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



Proaudio Sound Press Magazine: Your career spans multiple genres and decades. What do you think has been the key to staying relevant in such a fast-paced industry?

Tamara Dey:

I'll always be a music fan first, before anything else. I'm constantly exploring new sounds, emerging subcultures, and fresh approaches to songwriting and production. I also take great joy in staying immersed in the club scene. This connection to audiences at a grassroots level continues to inform my work and helps me resonate with listeners across different genres and generations.

Proaudio Sound Press Magazine: You've collaborated with some of the biggest names in South African music. Which collaboration stands out the most to you, and why?

Tamara Dev:

The collaboration that stands out the most to me is definitely with Oskido on the track "Thati Mpathlayako" early in my career. This project was a pivotal moment for me, as it not only launched my career but also placed me among artists who had inspired me to pursue my passion for being a club vocalist. The experience was transformative; I experienced incredible highs and learned some tough lessons along the way too, both shaping my artistic journey and helping me grow as a musician.

Proaudio Sound Press Magazine:

How do you approach songwriting, and where do you draw inspiration for your lyrics and melodies?

Tamara Dey:

I approach songwriting through a variety of methods, which keeps the process fresh and exciting for me. Sometimes, I start with a vocal hook that plays on repeat in my mind, and I build the music around it. Other times, I might have a specific message I want to convey, or I'm inspired by a bassline or synth hook in my head that sparks my creativity. I've had moments where I sometimes hear entire tracks in my dreams and then wake myself up to record ideas on my phone. Listening back to those recordings is hilarious as I'm half asleep, but they have often led to some cool concepts.


Proaudio Sound Press Magazine:

Growing up, I was surrounded by my parents' love for rock and soul music, which left a lasting imprint on my own musical style. It's allowed me to explore blending the darker tones I'm so drawn to with the lighter, more melodic elements of pop. As a result, my productions and songwriting often have a balance between these contrasting elements.

Technology has transformed my career in many ways over the years, but most recently in my transition from club vocalist and songwriter to DJ. The advancements in DJ equipment have made it possible for me to learn the craft and start performing professionally in under a year, which has been a tremendous advantage given that I began DJing later than many of my peers. Additionally, the access I have to a vast array of high-quality music through various platforms has allowed me to quickly build a diverse, multi-genre collection of dance music for my sets. This technology has not only helped me elevate my craft, but has also allowed me to enrich my musical repertoire extensively, keeping me connected to audiences in new and exciting ways.

Proaudio Sound Press Magazine: What is your go-to setup for recording and performing, and are there any specific brands or equipment you swear by?

Tamara Dey:

When it comes to brands and equipment, I've worked with both the best and the bare minimum over the years, and both have yielded wonderful results and hit singles. The right tools certainly enhance the process, but I believe that it's ultimately human skill, creativity, and imagination that elevate the technology we use and result in music reaching its fullest potential.

Proaudio Sound Press Magazine: You're known for your vibrant stage presence. What advice do you have for up-and-coming artists about connecting with their audience during a performance?

Tamara Dey:

We all have a unique story to share with the world—a unique conversation and interaction to have with our audiences through music. Each of our voices is as important as the other.



Finding time to nurture my well-being and allowing myself time to recharge definitely helps me stay creatively inspired.




Proaudio Sound Press Magazine: You have been producing your own dance events. How has being on this side of the music industry changed your life?

In terms of effects and mixing capabilities, the DDJ-GRV6 brings a new generation of FX control, allowing DJs to apply Sound Color FX, Beat FX, and new Filter FX with precise control. The dedicated FX paddles provide a tactile, performance-oriented method of engaging effects, something that turntablists and experimental DJs have found incredibly useful.



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Connectivity is another strong point of the **DDJ-GRV6**. With **dual USB ports**, it supports seamless back-to-back performances, making it ideal for collaborative sets and smooth DJ handovers. Balanced XLR outputs provide professional-grade sound delivery, ensuring that performances are crystal clear whether in a club, live stream, or studio setting.

Another feature that has received glowing reviews is the **standalone mixer mode**, allowing the **DDJ-GRV6** to be used as a dedicated mixer for externalmedia players or turntables. The onboard mixer is designed to provide a **pro-club feel**, with **full three-band EQs, independent channel filters, and professional-grade faders**. The inclusion of a **Magvel crossfader** ensures durability and a smooth feel for those engaging in fast transitions or scratching.

Many DJs have noted that the mixer section closely resembles high-end club setups, making it a great tool for those transitioning from home setups to professional environments.





The AT-LP140XP

fully manual professional DJ turntable features a high-torque direct-drive motor and antiresonant, mass-damped, die-cast aluminum platter to ensure stable, on-axis rotation at 33-1/3, 45, and 78 RPM. It is equipped with an Sshaped tonearm with height adjustment, adjustable tracking force (counterweight) and adjustable dynamic anti-skate control.

Audio-Technica has been a leader in phono cartridge design for more than 50 years, and that expertise shows in the durable, high-output AT-XP3 DJ cartridge with 0.6 mil conical bonded stylus included with the turntable. It comes pre-mounted to an AT-HS6 universal ½"-mount headshell.

Designed to connect to components with a dedicated phono input, the turntable comes with a detachable dual RCA output cable and supplies a strong 5.5 mV output.

Additional professional features include a start/stop button; forward and reverse play; selectable high-accuracy quartz-controlled pitch lock and pitch change slider control with +/-8%, +/-16%, and +/-24% adjustment ranges; a stroboscopic platter with speed indicator; a popup stylus target light; and a removable hinged dust cover.









Audio-Technica's AT-LP140XP turntable emerges as a compelling addition to the landscape of DJ-centric equipment, catering to both the professional realm and the audiophile enthusiast's cravings.

Akin to its predecessor, the ATLP120USB, this newer model elevates the experience with an assortment of enhancements, notably the inclusion of the AT-XP3 cartridge. In this comprehensive review, we delve into its features, sonic performance, and its place within the audiophile sphere.

Designed with the DJ community in mind, both the ATLP120USB and the AT-LP140XP present an array of familiar tools. The latter, however, ventures further, aiming to carve its place in audiophile circles despite the inherent DJ-centric accessories. This review seeks to explore whether the AT-LP140XP lives up to its aspirations in the high-fidelity domain.

From a feature standpoint, the AT-LP140XP mirrors its predecessor with a suite of DJ-centric functionalities—platter strobe/light, forward/reverse operation, variable pitch control, and a retractable light. However, distinguishing itself, the AT-LP140XP foregoes built-in phono amplification and a USB port, contributing to a cleaner, purer audio signal, albeit sacrificing convenience for vinyl ripping.

Structurally, the AT-LP140XP exhibits notable differences, such as a robust, heavier plinth and a more damped construction, reducing feedback and coloration from low-frequency sounds.

This attention to build quality extends to its motor, boasting higher torque than its predecessor, ensuring a more stable and precise operation.

A significant highlight is the inclusion of the AT-XP3 cartridge, specifically tailored for DJ demands—showcasing a conical stylus tip, V-Mount dual magnet construction, and excellent tracking capabilities for manual and backcueing.

However, the inherent DJ-oriented cartridge contributes to a certain level of inherent noise, somewhat detracting from the turntable's audiophile potential.

Sound quality is where the AT-LP140XP shines and raises questions. The sonic profile leans towards a vibrant, energetic performance, with a sturdy and responsive bass and an animated midrange. Yet, the DJ-tuned cartridge tends to emphasize certain frequencies, occasionally leading to a slightly edgy or pronounced sound signature.

Experimentation with tracking force adjustments revealed intriguing results, highlighting the delicate balance between catering to DJ requirements and meeting audiophile expectations. Additionally, replacing the DJ-specific cartridge with an audiophile-oriented counterpart, like the Ortofon 2M Red, unveiled a transformation in sound quality, hinting at the turntable's potential when geared solely toward audiophile pursuits.



The Audio-Technica AT-LP140XP stands as a bridge between DJ functionality and audiophile aspirations. Its robust build, energetic performance, and responsive bass make it an intriguing choice for enthusiasts seeking a fusion of utility and sonic vitality.

However, its inherent DJ-oriented design compromises its standing as a true audiophile turntable, presenting a notable trade-off for those seeking pristine sound quality above all else.

Ultimately, its inclusion on demo lists becomes justified for those seeking a well-built, lively, and versatile turntable that balances the demands of DJing and audiophile listening.

Reviewers have consistently highlighted how the touchscreen enhances usability, making track selection and navigation feel seamless.

A standout aspect of the XDJ-AZ is its performance pads, which add a new level of creative expression. With eight multi-function pads per deck, DJs can trigger hot cues, loops, and samples with precision. Many users have found that the tactile feel of the pads, combined with their responsiveness, allows for highly dynamic performances. The inclusion of Slip Mode and Beat Jump ensures that DJs can make intricate adjustments to their mixes without disrupting the overall flow.



When he's not with family, Mark focuses on music production and building his own brand of sound, tailored for both the dancefloor and radio.

His calm demeanor stems from his studies in Buddhism and a life-changing meditation practice, which he's now sharing through an upcoming meditation app and his Instagram page.

Starting From The Beginning

You've been in the music scene since your early teens, and your journey has been incredible. Can you tell us about how your love for house music began and how you transitioned from DJing at Azzuri Lounge to becoming "The World's Strongest DJ"?

Mark Stent

My dad instilled in me a love for music; he was a musician and an early form of 'DJ' - he used to play records for his youth group. In the early 90s, dance music slowly exploded in the underground club culture. I was only around 15 years old, and I snuck out and went to a club called '4th World' - It was like nothing I had ever seen or experienced before; the music had so much energy, and there was so much togetherness on the dance floor.

This was more of an acid house/ progressive house culture and not quite my vibe, but my interest peaked. MK's mix of the Nightcrawler's hit 'Push the feeling on' was the song that made me want to play music - it is still my number-one song over 30 years later. From there, I got obsessed with collecting underground house music and got my first vinyl record at Dance Traxx in Hillbrow. From that point, music became the anchor for every part of my life.

Azzurri Lounge was my first official gig. My mate Ricardo Da Costa and I were so desperate to share our music that we used to play there for pizza and drinks. I can honestly say those were the purest moments of my career—it was purely about the music; big-name DJs were not a thing yet, and we just wanted to play records.

Fast-forward a few years: I finished university, married, and had my first daughter. I also competed heavily in bodybuilding competitions and recently won the South African heavyweight championships. I was still DJing, but primarily for fun, and Dave Forbes asked me if I would play a speed garage vinyl set at his new club, Sutra. This is where I believe it all got serious for me. After a couple of months, I played every week, multiple gigs all over the place, and things blew up fast. I quit my job, and DJing became my career. Right place, right time. The rest is history.

As for my moniker, 'world's strongest DJ', came from my friend Tyrel's(RIP) sister, Bianca - I wasn't on Facebook at the time, and she set up my page with that name more as a joke than as anything serious. After playing my first H20 set and meeting DJ Fresh, who is also a bodybuilder, he brought up meeting the 'DJ with muscles' on his 5FM show, and the name just stuck.

You started your own record label, Flexual Records, and later expanded with Stentfire Music and 3 Girls Music. What inspired you to launch your own label, and how has it helped you grow as an artist and support other talents?

Mark Stent

Flexual was initially started to help me release my music and the music of my industry friends. Being from South Africa, it took a lot of work to get international labels to hear us; Flexual was our way of showing them and learning the more serious side of the music scene. Flexual was an early starting point for artists like Kyle Watson, Crazy White Boy, Stupid Fresh, Nick Supply and many other international talents.

It also gave me access to international artists, remixers, and DJs, who I brought to South Africa for events. It was a labour of love and was instrumental in the early 'Fidget' and electro-house scene. I met so many great people with the label and watched so many young careers grow, but to be honest, we had no idea what we were doing.

Later, I started Stentfire Records to address the South African underground and Afro scene specifically—inspired by my friend and local legend Shona—and to give the world access to quality Afro and South African sounds. 3 Girls Music (named after my three daughters) is my label for releasing my music and has allowed me to experiment as a producer without the constraints of label sounds and politics.

Your "Marktronic" promo mixes have been a massive hit. You recently relaunched it — how has the sound and vibe of the "Marktronic" series evolved over the years, and what can fans expect from the latest edition?

Mark Stent

When I first became serious as a DJ, I would put out weekly mixes for my supporters (in those days, putting up a download for mixes wasn't controlled or regulated). These mixes served two purposes: one, to give my supporters access to the music I played every week and two, to give me a chance to 'feel' my new records before I played them live. They became very popular and helped me grow my following.

I relaunched the series when I moved to the UK in early 2024, but the goals are different now. Marktronix is about what I'm listening to right now, the music that moves me. Without the pressures of the circuit and radio, I can now experiment with what I play and truly craft mixes that reflect where I am musically right now, as well as test out my new productions.

H2O and the Event Industry You've played at some of the biggest events, including H2O. How has your experience with H2O shaped your career, and what are the ups and downs of working in the event industry, especially post-pandemic?

Mark Stent

H2O was the event that catapulted my career. It is by far my favourite gig, and it always felt like home. Dave and his team were so far ahead of the game and have consistently (for 25 years) put on some of the best shows South Africa has to offer.

What made it even more special was that it was in my home area, and I got to play for my friends and family at every event. It also gave me a platform to share my music and play alongside some of the most prominent artists to visit South Africa, for example, Avicii, Armin Van Buuren, Steve Aoki, Chris Lake, Swedish House Mafia, and the list is endless.

As cool as it is working in events, it's more complicated than people think - it's not just about the gig; a lot goes on behind the scenes - studio time, social media, sponsorship commitments, networking, brand management, etc.

Weirdly, it's also a very lonely job; you are always on the road, alone, in the studio, primarily alone and even in front of 20000 people crowds, you are alone - people want your brand, not your feelings on the day. There is a high rate of depression in artists who do this for a living. I managed to offset this by being disciplined in looking after my health and prioritizing family time.

The pandemic changed everything. For 2 years, our source of income was completely cut off, and many of us lost a lot. We were not sure if it would ever come back. It forced us to pivot and look at new and creative ways to survive.

The industry has taken a long time to recover, and I wonder if it ever will completely recover. People learned that they could still have fun at home. A whole generation of kids missed their 'partying' phase.



Old School Vinyl DJ Sets

You're known for your love of vinyl and old-school DJ sets. How do you feel about the resurgence of vinyl in modern DJ culture, and what's the magic of spinning vinyl compared to digital setups?

Mark Stent

I saw a statistic recently that vinyl sales have overtaken CDs worldwide, and I understand why. Vinyl has a much warmer analogue sound and is more tactile than other forms of music storage. I think people are yearning to connect with their music again, and vinyl is the perfect medium.

As a DJ, there Is something pure about mixing on vinyl - you have to be intimately connected to your record and pay attention to it for the whole duration of your mix. With a digital mix, once you have set the speed and pitch, it stays in, but with a vinyl record, it doesn't; you have to keep tracking it to ensure it stays in (this is because records warp, are scratched, etc.). It's a different experience, and the crowd can feel it, too.

Modern music is very disposable; it is short in length and has little shelf life, and there is far too much choice in which records to play. In the vinyl days, I would take a box of 80 records and be able to play 6 hours; with modern digital technology, I could have 3000 tracks on my USB and struggle to find what to play for 1 hour.

Now, I'm not hating modern tech; I love it. It gives so many more ways to mix and mash music—look at James Hype. He has taken it to a whole other level. But I love the old-school journey of mixing vinyl; it's magical, simple and real. I still have a huge record collection and I will never get rid of it, it defines me, each record is a memory of where I was In my life when that record came out. I feel fortunate to have been part of that era in DJ history.

The other thing that the vinyl culture had is that learning to mix on vinyl took time, care and ambition. If someone could mix a record, you knew he had a collection, the time and patience to learn and develop his ear. With modern setups, it is as simple as pushing a button for a perfect mix, allowing the title of DJ to be bestowed on anyone who could press a button.

Juggling Music and Family
You're not just a DJ but also a devoted family man. How do you balance a demanding DJ career, running Flexual Records, and being present for your family?

Mark Stent

My three daughters are the best and most grounding part of my life, and at times, it was really challenging to be consistent when I was on a plane or the road most weekends. But I always met all their milestones, made time to listen and be there for them, and tried to show up in every way I could.

I learned to manage my time and prioritize family and togetherness as I got better at it, but sadly, I still missed some birthdays and holidays. They are all grown up and have turned out to be the most incredible and strong women; I am very close to them, and being their dad is still my top priority.

Retrospectively, being a working DJ takes a heavy toll on your personal life in many ways, but no one prepares you for it, and you learn as you go. I think one of my favorite moments was taking all three of my girls to their first H20 and having them with me on the main stage while I played, what I did finally became real to them.


