EXCELLENCE ROOTED IN FAITH

Dear Friends of Mother Seton School,

It is with great joy that I write to you as we close a successful 2025–2026 school year. From honoring the 50th Anniversary of the canonization of our patroness, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, and dedicating the new St. Joseph's Chapel, to celebrating our 2026 graduates, **we have had a year of abundant blessings**, and we look forward to what the next year brings.

At Mother Seton School, **our Catholic and Vincentian mission shapes every aspect of school life**, inspiring us to treat one another with Respect, Serve with compassion and joy, and cultivate a community of Excellence through quality teaching and high expectations for learning. To help us in achieving our goals, we act within the framework provided by The National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools (NSBECS). First published in 2012, the NSBECS describes **an excellent Catholic school as one with a clearly articulated, rigorous curriculum aligned with relevant standards, 21st-century skills, and rooted in Gospel values, implemented through effective instruction.**

Over the past several years, **we have intentionally enhanced our curriculum to meet this standard.** Six years ago, we implemented a reading program grounded in the Science of Reading, emphasizing phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension to develop confident, capable readers. Five years ago, we adopted the Singapore Math curriculum, which moves beyond memorization to foster critical thinking, deeper conceptual understanding, real-world problem-solving using multiple strategies, and an appreciation for how math is applied in our daily lives.

We are now seeing the results of these investments. **Students continue to demonstrate significant growth** on our DIBELS assessments, which measure foundational reading skills, and on our MAP assessments in reading, mathematics, and language usage. This year, for the first time, our seventh-grade students took the practice High School Placement Test (HSPT) in April. The HSPT is given to 8th-graders in the fall and used by Catholic and private high schools for admission and placement decisions. They performed at the national average overall, with many students already scoring well above it. **Our rising eighth graders are motivated to build on that success** when they take the official exam this fall.

Our values and the NSBECS standards of excellence derive from The Holy See's Teaching on Catholic Schools, compiled by Archbishop J. Michael Miller: "First and foremost, a Catholic school is characterized by excellence." Inspired by this vision, **our faculty spent time reflecting on these teachings and considering what excellence should look like in every aspect of an MSS education.** Those conversations helped shape not only our understanding of our core values and responsibilities to our students but also **the qualities we hope to instill in every graduate** who leaves our halls.

In the pages that follow, you will see the many ways our students, faculty, alumni, and supporters continue to bring that vision to life. **Thank you for being an essential part of the Mother Seton School community.** Your prayers, generosity, and encouragement make it possible for us to fulfill our mission and prepare our students to lead lives of faith, with excellence, respect, and service as their guiding values.

MEET MOTHER SETON SCHOOL'S NEW PRINCIPAL: JOSEPH FANNING

Mother Seton School is pleased to welcome Joseph Fanning as its next principal beginning with the 2026-2027 school year.

Mr. Fanning brings more than 27 years of experience in education and leadership to Mother Seton School. His career includes serving as an English and Social Studies teacher, Assistant Principal at Montgomery Blair High School, Consulting Teacher and Pupil Personnel Worker for Montgomery County Public Schools, and, most recently, Staffing Coordinator for Montgomery County Public Schools. He holds a bachelor's degree in Government and Politics from the University of Maryland, an MBA from the University of Notre Dame, and a master's degree in Teaching from Salisbury University.

According to Dr. Kilty, outgoing Principal and new President of Mother Seton School, Mr. Fanning was selected not only for his extensive educational background, but also for his commitment to Catholic education and leadership.

"As a graduate of Catholic elementary and secondary schools and an active member of his parish, Mr. Fanning brings a strong Catholic identity and personal commitment to the faith that will enrich our mission

at Mother Seton School," Dr. Kilty shared in announcing his appointment.

Earlier this spring, sixth-grade student Elliott Brown had the opportunity to interview Mr. Fanning for *The Daily Bayley*, Mother Seton School's student newspaper. During his visit to campus, Mr. Fanning toured classrooms, met students and faculty, and experienced firsthand the welcoming spirit of the Mother Seton community.

In his article, Elliott noted that Mr. Fanning is especially excited about "getting to know everyone." During their interview, Mr. Fanning explained that he believes one of the most important responsibilities of a principal is to know the students personally, support their learning, and ensure they receive the best education possible.

Elliott also learned that Mr. Fanning's journey to education began after an earlier career in law enforcement. After spending 27 years working in public schools, he found himself reflecting on the Catholic schools that shaped his own education and felt called to return to Catholic education.
