





Night of Dreams

Porsche Canada at the Canadian International Auto Show.

Night of Dreams was an amazing event held by Porsche Canada at the Canadian International Auto Show in Toronto. We received early VIP access to a private showing, where some of the finest Porsches were displayed.

At the entrance to the display hall, I was greeted with a Porsche Lego display and a Porsche Vision Gran Tourismo model from a very popular game with the same name. Both brought smiles to everyone's faces and were clearly crowd favourites.

Entering the main hall, a heavily modified 911 Carrera 4S stood proud in offroad hill climbing reenactment. This Porsche broke the record for the highest altitude driven by any car. The Porsche 911 is quite far from an off-roading vehicle; however, with quite a few modifications to the undertray, suspension and safety gear, the car reached 6,734 meters above sea level. Notably, the engine and the gearbox were not modified; moreover, eFuels were used to promote the massive investment that Porsche has made in that sector in recent years.

The only new car on display that was not covered before the event was the new Panamera 4 in an absolutely stunning shade of dark blue. Despite multiple attempts, I couldn't capture the depth and shine of this paint on camera. The new design is more of a refresh than a brandnew design. Nonetheless, the differences will make it easy to distinguish between generations. The new headlamps and very aggressive front bumper looked much better in person, too; photos don't capture the complexity of the creases, especially on a darker paint; now I understand why Porsche has chosen a gold/orange shade for the global public release.

The ceremony started with Porsche Cars Canada's President and CEO John Cappella unveiling the special livery for the 911 GT3 RS and celebrating the upcoming Porsche Experience Centre (PEC) in Toronto. Designed by Walter Dixon, Exclusive Manufaktur Manager, this one-of-a-kind livery embodied the Canadian flag and colours in a playful and original way. Many little details could be spotted around the car, with small maple leaves at each center wheel cap being my favourite. PEC Toronto is scheduled to open later in the year. However, this car will be auctioned off in spring 2025. If you missed out on a GT3 RS allocation, you could still bid on this vehicle.

But the best was left for last. The new Taycan Turbo S was unveiled alongside the Taycan Cross Turismo. The Taycan is Porsche's most powerful and fastest-accelerating car ever. The new EV is a rocket ship with 938 peak BHP and 2.3 0-60 MPH. The design has been updated, too, and like the new Panamera, it is more of a refresh than a brand-new look.

Notably, the new Macan EV was not on display. Nonetheless, the event was an amazing display of upcoming cars, the warm hospitality of freezing Ontario, and a great opportunity to meet with the local community of Porsche enthusiasts. Porsche 911 Turbo celebrates 50 years

Since its introduction in 1974, the Porsche 911 Turbo has achieved legendary status. Story by Edward Quan

We are commemorating the 50th anniversary of the

legendary Porsche Turbo this year. Since its inception, this Stuttgart-born racing marvel has been synonymous with cutting-edge technology, high-performance capabilities, and a thrilling turbocharged engine that has set new standards in the world of sports cars.

The first generation of the Porsche Turbo debuted in 1975 at the Paris Automobile Show, instantly capturing the hearts of automotive enthusiasts worldwide. With its track-inspired design, horsepower that pushed boundaries, and signature flared rear wing trim, this powerhouse quickly became a symbol of speed and adrenaline. Porsche introduced the first 911 Turbo with a wide body kit that was 12 mm wider than the standard model. of 330 km/h, making it an excellent choice for speed demons.

Introducing the Porsche Turbo Cabriolet and S models only added to its allure. This convertible version combined outstanding acceleration with top-speed power and luxury like no other car on the market. It was a true masterpiece that embodied both elegance and raw performance.

Throughout its illustrious history, the Porsche Turbo has continued to evolve and innovate, pushing boundaries with each iteration. From aerodynamic advancements to engine technology enhancements, it has consistently raised the bar for what a sports car can achieve.

Today we celebrate half a century of this legendary vehicle and pay homage to its remarkable legacy. Thank you to everyone who participated in the Christmas Toy Drive; my heart is so full to know my Porsche club truly has a heart!








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EV? Is it for me?

Tech Talk by Darren Batstone, Technical Chair

It is coincidental that I wrap up this article on the day that Porsche unveils the all-new, all-electric Macan! I have been pondering the idea of buying an EV for the past six months. Back and forth. I decided to write about it this quarter as from speaking to many people. They are in the same debate. So, let's take a look. In this comparison, I am comparing BEVs (Battery Electric Vehicles) only, not including electric Hybrid engines.

The fact is, whether you are for them or against them, they are here. As years go on, they are making ground in the market share. Porsche waded into the waters with the Taycan in 2019. Making a new car, not transforming an existing one. They had an EV for that market to offer but weren't messing with their popular models. This is slowly changing as we now see the Electric Macan. The Boxster is on the horizon. And rumours of at least a Hybrid 911. Other manufacturers say they will be all-electric by a specific date. The fact is, in the next 10-15 years, this is a question you will ask yourself. Chances are a lot sooner than that.

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6108 Fraser Street Vancouver, BC Canada, V5W 3A1 My number one question six to eight years ago, when we started seeing EVs arrive regularly on the scene, was durability? Not so much range but durability. As a car enthusiast, I like to see cars on the road for an exceptionally long time. When buying a car, I expect to drive that car for a minimum of 10 years. I know no cell phone I have ever had has lasted 10 years. Why? Because of the battery and software. Well, look where we are with cars.

The question about durability is not so much about the car but the battery. How long do I have? We know \$40,000 to \$300,000+, as you can buy an ICE vehicle. So, the purchase costs cancel each other out. But let's look at operating costs. Take an example of 10 years and 200,000 km.

ICE Vehicle:

I estimate that if you spend \$80 on gas each week, you will spend \$41,600 on gas in the next 10 years at current prices. When have gas prices stayed the same over ten years? Let us say that in 10 years, you have done your brakes three times. Roughly \$3,500 depending on the

a battery will not last forever. So, in my research, I dove into this and was pleasantly surprised. HV batteries (high voltage) used in EVs are designed to last 10-15 years or 150,000-200,000 km. Take that with a grain of salt. One explanation I found explains that EV batteries will lose 2.3% of their charge capacity in one year. So, in 10 years, with proper use, you can expect to lose 23% battery life. 34% over 15 years. That is somewhat acceptable to me if true. Realistically, other than your forever car, fun car or classic,



which spends more than half its life in a garage, are you going to drive the same car for 15 years? Probably not. No way in heck if your name is Joel Parker! Even an ICE (internal combustion engine) car is going to need some serious tending to at the 10–15-year mark or 200,000+ km.

So, what kind of warranty can I get on an EV? I researched four manufacturers' warranty coverage of HV Batteries, and here is what I found. Sadly, Porsche offered the least. Eight years or 130,000 km, whichever comes first. The biggest player in the EV market offers the best. Eight years or 240,000 km, whichever comes first on their top models. And eight years or 192,000 km on some of their other models. Two other manufacturers, which are popular in the market for everyday middle-ofthe-range vehicles, offer the same within 10,000 km of each other. Their plans include eight years or 160,000 km, whichever comes first. So, eight years seems to be a common denominator. When discussing this with each dealership on the phone, there are extensions available for an extra fee, topping out at 10 years, except for one, which can go to 12 years for a very hefty fee. So, 10 years max is what they are covering these for. Guess what. These are almost the exact same numbers you will get on most ICE Vehicles. Cars will not last forever if used as a daily driver. Manufacturers cannot, will not and should not be on the hook past 10 years.

Let us look at the cost. I am excluding the cost of the vehicle, as you can buy an EV for anywhere from

vehicle. And then let us say an additional \$7,000 for miscellaneous stuff: water pumps, wheel bearings, clutches, suspension, etc. So, over 10 years, you spend roughly \$51,000 maintaining and operating an ICE Vehicle. **EV:**

With owning an EV you will most likely have a charger at home. I have read (I do not own an EV, so I have no experience) that an EV will cost you between \$25-\$50 per month to charge. So, over 10 years, \$6,000 max? An EV has regenerative braking, making your brakes last 3-4 times as long. Reports indicate you might make 150,000 km+ on a set of brakes. But the replacement cost is about the same. As for miscellaneous things, I am not sure what comes up. But one unknown variable is software. I am assuming this may be covered in the warranty. But from these numbers, over a 10-year period, the operating cost of an EV will be about one-fifth of an ICE vehicle.

The big kicker is that the battery will die. So, you are either replacing the car or the battery. The costs of a battery are rumoured to be approximately \$20,000. Does the savings on operating costs cover that? We know ICE vehicles can last well beyond 10 years. But factoring in an engine rebuild at some point, especially on a Porsche, you may be looking at \$30,000-\$40,000. If you end up rebuilding an ICE vehicle, you have that cost as well as your previous operating cost. I do believe that manufacturers want the EV market to be a subscription of sorts. Buy one, trade it in. Repeat. Does it work for you? As for my situation, my wife and I drive a combined 600 km a week to our jobs. The math makes sense to me, but we will see. Porsche Museum is celebrating its 15th anniversary

Since opening on January 31, 2009, the Porsche Museum has welcomed almost six million visitors worldwide. The museum underpins the history of Porsche, not just with an impressive collection but also with comprehensive knowledge from the company archive. It is already an essential part of Porsche's history, which is still being written.

Visitors will experience a fascinating journey through Porsche's

history and vehicle development at the museum. The collection includes over 700 cars and nearly 200 racing cars, including an original Canada West Region club grill badge from the 1970s.

The Porsche Museum preserves the company's historical values by showcasing them in the present day. Featuring approximately 95 vehicles, this awe-inspiring exhibition presents the sports car manufacturer's history.

On display are some of the world's most renowned automobile racing icons, including the Porsche 356 "No. 1" Roadster, various generations of Porsche 911 models, and examples of both Porsche 550 and 917. You can explore the history of Porsche's production and motorsport cars chronologically.

They frequently participate in national and international historic racing events and classic car rallies with

The workshop is the heart of the Porsche Museum, where they prepare and maintain their collection of nearly 800 classic cars for around 320 events in what is now more than 30 countries.

The museum archive contains 25,000 exhibits, 5 million photos, 1,700 hours of film, and 3 km of documents. Over the past 15 years, the archive has received over 90,000 inquiries.

In 2023, the Porsche Museum broke the 2009 record for the number of visitors. In its opening year, the museum welcomed 511,513 guests; in 2023, there were 535,613 guests.

The 15th Anniversary of the Porsche Museum is expected to break the attendance record this year. Plan your trip to Stuttgart and join their 15th anniversary celebration.
