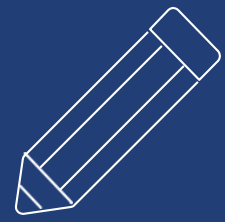

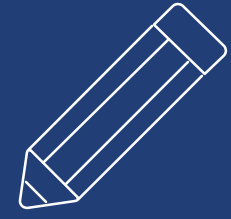

- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY **33** FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS DECREASED BY **56** FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY **89** FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- INDIVIDUALS WHO FILED FOR UNEMPLOYMENT INCREASED BY **788** FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

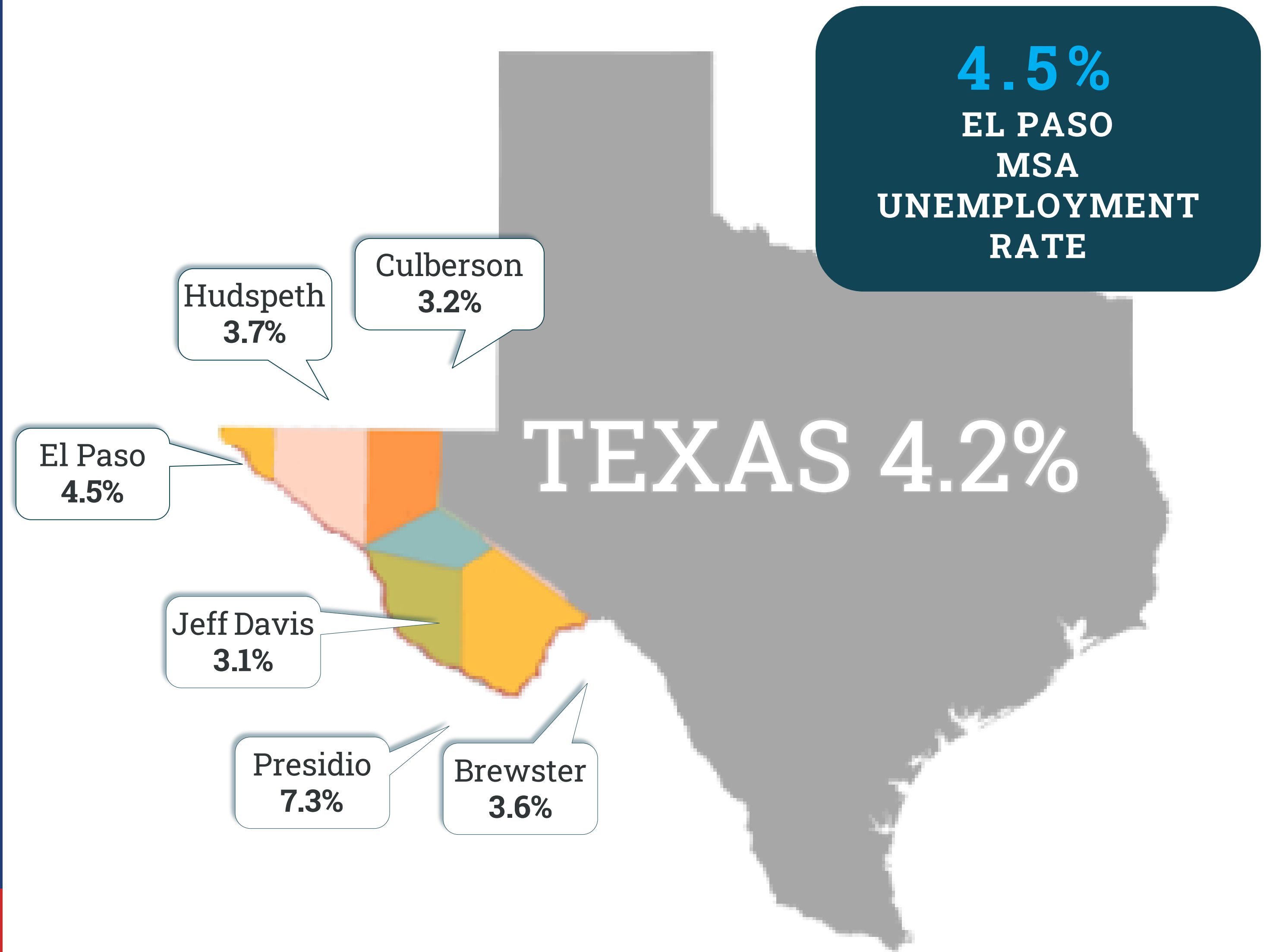

These three Super Sectors represented **57%** of the total nonfarm employment.

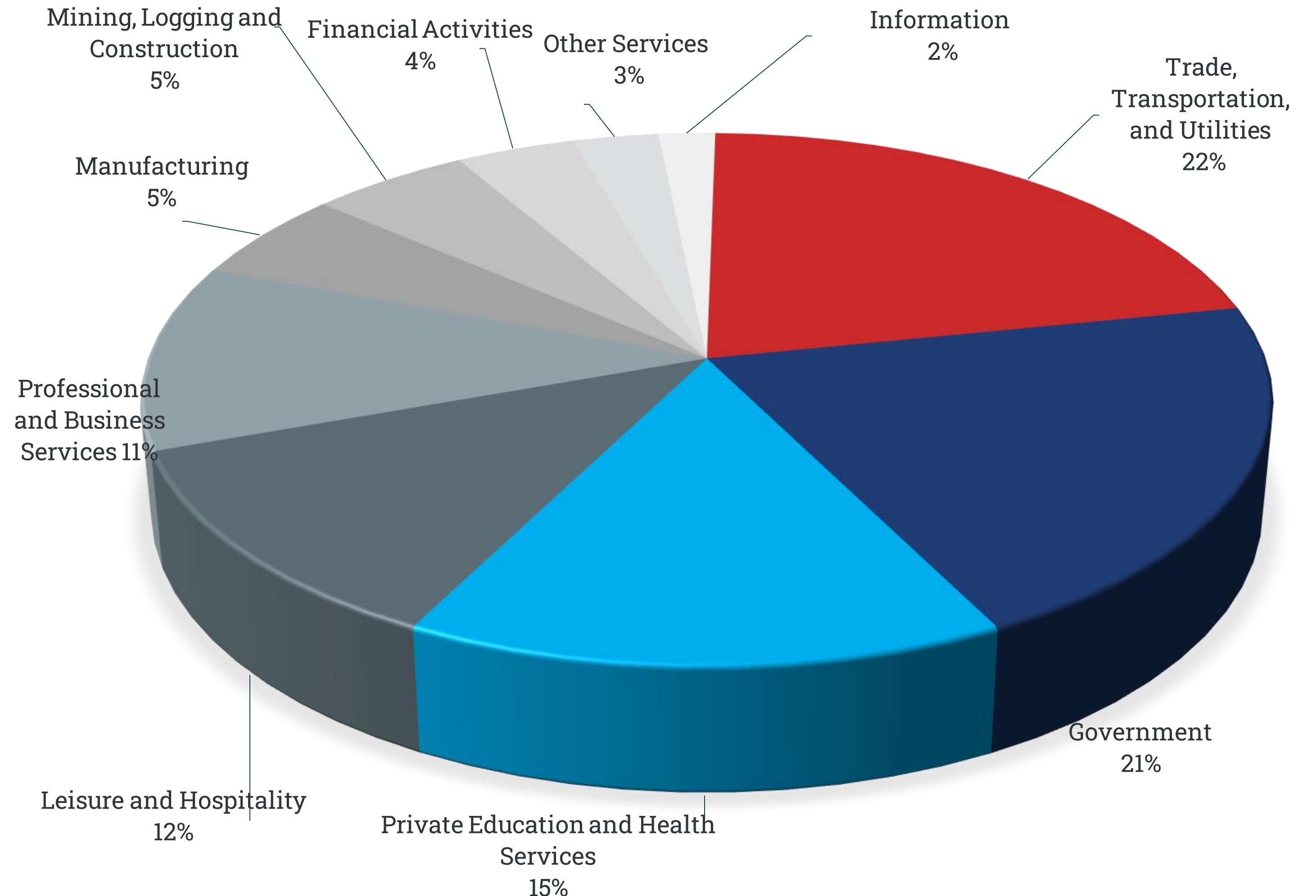
The three Super Sectors with the least employment for the El Paso MSA in June 2023 were:

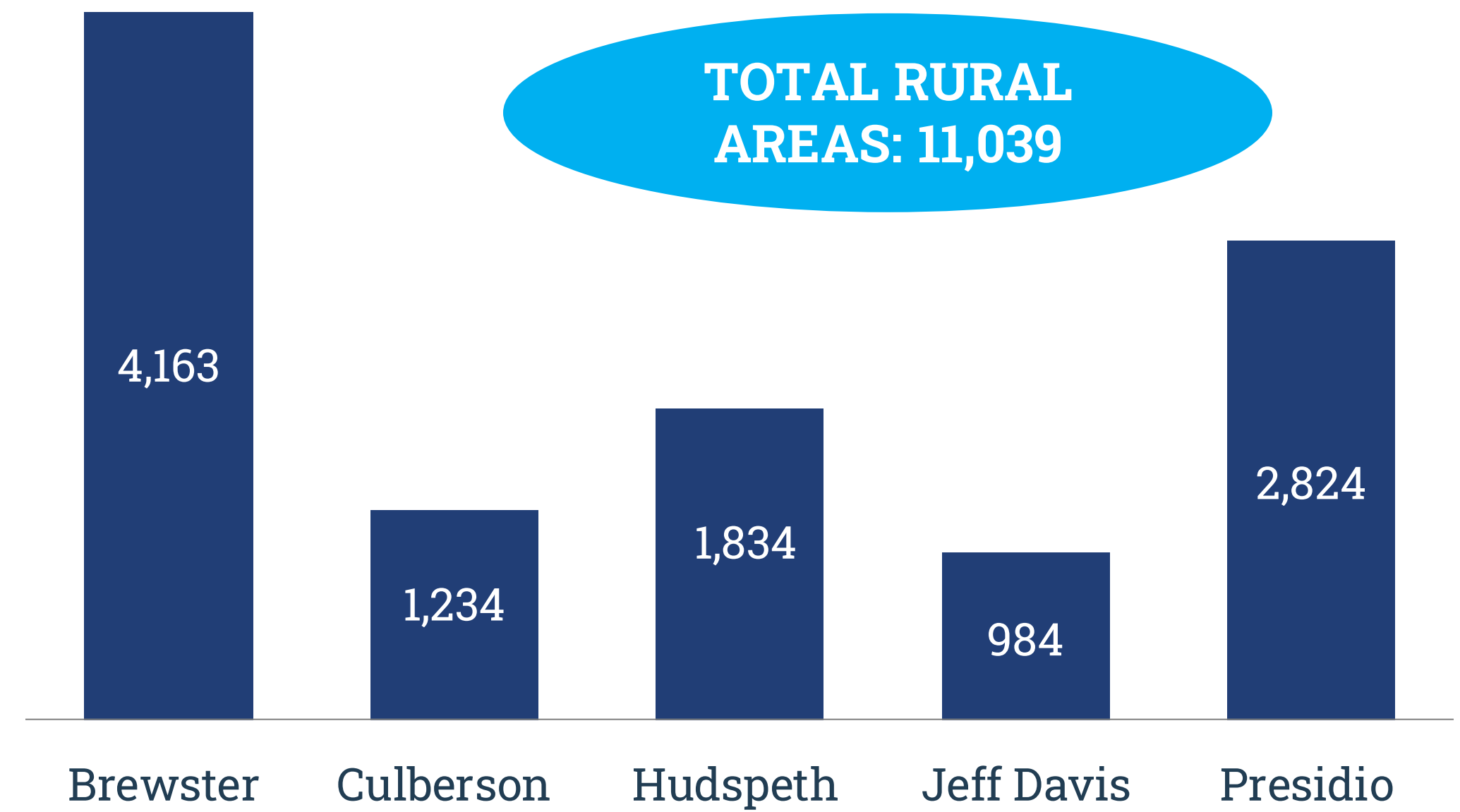

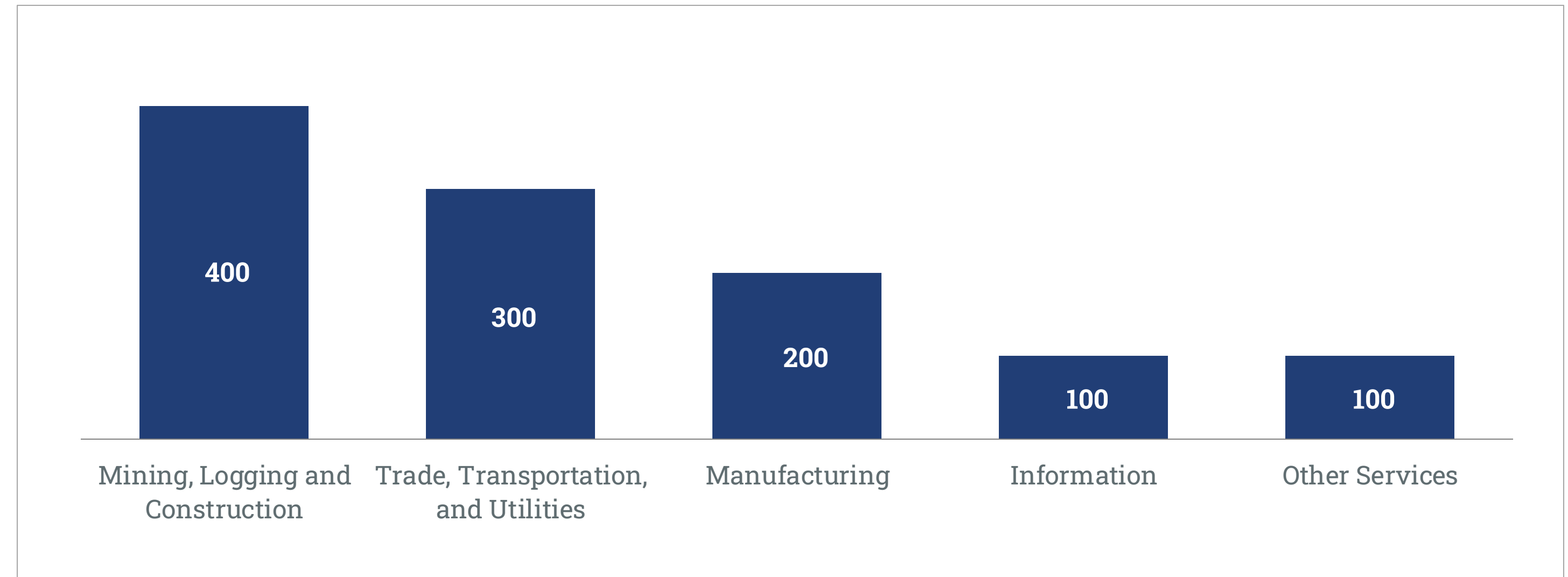

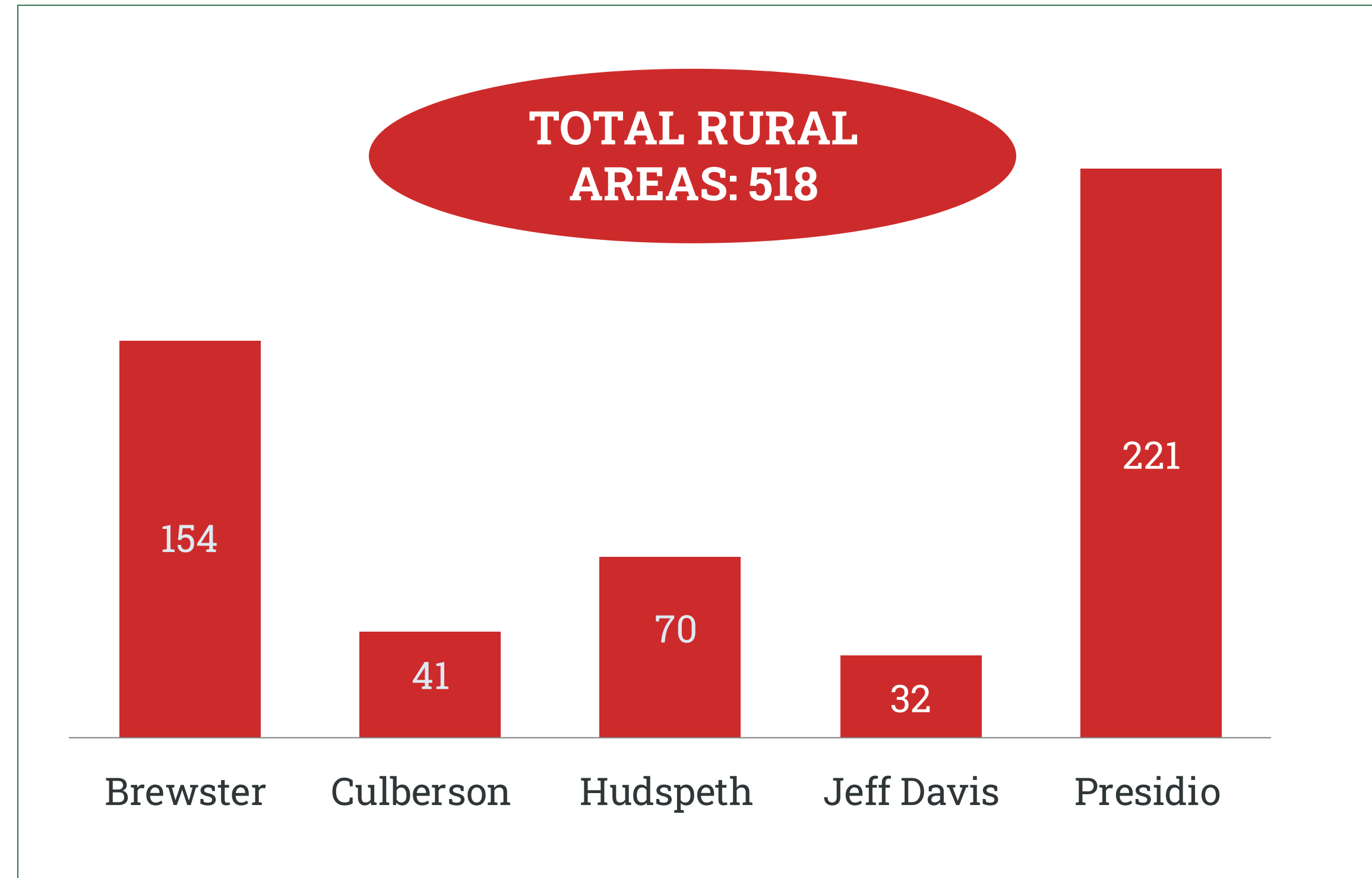

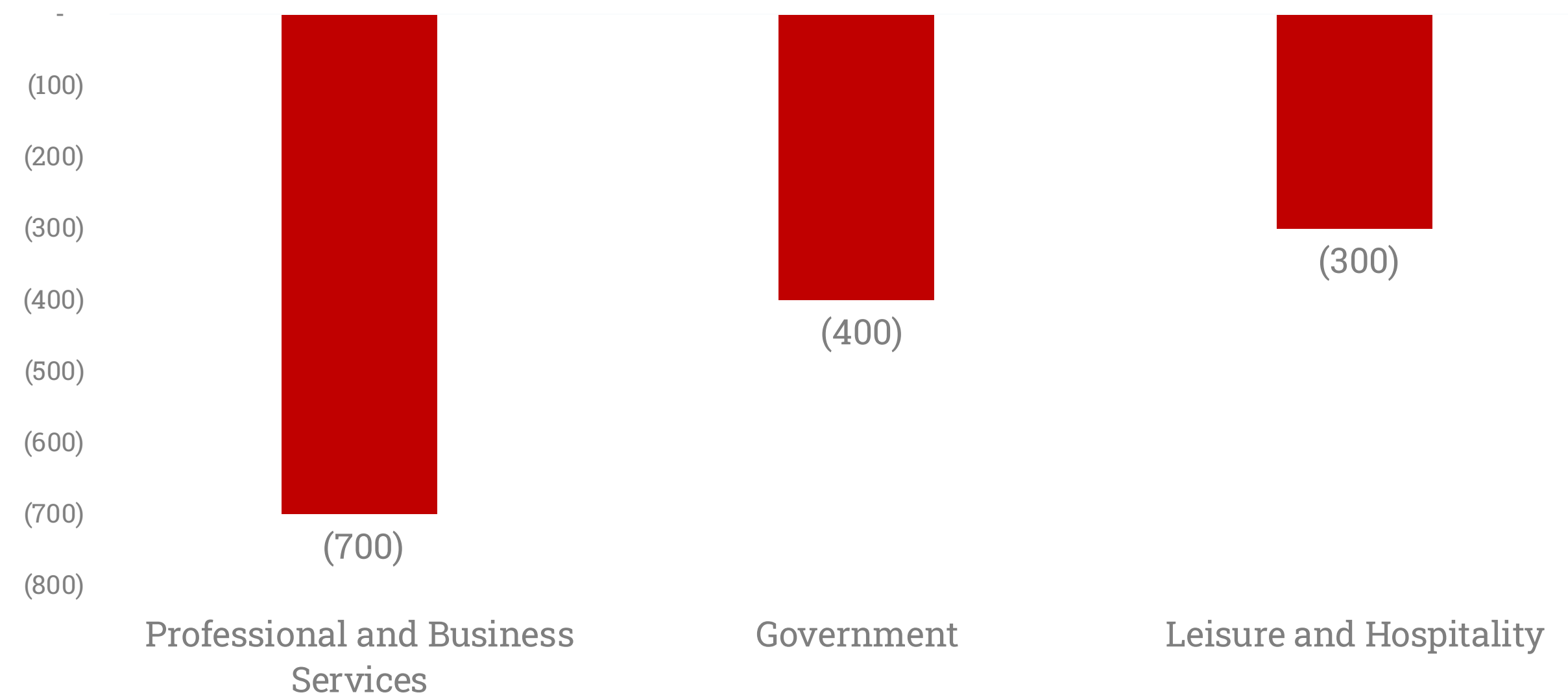

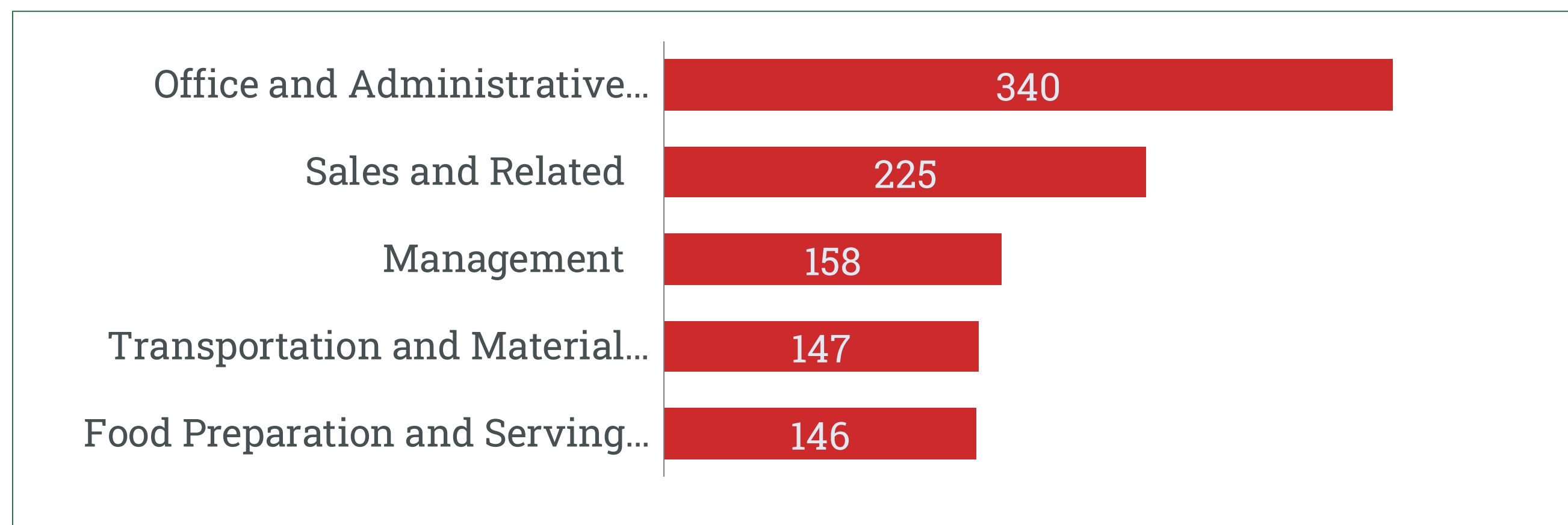

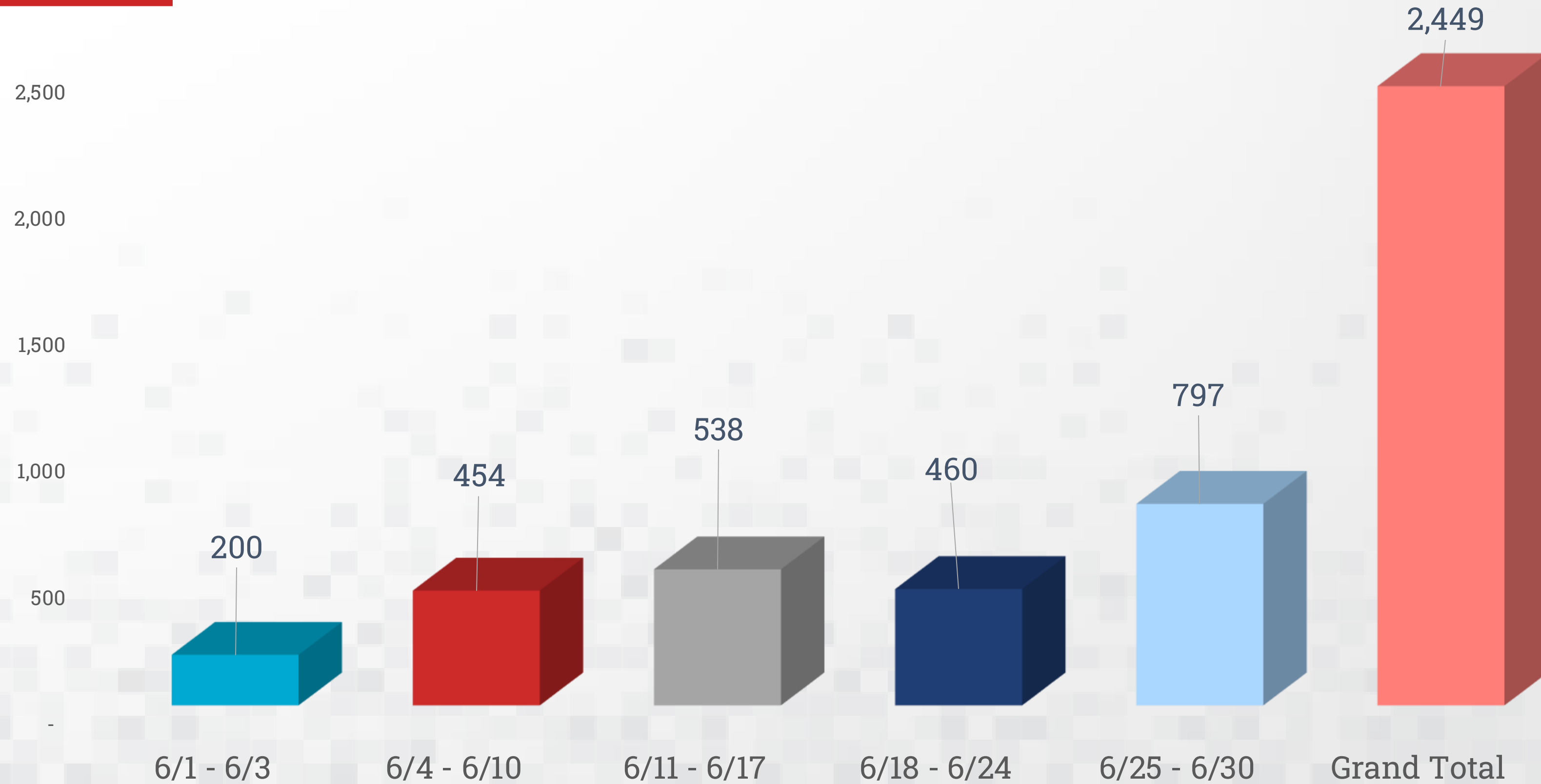

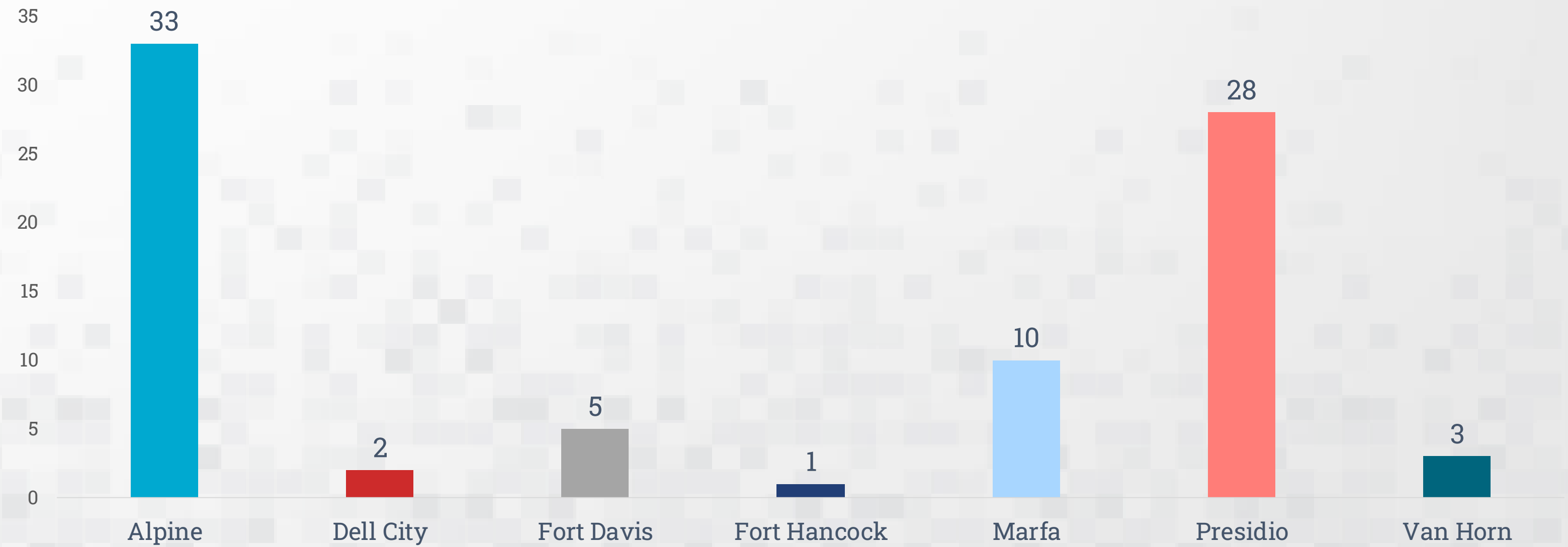

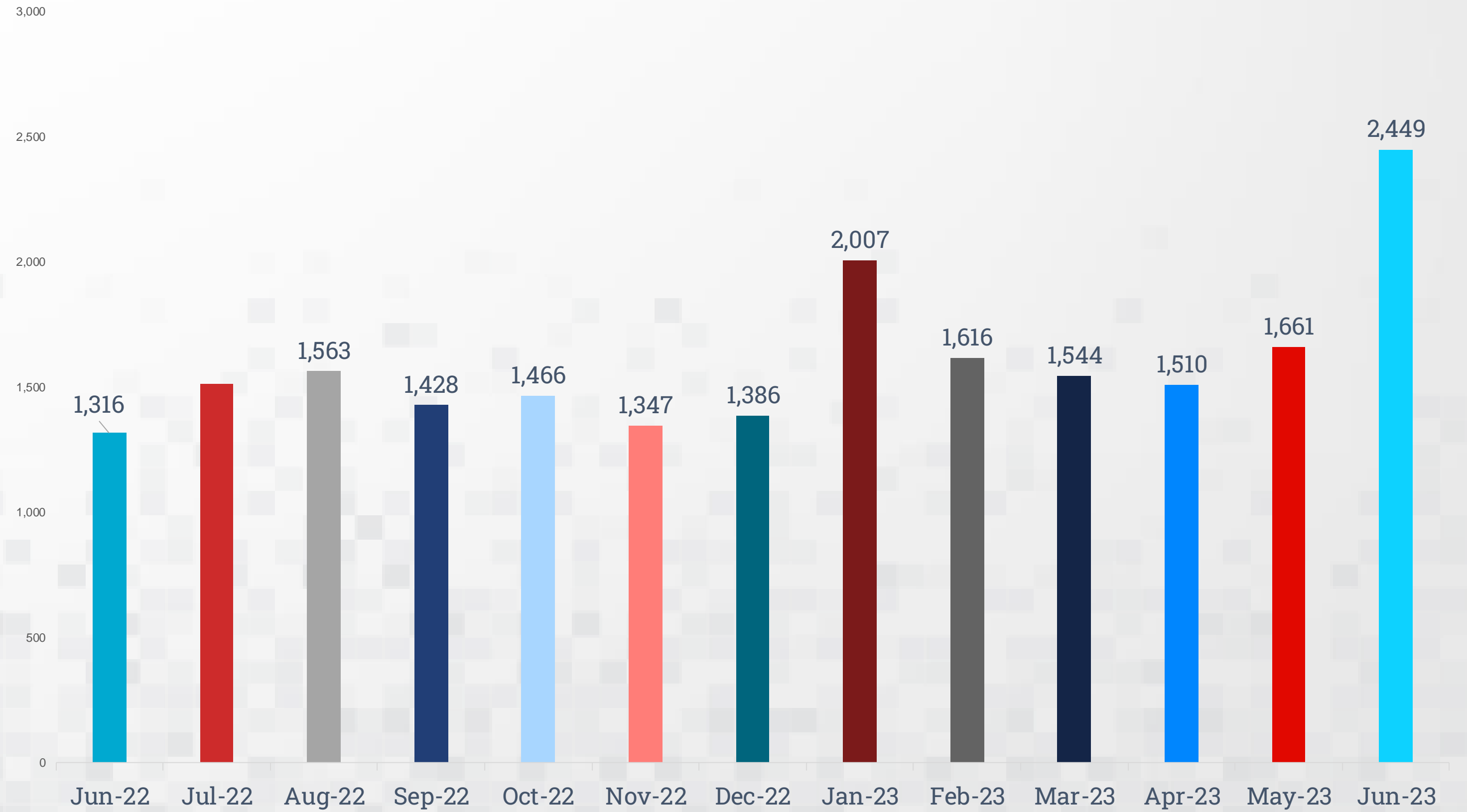

UI CLAIMANTS BY MONTH

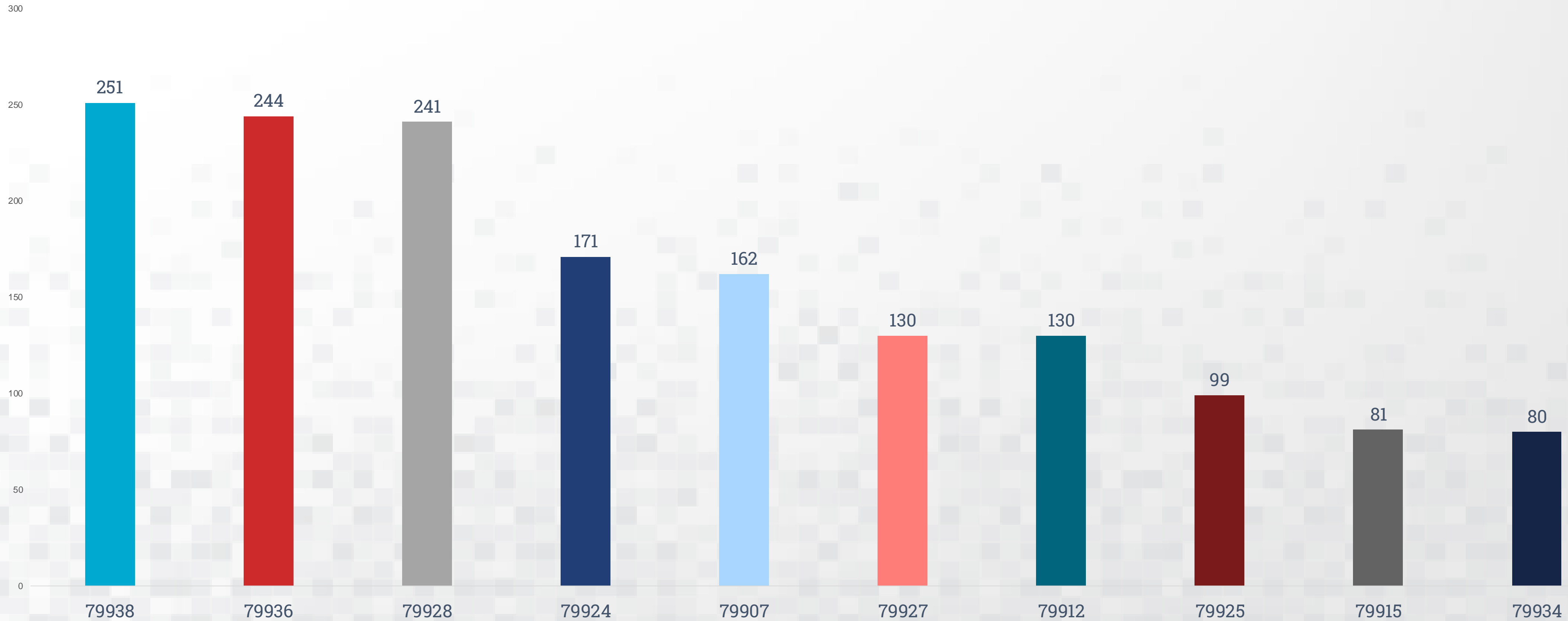

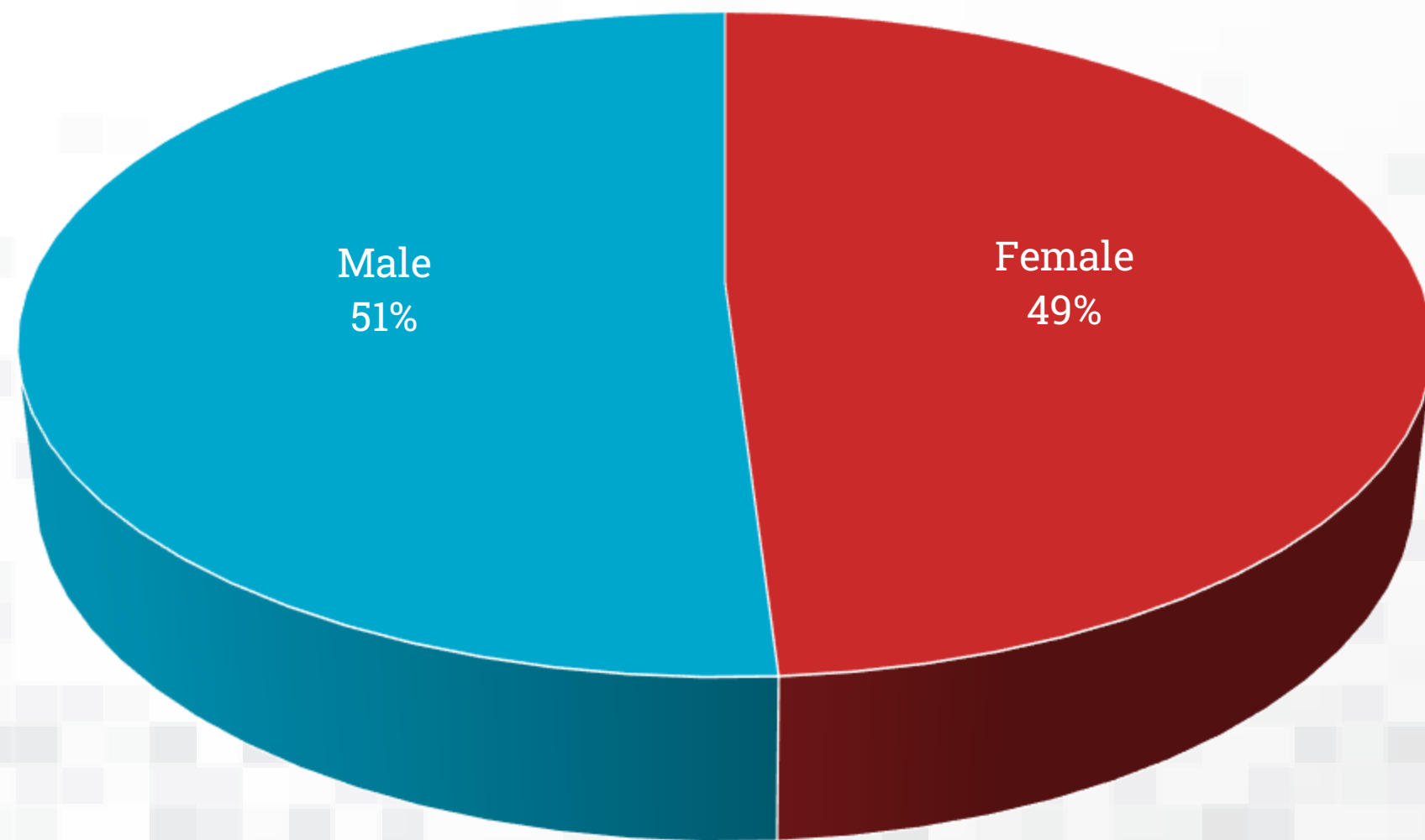


UI CLAIMANTS DEMOGRAPHICS – BORDERPLEX REGION

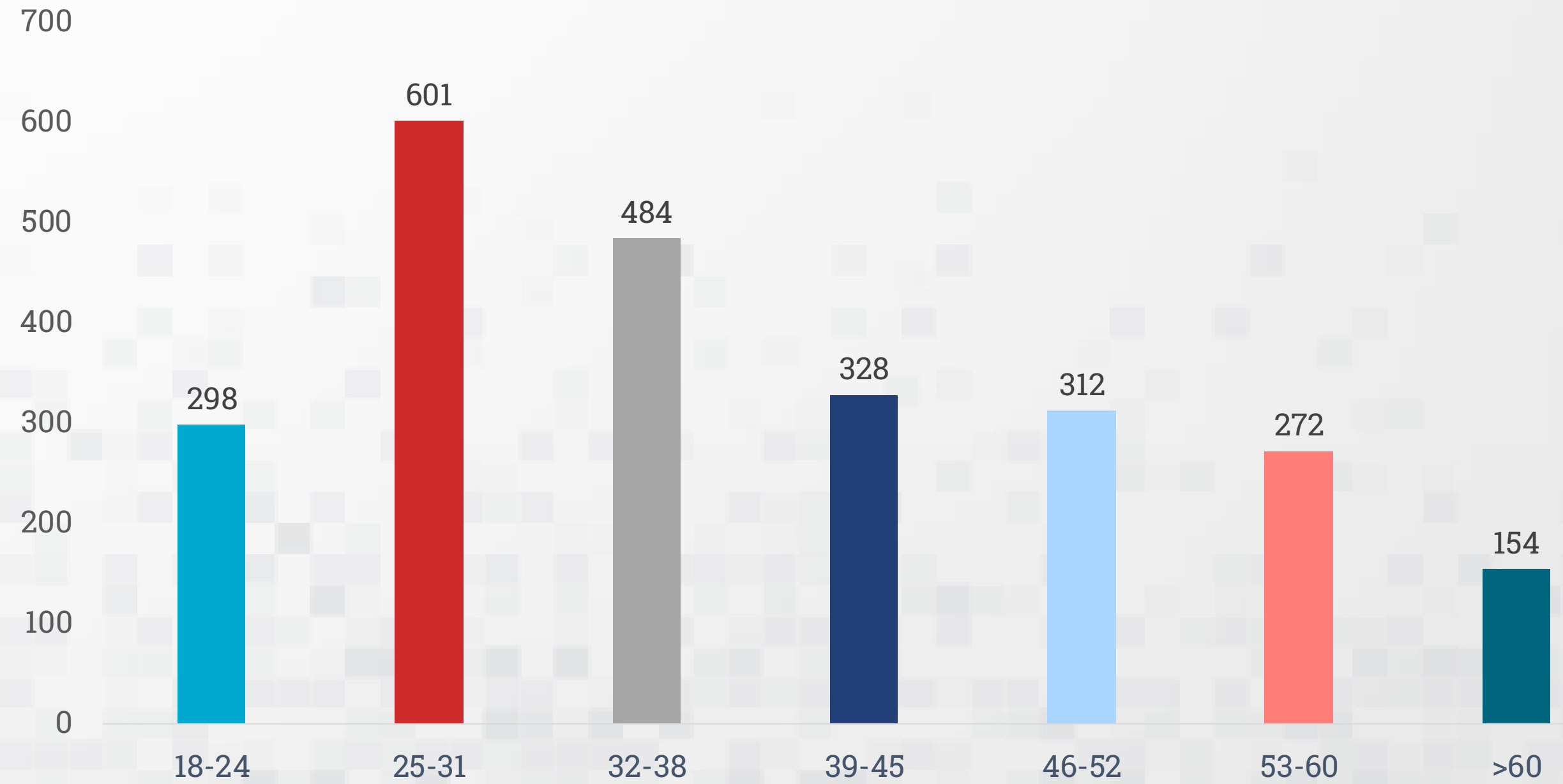

Gender



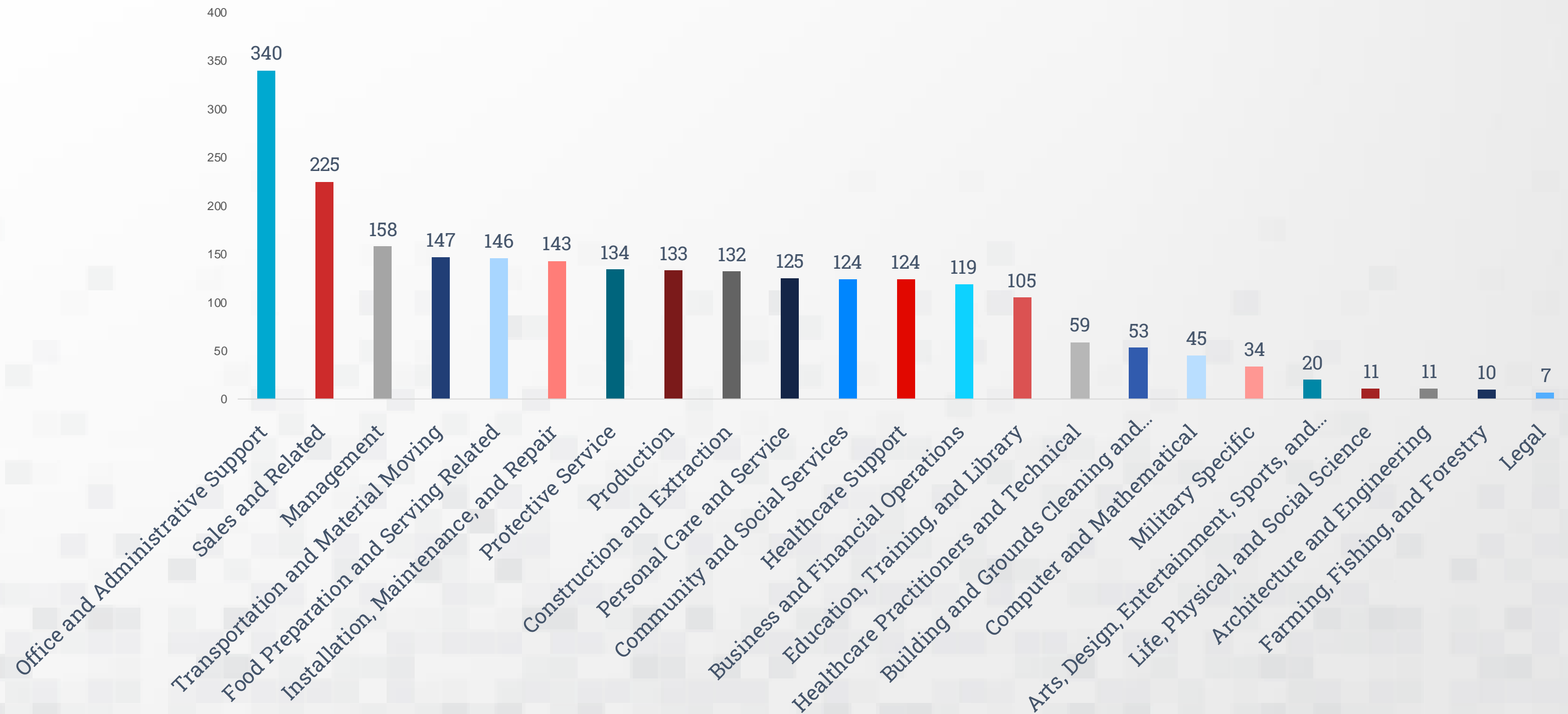
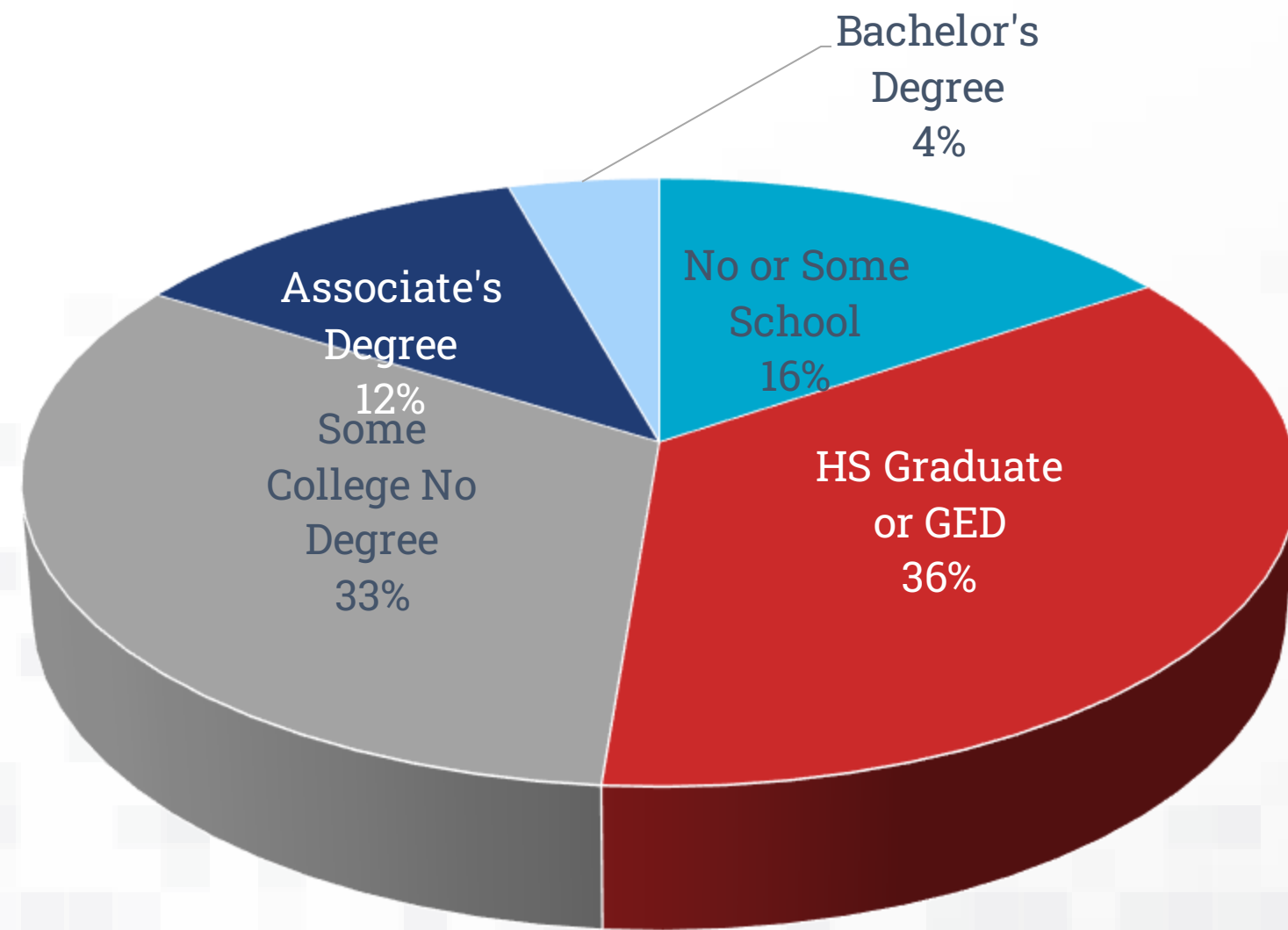

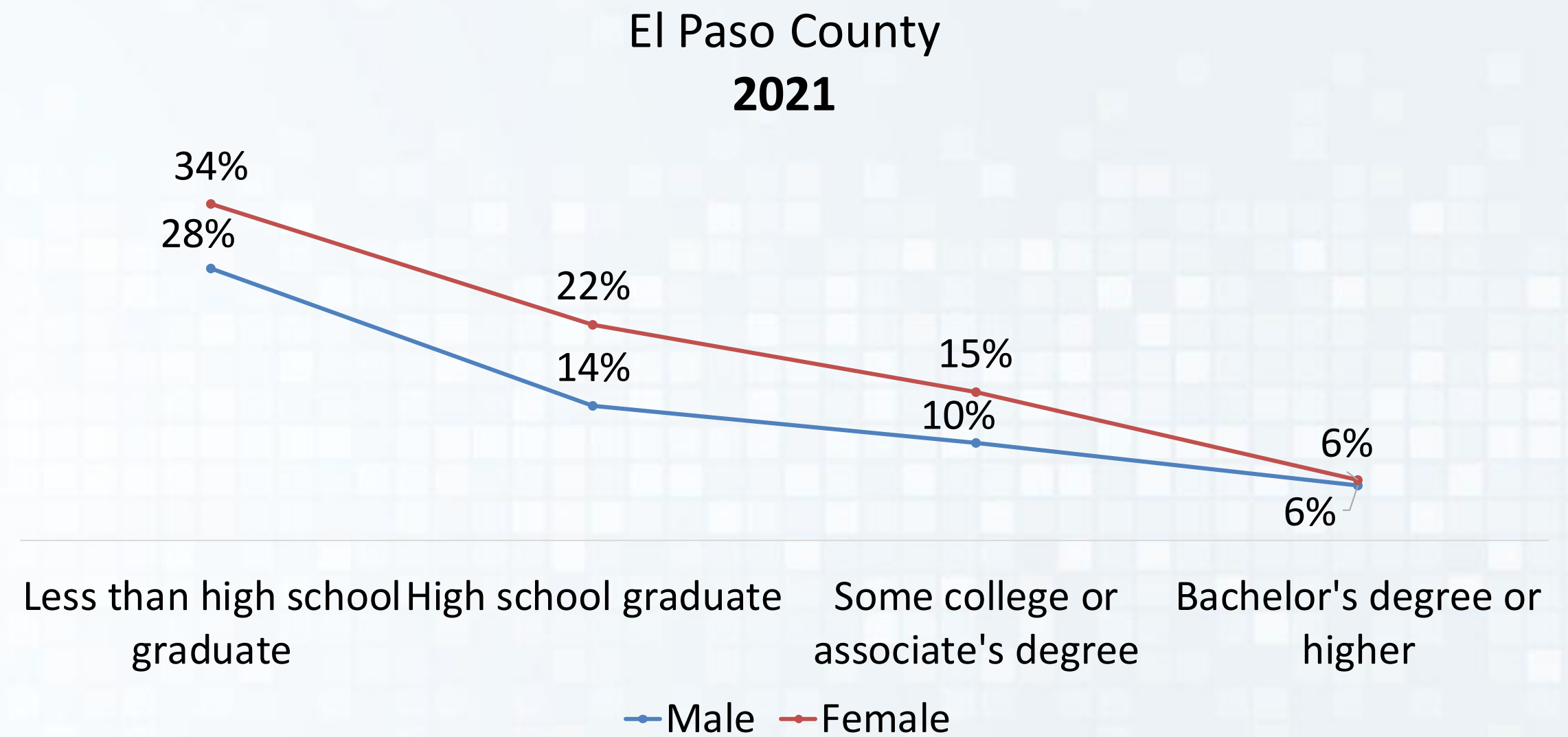
