
Objective of the Course





Reading: Interpret medium-complexity texts independently.

Expression: Write coherent multi-paragraph compositions and deliver structured oral presentations.

Expert Grammar: Fluency with all verb moods, advanced voice, and rare particles.

Advanced Reading: Independently analyze classical texts (e.g., Tafsīr excerpts, classical prose).

Academic Expression: Produce well-structured essays and formal oral presentations.

Preparation for Higher Studies: Ready for undergraduate-level Arabic scholarship, research, and academic discourse.
