CLUBS AND LEAGUES

Cricket Clubs form the core of the recreational game in Surrey, serving well over 25,000 people of all ages, genders and backgrounds across the county.

Clubs play a vital role in supporting participation growth in the sport and we have a dedicated team whose role is to support clubs of all sizes to develop and grow. This includes delivering the best possible junior competition structure via the Surrey Junior Cricket Championship, working to support the creation of the Surrey Cricket Championship (which will see the transformation of our adult leagues in Surrey) and providing day to day support to clubs across a myriad of areas such as funding, training, facility development, disability provision and more.

Our team is here to support the club network to play its part in creating the most inclusive team sport in the country and we are continuing to see fantastic progress towards this every year.

The Surrey Junior Cricket Championship continues to reign as the largest junior cricket league in the country, providing unparalleled opportunities for young cricketers across Surrey. The 2024 season saw an impressive 18,660 participants engage in over 6,000 matches completed, demonstrating the league's significant impact on youth cricket development.

The SJCC caters to all skill levels, offering a pathway from introductory softball cricket for beginners all the way up to highly competitive matches for older age groups. This inclusive structure ensures that every young player, regardless of experience, has the chance to participate and enjoy the sport.



CASE STUDY: PIRBRIGHT CC



Pirbright CC has emerged as a shining example of how a community-driven approach can revitalise a cricket club. With dedicated volunteer effort and crucial support from the Surrey Cricket Foundation, the club has experienced remarkable growth, expanding from just 26 members in 2019 to nearly 300 today. This upsurge includes the establishment of thriving adult, junior, women and girls, and walking cricket sections, whilst also supporting disability cricket, making the club a truly inclusive hub within the village of Pirbright.



The club's remarkable growth and development has been significantly supported by over £17,000 in funding from both the Surrey Cricket Foundation and the ECB. This investment has enabled the club to strengthen its coaching, improve its facilities, and enhance its playing surfaces to accommodate its burgeoning membership. An initial grant helped train parent coaches, empowering them to organically grow the junior section and fostering a strong sense of community ownership. This led to increased junior participation and a subsequent rise in adult membership. Further funding was then provided to furnish the club's brand new pavilion, creating a welcoming and inclusive environment for all members.

A MODEL FOR GRASSROOTS GROWTH

This pavilion was built in a partnership arrangement with the Parish, which leveraged £300,000 in funding through Your Fund Surrey, demonstrating the club's ability to forge strong local partnerships.

The club's growth has been further enhanced by the their success in securing a number of shirt sponsorships, demonstrating the increasing interest and support from local businesses. These partnerships include sponsors for the youth teams, midweek team, women's teams, Saturday and Sunday teams, walking cricket, and even the coaches, providing valuable financial contributions and strengthening community ties.

Pirbright CC exemplifies the power of community-driven initiatives and strategic partnerships. Through the dedication of volunteers, effective utilisation of resources, and crucial support from the Surrey Cricket Foundation, the club has transformed into a thriving hub for the village of Pirbright. This remarkable growth, encompassing diverse sections and prioritising inclusivity, demonstrates a commitment to providing opportunities for all members of the community and ensures a strong foundation for continued success in the years to come.

State School Cricket initiatives have expanded, ensuring that cricket is available to a wider range of young people, regardless of their background.

We also offer a completely free pathway, enabling even more children to experience the sport. This includes programmes like All Stars and Dynamos Cricket, which provide fun and engaging introductions to the game for younger children.

We continue to invest in Disability Cricket, offering programmes tailored to the specific needs of players with disabilities. These initiatives encompass various formats and levels, ensuring that everyone can access and enjoy cricket.

EMPOWERING SCHOOLS, INSPIRING YOUNG CRICKETERS

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE



At the Surrey Cricket Foundation, we strive to ignite a lifelong passion for cricket in young people. In 2024, we delivered in-school coaching to over 23,000 primary school children, many of whom experienced cricket for the first time. Our coaches work closely with teachers to build sustainable cricketing cultures within schools. We also organise numerous primary school competitions, attracting over 400 teams and providing a pathway for children to progress to club cricket or ECB's All Stars and Dynamos programmes. Our secondary school programme offers competitive opportunities and exposure to professional cricket through the annual schools day at The Kia Oval.

WOMEN AND GIRLS

EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION OF FEMALE CRICKETERS

The Women and Girls game continues to grow significantly across Surrey, with an increase in both the number of clubs offering Women and Girls cricket and the number of teams offered by those clubs. This growth is supported by a growing league structure for women's cricket, offering both hardball and softball options at every level from beginners through to the Premier Division.

The SJCC offers girls-only divisions at every age group from U8 through to U17, and we run softball festivals to complement the leagues and offer more opportunities to play.

Our work in secondary schools has been targeted on places that don't already offer

cricket and we provided each of these schools with their own kitbag so they can continue running cricket sessions in the future.

We are increasingly focused on linking schools and clubs together to provide further playing opportunities for these girls, as well as running girls-only festivals to bridge the gap in competitive opportunities provided to girls in school settings.

We continue to run women-specific coaching and officiating courses to upskill the female volunteers in our network and further support the growth of Women and Girls cricket across Surrey and consolidate our position as one of the leading counties in the area.

CASE STUDY: SCF'S FREE PATHWAY TO SUCCESS

BREAKING DOWN BARRIERS, OPENING UP THE GAME

Our aim is to create a financially accessible pathway for all aspiring cricketers. To ensure that finance is never a barrier to participation, we have developed a completely free pathway for junior players.

By removing financial barriers, we've made cricket more accessible to ethnically diverse communities, people with disabilities, and those from lower socio-economic groups. The free pathway has significantly increased the number of young people engaging with cricket, fostering a love for the sport from a young age. The recent introduction of MCC Foundation Hubs will provide high-quality coaching and opportunities for talented young players to develop their skills and potentially progress to elite levels.

These free to access initiatives are bringing cricket to the heart of local communities, inspiring the next generation and promoting physical activity and social interaction. This aligns with our strategic priorities by increasing accessibility, engagement, and participation for diverse groups, providing opportunities for the next generation to start their cricket journey, and fulfilling our commitment to being a good neighbour and benefiting our communities. By offering a clear and affordable pathway, we are breaking down barriers and ensuring that cricket is a sport for all.



In partnership with our disability cricket sponsors, First Sentier Investors, and with support from departments across The Kia Oval, we continued to empower young people aged between 15 and 18 years old from our Lord's Taverners Super 1s hubs through our impactful Employability Programme.

Through workshops covering essential employability skills such as CV writing and interview preparation, culminating in valuable mock interview sessions, participants gained invaluable skills and a significant increase in confidence.

Building upon these foundational skills, participants then embarked on invaluable

work experience placements across various departments at The Kia Oval. Their newfound confidence was evident, empowering them to approach their placements with a positive and proactive attitude. This hands-on experience provided them with a valuable insight into the world of work, allowing them to apply their newly acquired skills in a real-world setting.

The Employability Programme continues to be a cornerstone of the Foundation's commitment to creating positive social impact. By providing young people with the tools and opportunities to succeed, we are not only enhancing their employability but also empowering them to reach their full potential.

MORE THAN CRICKET: BUILDING STRONGER COMMUNITIES

We recognise that access to cricket can be limited for many young people, and we simply don't think that should be the case. Building on the success of the 2023 Dynamos Intros pilot programme, generously supported by Sky, we worked strategically to expand the programme in 2024. We prioritised accessibility and inclusivity across south London with the core aim of providing opportunities for children who may not otherwise experience the game.

A key element of this expansion was the cultivation of existing and the establishment of new partnerships with schools, community groups, mosques, youth clubs, and local councils. These collaborations are essential for the programme's long-term sustainability and its reach within the community. To maximise participation, sessions were delivered in a variety of accessible locations, including lunchtime and after-school clubs in schools, local parks, and community halls. In 2024, we also made a big push for inclusivity, creating specific sessions for girls and children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), making sure as many children as possible were given the opportunity to play.

To further encourage engagement and participation, match-day gifts and prizes were provided, and a Dynamos School Leagues was introduced to offer a structured pathway to competitive play. These initiatives worked to foster community buy-in and support, maximising the programme's positive impact across south London. Without targeted programmes like Dynamos Intros, many young people in these communities would be missed out on the valuable opportunities and benefits that cricket provides.





CASE STUDY: JACOB'S STORY

CRICKET FOR ALL, MORE THAN JUST A GAME

Cricket has become a life-changing force for 12-year-old Jacob, who was born with Spina Bifida. It's ignited a newfound confidence and opened doors he never thought possible. While Jacob's passion for sport has always been strong, his mobility challenges made organised cricket seem out of reach. He enjoyed backyard games with his brothers, but the chance to train, play, and truly belong to a team felt like a distant dream.

That dream became a reality thanks to a chance encounter with former England captain, Andrew Strauss, who introduced Jacob to the Lord's Taverners Super 1s Disability Cricket Programme. From his very first session with the Valley End Rascals, Jacob found a sense of belonging he hadn't experienced before. He was finally part of something bigger, surrounded by other young people who shared his love for the game.

The support Jacob receives from the coaches at Valley End, supported by the Foundation, has been invaluable.

He now trains regularly, participates in matches against other Super 1s teams across Surrey, Hampshire, and Berkshire, and has even had the incredible opportunity to meet and train with professional cricketers like Nathan Lyon, Ben Foakes, Chris Jordan, Kemar Roach, Dan Worrall, and Sam Billings.

Cricket has become so much more than just a sport for Jacob. He avidly watches matches on TV and enjoys attending live games as a Surrey Pride of Lions member. His passion was even evident in his end-of-year school review, where he proudly declared his ambition to play for the England Disability Cricket Team. With the continued support of his coaches, the Surrey Cricket Foundation, and the Lord's Taverners, Jacob's dream of representing his country on the cricket field is within reach. Super 1s has not only provided Jacob with an opportunity to play the sport he loves, but it has also fostered his confidence, built his community, and given him a pathway to achieve his full potential.



FUNDRAISING

FUNDING THE FUTURE OF THE GAME

Fundraising efforts played a crucial role in enabling us to achieve our ambitious goals in 2024.

Key highlights included the success of our second annual Six Nations with Surrey event, featuring rugby legends Toby Flood, Jamie Roberts, and host Chris Hollins.

The Bedser Lunch, our longest-running fundraising event, raised over £20,000 with insightful commentary from Kumar Sangakkara, Nick Knight, and host Dan Norcross. We also celebrated a significant milestone with the 50th Surrey Cricket Foundation Patron, underscoring the growing support for our mission.

Matchday fundraising initiatives, including raffles, silent auctions, and charitable cup sales across all bars, generated substantial revenue. These efforts enabled us to partner with and support eight additional local and cricket-based charities. Charity cup sales alone raised over £45,000, with over £20,000 directly benefiting our chosen charities.
