"Our plans to reach Shimla were stalled. We were stuck in Mandi. There was 96 hours of continuous downpour. After spending 5 days in Mandi amidst the chaos, the situation started to get better if not normal. We camped and consulted patients, distributed medicines, and educated people about some preventive measures.

Our next stop was Shimla. We were informed that the roads had been damaged and the weather was too unfavourable to travel. We were disappointed but things were beyond our control.

What if we couldn't make it? What if we lost our teammates? What if in order to save others, we lose this mobile medical unit? Every thought crossed our mind. We were so afraid that as soon as the thought of going to Shimla arose, we countered it with another thought. Until...

Until someone from our team decided that there was no point staying behind. He reminded us to think about how many might be waiting for us. What was the point of coming that far if we had to come that far?

Suddenly everyone was ready. We put every thought aside that was crippling us and were ready to face the fate. On the way, there was a moment when our mobile health vehicle's front tyre dangled on the edge of the road. That was it! But god was on our side that day. Rains, thunder, broken roads, every odd was against us but we didn't let go of hope and hope triumphed when we reached Shimla."




