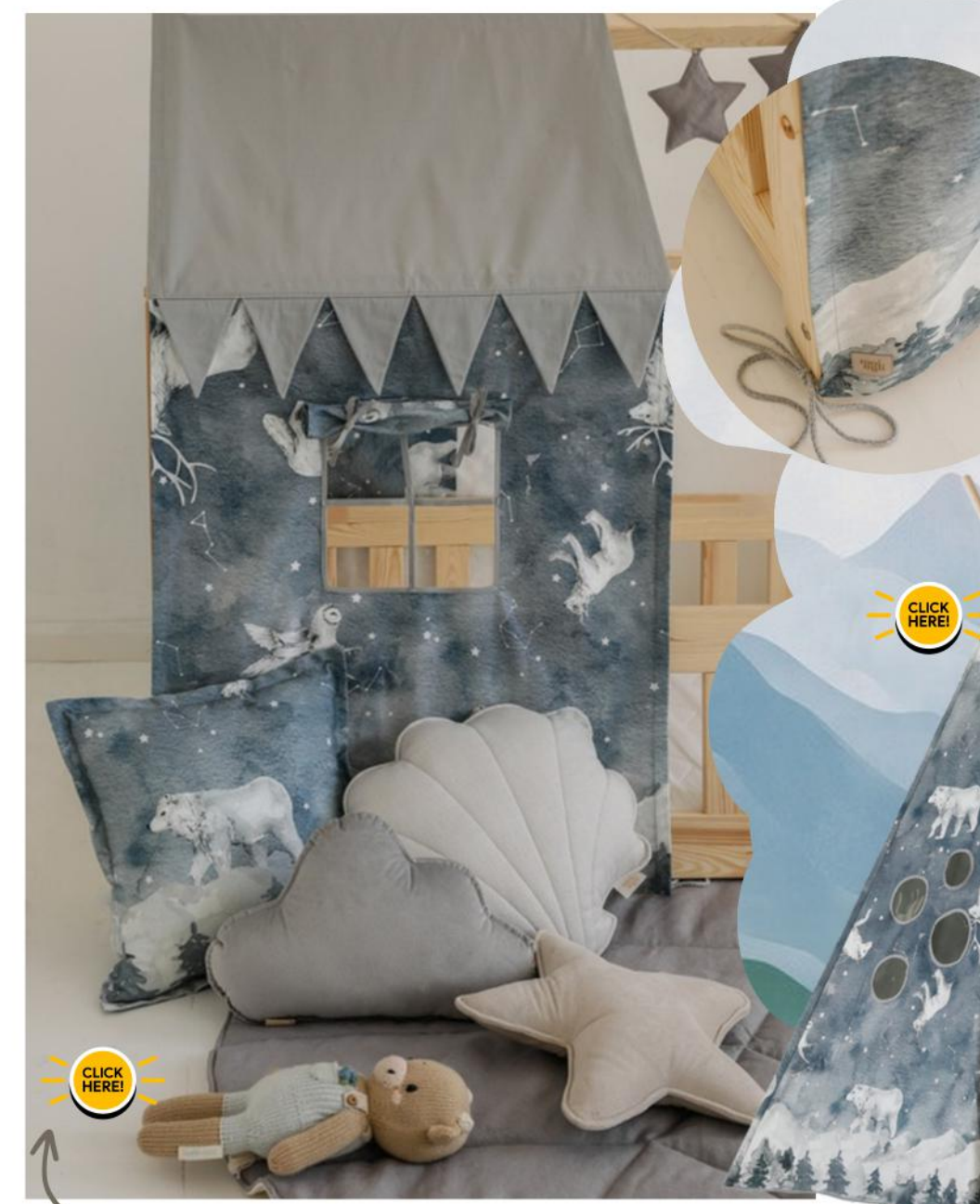

Moodboard Instructions in 5 steps (but only if you're not too busy running the world)

1. Start with the walls

The **mountain wallpaper** is the visual foundation here — bold, but not overwhelming. Choose a wall large enough to carry the scene or use smaller **wall stickers** with a similar theme if your space is limited. Alternatively, you can paint the wall with a similar colour to grey-blue or grey-green tones.



2. Decide the room's purpose

Will this be a bedroom, a playroom, or both? This moodboard supports all functions thanks to flexible elements like the play tent, bed with canopy, and multifunctional cushions.





3. Think about how your child spends time

Whether they're building block towers, flipping through picture books, or launching stuffed animals into space, the layout supports open play, floor-based activity, and relaxation.

4. Add softness and texture

Use shaped cushions, warm blankets, and natural textiles like cotton or linen. A variety of textures helps the space feel cozy and dynamic without overstimulating.

5. Make it theirs

Add a polar star print, a planet mobile, or a nature-themed name garland. A few favourite books or forest animal figurines on a shelf make the space personal and engaging.
