A Touching Winchelsea Memorial Cairns Service

Sunday the 21st August finally saw the official 'opening' of the memorial cairns in Winchelsea town centre, after a long postponement due to Covid and its restrictions.

The ceremony was well-attended and even featured an impressive military display by the Geelong Military Reenactment Group. With Federal and State politicians plus Shire Councillors and many a medal, the Service was a touching recognition and honouring of the significant contribution of by Winchelsea region families over many modern-history conflicts.

The commemorative service was hosted by the Winchelsea RSL, led by RSL President Robin Mawson. Speakers kept it brief and covered a

variety of interesting perspectives; Dan Tehan (Federal MP for our electorate of Wannon), Libby Coker (Federal MP for what used to be our electorate of Corangamite), Richard Riordan (State MP for our electorate of Polwarth), Bev McArthur (State Senator for Western Victoria Region), Councillor Adrian Schonfelder and Councillor Heather Wellington (both Winchelsea ward). The whole event was lent a sombre and formal air thanks to the catafalque party (members of an armed guard who stand, heads bowed and weapon reversed, facing outward as a symbolic form of respect for those who have fallen).

Speeches were followed by a prayer and then wreath laying, which was opened to the general public too.

The Ode was read by David Kelly;

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old

Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn

At the going down of the sun and in the morning

We will remember them

The Memorial Cairns are a fitting tribute to the sacrifices of many, and reading the names on the cairns brings how 'local' those sacrifices have been. If you haven't already, stop by and take a look at the cairns and the long lists of names. In these days of turmoil, it's a terrific reminder of how we've come to be the country we are, the price that has been paid, and why we should all take an interest in its future directions.

Winchelsea Lions Club at Cairns Dedication Story and Photos Linda Carter



The Joys of Playing Football

I came from a "football mad" family. My father and most of my uncles played for Sandringham in the VFA. When we cleaned out my grandfather's shed we found a large photo of the Sandringham football team from about the 1890's. Prominent in the photo was my great-grandfather, Sandringham's coach. We handed the photo over to the present day Sandringham football club.

However I was pretty slow in catching "footy fever". It wasn't until in about Year 5 I changed classes and joined the Year 5 "football fanatics". For no known reason I became a devoted Carlton supporter and the Blues were the mob that I was going to play for. However it was many years before I actually saw the Blues play a game of football.

I also joined the hordes that hated Collingwood!

Instead of following the family tradition and going to Sandringham I wound up with Moorabbin. I delude myself in thinking I was Lindsay Fox's understudy while playing with Moorabbin "Seconds" I am sure if Lindsay was injured they would have found someone better than me.

Then the Moorabbin committee came up with a bright idea. They would combine with the St. Kilda VFL team and St Kilda's home ground would be Moorabbin. Things didn't work out that way, The Moorabbin players moved out, mainly to other VFA clubs, and the St Kilda players moved in.

I had to make a decision. Did I continue with football or look at some other sporting activity. To fit in with my Night School classes I decided to swap to athletics. I never really worked hard at football again. However I did run against Ron Clarke. Even though he lapped me it was still a magic moment in my life.

Then I graduated as a teacher and was sent up the bush to Yarrum. Because of the distance from Melbourne my athletics career was finished. As soon as I arrived in Yarrum I was approached by the local football club and was signed by them. I instantly went from knowing no one in Yarrum to knowing a whole town. However, I before I played my first game, I was transferred to Hamilton.

Hamilton was completely unknown territory. I had been to Geelong a few times but never passed it. I had been to Ballarat once. In those days in teaching you packed your toothbrush and off you went.

I wound up being signed by Hamilton Football Club. Hamilton Imperials were a bit like Collingwood. You either loved

'em or you hated 'em. I was not a great success as a Hamilton player but it was a wonderful introduction to the Hamilton people. I wound up as a Hamilton Football Club committee member.

Then I transferred to Purnim school, near Warrnambool. I came out of retirement to play with Grassmere in the Warrnambool District League. Again it was a great introduction to the local population. I was too old and had slowed up too much though I did win a bottle of wine from my partner, Prue, who bet me I couldn't kick 4 goals in a game.

Then we bought our beautiful stone house in Winchelsea. Our next door neighbour, Sammy Orchard, introduced me to the "Sammy's Cellar" crowd, otherwise called "The Sunday Pub". From memory, even with my complete lack of cricketing skills, I actually played in the annual cricket match between Sammy's Cellar and the Elm Tree Boys.

I will always be grateful for the "entry ticket" that football gave me to the towns that I was sent to in my teaching career

Does it really matter that The Magpies beat The Blues last week by one point and put them out of the finals? Well yes it does. Now I have to barrack for the Western Bulldogs. I still can't barrack for Collingwood.

Ocean Mind volunteer training

Ocean Mind is a community surf charity that provides therapeutic surf programs to young people experiencing mental health challenges, disabilities and social isolation. Based on the Surf Coast, participants are matched one to one with a volunteer surf therapy mentor.

They learn to surf at Anglesea Main Beach and also participate in wellbeing activities alongside a group of 10 other kids and mentors over six weeks. The programs are free. Everything is provided, including transport. Ocean Mind brings the mental health benefits of surfing to kids who need it.

In partnership with the Winchelsea Community House, Ocean Mind is running a volunteer training day on Sunday 18 September at 9:30am. The organization invites Winchelsea locals who have a passion for the ocean, to sign up to the training. You don't need to have any surf or youth work experience, as the comprehensive training covers everything you need to know including a practical water session. As well as surf mentors, are also looking for volunteer drivers. Everyone over the age of 16 is welcome!

Ocean Mind has supported over 20 Winchelsea young people with mental health challenges on their therapeutic surf programs. They currently receive referrals from the primary school and other support services. Ocean Mind has over 80 young people on their waitlist who need support.

Agency Partnership results in Positive Outcomes for the Environment

A unique partnership between the Corangamite Catchment Management Authority, Parks Victoria and the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) has resulted in positive outcomes for the environment through the research and adaptive management being undertaken in the Wild Otways Initiative.

The Australian Government's Wild Otways Initiative (WOI), managed by the Corangamite Catchment Management Authority, is a \$6M collaborative research and land management program with multiple partner organisations and agencies in the Otways region.

The project area encompasses the entire Otways landscape – Bells Beach / Ironbark Basin west to Port Campbell – incorporating some private land, but primarily the public land estate under management by Parks Victoria and DELWP: nominally the Great Otway National Park and Otway Forest Park.

At the beginning of the three-year project, an agreement was made to work with the key land management agencies by embedding two dedicated WOI project officers within Parks Victoria and DELWP.

This collaborative arrangement has ensured effectiveness and efficiency in working towards achieving project goals. In addition, it has streamlined knowledge sharing and problem-solving across the agencies and with the researchers in the field.

The research and applied management projects cover areas such as feral animal control, small mammals surveys, Phytophthora mapping, management and control, fox and cat management in planned burn landscapes and Rewilding – creating conditions for reintroducing species that have disappeared from a landscape.

Applying research across a landscape requires collaboration and coordination – in the case of feral pigs and deer, the animals move in the landscape, and control strategies must be implemented across the National Park and Forest Park to be effective.

This means that all the agencies need to communicate and work together to use resources efficiently and exchange knowledge, leading to mutual benefits for researchers and agency staff. Successful management actions can be implemented as soon as research findings are made.

Parks Victoria District Manager – West Coast, Dale Antonysen says the partnership will have a lasting legacy through the relationships and understandings formed and mutual benefits achieved for the environment.

Corangamite CMA's Jessica Miller, Manager of Environmental Programs (Otways, Surf Coast and Bellarine) said, "The research has improved our management of feral animals such as pigs and deer. In addition, it has given an insight into the small mammal populations in the Great Otway National Park and given us tools and strategies for tackling Phytophthora dieback in our region".

This project is supported by the Corangamite CMA, through funding from the Australian Government.

Be prepared, not scared of swooping this bird breeding season.

Victorians are being reminded that with spring just around the corner, native birds such as magpies and masked lapwings may begin swooping during their breeding season - but there are steps we can take to remain safe at this time.

Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) Senior Wildlife Projects Officer, Abby Smith, said some native birds swoop to defend their eggs and young for the six to eight weeks until they leave the nest.

"Swooping can catch us by surprise, but it is normal behaviour for some territorial birds." Ms Smith said.

"Swooping is basically a scare tactic to warn people and animals not to come near their nesting young. Birds may swoop people or animals, so be mindful of your dogs too.

"However, not all birds swoop to protect their eggs and young during the breeding season, so don't be concerned simply because there are magpies or other common swooping birds in the

"If you are worried about being swooped, you can do a few things to protect yourself." Tips to avoid being swooped:

- Know your local swooping hotspots
- · Avoid the area if possible
- · Move quickly, but do not run
- · Cover your head with a hat, helmet or umbrella, but don't wave it around
- · Do not harass or feed birds
