Shop Kahnawà:ke had a busy few months! From October to December, purchases exceeded \$56,000. This surge in sales reflects the community's strong support for local businesses during the holiday season.

The "Shop Kahnawà:ke First" is a promotional campaign supported by Tewatohnhi'saktha in an effort to encourage community members to purchase local products and services. This campaign is in support of our businesses to help stimulate our local economy.

In November and December, a Holiday Kiosk was held and had five sessions to sell Shop Kahnawà:ke certificates alongside a Christmas raffle. A total of \$1,000 was raised, and all proceeds from the raffle were donated to Karihwanoron Mohawk Immersion!
