); On The Red Hill (Duck Soup/BBC FILMS); Queer As Folk Dancing (Armidages UK); Songs Across The Sueniverse (NTW/CHAPTER) and Wanted Petula (AUGUST 012).

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



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

A Case for the Existence of God

by Samuel D. Hunter March 5-22, 2025

Ryan, a yogurt plant worker looking to buy a plot of land that belonged to his family decades ago, meets with Keith, a mortgage broker in Twin Falls, Idaho. What starts as a discussion on loans opens up a conversation about the chokehold of financial insecurity and eventually develops into a bond over the precariousness of parenthood. With humor, empathy, and wrenching honesty, Hunter commingles two lives and deftly bridges their disparate experiences.



About the Playwright

Samuel D. Hunter was born and raised in Moscow, Idaho, and lives in New York City. He is best known for A Bright New Boise (Obie Award for playwriting, Drama Desk nomination for Best Play), and The Whale (Drama Desk Award, Lucille Lortel Award for Outstanding Play, GLAAD Media Award, Drama League and Outer Critics Circle nominations for Best Play). **BCT produced the Co-World Premiere** of Norway in our 10|11 season with the Phoenix Theatre in Indianapolis, commissioned and produced the World Premiere of A Permanent Image the following season, and Lewiston/Clarkston (Drama Desk nomination for Best Play) for our 18|19 season.

His plays have been developed at the O'Neill Playwrights Conference, Bay Area Playwrights Festival, PlayPenn, Ojai Playwrights Conference, the Lark Playwrights Workshop, Juilliard, LAByrinth, Rattlestick, Seven Devils Playwrights Conference in McCall, Idaho, 24Seven Lab and elsewhere. Internationally, his work has been translated into Spanish and presented in Mexico City and Monterrey, and he has worked in the West Bank with Ashtar Theatre of Ramallah and Ayyam al-Masrah of Hebron. At Ashtar, he co-wrote The Era of Whales which was performed in Ramallah and Istanbul. He is a member of New Dramatists and a current Resident. Playwright at the Signature Theater in New York.

He holds degrees in playwriting from NYU, The Iowa Playwrights Workshop, and Juilliard. He is also the recipient of a 2014 MacArthur Fellowship. He has also been a guest lecturer at Rutgers University-New Brunswick, Fordham University, and other universities.

He was selected for BCT's 3rd Annual BIPOC Playwrights Festival in 2023. His recent work includes *Remains and Returns*, a winner of the Ashland New Plays Festival; and *Through the Elevated Line*, Jeff Award nominee for best new work. His plays have been produced or



developed by Golden Thread Productions (San Francisco), The New Group (New York), Paines Plough (London), Playwrights Foundation (San Francisco), Queens Theatre (New York), Silk Road Rising (Chicago), and the St. Louis Shakespeare Festival, among others. Novid has been named a two-time winner of the Ashland New Plays Festival, winner of the Crossroads Project's Diverse Voices Playwriting Initiative, a two-time finalist for the Bay Area Playwrights Festival, a finalist for Amphibian Stage's SparkFest, Broad Horizons' New Voices, New Plays, and the Woodward/Newman Award, and a semifinalist for the New American Voices Playwriting Festival and the O'Neill National Playwrights Conference.



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

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


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
