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Whole-class Ensemble Tuition (WCET)

Through whole-class teaching you can ensure that **every child** has an opportunity to learn to sing, play an instrument and create music together in class time. Our WCET programme is designed to spark children's musical curiosity through playing, singing, listening, creating and performing.

Discover the world of music and music production through technology. This half-term programme will be led by a Music Tech Tutor using easily available free software including Audacity, Garage Band, Cakewalk and Bandlab.

Use music technology in innovative ways in the classroom to create music digitally - sourcing and recording sound, learning about sound manipulation, composition and music production using standard IT equipment available in your school.

Musical Nurture Groups

Musical Nurture Groups use music to develop confidence, social skills, emotional regulation and resilience. The 30 minute weekly sessions, delivered in small groups, provide a calm and nurturing environment for children to explore creativity and expression through the development of musical and instrumental skills.

The sessions are a form of targeted intervention for students at risk of poor educational outcomes due to social, emotional or behavioural needs. The scheme is modelled on an established programme led by Changing Tracks in Hertfordshire, and follows on from a successful pilot project in South Cumbria in 2022/2023.

CPD: Musicianship in the Classroom for KS1 in partnership with the British Kodály Academy

Are you a Nursery or Primary teacher looking for practical ideas to support music teaching in your school? Join this Foundation Level CPD Certified Course led by Lucinda Geogheghan in partnership with the British Kodály Academy and Cumbria Music Hub. **NO PREVIOUS MUSICAL KNOWLEDGE IS REQUIRED!**

The course is aimed at those with little or no previous musical training, or who are completely new to Kodály Inspired Music Education. You will go away equipped with ideas to use immediately with children aged 4-7. This introduction to the Kodály Approach gives you the requirements of Module 1 of the Kodály Certificate Foundation Level if you choose to be assessed (not a mandatory part of the course). To be awarded the accredited certificate the full course must be completed (see module content).

CPD: Musicianship in the Classroom for KS1 in partnership with the British Kodály Academy

The course will cover:

- The importance of singing, games and movement in the Early Years/Primary Education
- Develop confidence as a leader of singing activities
- Helping children understand the basic building blocks of music: Beat, Rhythm, Pitch, Dynamics, Tempo, Phrasing and Timbre
- Using simple classroom percussion to support a singing based curriculum
- How music benefits all areas of the curriculum – specifically literacy, numeracy, health and well-being
- Encouraging creativity in the classroom

Key Features

CPD Certified: This course is run in partnership with the British Kodaly Academy and can be part of the Kodaly Certificate Foundation Level if you want a formal qualification

First Thing Music offers an easy-to-deliver, effective, and fun way to introduce young children to the world of music and creativity.

The training is mostly delivered online, and the programme is designed to be easy to implement and deliver, with a focus on engaging your pupils. You'll be able to provide your students with a solid musical foundation that will inspire them for years to come. Support materials are provided.

Creativity and Composition with Digital Resources

Develop your creativity and composition skills using Digital resources. Join our Music Tech experts for a CPD short-course to learn about music technology and composition and create a good foundation for working with your students.
