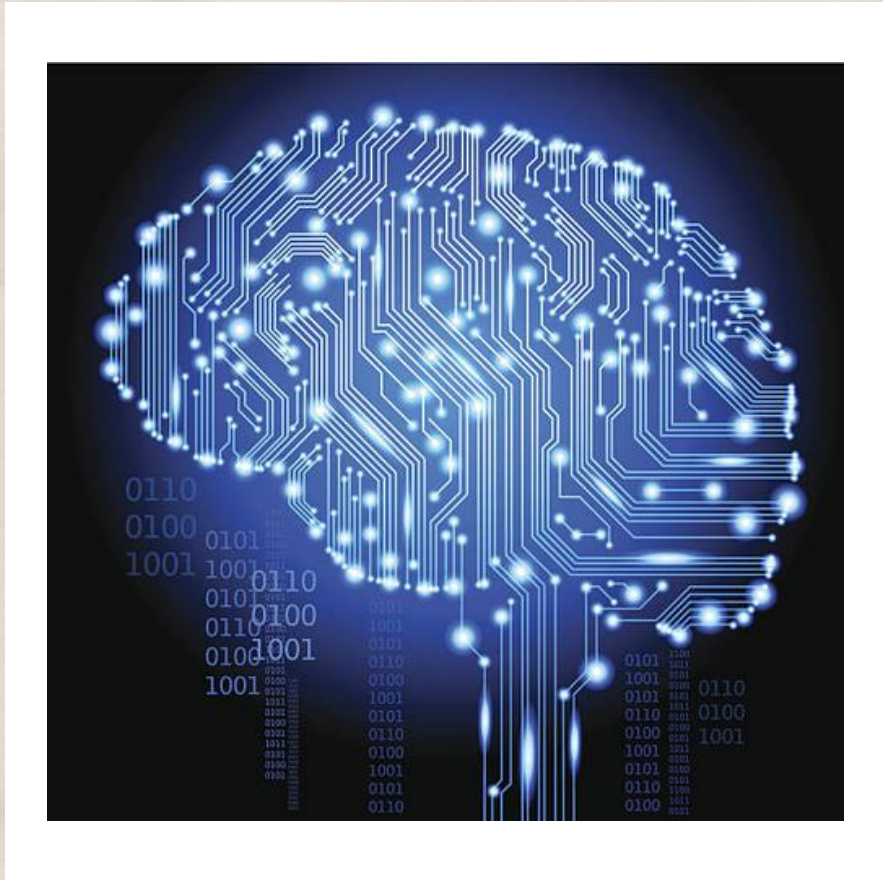
NOVEMBER REWIND: KEY MOMENTS THAT SHAPED THE MONTH

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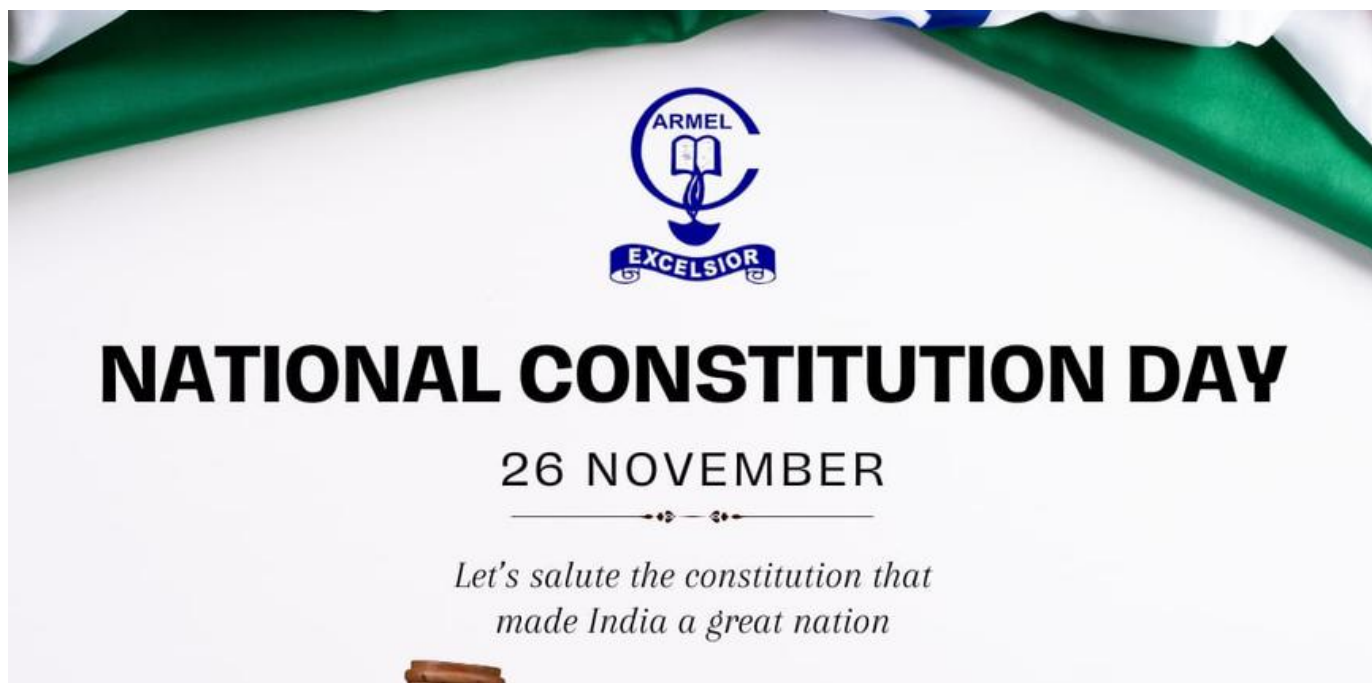

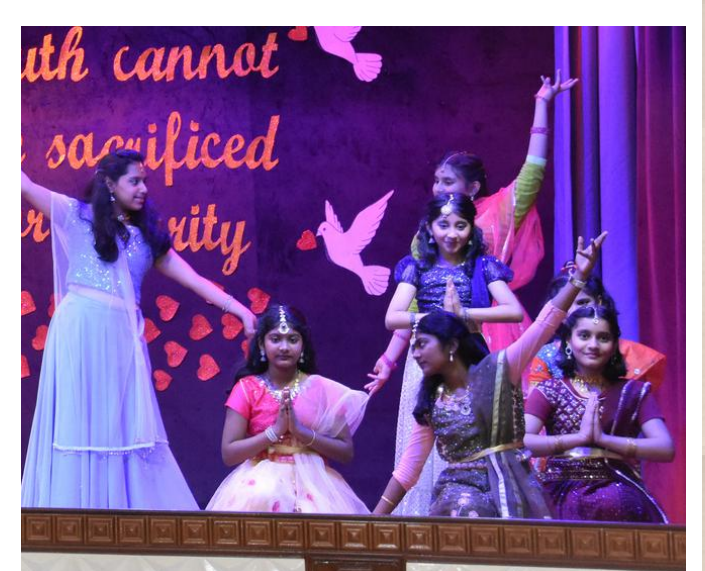
CARMEL SCHOOL MARKS CONSTITUTION DAY WITH PLEDGE
