Exploring Leadership and Community Engagement:

EdUHK Australia Study Tour 2025

From July 27 to August 8, 2025, 18 students and teachers from our department participated in the CLOC course "Learning beyond Classroom: Being a Proactive Leader in the Globe" through a study tour to Western Australia, coorganized with Curtin University. The program aimed to develop students' critical thinking, intercultural competence, and leadership skills through both academic and community-based experiences.

Upon arrival in Perth, participants were welcomed by Curtin University and engaged in academic workshops with the School of Education. Professor Darren Bryant encouraged students to critically compare Western Australia's unique social, economic, and cultural landscape with that of Hong Kong, fostering deeper understanding of local challenges and opportunities. Dr. Luke Webster's session highlighted the importance of community engagement in education, while the Professional Experience Team introduced innovative approaches to teacher training and support. These interactive workshops broadened students' academic horizons and sparked meaningful discussions on leadership and educational futures.

Beyond the classroom, students explored Western Australia's culture and community through field visits. Highlights included Fremantle Prison, where they reflected on human rights and justice; Perth Zoo and Pinnacle Desert, offering insights into environmental education; and Scitech, where students learned about science engagement's role in empowering communities. A visit to Rottnest Island deepened their appreciation for sustainability and environmental preservation. Interactions with local residents and Curtin students further enriched their understanding of indigenous cultures and social diversity.

The tour culminated in group projects where students tackled real social issues—such as mental health, discrimination, city branding, and homelessness—by presenting analyses and proposing innovative solutions. Through comparison with Hong Kong, students enhanced their global perspectives and sense of responsibility as future leaders. This transformative experience not only broadened their worldview but also inspired them to actively contribute to their communities.

Visit of Dr Dong Nguyen, Durham University, UK



From 21-22 August, the Department of Education Policy and Leadership and The Joseph Lau Luen Hung Charitable Trust Asia Pacific Centre for Leadership and Change were honoured to co-host Dr Dong Nguyen, an Associate Professor in Educational Leadership and Change at Durham University, UK. He has around 15 years of international professional experience across many education systems.

During his visit, Dr Nguyen delivered two seminars for EdUHK staff and students. The first session moderated with Prof Sedat Gumus, titled "What can leaders do to retain teaching talents in their schools?", shared some evidence-informed insights into why and how to maximise teacher feelings of being professionally autonomous, developmental and listened; and the second session moderated by Dr Soobin Choi, themed "How to publish in International Journals: Tips for doctoral students and junior researchers", gave some tips and strategies for young researchers when they publish a paper. Dr Nguyen also provided individual consultations to several PhD students and post-doctoral researchers.

We would like to extend our sincere gratitude to Dr Nguyen for his invaluable contribution during the visit. We look forward to future collaborations.







EPL Hosts UTokyo Scholar Dr Michael Facius for an Insightful Week of Higher Education and AI Events



From August 25–29, 2025, the Department of Education Policy and Leadership was privileged to host Dr Michael Facius, Associate Professor at Tokyo College, The University of Tokyo. Dr Facius, an active scholar specialising in global knowledge systems, the history of knowledge, and the future of humanities, brought his expertise to a series of engaging and thought-provoking events. As a seasoned educator in international, interdisciplinary, and innovative programmes, Dr Facius enriched the EdUHK community with his forward-thinking insights.

Over the course of the week, approximately 90 participants, including EdUHK academics, students, and practitioners from the broader education field, actively participated in a dynamic lineup of workshops and seminars. Exploring the transformative role of artificial intelligence (AI) in education and research, fostering meaningful dialogue and collaboration, Dr. Facius delivered a series of impactful sessions tailored to diverse audiences:

- "Dancing with AI: Reflecting Together on Pedagogy and Student Ownership for the New Semester"
 This seminar brought together EdUHK academics and teachers to engage in a reflective session which explored innovative strategies of integrating AI into pedagogy while empowering student ownership of learning.
- "Good Practices in Al-Powered Research at Postgraduate Levels: New Possibilities and Risks"

 This session equipped researchers and research postgraduate students with practical strategies to leverage Al in their work while addressing critical ethical considerations, fostering responsible and innovative research practices.
- "The Art of Living in the Age of Al: Future Imaginaries Workshop" (2 sequential sessions)

 Designed for undergraduate and taught postgraduate students, this interactive workshop guided the participants to engage in scenario thinking, and envisage the future of living and working in an Al-driven world, sparking creative and critical thinking.

A Week of Inspiration and Collaboration

The events provided a platform for meaningful exchange, enabling participants to explore the new possibilities, concerns, and challenges of AI in higher education. Dr Facius' expertise and engaging delivery left a lasting impression, inspiring attendees to rethink their approaches to teaching, learning, research, and future imaginaries.

The Department of Education Policy and Leadership extends its heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Michael Facius for his invaluable contributions and for sharing his expertise with our community. We are excited about the prospect of future collaborations and the continued exploration of practices for innovative higher education.





EdUHK Delegation Embarks on Academic and Cultural Exchange at Shandong University of Finance and Economics



From May 12 to 18, 2025, a delegation from The Education University of Hong Kong (EdUHK) participated in a seven-day academic and cultural exchange with Shandong University of Finance and Economics (SDUFE). This inaugural face-to-face exchange, following their formal partnership established in 2024, aimed to deepen collaboration, promote resource sharing, and foster mutual understanding between the two institutions. The visit began with a warm welcome at Jinan Yaoqiang International Airport and a banquet hosted by SDUFE, setting a friendly tone for the week's activities. The opening ceremony at SDUFE's Yanshan Campus featured speeches from university leaders, supportive video messages, and symbolic gift exchanges, highlighting the enduring friendship between the universities.

During the campus visit to SDUFE's Zhangqiu Campus, the delegation participated in a lecture on Public Governance and Non-Profit Organization Management, engaging in lively discussions about China's governance landscape. Students from both sides interacted through music performances, gift exchanges, and cultural conversations, fostering friendship and mutual respect. Following the academic activities, the delegation traveled to Qufu, the birthplace of Confucianism, where they visited the Temple of Confucius, Confucius Family Mansion, and Confucius Forest, experiencing China's profound cultural and philosophical heritage firsthand. The group also ascended Mount Tai, contemplating the mountain's symbolic significance in Chinese history and culture.

On May 16, Professor Yang Zhiheng delivered a keynote on regional governance and development in Shandong, emphasizing innovative policies and sustainable growth. The closing ceremony was attended by senior officials, who emphasized the importance of cultural ties and pledged continued support for future collaborations. The delegation also visited the Shandong Museum, Baotu Spring, and Daming Lake, deepening their appreciation of the region's history and natural beauty. The exchange concluded with heartfelt farewells, having strengthened institutional bonds, enhanced cultural understanding, and fostered youth connections, contributing to the shared goal of nurturing globally-minded talents rooted in national identity.

Prof Sedat Gümüş Receives Friedrich Wilhelm Bessel Research Award

Prof Sedat Gümüş, Professor in the Department of Education Policy and Leadership (EPL) and the Director of The Joseph Lau Luen Hung Charitable Trust Asia Pacific Centre for Leadership and Change (APCLC) at The Education University of Hong Kong (EdUHK), has been awarded the prestigious Friedrich Wilhelm Bessel Research Award for 2025 in recognition of his research and academic achievements.

Prof Gümüş joined the Department of Education Policy and Leadership in 2021. Before joining EdUHK, he served as an Associate Professor at Aarhus University in Denmark. Prof. Gümüş has researched school leadership practices and models in various contexts.

The Alexander von Humboldt Foundation in Germany grants up to 20 Bessel awards, named after the renowned German astronomer and mathematician Friedrich Wilhelm Bessel (1784–1846), each year to internationally renowned academics. Prof. Gumus has been one of the few education researchers to receive this distinguished honor to date.

Participating in the EPL Doctoral Student Exchange at the University of Southampton, UK was an excellent experience, especially as a first-year PhD student. My primary motivation for joining was the opportunity to work with a professor whose model forms the foundation of my research project. Having direct access to his expert consultations and insights not only enriched my understanding but also opened several new directions that I can integrate into my PhD work.

The exchange period facilitated my research by giving me clarity and confidence to move forward with my project. Engaging with an international academic environment allowed me to explore diverse perspectives, teaching styles, and cultural experiences, all of which broadened my academic outlook. The exposure to ongoing research at Southampton further strengthened the quality and scope of my work.

I would strongly recommend this exchange to other PhD candidates. It is a unique opportunity to gain mentorship, broaden academic horizons, and network with peers across borders. Experiencing this in the very first year of PhD provides an invaluable head start.

For future applicants, my advice is to live closer to the university to save transport costs and plan your visit between September and June to participate fully in the academic year's activities."
