



PRINCIPAL



THE YEARS SEEM TO BE SWEEPING BY AT AN EVER INCREASING RATE. BRYANSTON HIGH IS A VERY BUSY SCHOOL AS WE TRY TO CONFORM TO THE NEWS POLICIES, LEGISLATION AND CURRICULUM BUT, AT THE SAME TIME, RETAIN THE TRADITIONS AND POLICIES THAT HAVE MADE OUR SCHOOL SO SUCCESSFUL IN THE PAST. IN ADDITION, SOCIETY, TECHNOLOGY AND THE ECONOMY IS CHANGING AT AN EVER INCREASING RATE. TO PROVIDE A QUALITY AND RELEVANT EDUCATION IN THESE CHANGING TIMES IS AN EVER INCREASING CHALLENGE. I DO FEEL THAT ACADEMIC STANDARDS ARE UNDER THREAT. NEW CURRICULUMS HAVE TRIED TO EMPHASIZE NEW WAYS OF LEARNING, BUT I FIRMLY BELIEVE THAT BASIC ACADEMIC SKILLS ARE ABOVE AND BEYOND THE CALL OF TIME AND ARE TRIED AND TESTED. WE OWE IT TO OUR CHILDREN TO GIVE THEM THE OPPORTUNITY TO ACQUIRE AS MUCH KNOWLEDGE AS POSSIBLE AND ALL THE SKILLS AND CREATIVE ABILITY THAT GOES WITH THIS. ARMED WITH KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS THEY WILL BE MORE THAN READY AND PREPARED TO MEET THE CHALLENGES OF THE GLOBAL ECONOMY AND BE ABLE TO ADAPT TO RAPID TECHNOLOGICAL AND SCIENTIFIC CHANGE. IF WE TEACH THE BASICS WELL TO OUR STUDENTS, THEY WILL BECOME THE NEW LEADERS IN THE WORLD AND NOT THE FOLLOWERS.

THE CHALLENGES TO MAINTAINING STANDARDS ARE CONSIDERABLE:

- TEACHERS ARE BATTLING TO ADAPT TO THE EVER CHANGING CURRICULUM AND THE ADMIN THAT GOES WITH IT
- FAMILIES ARE NOT AS STRONG AS THEY WERE IN THE PAST AND IT IS PLACING AN EXTRA BURDEN ON SCHOOLS TO TEACH STUDENTS VALUES AND THE CORRECT WAY TO BEHAVE
- VALUES HAVE DECLINED. JUSTICE, HONESTY AND FAIRNESS ARE DECLINING VALUES
- TV AND MOBILE PHONES HAVE CHANGED THE WAY PEOPLE INTERACT
- THE INTERNET HAS OPENED UP MANY OPPORTUNITIES, BUT IT HAS ALSO CREATED CHALLENGES, SUCH AS FACEBOOK AND PORNOGRAPHY
- MARKETING AND ADVERTISING IS MANIPULATING THE MARKETS AND THE WAY PEOPLE THINK AND WHAT THEY DO
- MORE AND MORE PEOPLE ARE UNDER SOME KIND OF CHEMICAL INFLUENCE OR HAVE A DEPENDENCY
- CRIME HAS MADE PEOPLE SCARED AND VULNERABLE
- THE DECLINING ECONOMY HAS THREATENED THE INCOME OF MANY FAMILIES
- THE SCHOOL IS STRUGGLING TO COLLECT SCHOOL FEES
- THE EXEMPTION SYSTEM IS DRAINING THE SCHOOL
- IT IS MORE AND MORE DIFFICULT TO GET STUDENTS AND THEIR PARENTS TO COMMIT TO THE EXTRA-MURAL PROGRAMME.

IT IS A TALE OF NEGATIVITY, HOWEVER I DO BELIEVE BRYANSTON HIGH HAS AN ANSWER TO MOST OF THE ABOVE ISSUES. WE ARE MAINTAINING STANDARDS AND OPENING UP NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL OUR MOTIVATED STUDENTS.

OUR TEACHERS ARE COMMITTED TO THE SCHOOL AND THE PROFESSION AND DO A FANTASTIC JOB UNDER DIFFICULT CIRCUMSTANCES. THE MANAGEMENT OF THE SCHOOL IS EXPERIENCED AND VERY COMPETENT. I BELIEVE THAT BECAUSE OF THEIR SKILLS AND HIGH STANDARD, THEY DO COME IN TO CONFLICT WITH PARENTS, STUDENTS AND EDUCATIONAL AUTHORITIES WHO DO NOT

WE STILL ARE ABLE TO FIELD AS MANY SPORTS TEAMS AS WE HAVE DONE IN THE PAST. ALL STUDENTS AND TEACHERS HAVE ACCESS TO COMPUTERS. WE TRY TO MANAGE THE SCHOOL IN A DEMOCRATIC WAY SO OUR STUDENTS CAN LEARN THE SKILLS REQUIRED TO FUNCTION IN A FREE SOCIETY.

BRYANSTON HAS A LOT TO BE GRATEFUL FOR AND A LOT TO BE PROUD OF!

THE GOVERNING BODY WAS ELECTED DURING THE MIDDLE OF THE YEAR AND IT BROUGHT IN NEWLY ELECTED MEMBERS WITH NEW AND MUCH NEEDED SKILLS. IT IS EXCITING TO SEE THE NEW CHANGES IN THE ADMISSION PROCEDURE, FINANCIAL PROCEDURES AND THE REFURBISHING OF THE TUCK SHOP.

MR HUTTON HAS DONE A SUPERB JOB IN MANAGING THE FINANCES OF THE SCHOOL. HIS KNOWLEDGE AND ACCOUNTING EXPERTISE HAVE KEPT THE ACCOUNTS BALANCED AND HE HAS HAD THE SUPPORT OF A SKILLFUL BURSAR, MRS PEACOCK.

THE GOVERNING BODY'S CONTINUED MEMBERSHIP AND SUPPORT OF THE GOVERNING BODY FOUNDATION HAS GIVEN US IMPORTANT LEGAL AND POLICY ADVICE AND KEPT US INFORMED OF LEGISLATIVE AND POLICY CHANGES IN EDUCATION.

I AM VERY CONCERNED ABOUT THE FINANCIAL VIABILITY OF THE SCHOOL IN THE FUTURE. EXEMPTIONS ARE MAKING A BIGGER AND

BIGGER DENT IN OUR INCOME AND THE COST OF EDUCATION IS NOT DECREASING. ELECTRICITY AND MUNICIPAL CHARGES ALONE ARE A BIG THREAT AS THEY BECOME MORE AND MORE EXPENSIVE. THE GDE DOES NOT MAINTAIN THE INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE SCHOOL. SECURITY IS A GROWING COST. TEACHERS HAVE RECEIVED LARGES ALARYINCREASES IN THE PAST TWO YEARS. WE NEED TO KEEP OUR TEACHERS AND NOT LOSE THEM TO BETTER PAYING SCHOOLS. FILE SERVERS AND COMPUTERS ARE VERY EXPENSIVE AND EVERY MODERN SCHOOL NEEDS THEM. THE GROUNDS NEED CONSTANT ATTENTION, YET THE GOVERNMENT MAKES IT MORE AND MORE DIFFICULT TO COLLECT FEES AND IS NOW SEEKING TO CAP SCHOOL FEES. ONE WONDERS HOW LONG WE CAN MAINTAIN STANDARDS WHEN WE FACE SUCH A FINANCIAL THREAT IN THE FUTURE. | APPLAUD THE LADIES IN THE OFFICE COLLECTING THE FEES, UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF THE GOVERNING BODY. THIS IS AN IMPORTANT, BUT VERY STRESSFUL JOB.

ONE CAN SEE THE PATTERN IN SCHOOLS WHERE PARENTS HAVE RESISTED THE PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES AND THE NUMBER OF EXEMPTIONS HAVE GROWN; THESE SCHOOLS DO NOT ACHIEVE TO THE SAME LEVELS AS THEY HAVE DONE IN THE PAST.

THIS THEN RAISES THE ISSUE OF EXTRA-MURALS. I BELIEVE IN HOLISTIC EDUCATION WHERE EXTRA-MURALS PLAY A CRITICAL ROLE IN THE EDUCATION PROCESS WE OFFER AT THE SCHOOL. SPORT AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES PLAY A CRUCIAL ROLE IN THE HIDDEN CURRICULUM OF THE SCHOOL. EXTRA-MURALS GIVE THE SCHOOL A SOUL AND A PURPOSE. IT IS MY EXPERIENCE THAT IF EXTRA MURALS ARE ALLOWED TO DIE, SO DOTHE ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND DISCIPLINE OF THE SCHOOL. ALL THE TOP SCHOOLS IN THE WORLD OFFER ELABORATE AND WIDE RANGING EXTRA-MURAL ACTIVITIES, BUT THE TREND IS FOR MANY GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS TO GIVE UP EXTRA-MURALS.

THE EVIDENCE IS APPARENT WHEN SOME SCHOOLS ARE NO LONGER COMPETING AGAINST US - EVERY SEASON WE ARE IN SEARCH OF NEW FIXTURES AS MANY OLD AND TRADITIONAL FIXTURES ARE NO LONGER VIABLE FOR US. YET PARENTS STILL CONSISTENTLY RESIST SUPPORTING THE SCHOOL WHEN THEY DO NOT ENCOURAGE THEIR CHILDREN TO PARTICIPATE IN AN AFTERNOON OR WEEKEND ACTIVITY, OR THEY SUPPORT THEIR CHILD'S INVOLVEMENT, BUT NEVER COME AND WATCH THE MATCH.

IT IS A CHALLENGE FOR TEACHERS TO CARRY A HEAVY ACADEMIC LOAD AND STILL GO ON TO UMPIRE A CRICKET MATCH OR TRAVEL ACROSS JOHANNESBURG FOR A HOCKEY MATCH, BUT THEY DO IT BECAUSE THEY KNOW IT CREATES A

QUALITY SCHOOL AND IT MOULDS AND BUILDS QUALITY AND SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS. I HAVE NEVER BELIEVED THAT MAKING YOUR SON GIVE UP RUGBY SO HE CAN CONCENTRATE ON HIS MATHS WILL RESULT IN A HIGHER MATHS MARK. IN FACT I WILL ARGUE THAT BY DOING BOTH, HE WILL LEARN TIME MANAGEMENT AND DISCIPLINE.

I WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL TEACHERS FOR DOING A WONDERFUL JOB. THERE ARE ALWAYS ISSUES IN THE STAFFROOM, BUT WE DO HAVE A HAPPY GROUP OF TEACHERS WHO CONDUCT THEMSELVES IN A PROFESSIONAL MANNER. THE STRESS IS ENORMOUS AT TIMES AND WE DO CRACK, BUT I ALSO BELIEVE WE ARE SKILLED AND PROFESSIONAL ENOUGH TO SOLVE PROBLEMS AND GROW FROM THE EXPERIENCE. WITH NEW CURRICULUM CHANGES IN THE PIPELINE, TEACHERS AGAIN HAVE TO LEARN NEW SYSTEMS AND ADAPT TO NEW POLICIES.

EVERY TEACHER IS SPECIAL AND I WOULD LIKE TO THANK EACH ONE FOR THEIR LOYALTY TO THE SCHOOL, THEIR SUPPORT OF ME AND THE HUGE COMMITMENT THEY HAVE MADE TO THE STUDENTS OF THE SCHOOL. IT IS A PRIVILEGE TO WORK WITH SUCH WONDERFUL PEOPLE.

THE ADMIN STAFF ARE AMAZING AND VERY SUPPORTIVE AND THEY TAKE A BIG LOAD OF PRESSURE OFF THE TEACHERS. FROM ANSWERING THE PHONE TO COLLECTING SCHOOL FEES THEY ARE AMAZING. PARENTS ARE OFTEN DIFFICULT; THEY HAVE TO DEAL WITH THE GDE; ADMISSIONS ARE COMPLEX AND YET THEY STILL HAVE TIME TO HELP STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT FEELING WELL OR STUDENTS WHO NEED HELP AND ASSISTANCE IN A FAMILY CRISIS.

MRS DE VILLIERS AND MRS PEACOCK ARE SUPERB LEADERS AND MANAGERS OF THE ADMIN AND FINANCES OF THE SCHOOL.

WE ARE BLESSED TO HAVE A LOYAL AND HARD WORKING GROUND STAFF. WE HAVE NOT REPLACED SOME OF THE STAFF WHO HAVE LEFT SO THEY ARE CARRYING A BIGGER WORK LOAD, YET THEY ARE PLEASANT TO WORK WITH AND ARE ALWAYS POSITIVE AND SUPPORTIVE OF THE SCHOOL.

THE NEW SGB HAVE BEEN AMAZING IN BRINGING NEW ENERGY, EXPERTISE AND SKILLS INTO THE GOVERNING BODY AND THEY HAVE UNITED INTO A VERY GOOD TEAM, ACTING IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE SCHOOL. TO RUN A SCHOOL WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE NEW LEGISLATION IS A NOT AN EASY TASK AND THE FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS ARE HUGE.

ANOTHER MATRIC GROUP MOVES THROUGH THE SCHOOL AND I WOULD LIKE TO WISH THEM MUCH SUCCESS FOR THEIR EXAMS AND TRUST THEIR RESULTS REFLECT THE HARD WORK THEY HAVE PUT IN AND THAT THE RESULTS WILL BE STEPPING STONES TO EVEN GREATER SUCCESSES IN LIFE. CHAIRPERSON



I WOULD LIKE TO BEGIN BY OFFERING A SPECIAL WELCOME TO THE NEW MEMBERS TO OUR GOVERNING BODY. JUDGING BY THE MEETINGS AND THE AMOUNT OF RESEARCH AND ACTUAL WORK BEING DONE BY THESE INDIVIDUALS, THEIR EAGERNESS TO GET INVOLVED AND TO INTERROGATE DECISIONS WHICH HAVE BEEN TAKEN IN THE PAST, I CAN SAY THAT MY PORTFOLIO AS CHAIRMAN HAS BEEN MADE SO MUCH EASIER. IT'S A PLEASURE WORKING WITH YOU.

THE AGM MEETING IS THE MOST IMPORTANT MEETING IN THE SCHOOL CALENDAR, AS PARENT INPUT AT A MEETING OF THIS NATURE IS CRUCIAL. THE AGM IS WHEN RESOLUTIONS ARE PASSED OR REJECTED; IT'S WHEREWEPITCH NEW FEESTRUCTURES FOR THE COMING YEAR; IT'S A PLATFORM FOR YOU AS THE PARENTS, TO ASK QUESTIONS OF GOVERNANCE OR ANY OTHER ISSUES FOR THAT MATTER; AND OF COURSE IT'S AN OPPORTUNITY TO SHOWCASE OUR ACHIEVEMENTS AS A SCHOOL. AT THIS POINT I WOULD LIKE TO CONGRATULATE THE SCHOOL FOR BEING MENTIONED IN THE TOP 100 SCHOOLS IN SOUTH AFRICA, SUFFICE TO SAY FROM NOW ON WE SHOULD REFER TO OURSELVES AS A "TOP 100 SCHOOL".

THE MORE THINGS CHANGE THE MORE THEY STAY THE SAME, WE ARE ONCE AGAIN FACED WITH "TEACHER RETENTION" CHALLENGES, AND IN TRUE GDE FASHION, THEY ARE MAKING IT MORE DIFFICULT FOR THE GOVERNING BODYTO AUGMENT TEACHERS' SALARIES, COMMONLY KNOWN AS A "TOP UP" OR SECTION 38A OF SASA. WELL TRAINED AND DEDICATED TEACHERS SUCH AS OURS, ARE AN INCREDIBLY SCARCE COMMODITY IN THE PUBLIC SECTOR. PRIVATE SCHOOLS PAY TEACHERS WHAT THEY REALLY DESERVE, WHICH CREATES POACHING

OF OUR WELL TRAINED TEACHERS BY THE PRIVATE SCHOOLS.

SOUTH AFRICA HAS APPROXIMATELY 12.5-MILLION STUDENTS, SOME 386 600 TEACHERS AND 26 300 SCHOOLS, INCLUDING 1 100 REGISTERED PRIVATE SCHOOLS. OF ALL SCHOOLS, ROUGHLY 6 000 ARE HIGH SCHOOLS (GRADE 7 TO GRADE 12) AND THE REST PRIMARY (GRADE 0 TO GRADE 6).

IN GOVERNMENT-FUNDED PUBLIC SCHOOLS, THE AVERAGE RATIO OF SCHOLARS TO TEACHERS IS 36 TO ONE, WHILE PRIVATE SCHOOLS GENERALLY HAVE ONE TEACHER FOR EVERY 17 STUDENTS. CENTRAL GOVERNMENT PROVIDES A NATIONAL FRAMEWORK FOR SCHOOL POLICY, BUT ADMINISTRATIVE RESPONSIBILITY LIES WITH THE PROVINCES. POWER IS FURTHER DEVOLVED TO GRASSROOTS LEVEL VIA ELECTED SCHOOL GOVERNING BODIES, SUCH AS OURS, WHICH HAVE A SIGNIFICANT SAY IN THE RUNNING OF THE SCHOOL. IN OUR SCHOOL WE ARE ALLOCATED 36 TEACHERS, WHO ARE PAID FOR BY THE GDE, THE GOVERNING BODY EMPLOYS A FURTHER 31 TEACHERS, THIS IS TO KEEP THE STUDENT TEACHER RATIO TO MANAGEABLE PROPORTIONS.

THE BREAKDOWN OF STAFF EMPLOYED AT THIS SCHOOL IS AS FOLLOWS: ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF GDE 3 – SGB 6, GENERAL ASSISTANTS GDE 6 -SGB 9, TUCK SHOP SGB 2; AS YOU CAN SEE WE EMPLOY AND PAY FOR AN ADDITIONAL 48 STAFF MEMBERS TO MAKE THIS SCHOOL FUNCTION AT ITS OPTIMUM LEVEL.

MOST STATE SCHOOLS ARE STATE-AIDED TO SOME DEGREE; THE GOVERNMENT PROVIDES THE MINIMUM, AND PARENTS CONTRIBUTE TO BASICS AND EXTRAS IN THE FORM OF SCHOOL FEES. SCHOOL FEES ARE A VITAL SOURCE OF INCOME FOR US TO MAINTAIN THE STANDARDS THAT WE HAVE ACHIEVED THUS FAR.

SCHOOLS ARE RANKED IN FIVE CATEGORIES FOR FUNDING PURPOSES, BASED ON THE RELATIVE POVERTY OF THE COMMUNITIES THEY SERVE. THE POOREST SCHOOLS FALL INTO CATEGORY ONE, AND THE WEALTHIEST CATEGORY FIVE. WE FALL IN THE CATEGORY FIVE GROUPING, WHICH MEANS WE GET THE BARE MINIMUM FROM GOVERNMENT. OUR DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE HAS CHANGED VASTLY AND WILL CONTINUE TO DO SO, AND WE STRIVE TO ATTRACT THE BEST POSSIBLE CANDIDATES.

BRYANSTON HIGH WE DO NOT OFFER A BASIC EDUCATION; WE OFFER A WORLD CLASS EDUCATION WHICH HAS TO BE PAID FOR. THERE ARE ONLY TWO KINDS OF PARENTS - THOSE WHO PAY SCHOOL FEES AND THOSE WHO WON'T!

THE HIGH COST OF LIVING IS AFFECTING TEACHERS AND PARENTS ALIKE; WE ARE ALL FEELING THE PINCH OF THE ECONOMIC CLIMATE. SCHOOL MATERIALS AND MAINTENANCE ARE ALL CONTRIBUTING FACTORS FOR THE INCREASE IN SCHOOL FEES.

INCREASES IN FEES AT GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS, WHICH MANAGE THEIR OWN BUDGETS, ARE AFFECTED BY THE INCREASING COST OF TELEPHONE BILLS, INTERNET CONNECTIONS, ELECTRICITY, WATER, AND GENERAL MAINTENANCE, INSURANCE FOR BUILDINGS WHICH INCIDENTALLY WE DON'T OWN, STOCK AND VEHICLES, AS WELL AS ADDITIONAL ACADEMIC AND NON-TEACHING STAFF EMPLOYED BY THE GOVERNING BODY. ELECTRICITY ALONE HAS INCREASED BY 3 2% THIS YEAR, AND FURTHER INCREASES OF 45% EACH YEAR FOR THE NEXT 3 YEARS ARE TO BE EXPECTED AND BUDGETED FOR. THE WORLD IS A DIFFERENT PLACE TO WHAT IT WAS 18 MONTHS AGO.

THERE ARE NO GOVERNMENT SUBSIDIES FOR OUR SCHOOL, AND IN ORDER TO BALANCE THE BUDGET, SCHOOL FEE INCREASES HAVE TO AT LEAST EQUAL THE INCREASE IN THE COSTS OF RUNNING THE SCHOOL.

THE CEO IS AIDED BY THE SMT (SCHOOL MANAGEMENT TEAM) WHO ARE VERY DEDICATED AND TAKE A NO NONSENSE APPROACH TO THE DAY TO DAY RUNNING OF THESE FACILITIES, AND THAT IS WHY WE ARE IN THE TOP 100 SCHOOLS IN GAUTENG.


GRADE 8 CAMP - BOYS



As we entered the museum, there were two signs: Whites and Non-Whites; this came as a shock to us because we were never brought up this way, however, our tour guide explained that this was how many people of south Africa were discriminated against. This brought about a sense of realism to many of the learners because it was not as if we were learning about Apartheid in an Afrikaans textbook – it was first-hand experience.

AS OUR JOURNEY CONTINUED WE LEARNT ABOUT THE PASS LAWS, THE 150 ACTS OF APARTHEID, THE FORMATION OF THE ANC AND THE PAIN AND SUFFERING THAT APARTHEID CAUSED. THE LARGE, BLOWN-UP PHOTOGRAPHS AND NUMEROUS MONITORS PLAYING THE VIOLENT SCENES OF APARTHEID CAPTURED EVERY EMOTION IN OUR BODIES. THIS WAS AN EXPERIENCE I WILL ALWAYS REMEMBER.

THE SEVEN PILLARS OF OUR CONSTITUTION WERE IN SIGHT AS WE WERE LEAVING THE MUSEUM: DEMOCRACY, EQUALITY, RECONCILIATION, DIVERSITY, RESPONSIBILITY, RESPECT AND FREEDOM. THIS VISIT TO THE APARTHEID MUSEUM WAS AN EYE-OPENER ABOUT HOW LUCKY WE ARE AND THE GRADE 11'S CERTAINLY LEARNT A LOT ABOUT OUR PAST. SOUTH AFRICA IS A DEMOCRACY; WE ARE ALL EQUAL AND FREE FROM DISCRIMINATION.






