



PEOPLESISINE

The Christian faith is not based on an idea, but on a person. It is in meeting Jesus that we come to faith. Over Lent and after Easter, in the morning services, we will be looking at a number of people who encountered Jesus, both during his earthly ministry and after his resurrection. Their encounters were very different but they all had this in common. Once people had met Jesus, their lives were never the same again. Some sought Jesus out; some did not realise who Jesus was at the time. Some turned away from him; some put their trust in him. Some found restoration; some found a new purpose. And for the 2000 years since these first encounters, Jesus has continued to transform lives all around the world.

The Church Meeting was held on Tuesday 11th March, when the church budget 2024-25 was accepted. An update was given on the kitchen renovation and the church agreed in principle to replace the kitchen shutter with a mechanised one. Pastoral concerns and news of upcoming events were also shared.

Our church is part of HEBA, the Heart of England Baptist Association. HEBA is currently served by three Regional Ministers, who together have responsibility for 153 churches between us here in Rugby and the Welsh borders (including Birmingham and Coventry.

One of these Regional
Ministers, Neil LeTissier, is
shortly to retire. Neil is well
known to our church. He was
born and raised in Guernsey
and worked as a teacher and
accountant before entering
ministry. Serving as a minister
in London and Sutton Coldfield.
and has been a Regional
Minister in Heba for some
years. We pray God's blessing
on him in retirement.



Due to financial pressures, the decision has been made not to appoint another Regional Minister to replace Neil. Instead, Heba are appointing a number of "Pastoral Ministers" who, as well as probably serving as a minister of a local church, will support and advise up to twelve churches around their area.

This is a big change, and with only two regional ministers covering a huge area, the reality is that we will probably see less of Regional Ministers, but more of whoever is appointed as our area's Pastoral Minister.
