HELP PATIENTS ACCESS FREE NHS WEIGHT MANAGEMENT SUPPORT

The NHS Digital Weight Management Programme (DWMP) is a free 12-week service designed to support adults living with obesity who also have diabetes, hypertension, or both.

Eligibility:

- Age 18+
- BMI > 30 (or > 27.5 for Black, Asian, and minority ethnic groups)
- Have diabetes, hypertension, or both
- Access to a smartphone, tablet, or computer

Referral Process:

You can only make a referral via your EMIS, SystmOne or Medicus e-referral (e-RS) system. You will need the referral templates, which are available to download from the [NHS Digital Weight Management Programme GP Template Site](#) (you'll need your practice ODS code for access). Use SNOMED code: 1402911000000108.

Practices receive £11.50 per referral up to their allocation, supporting the delivery of this important service.

By helping patients access DWMP, practices play a vital role in improving health outcomes and reducing risks associated with long-term conditions. Uptake in Derby and Derbyshire is currently among the lowest in the Midlands – your support can make a real difference.
