A SUMMER OF NOTICING

You are invited to join us in worship this summer as we practice the spiritual discipline of noticing God's activity. You probably "notice" lots of things during your day—the weather, chatter on social media, texts from friends, the traffic, or people's level of stress at work. That's good, but there's another kind of noticing too. Alongside the things we do - or don't - pay attention to every day, we are invited to take notice of God's activity underneath and above it all.



FEEDING AMERICA



Our Savior's began serving with Feeding America and St. Paul's Lutheran Church in 2014, distributing free food to around 200-250 families on the third Friday of every month. Anyone can come get food, whether for themselves or for a neighbor in need. Together, we serve by showing up and working to bless our community.

For over 40 years, Feeding America has responded to the hunger crisis in America by providing food to people through a nationwide network of food banks, food pantries, and meal programs. Last year, the Feeding America network served 5.2 billion meals reaching 40 million people, in every community in the United States including Oconomowoc.

HIGH SCHOOLERS TRAVEL TO NASHVILLE, TN

Every year, OSLC high schoolers go on a summer mission trip. Recent years have led them to Bethpage Village in Nebraska to work with severely disabled adults, and to St. Louis for ramp building for homeowners in need.

This year, the 8-12 graders will have the opportunity to do community work in Nashville, TN. Joining the youth and Bethany on this trip will be Casey Krueger, Molly Neumann and Pastor John, and they are scheduled to hit the road July 23-27. They will be doing 3 days' worth of work, from helping in community gardens and food banks to sorting and packing medical supplies.

One of the highlights of the week will be working at the Soles 4 Souls warehouse, where they will sort

thousands of donated shoes. The work will start, however, with our own OSLC shoe drive in May and June—watch for more information on that! The shoes donated to Soles 4 Souls go into micro-enterprise programs in developing countries around the world. These programs serve as long-term opportunities to break the cycle of poverty for those in need.

It is so important to provide the opportunity of mission work for our youth. These trips, where the focus is to volunteer and help others, give them a sense of belonging and connection. They make new friends and learn new skills. And, of course, there are plenty of opportunities to have fun, try new foods, see new places, and discover all things Nashville!



Let's invest in this together!

Martin Luther wrote, "If I knew the world were ending tomorrow, I'd plant a tree today." This is a profound message of hope and trust that God will be present to bring growth and new life into our lives. At Our Savior's, we have entered into a season of rebuilding, renewal, and investing in the mission God has given: "Sharing the Love of Christ to Transform Lives."

Living into this mission requires the investment of the whole congregation – time and energy, skills and passions, and money. Investing in our church is important because we care about our mission as a congregation and because generosity helps us to grow in our own relationship with Jesus.

At the Annual Congregational Meeting in February, the congregation passed a budget with a deficit of \$183,494. A significant gap, but an amount that can be covered by reserves in the short term. Longer term, to maintain and grow in ministry, this level of deficit will need to be addressed. However, passing this year's budget was a sign of hope, as the congregation planted a proverbial tree.

In order to reduce the deficit, the Church Council is inviting all members and friends of the congregation to grow their investment in Our Savior's. The goal is to receive \$100,000 in gifts and commitments, which represents over half of the budgeted deficit. Not everyone is able to make an additional gift, but many can.

Opportunities to make a commitment or an immediate gift are available now, including the envelope enclosed in this mailing. Council members will be sharing updates during worship in the weeks ahead. This is an exciting time for Our Savior's!
