




Operating budget for 2021-2022 \$4,438,688


























# **ULPBC**Achievements



Reinstated the ULPBC Guild program, to support our agency's fundraising, programming and community initiatives. 50 members recruited in 2 months.

**Raised over \$50,000** to conduct a simultaneous **Summer Food Drive**, in Delray Beach, Belle Glades and West Palm Beach. Provided 55,200 lbs. of food to over 2,400 families.

Hosted the **20th Congressional District Democratic Candidates Forum** with the Urban League of Broward County. Event was televised and streamed live in South Florida.

Celebrated Patrick Franklin's 20 years of service to ULPBC and the Palm Beach County.

Hosted 10 Community Police Relations (CPR) Forums to build a better verbal dialogue between the community and law enforcement.

Created **five financial business workshops** through **JPMorgan Chase** in partnership with our **Entrepreneurship Center**, to help Black and minority small emerging businesses grow.

Joined forces with the **National Coalition of Jewish Federation West Palm Beach Chapter** to host a **COVID-19 vaccination event** for over **200 Palm Beach County residents**.

Partnered with the **National Urban League and Office Depot** for the **Elevate Together Initiative**, to provide **grants of \$5,000 to \$10,000** to small minority emerging businesses.

Held our **Annual Thanksgiving Food Drive** to address the food insecurity issues. **Provided 800 families food** for the Thanksgiving holiday.

Continued to **distribute over 100K face masks** in collaboration with State of Florida and **50K bottles of hand sanitizer** to Palm Beach County residents.

Conducted two, socially distanced, graduation ceremonies to celebrate the 2021/2022 High School Graduating Class.

Proudly distributed \$10K in scholarships and 21 laptop computers to graduating high school seniors, made possible by Office Depot and Otis Elevator Company.

Conducted over **26 virtual First Time Home Counseling seminars** to larger than usual groups of potential homebuyers.

Continued Collaborating with Palm Beach County FoundCare and the Quantum Foundation to **deliver coronavirus (COVID-19) testing and vaccination** to inner-city urban communities throughout Palm Beach County from south to north to the western communities.

Created a Get Out the Vote Campaign to educate and register new low-income residents for the Primary and General Elections.

Worked with media partners, Hubbard Radio South Florida, The Palm Beach Post and WPTV News Channel 5, to expand our target audience, media reach and engagement for programming, advocacy and community initiatives.

**Received \$75,000 from NextEra Energy Foundation** for the **FPL STEM Program**, to prepare local middle and high school students for evidence based, STEM related experiments, that encourage students to exam an ever-evolving world of science and technology.

Partnered with the **National Council of Jewish Woman of West Palm Beach**, to host a series of Racial Gaps in our Community Economic and Social Inequity Forums.
