NPQ for Special Educational Needs Co-ordinators (NPQ for SENCOs)	a SENCO or other senior leader with responsibility for leading SEND in the school.
NPQ in Headship (NPQH)	a headteacher or head of school with responsibility for leading a school
NPQ in Executive Leadership (NPQEL)	an executive headteacher or have a school trust CEO role with responsibility for leading several schools

Why does school leadership matter?

Why does school leadership matter?

Effective leadership makes schools ten times more likely to improve at their next Ofsted inspection

90% of teachers say leadership development opportunities encourage them to stay in a school

Around **50,000** young people are not benefiting from good or outstanding leadership, according to Ofsted

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Funding

The DfE have announced that NPQ funding from Autumn 2024 will now be targeted to those teachers and leaders working in the most challenging schools or educational settings, serving more disadvantaged communities.

Therefore, funding to cover the full NPQ cost will only be available to teachers and leaders from the 50% of schools with the highest proportion of students who attract pupil premium funding. Comparative disadvantage measures will be applied for Early Years and 16-19 educational settings.

There are different criteria for the NPQs below. Funded places will continue to be available to all teachers and leaders from publicly funded schools and settings for the following NPQs:

☐ Leading Primary Maths

□ SENCO

□Headship

□ Early Headship Coaching Offer

For October 2024, the DfE have committed to funding up to 10,800 places in total. This encompasses the full suite of NPQs and individuals from both groups outlined above.
