

Growing Winchelsea Inc. is a group of volunteer leaders who help provide the Winchelsea community with a united voice.

Come and meet one of those artisans Jacqueline Pyke of Otway Opals. Here is her story about her work.

MEET THE MAKER: Jackie Opals

Many very kindly call me a silversmith, but I am not one. To me, a silversmith has trained for a number of years under specialists to develop amazing skills, while I dabble. Over the years I have developed techniques through practice and experimenting, with the occasional help from a silversmith friend. However, the creativity journey has been a mixture of excitement, pleasure and fulfilment.

Everybody is creative in some way - we just follow different directions and passions. My passion started with glass beads, followed by wire wrapped beach glass, then opals and now Roman glass. As with most hobbies, my creativity is limited to my available spare time. My pieces are more interesting the more often I work. Creativity feeds upon itself and I'm constantly trying new ideas and techniques to spark my interest. I joined my local gem club and learned to cut opals, and found like-minded people to

enjoy similar passions. Later, I discovered that the same equipment and techniques enabled me to work with ancient glass. My wonderful husband set up a 3m x 3m studio space, that it is full to the brim with everything I need to grind and polish stones and glass, as well as shape and melt silver.



Ancient Roman glass is glass that was discarded by traders travelling along the Silk Road between Rome and China 2000 years ago. China was the only source of silk fabric - a prized luxury item for the Romans. The glass has chemically reacted with the soil over time and developed an attractive and unique patina not unlike an oil slick on

the surface.

Because the glass has been buried for such a long time, it has many layers of soil, sand and decaying glass that must be carefully cleaned away. Quite like carefully peeling back the layers of an onion. This process can take many hours, to carefully reveal the beautiful patina on the glass. And once the patina is revealed, it remains quite delicate



and must be carefully handled as any oil contamination (hand cream, solvents etc) may remove the beautiful rainbow film on the glass.

Roman glass can be shaped and set in to jewellery with similar techniques to that of shaping and setting opals into delightful jewellery. My designs for roman glass are quite different to those of my opal jewellery, reminiscent of ancient Roman jewellery. The glass cannot be polished, as this obviously removes the patina. I can only cut it to shape. As I work I am very aware of the fact that I am playing with glass that another person made 2000 years ago as a functional object before it was broken and discarded.

I forgot to mention I am a retired metallurgist and mathematics teacher. Scientists can be creative.

East Barwon Willow Removal and Restoration Project

After months of careful planning, Barwon Water has made a start on the second stage of the East Barwon Willow removal and restoration project.

The works involve remediation and stabilisation of the streambed and banks, and removal of the willow trees downstream of the Wurdee Boluc Inlet Channel. Works started in November and will be complete by late April.

The project will provide environmental benefits from improved water flows, water quality and waterway health, and help alleviate flooding issues in this section of the East Barwon river. Barwon Water continue to take care of the newly vegetated buffer zone along the 3.5 km reach of river upstream, including weed management and more planting.







The Climate Report

Emissions from households' water use are on a par with aviation. The big cuts and savings they can make are being neglected

Why is there such a big gap between people, industries and government agreeing we need urgent action on climate change, and actually starting? Scope 3 emissions are a great example. These are greenhouse gas emissions that organisations can influence, but don't directly control.

Our research has identified the benefits of tackling these emissions in Australia's urban water sector. If we consider the energy we use to heat water, water costs us far more than we think. It's an issue of cost of living as well as water supply and energy infrastructure.

Our mission is to share knowledge and inform decisions.

Extrapolating from Melbourne household data suggests domestic water heating accounts for 3.8% of each person's share of Australia's greenhouse gas emissions — on a par with the 4.1% from aviation. Our research indicates that in Melbourne alone a city-wide program to retrofit showerheads could, by reducing water and energy use, have the same impact on emissions as taking tens of thousands of cars off the road.

Customers would also save up to \$160 a year on their bills. The full economic benefit to society is more than five times the cost of the program

Who influences water use? Everyone

Helping customers adopt highly efficient showerheads could cut emissions at much lower cost than all other renewable energy investments water utilities are making.

Most households don't realise hot water systems account for around 24% of their total energy use. Their total energy use for water heating is larger as it includes appliances such as washing machines, dishwashers and kettles.

We think only of the savings on water bills, but efficient water use also affects our power bills and emissions. But communicating the link isn't easy.

Reducing emissions from water use requires community, industry and government to act together. The stumbling block is decision-making and current legislation.

Water utilities have focused on cutting their own emissions and costs, neglecting the much bigger gains to be had from changing water users' behaviour.




BLUE'S NEWS:


Prizes will be drawn at the Season Launch – date and venue to be announced.

NEW MASTERPLAN LAUNCHED AND \$1.7M IN FUNDING ANNOUNCED

The final Kitjarra-dja-bul Bullarto langi-ut masterplan is now complete covering the lower Moorabool and lower Barwon River corridors stretching from near Meredith in the north, through Geelong and to the estuary at Barwon Heads. The objective of the masterplan is to connect people to the lower Moorabool and lower Barwon River corridor by balancing public access, recreation, economic opportunities and education while enhancing the area's unique cultural and environmental values.

The masterplan has been in development for two years, involving engagement with many stakeholders, including State and Local Government Agencies, Wadawurrung Traditional Owners, community groups and the general community.

The funding announced will support the immediate commencement of some of the high priority projects identified in the masterplan to re-vegetate high-value sites along the Barwon River, Leigh River, Moorabool River and Waurn Ponds Creek. These projects will deliver environmental, cultural and biodiversity improvements to this highly valued river corridor along with significant improvements to public amenity.

Corangamite CMA's CEO, Amber Clarke, expressed gratitude for the State Government's invaluable support in launching the Masterplan and unveiling its substantive investment into the Rivers of the Barwon Revegetation Initiative.

Corangamite CMA's Senior Strategy Project Officer, Andrew Harrison, said the delivery of the project will include engagement with Wadawurrung and Eastern Maar Traditional Owners and relevant community groups.

"We are thrilled to have been awarded this funding, as it signifies a significant stride towards enhancing our environment. This corridor and these rivers are important to the local community and Aboriginal Traditional Owners", he said.

South-West Locals Love Their Pets

by Belinda Dent, RSPCA Inspectorate Team Leader (South-West Region)

As Team Leader for RSPCA Victoria's Inspectorate South-West region, my team of six Inspectors and I share 43 years of experience investigating reports of animal cruelty.

Inspectors Dani, Sarah, Jackson, Allie, Franke, Manu, and I are often on the road around Melbourne's innerwest, out to Warrnambool and Portland and everywhere in between.

Out on the road, we're seeing firsthand how the cost-of-living crisis is impacting pet owners and their ability to provide basic veterinary care for their animals, including preventative medicines like flea and worming treatments and, crucially, de-sexing.

We're also seeing horses with insufficient and oftentimes inappropriate feed and again, not receiving vital veterinary care. We're extremely grateful to the community for their ongoing vigilance in reporting animal cruelty.

Over the last six months, we received 1,232 reports and tip-offs about animal cruelty in the South-West and 219 animals were seized or surrendered into our care.

Last financial year, over 460 animals came into our care, and sadly, it seems we're likely to repeat this total again by the end of June.

As we enter what is historically the busiest time of year, we urge everyone in the South-West to remain vigilant for animal cruelty in our area and to report it to RSPCA Victoria by calling (03) 9224-2222 or online at www. rspcavic.org/cruelty-report.

The community support we see every day keeps us going and makes each day just a little bit better.

At the end of the day, RSPCA Inspectors are here to help, and thankfully, many of the animals we encounter every day have loving owners who want to do the best they can for their pets.

Together, let's end animal cruelty.






