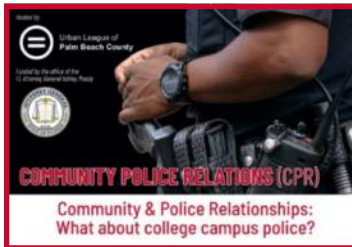

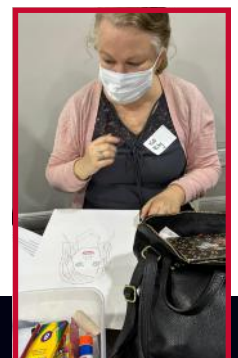

Financial Outlook

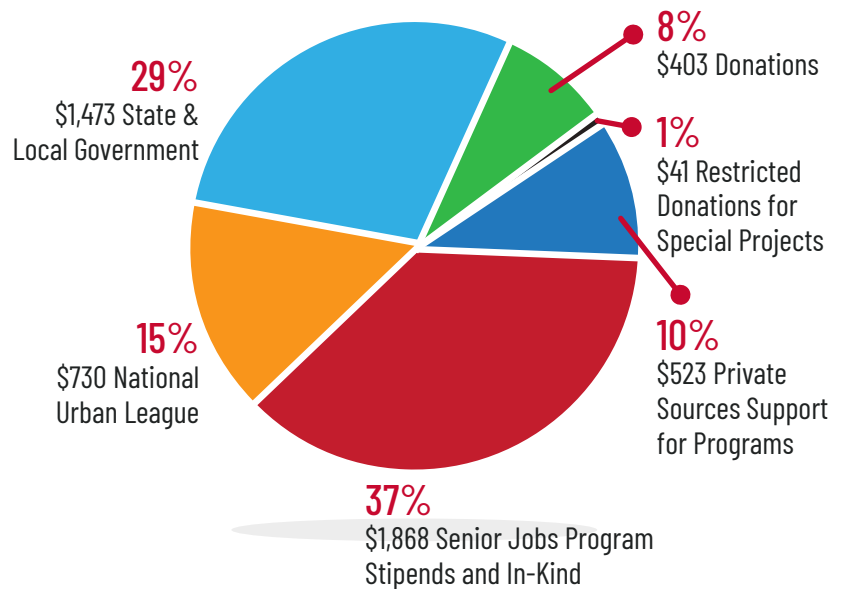

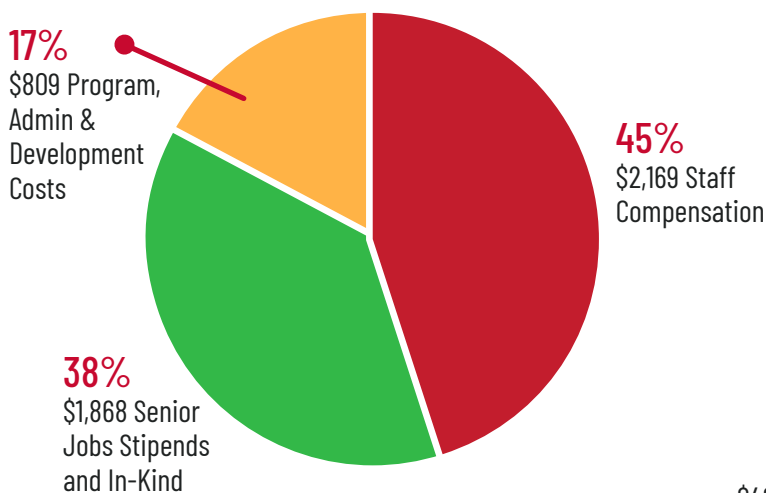
Revenue Sources

Total \$5,039 (thousands)



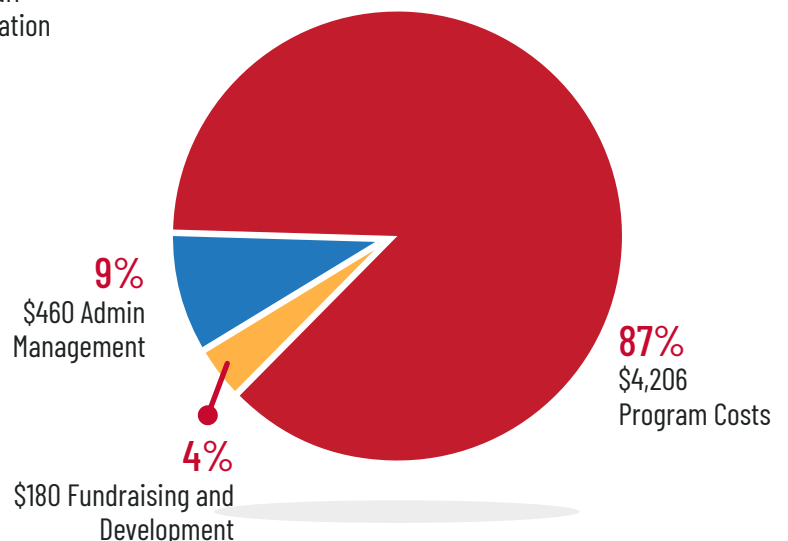
Functional Expenses
