COURSE NEWS

Course Renovation & Maintenance Update

Next week the ground staff will be carrying out a series of important maintenance practices to set the course up for the busy season ahead.

Greens Renovation

- Coring with 19 mm hollow tines to a depth of 4 inches - removes organic matter, relieves compaction, and promotes stronger root growth.
- Application of 120 tons of sand smooths surfaces, improves drainage, and creates firmer, truer putting conditions.
- Verti-draining with 12 mm solid tines to a depth of 8–10 inches - relieves subsurface compaction and allows deeper penetration of water and oxygen.
- Air2G2 treatment to a depth of 10 inches –
 follows the verti drain, injecting air laterally
 into the soil profile to further relieve
 compaction and enhance gas exchange
 without surface disruption.

These combined practices are critical for maintaining healthy, resilient turf and delivering the best possible playing surfaces through spring and summer.

While there may be minor short term impacts, recovery is fast at this time of year, and the long-term benefits will be significant in providing consistent putting surfaces.

In line with recent soil testing, we'll also be applying key nutrient amendments to support turf health and balance the soil profile. This includes:

- 1.2 tons of calcium, to improve soil structure and aid nutrient uptake.
- 600 kg of magnesium, essential for photosynthesis and overall turf vigour.
- 500 kg of potassium, to strengthen turf against stress, heat, and wear.

As part of our ongoing Integrated Pest Management (IPM) program, the ground staff will also be conducting fungicide and insecticide applications across the course.



COURSE UPDATE

These treatments are carefully targeted to:

- Protect turf from disease and pest pressures.
- Maintain healthy, resilient playing surfaces.
- Minimise chemical use by focusing on precise, need based applications in line with our IPM strategy.

These applications will complement our ongoing maintenance program, ensuring the course remains in excellent condition throughout the season.



Fairway Sand Slitting

Selected fairways will also undergo sand slitting. This involves creating narrow slits (50mm wide) in the turf and backfilling them with sand (approximately 90 ton/hectare) benefits of this are to:

- Improve drainage and surface firmness.
- · Reduce soft, wet areas after rain.
- Encourage deeper rooting and healthier turf.

Some short-term surface disturbance may be visible, but recovery is quick, and the long-term benefit will be firmer, more playable fairways throughout the year.

This week we completed aeration on the tees using our new Verti Drain, fitted with 12 mm solid tines at a depth of 10 inches. This work relieves compaction and improves root development on these heavily trafficked areas.

Following the upcoming greens renovations, we will also run our new Air2G2 machine across the tees. This will further relieve subsurface compaction by injecting air laterally into the soil profile, enhancing oxygen exchange and overall turf health.

With these two new replacements to our maintenance fleet, we are confident the tee surfaces will continue to improve providing a more robust playing surface going forward.
