



Improvements to the Coxen Hole Wastewater Treatment Plant, with 50% progress, in the Structure for the Pre-treatment area, Excavations for the Upflow Anaerobic Reactor (AFAR) area, Slope Stabilization for the installation of a Geomembrane in the Polishing Lagoon, Sludge Drying yard area and Aerators in the Aeration Lagoon.

improvement of this treatment plant, we guarantee that the water that is deposited into the ocean is safe and we protect our health, the natural environment, marine life and reefs on the island of Roatan. 

At the end of the meeting they agreed that improvements in security will begin in the coming days and will be strengthened throughout 2024.

Among the points agreed to improve is the increase of the vehicle fleet and police motorized equipment.

600 linear meters of whitetopping will be melted in the sector of willie warren

Starting on Monday, January 15, the Mayor's Office of Roatan began to carry out works of recovery of the road network in the Willie Warren sector, starting from the bridge to the Cruise Port, an area that requires immediate intervention due to the poor condition in which it is located.

In the work to be executed, hydraulic concrete will be cast over the existing asphalt (whitetopping) on the entire roadway in the aforementioned sector, which is equivalent to 600 linear meters, in addition to improving the sidewalks and drainage in the sector

SEDUC AND CICESCT

n an unprecedented move, both entities collaborate in prevention efforts, creating local committees, focusing on the identification of possible cases in classrooms, education and prevention for children and adolescents. This effort is complemented by prevention and awareness initiatives to ensure a safe and secure educational environment. Above all, free of human trafficking. The Head of CICESCT Sua Martinez said that "It is a historic event where for the first time this secretariat will be involved in the work of local committees, as well as in the work of identifying possible cases of trafficking and smuggling in the classroom, so our president Xiomara Castro, has entrusted us with this institution to repair the damage and provide protection to victims of trafficking and above all to defend the

dignity, care and protection of our children who are our greatest treasure. After parents, teachers are the most trusted authorities of the students in this space, they are key to determine situations such as truancy, which may be due to forced begging, forced recruitment.

recruitment, sexual cybercrime, forced pregnancy, slavery or servitude, commercial sexual exploitation and human trafficking, said Martinez, Executive Secretary of CICESCT.

For his part, Secretary of Education Daniel Sponda emphasized, "This agreement is important for the government of President Castro, to work for the protection of children and the reparation of damages.

The SACE system, which is a tool to see the time of absenteeism of students so that each teacher must report the violation of rights, we will activate the local committees CICESCT and prevention work for school principals and teachersSome important points of this agreement signed between both governmental entities for collaboration, is to provide support in the implementation of prevention campaigns, awareness and strengthening of local committees-CICESCT nationwide in order to develop planned joint activities between both parties in the process of training against the following crimes; Commercial Sexual Exploitation and Trafficking in Persons, as well as crimes related to trafficking.



Strengthening Education in the Municipality of El Progreso, Yoro



embers of the Mu-Council nicipal to Guarantee the Rights of Children and Adolescents of El Progreso, were informed this afternoon about the results and progress of the innovative Mathematics Program with NEPO, implemented in 2023 by the Municipal Administration of Mayor Alexander Lopez Orellana in partnership with the Ministry of Education and the Aztec Corporation of Mexico, benefiting a thousand children from 30 schools in the urban, rural and mountain sector. Simultaneously, 40 teachers were trained with this methodology.

For this year 2024, the projection is to extend this benefit to 2 thousand more schoolchildren and, in addition, to put into operation 50 virtual classrooms in the same number of educational centers, as well as to provide English classes to 2 thousand first grade children.

The above is an important contribution that the Municipality of El Progreso is making to strengthen local education, in addition to the contributions that it permanently provides for the repair and construction of schools, equipment with desks, teaching materials, among others.





For this year 2024, the projection is to expand this benefit to 2,000 more schoolchildren.
