Adventure4Sewa - Charity Through Adventure Event - 26th Aug 2023 - *Team HSS Scotland Ben Nevis Trekking Challenge 2023*

Ben Nevis is the highest peak of United Kingdom, it is 3rd year in row this event has been organised successfully. This challenge is test of stamina, endurance and team spirit.

The event was well organised and co-ordinated by HSS Scotland Team as a part of CTA initiatives to raise fund funds for Sewa UK which supports a number of projects in Bharat. All the key information including the kit, transport, starting point and regular weather forecast was communicated to the team well in advance and timely manner.

All of us were eagerly waiting for the day and finally it did arrive, 26th August, 10 am, Ben Nevis Visitor Centre.

We had a team of 30+ determined trekkers consisting of all ages from various towns including Edinburgh, Glasgow, Aberdeen, Manchester, Solihull, Birmingham, Reading and Wycombe. This included 10+ in age range of 7-14 years.

Team left in batches to accommodate more time for slow walkers and latecomers trekkers and weather on day was treacherous and deceiving, it was ideal trekking weather in the morning but as the day progressed, it surprised everyone with drizzle and pockets of heavy rain as if it was testing the preparedness and morale of the team.

Team had few shorter and longer breaks during the course, and mid-way of the course on waterfall, most of us refilled our water bottles to gear up for latter half of the hike, which was going to be challenging as you will not find any vegetation or shelter after this point.

On the way, gloomy weather, pockets of heavy rain, foggy and poor visibility didn't deter the morale of our team, even after soaked-up completely from head to toe they carried on to conquer peak after peak.

At some point it felt like there is no end to this hike, but the team boosted each others morale and carried on and finally we able to see the peak and the team had a sigh of relief, as it certainly was herculean task for first timers.

After reaching to the peak we had our snacks and food together before getting queued for the group and individual photo sessions at the summit.

It was a big moment for the whole team, but even bigger for first timers Bal and Balikas.

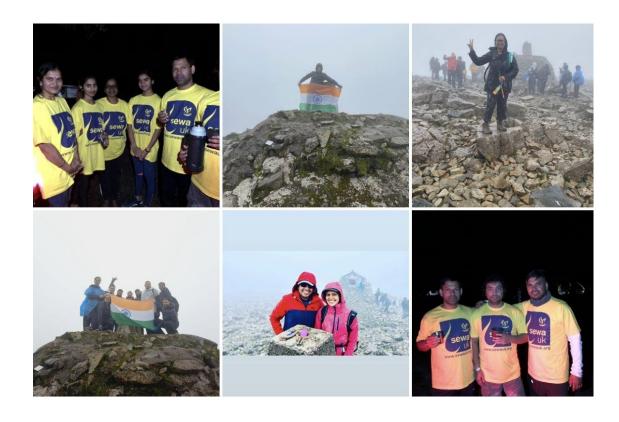
After spending some time at the peak, the team started Beating Retreat for the base at their own pace.
