Interactive presentations

Short, curriculum-linked presentations that explore identity, belonging, faith, culture, stereotypes, prejudice, racism and more.

- 60-90-minute sessions
- For small and large groups
- Suitable for primary and secondary students

Presentation topics:

- Migration Stories
- Overcoming Stereotypes
- Challenging Prejudice
- Studies of Religion

Student programs


Multi-session / full-day programs

Intensive and highly interactive small group programs that support students to build confidence, develop empathy and respectfully navigate diversity.

- 4-6 x one-hour sessions
- Ideally 12-15 students, can be run with more
- Suitable for Years 6-12

Program topics:

- Deconstructing Racism & Prejudice
- Strengthening Identity & Inclusion
- Our Country
- Intercultural/Interfaith Dialogue
- Student Ambassadors

Interschool programs

Students from different cultural and/or religious backgrounds come together to explore similarities and differences through discovery learning.

- Annually, bi-annually, or once a term
- For students from 2-3 different schools

Presentation topics:

- Intercultural Friendship
- Significant Places
- Interfaith Connections
- Community Service

Distance / blended programs

Blended sessions which use a combination of online, video-conference, and classroom activities.

- 3 hours (morning or afternoon session)
- Single school or interschool

- 1-hour, 2-hour or half-day workshop
- Face-to-face or interactive webinar
- Linked to Australian Professional Standards for Teachers
