As we look ahead to the future, we are delighted to share more information about the planned merger of Learning Partners Academy Trust, Learning Partners Church Academy Trust and Enlighten Learning Trust, which is currently progressing towards a formal merger date of 1 January 2027. School leaders from across all three trusts continue to be actively involved throughout the process to help shape our shared future and staff in all 3 trusts have already started to work closely together to align systems, processes and procedures.

Building a Stronger, More Resilient Trust

The merger represents an exciting opportunity to bring together the strengths, expertise and experience of three successful trusts. By working as one organisation, we will be better equipped to respond to future changes in the education landscape, ensuring a more resilient and sustainable trust that can continue delivering the very best outcomes for our children and young people.

Most importantly, this partnership is about being stronger together. By sharing knowledge, resources and best practice across a larger family of schools, we can enhance the support available to staff, strengthen leadership capacity and create even greater opportunities for pupils.

A Home for Church and Community Schools

A helpful way to think about the future trust is to look back at how schools worked together before the academy system existed. In Guildford and the surrounding areas, church and community schools have long worked side by side, united by a shared commitment to serving their local communities while maintaining their own distinctive identities.



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That spirit remains at the heart of the merger, and the new trust will proudly be a home for both church and community schools. The trusts are proposing to join together through a Department for Education-approved process known as equity articles. This approach enables church and community schools to work together within a strong partnership that protects the Christian distinctiveness of church schools while equally respecting the unique values and character of community schools.

Preserving What Makes Each School Unique

While we are joining together as one trust, schools will continue to retain their individual identities and strengths. The merger will not change the role of local governing bodies, nor will it diminish the unique character, traditions and community relationships that make each school special.

Instead, the aim is to provide a stronger framework of support while allowing schools to continue flourishing within their own communities.

Our Shared Values

Work is currently underway to harmonise the values of the three trusts. This is not about changing who we are; rather, it is about bringing together the best of our existing cultures and creating a shared set of values that reflects our collective vision and purpose.
