Hope Haemodialysis Society is an NGO initially set up by Canning Garden Methodist Church in 2002. We provide affordable, high-quality hemodialysis treatment to low income individuals of any race or religion suffering from End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD). Our patients come from around the community, including some patients from further away.

We assist patients by helping them find and apply for dialysis subsidies.

Besides providing dialysis, the Centre helps our patients and their families lead more comfortable lives.

Capacity and Staff

With our team of qualified renal nurses, and dialysis assistants, the Centre has capacity to treat 43 patients, with dedicated chairs to treat patients with Hepatitis B and Hepatitis C.

We also have volunteer doctors from Canning Garden Methodist Church who come to the Centre to see patients, including a consultant nephrologist.

There is ample free parking space.

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At the Hope Haemodialysis Centre, an Indian lady in her 50s sits comfortably in her chair, receiving treatment. Her brother, faithfully waits outside for her to finish treatment and drive her home. A home-cooked meal prepared by her mother-in-law awaits her - a small comfort in her otherwise challenging life. She has accepted her condition with grace and found happiness in the small moments.

Jack wakes up feeling the familiar fatigue that has become a part of his daily life. Despite this, he manages to keep his pest-control business afloat, a testament to his resilience. On weekends, he makes his way to church, or goes cycling in the countryside around his home. He has found peace in the knowledge that God is in control, and feels a sense of community.

A young Grab driver in his early 30s struggles to keep up with his demanding schedule. Dialysis leaves him exhausted, and the long hours on the road make it increasingly difficult. He often wonders if he will ever find someone who can understand his life and accept him as he is. The weight of his condition feels heavier each day.

OVERCOMING CHALLENGES

I am Hari Moganaraj, 52, from Taman Rishah, Ipoh. In 2009, I lost one leg in an accident, which drastically changed my life. Despite my suffering, I continued to work, trying to maintain some normalcy.

Eventually, my kidneys failed, and I needed dialysis treatment. The General Hospital couldn't accommodate me, so I had to seek treatment at a private hospital, costing RM200 per session. I relied on friends and family for financial help, feeling like a burden.

During one difficult period, I was bedridden at the General Hospital for 3 months due to a failed AV fistula, my weight dropping to 30 kg. I was so weak that I needed assistance just to get up. This was a turning point for me.

Daisy introduced me to Hope Haemodialysis, and a friend helped me apply for a SOCSO dialysis subsidy. The Centre has been a tremendous support.

At one point, feeling utterly disheartened, I stopped dialysis for 3 days and stayed at home with no one to help me. Doctors from Hope Haemodialysis Centre, along with Pastor Andrew Tan and friends from Canning Garden Methodist Church, came to my aid, arranging for ambulance transport so I could continue receiving treatment.

Now, when I arrive at the Centre on my wheelchair motorcycle sidecar, Mr. Lee greets me and skillfully lifts me into the wheelchair for treatment. He waits outside to ensure I am safely seated on my motorbike when I am done.

Shockingly, more than three-quarters (93%) of Malaysian households with dialysis patients belong to the B40 income bracket, representing the lowest 40% of income earners. The financial burden is crushing, with many families struggling to cover the out-of-pocket costs associated with treatment.

The situation is especially dire for B40 patients, with 45% of them unemployed and many relying on semi-funded or self-funded options. The treatment prospect of maintaining employment while undergoing treatment is daunting challenge. а Employers often lack understanding of kidney disease, leading to concerns about productivity and the costs of health benefits.

For Jack, the Indian lady, Hari and the young driver, the Hope Haemodialysis Centre is a lifeline. It provides them with the care they need to continue living their lives, however challenging. But the Centre relies heavily on donations to continue its vital work.


