



Dear Friends and Family, *November 2025*

We've just returned from Europe! I landed in Lisbon to begin this three-week journey with Luan, my European director and lawyer, and Levi, my translator. They greeted me with wide smiles and huge hugs. Shay and I had visited in March, building relationships with friends who helped pave the way for everything that unfolded on this trip. During this trip, we held eight events in four nations—Portugal, Italy, Spain, and Ireland!

***Remarkably, every one of these ministry opportunities is connected in one way or another to the friends and partners we've served alongside in Brazil over the past fifteen years!***

Our first event took place in the city of Leiria, about two hours north of Lisbon. I had the privilege of speaking at the Be One Conference 2025, where more than 300 young people from across Europe gathered—hearts burning with a desire to reach the nations for Jesus. It was a powerful and deeply meaningful time, with the Spirit of God imparting strength, vision, and encouragement to everyone present. And, of course, they insisted on the snake making an appearance during the first night's message...how could I say no?

From Lisbon, we made the six-hour drive to Madrid, Spain, where two events awaited us.

My friend Raul, originally from Colombia, joined me as both my Spanish translator and my unofficial tour guide for the weekend. In each service, the Spirit of God moved powerfully among those wrestling with depression and suicidal thoughts. Every altar call filled with people reaching out in faith, hungry for freedom, peace, and a fresh breath of hope.

After returning to Lisbon, we flew to Bologna, Italy, where we reunited with our friend and translator Nathan. His family has served as missionaries in Italy for 25 years, and their deep relationships with local churches and refugee communities continue to open new doors for ministry. From there, we took a two-hour drive to the city of Ravenna for a weekend youth event at Nuova Alleanza Church—an especially joyful gathering, as it brought together young people from three different nations.

The missionary work unfolding in Italy is remarkable, shaped in part by the many Brazilian families who have settled there and become a living voice of hope to those in need. Through these relationships, a door opened for me to speak at a Muslim refugee facility in a nearby city—a transitional home for people seeking asylum or awaiting final visa approval.

It became a beautiful moment to share the simple, clear message of faith in Jesus, and many of the men responded with heartfelt prayers of faith, welcoming the prophetic words spoken over their lives and families.

The final two days of the trip took us to Ireland, where the Life and Spirit Church in the city of Claremorris invited me to host a Life Event. Having the opportunity to host a Life Event in Ireland was unique. When people think of Ireland, they often picture an emerald isle with rolling fields and a dramatic, beautiful coastline. Yet behind this idyllic image lies a darker reality that affects many. A 2024 study found that 29% of adolescents rated their mental health as “bad” or “very bad,” with transgender and gender-diverse young people reporting especially high levels of poor mental health and suicidal thoughts. This poor state of mental health is closely linked to factors such as unemployment, and substance addiction. Our meetings not only brought hope and a message of personal value, but it started a much bigger conversation that will continue in the community.

Though Claremorris is a small city of about 8,000 people, it carries a wonderfully international character, with many residents coming from other nations. Anticipation for the event had been building for

months, and the community truly rallied to be part of it.

The message that night was direct and full of grace, and the Spirit of God moved deeply—exposing lies, imparting truth, and touching many hearts in a profound way.
