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SEINE-ET-MARNE HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY

The traces of the first inhabitants of the Seine-et-Marne date back to prehistory. Subsequently, the Sénons, a Gallic tribe, occupied the area before the arrival of the Romans, who built roads still visible today.

The Middle Ages then saw the rise of the seigneuries and the construction of castles like Blandy-les-Tours, then the Renaissance brought architectural elegance with the castles of Fontainebleau and Vaux-le-Vicomte.

The arms of the Seine-et-Marne are thus blasonnent: "of azure sown with flowers of gold lily, with two fasces wavy of silver".



The department is the largest in the Île-de-France region, covering an area of approximately 5,915 km².

The department has a great diversity of landscapes, its majority being agricultural plains and plateaus, such as Brie and Gâtinais. It is also crossed by several important rivers, including the Seine, the Marne, and the Yonne.

Seine-et-Marne is also home to several important forests and natural areas, such as the Forêt de Fontainebleau and the Forêt de Ferrières.

The department combines extensive rural areas with major urban hubs, and its proximity to Paris makes it an area well served by transport infrastructure,

In summary, the Seine-et-Marne offers a balanced mix of agricultural landscapes, forests, rivers, and urban areas, with a rich natural and cultural history, while being closely linked to the Parisian agglomeration.

Villages: picturesque and original

Between art villages, medieval towns and villages dedicated to leisure, the Seineet-Marne is full of surprises. It's up to you to discover them!

Barbizon: the impressionist village



Follow in the footsteps of pre-Impressionist painting in the village of Barbizon, famous worldwide for having inspired Jean-François Millet's painting, *L'Angélus*.

Located on the edge of the forest of Fontainebleau, the village gained its fame thanks to the landscape painters of the nineteenth century such as Théodore Rousseau, Jean-Baptiste Corot, Charles-François Daubigny and Jean-François Millet.

Considered one of the precursors of Impressionism, the art movement of the Barbizon school flourished from 1830 to 1875, attracting artists who came to seek the tranquility and natural beauty of this peaceful village.

Still today, Barbizon seduces lovers of painting and romanticism.

With its beautiful villas adorned with ivy waterfalls, its bucolic inns, its cobbled and flowery streets, and its atypical chapel, Barbizon ticks all the boxes of the village of character.

Provins: the medieval town

Classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the medieval city of Provins invites you to a real trip to the Middle Ages, animated by visits, historical shows and great events.

In the 12th and 13th centuries, Provins reached its peak thanks to the famous Champagne Fairs. The urban plan was then designed to accommodate many merchants, and the presence of waterways favored economic activity, especially for drapers, parchments and butchers.

The imposing ramparts, real architectural masterpieces of the thirteenth century, are erected to protect the inhabitants and wealth, while affirming the power of the counts.

Provins offers exceptional shows and monuments to discover throughout the year, described below.

Free access, except to visit certain monuments and to do other paid activities.

Cesar Tower

Emblematic monument of the medieval city of Provins, this 12th century keep impresses with its size and shape.

The Cesar Tower served as a watchtower, refuge and prison. The prisoners were locked in narrow turrets and dungeons, often in total darkness. Today, it houses the bells of the collegiate church of Saint-Quiriace.


The Tithe Barn

Thanks to an audio-guided tour, the Tithe Barn of Provins offers an immersive staging of the Champagne Fairs that took place in Provins. You will discover the trades of the Middle Ages practiced in Provins. In the sixteenth century, this place served as a warehouse for tithing, the tax on crops, hence its name.

The Provins and the Provins area Museum

Inside this "Museum of France", you will discover invaluable collections from archaeological excavations carried out in Provins and its surroundings, covering a period ranging from prehistory to the 19th century, through the Renaissance.



The museum houses exceptional remains of the treasure of Saint-Quiriace, but also sculptures, paintings and rare objects.

The Saint-Ayoul Priory

The origins of this architectural ensemble date back to 996, when relics attributed to Saint Ayoul were discovered. The chapel, too small to accommodate the many pilgrims, led Count Thibaut I of Champagne to build, in the middle of the 11th century, a parish church and a priory for the Benedictines of the Order of Saint Benedict.

Sold as a national property at the end of the 18th century, the site hosted a subprefecture, a national gendarmerie, the cavalry, and the army. Since 2003, continuous efforts have been made to rehabilitate and restore this monument, now classified as a Historic Monument.

Underground

It is very likely that these subsurfaces were initially used as a quarry to extract a specific type of fuller's earth for degreasing woollen cloth.

Subsequently, these cavities served as refuges and warehouses during the Champagne Fairs, as well as places for cultural meetings. Ancient inscriptions on the walls also attest to their use by Freemasons.

Moret-sur-Loing: one of the most beautiful detours in France

Medieval town, Moret-sur-Loing is proud of its roots that still structure its architecture today, with its royal square, ramparts and keep of the twelfth century. Although all the ramparts and turrets are no longer present, the gates of Bourgogne and Samois and the urbanism of the city center testify beautifully to its medieval past.

As you stroll through the city, you will discover Renaissance facades, the Maison du sucre d'orge, as well as the house and tomb of Alfred Sisley.

Many tourists come to admire the sites painted by Sisley, some of which are still preserved: the bridge over the Loing, the Notre-Dame church, the keep, and the towpaths.

Enjoy guided tours and let yourself be carried away in the small streets or along the banks. Hiking, canoeing, boat arrival at the port, museums and various festivities await you.

Domains and castles: a rich historical heritage

At the crossroads of architecture and landscape, a perfect harmony emerges around each historical monument of the Seine-et-Marne. Immerse yourself in the unmissable heritage of this department steeped in history!

Castle of Blandy

The visit opens with the presentation of objects from archaeological excavations, revealing the pre-existing populations but also the daily life of the inhabitants of the castle.


The ascent of the Keep (147 steps) offers a magnificent view of the surroundings and continues with the walkway, as close as possible to the six towers. Visit the Auditorium, witness of the banquets of the Middle Ages, and the weapon room of the Tower of the Guards.

Throughout the year, the castle comes alive to the rhythm of many <u>shows and</u> <u>events</u>.

Castle of Fontainebleau

An imposing building mixing classical and Renaissance styles, the Château de Fontainebleau is much more than a witness to Napoleon's imperial adventure. With its 1,500 pieces, it tells a multitude of stories and offers a real immersion in the past.

Immerse yourself in the apartments of eminent figures of the court, such as Marie-Antoinette, Pope Pius VII, Madame de Maintenon, Napoleon I or Napoleon III. The splendor of the two chapels and the richness of the four museums will also dazzle you.

Outside, discover the courtyards and gardens: the Cour d'Honneur with its famous horseshoe staircase, witness to the farewell of the Emperor; the Grand Parterre, the gardens, the ponds populated with carps and the Grand Canal invite you to walk.

Castle of Champs-sur-Marne

A masterpiece of French classical architecture, the Château de Champs-sur-Marne, built between 1703 and 1708, is a superb illustration of the French art of living in the 18th century.

Over the centuries, it has hosted many eminent personalities, including the Marquise de Pompadour, and more recently, the President of the French Republic, who used it as an official residence for foreign heads of state.

The richly decorated rooms reflect the refinement and taste of the various owners who succeeded each other. Today, the Château de Champs-sur-Marne is open to the public and offers a fascinating immersion in the history and lifestyle of the 18th century.



Fontainebleau forest

Classified as a Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO, in association with its region and the Gâtinais Natural Park, the Fontainebleau forest is one of the largest and magnificent state forests in France.

Recognized as the "Green Lung" of the Île-de-France, this forest offers a diversity of landscapes and exceptional sites. It is the first forest in France to receive the title of "Exceptional Forest", highlighting its heritage and biological richness.

A haven for many outdoor activities such as hiking and climbing, this forest is an ideal place to escape everyday life, reconnect with nature, marvel and share precious moments with loved ones..



Lumigny Safari Reserve

A sanctuary of 71 hectares, home to 160 felines living in freedom in an exceptional natural setting, the Lumigny Safari Reserve welcomes you for an immersion in the heart of the animal world.

Thanks to routes accessible to all, you can observe an incredible diversity of felines: lions, tigers, panthers, cheetahs, jaguars, wild cats, lynx, pumas, ocelots, leopards, and emblematic species such as tigers and white lions.

The park also hosts about sixty lemurs free on an island of one hectare, and a variety of primates and exotic birds on Monkey Land.

The park is designed to allow optimal observation without disturbing animals. You can take the Trans'Félins, a train that takes you closer to the animals during a 30 minutes guided tour.







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CASTLES TO BE DISCOVERED



Like many Île-de-France departments, the Seine-et-Marne is full of castles, most of which are already mentioned in the <u>Must-See</u> section of this magazine. Below, extend your reading with a non-exhaustive selection of other castles to discover!

Castle of Brie-Comte-Robert

Built in the 12th century and now in ruins, this castle offers partially restored remains, revealing the castral architecture with its 12th century defenses and residential areas with exceptional comfort for the time.

As you walk around the castle, you will discover the remains of the restored towers, the moat, then the central courtyard.

The Heritage Interpretation Centre welcomes you to help you understand this building with more complex architecture than it seems. The exhibition reveals the daily life of the lords and more modest inhabitants who lived in the castle for eight centuries.

Finally, the remains of the seigneurial hotel allow you to walk freely through the medieval rooms.

Open on Wednesdays from 2pm to 5pm, on Saturdays from 2:30pm to 6pm, and on Sundays from 10am to 12:30pm and from 2:30pm to 6pm.

The castle, whose origins date back to the early 12th century under the reign of Louis VII, was a major place of power in the Renaissance and a central actor in the history of France.

Emblematic of this period, it reached its peak in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. Nicknamed "Castle of the 3 Queens", it was occupied by Catherine de Médicis, Gabrielle d'Estrées and Marie de Médicis. The prince of Conti was the last resident.

The castle, its park and its alleys have been classified Historic Monuments since 1942 and are currently managed by the Centre des Monuments Nationaux.





The museum's itinerary, organized chronologically, explores the evolution of man, from the Australopithecus to the Homo sapiens. It also presents the flora of the different periods of prehistory, and highlights the work of archaeological excavations. The museum's archaeological collections contain more than 2 million objects, of which 3,400 are part of the permanent collections.

The main circuit chronologically retraces the main lines of regional prehistory, while the deepening circuit offers four additional rooms to complete the main route.



BRIE

Although it was not counted among the 10 most appreciated cheeses of the French, Brie de Meaux was crowned **"King of Cheeses**" at the Congress of Vienna in 1815.

Described as an essential figure of the trays, Brie de Meaux benefits from the Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée (AOC) and the Appellation d'Origine Protégée (AOP) and is mainly produced in Île-de-France region!

Donnemarie-Dontilly

Nestled among woods, valleys and fields, Donnemarie-Dontilly is a character village known for its charm and authenticity. The commune results from the twinning of two very close but rival cities: Donnemarie-en-Montois and Dontilly, founded respectively in the 9th and 12th centuries.



Medieval village, its medieval walls counted 20 turrets and 4 gates. Donnemarie-en-Montois was once animated by many craftsmen and traders, while Dontilly was mainly populated by farmers.

The medieval garden and the cloister of Donnemarie-Dontilly are part of a parish complex among the best preserved in France.

Samois-sur-Seine is one of the oldest and most charming villages in Île-de-France. Village of character, its picturesque streets and enchanting landscapes on the banks of the Seine will seduce you.

Popular with artists, the village is also famous for being the cradle of gypsy jazz, having hosted the famous guitarist Django Reinhardt in his last years.

Larchant


Village of the Natural Park of the Gâtinais, Larchant seduces lovers of nature and heritage.


Among the legends whispering in Flagy, one of the most intriguing concerns the weathervane on the roof of the church. This curious weather vane is decorated with a rooster and a pig's head.

The story goes back to the time of the Hundred Years War, when a dark epidemic of Black Death ravaged the region. The inhabitants of Flagy, terrified by the contagion, refused to welcome the sick from a nearby village, leaving them to their fate.

As punishment for this lack of compassion, the bishop of the region decided to mark this fault forever. He ordered the installation of a pig-shaped weather vane on the roof of the church, a constant reminder of the villagers' selfishness.

Since then, this strange weather vane and its history have become an integral part of Flagy's heritage, reminding everyone of the importance of solidarity and humanity in times of crisis.
