## 2024 WAS ANOTHER BANNER YEAR

for the Boys & Girls Club of Lake Tahoe. Despite facing significant reductions to our state grant, we persevered and expanded our Tahoe Valley after-school site to include all grades from TK to 5th. With four fully operational sites, we increased the number of children and families we serve, achieving an average daily attendance of over 400 for the first time in the Club's history.

The Club was also instrumental in supporting the successful campaign and passage of Measure U, which will greatly enhance facilities and infrastructure at our local schools, including spaces that the Club uses daily.

We also made some facility changes of our own. Thanks to very generous donors, we were able to complete our Let the Kids Play capital campaign, and a new playground will be installed next spring. The playground will be inclusive, featuring ropes, platforms, and swings to create a dynamic experience accessible to all ages and abilities.

The focus for 2024 was to increase the variety, quantity, and quality of programs we provide our members. Kids are constantly evolving and maturing, so it is important that as an organization, we also adapt and grow in order to meet their changing needs.

In 2024, we started four competitive soccer teams, introduced the Teen Winter Recreation Program, continued our summer sleep-away camp and Thanksgiving flag football, and established new partnerships offering equine therapy, support group sessions, and anti-drug and tobacco programs. Our staff specialists have taken art, STEM, and recreation on the road, ensuring that all our members can participate in their fun and educational programs.

Looking ahead, we have obtained funding to incorporate Esports into our programs and will launch Lego Robotics this winter. We will keep evaluating what new programs and activities are needed to retain the interests and elevate the education of our members. Funding remains a challenge, and I will dedicate considerable time advocating for the continuation and increase of state grants that support our daily operations and keep costs low for families.

We remain committed to serving our members, families and community in the ways they need us most. Thank you for your continued support and engagement with the Club; we look forward to an incredible year ahead.

2024 was pivotal for embracing outdoor adventures. The Club focused on exploring Lake Tahoe throughout the year. Members participated in different activities such as snowshoeing, skiing, snowboarding, biking, hiking, and swimming.

The Club launched a competitive soccer program to engage older elementary and middle school members in a fun, positive after-school activity.

Over 60 boys and girls, aged 9 to 13, played on one of the four Alianza teams. They participated in four tournaments, two leagues, and weekly training focused on skill development and team building.

An additional 60 members joined the Club’s ‘Four Fields Soccer Tournament’ in the fall, where each Club site competed against each other, with every site winning at least one age bracket.

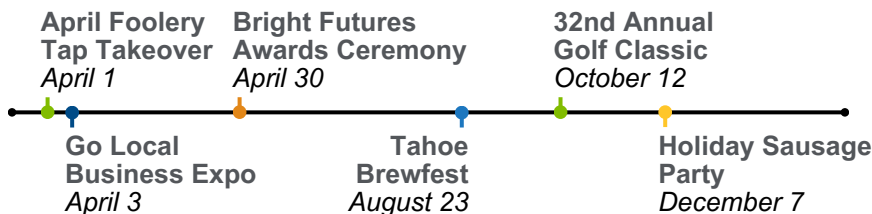

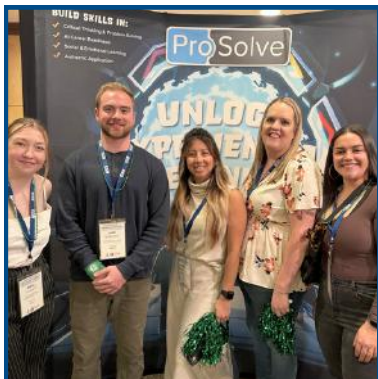

## League of Eagles Award



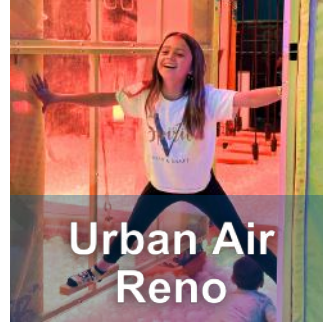
### Board of Directors

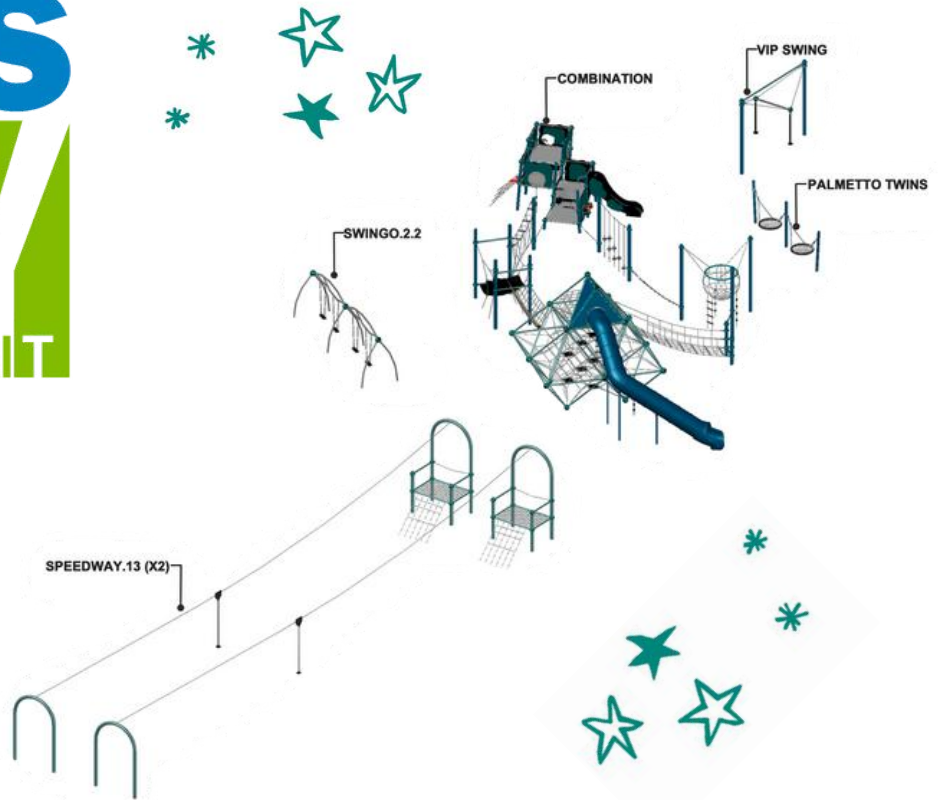

# SCHEDULED TO OPEN SUMMER 2025

The new playground will be open to all & enjoyed by over 2,000 children and teens per year. It will be the first all accessible playground in the Tahoe Basin and will serve as a focal point for the AI Tahoe neighborhood and surrounding programs.
