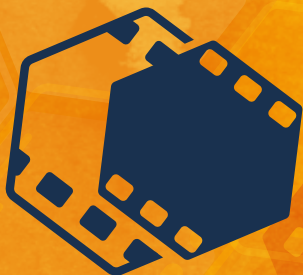

Welcome to our 10th annual Beeston Film Festival (BFF) Guide

This year's festival is a special milestone for us and we're celebrating it in style! We've extended the film festival to six days, and we're excited to be showing, for the first-time, full-length feature films! There are two groups of features, first, "In Competition" films selected by our festival reviewing team, including films from Spain and Iran that are battling for B'Oscar. Secondly, we're screening an acclaimed group of feature films, curated around the theme of 'Protest and Resistance'.

Of course, short films remain the creative backbone of our film festival and we're showing more than ever: we're screening 156 shorts over six days, from 28 countries covering the globe.

A huge thanks to our wonderfully dedicated festival reviewing and selection team, all volunteers, who have collectively amassed over 725 hours of reviewing time when watching nearly 1000 submitted 'shorts'. Truly, a stupendous effort.

We also take our hats off to our intern staff who provide such an invaluable service, ensuring that our film festival runs smoothly and making festivalgoers and filmmakers feel so warmly welcomed. This is also the third year of our flourishing partnership with Arc Cinema and we are delighted to be offering film-makers such impressive state-of-the-art facilities in which to showcase their work.

One of the great pleasures this year has been appreciating the fruits of creative partnerships forged between well-established, highly acclaimed actors and some of the most promising film-making talents. Highlights of such productive collaborations this year include: Kate Dickie working with Nick Tree in the compassionate, deeply affecting 'If Not Now, When?', Juliet Stevenson working with Amelia Sears in the deft, poignantly urgent, 'Ceres', and Charlotte Riley collaborating with Beth Park in the brilliant, blistering 'Wild Animal'.

In our inaugural feature film section, we're screening an acclaimed group of feature films, curated around the theme of 'Protest and Resistance' culminating in Ken Loach's reputedly final film, 'The Old Oak' (2023) and including the rarely screened, groundbreaking anti-Apartheid film from South Africa, 'Mapantsula' (1988). In addition, we are excited to have included international films from Spain and Iran. Another pleasingly noticeable development this year has been the growing number of outstanding short films submitted in our relatively new East Midlands submission category. We have also received a growing number of submissions from the African continent, and we will be screening excellent shorts from Egypt ('I Promise You Paradise') and South Africa ('Father's Day'), and we're excited to be introducing a new category this year called 'African Voices'. These developments very much chime with the ethos of BFF: celebrating both the local and the global.



The short film sector in the UK is as vibrant and important as ever. As the great New Zealand film director, Jane Campion, once observed, 'short films give a freedom to filmmakers', allowing them to hone their craft and develop their artistic visions, and to feel less constrained by commercial pressures which often beset the longer form of feature film-making. In doing so, within a matter of minutes, short films can transport audiences to new worlds, challenge our perceptions, and broaden our understanding: even more necessary as our world descends further into conflict and division.

Short films also win Oscars, BAFTAs, BIFAs, Césars and some are fortunate enough to win our very own B'Oscars! We hope you enjoy watching them and relish the veritable filmic feast on offer during our festival.

We have achieved so much over the past 10 years. We have become a BIFA short qualifying festival and for several years maintained a high position in FilmFreeway's TOP 100 Best Reviewed Film Festivals and who knows what the next 10 years will bring? Certainly more great international independent films.

PROTEST AND RESISTANCE IN FILM: 'STRONGER TOGETHER'

As part of our Protest and Resistance series of films showing in the festival, Simon Leyden considers different ways in which protest has been represented on screen.

If protest is essentially 'telling truth to power', then ever since Sergei Eisenstein's revolutionary masterpiece of montage, 'Battleship Potemkin' (1925), film has proven itself to be a powerful and persuasive medium of conveying such 'truth'.

One important consequence can be injecting fresh momentum into pressing societal issues and moral concerns. In 1966, Ken Loach, made a gritty, ground-breaking social realist drama for BBC television, 'Cathy Come Home', highlighting the growing plight of homelessness in Britain. In doing so, he cemented the urgent relevance of newly formed housing action group, Shelter.



Later on, widespread fears over the looming threat of nuclear war were given greater urgency by both the terrifying apocalyptic BBC television drama, 'Threads' (1984) and 'When the Wind Blows' (1986), an animated film adaptation of Raymond Briggs' graphic novel about a Soviet Union nuclear attack on Britain. Perhaps, unsurprisingly, the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament's (CND) popularity continued to surge during this period.

The years 2010–2015 saw the entrenchment of a new age of austerity in Britain and the return of mass street protests. Huge cuts to public spending and a steep rise in food banks would form the basis of Ken Loach's anti-austerity polemic, 'I, Daniel Blake' (2016), his compelling look at the dignity-sapping, byzantine benefits system, and the first of his unofficial trilogy of modern-day Britain, continuing with 'Sorry We Missed You' (2019) and 'The Old Oak' (2023).

Films not only give fresh insight and propulsion to contemporaneous issues, they also serve as aesthetic representations of historical protests and acts of resistance. Though set in the past, such films may also carry with them enduring moral and political messages. To illustrate this, during the same 2010–2015 period, three acclaimed British films were made which all harked back to earlier times of industrial conflict and political protest: 'Made in Dagenham', 'Pride' and 'Suffragette'.



'Suffragette' (2015) focuses on the hard-fought struggle for women's enfranchisement during the early 20th century. A struggle marked by violent state repression, civil disobedience, and astonishing acts of self-sacrifice and collective resistance. 'Suffragette' addresses a central myth of the Suffragette Movement: that it was the sole domain of middle-class women. Through centering the narrative on laundry worker, Maude Watts (Carey Mulligan), who is radicalised by her experiences of oppression and horrifying abuse, the film reminds us of the invaluable contributions

made by working-class women to female political enfranchisement.

'Suffragette' also taps into the widely held suspicion that working-class women were more harshly treated in prison than their middle-class counterparts. To demonstrate this point, in 1910, suffragette activist, Lady Constance Lytton, disguised herself as a seamstress and was treated far more cruelly in prison, including being force-fed, than when previously incarcerated as herself. The experiences of working-

class women are also foregrounded in 'Made in Dagenham' but here the mood is lighter, more upbeat and celebratory. It chronicles the 1968 sewing machinists strike at the Ford Dagenham plant, where female workers walked out to protest against sexual discrimination, demanding equal pay. The successful strike led to the Equal Pay Act 1970.



political in representation and intent, they salvaged heart-warming and feel-good tales out of Britain's industrial decline. In doing so, they offered small-scale but symbolic victories to the idea that we had not all become selfish, atomised individuals. The Thatcherite dictum was wrong. 'Society' stubbornly refused to go away.

Although made much later than this trio of films, 'Pride' (2014) looks back to the Miner's Strike, 1984-85, and avoids these films' pervasive sense of pessimism around the effectiveness of grassroots' protest. 'Pride' becomes an unabashed celebration of joined-up activism; the shared belief that systems of oppression and discrimination inevitably overlap and are most fruitfully considered and confronted in relation to one another.

Scripted by Loach's long-time collaborator, Paul Laverty, 'The Old Oak' (2023) is set largely around its eponymous run-down pub, which becomes the setting for dramatising the rising tensions caused by the arrival of political refugees in a northern community, decimated by years of economic marginalisation. Loach noted in a promotional interview for the film, "Paul had read the first story of the Syrians arriving in the North East," "So it began

Representations of the effectiveness of collective workers' resistance have a chequered history in British cinema: one only has to think of 'I'm Alright Jack' (1959) and its satirising of the labour movement through its stereotypical use of corrupt 'union leaders' and 'indolent', 'self-interested' workers. In 'Made in Dagenham' the women machinists team up and fight together for a just cause. Collective action leads to victory and enhanced levels of self-respect.

In a trio of earlier made British films: 'Brassed Off' (1996), 'The Full Monty' (1997) and 'Billy Elliot' (2000), broadly coinciding with the arrival of the New Labour Government, no such opportunities seemed available anymore for effective grassroots protest and the collective resistance of working class communities.

Instead, these three films belonged to an emerging post miners' strike sub-genre of British films. Less overtly

with Paul and then we talked about it and what ideas we would explore through the collision of the two communities.”

Stylistically, with its use of broad humour and its affectionate evocation of period fashion and music, 'Pride' seems much closer to 'Made in Dagenham' than to 'The Old Oak'. However, what unites 'Pride' and 'The Old Oak' is their unyielding commitment to the overarching importance of solidarity and shared resistance.

'Mapantsula' (1988) has been hailed as the “first South African film to truly represent apartheid onscreen”. Banned in its homeland and made guerrilla-style while evading government authorities, the film was screened in the Un Certain Regard section at Cannes and went on to be selected as the South African entry for Best Foreign Language Film at the Oscars.

Initially, it seems to lack the sharp political and moral focus characteristic of Loach's work. Set in late apartheid South Africa, it begins as a gangster melodrama, where its black anti-hero, 'Panic', is a petty thief who straddles the racial divide by picking pockets with a quick smile and an even quicker knife.

However, when he ends up in prison, 'Panic' is forced to choose between individual gain and taking a stand against the oppressive apartheid regime. 'Mapantsula' morphs into a blistering moral critique of an unequal society built on racial division. As with Loach's late trilogy, the underlying message is that oppressed individuals and communities remain stronger together.

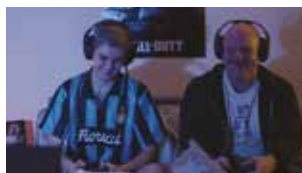

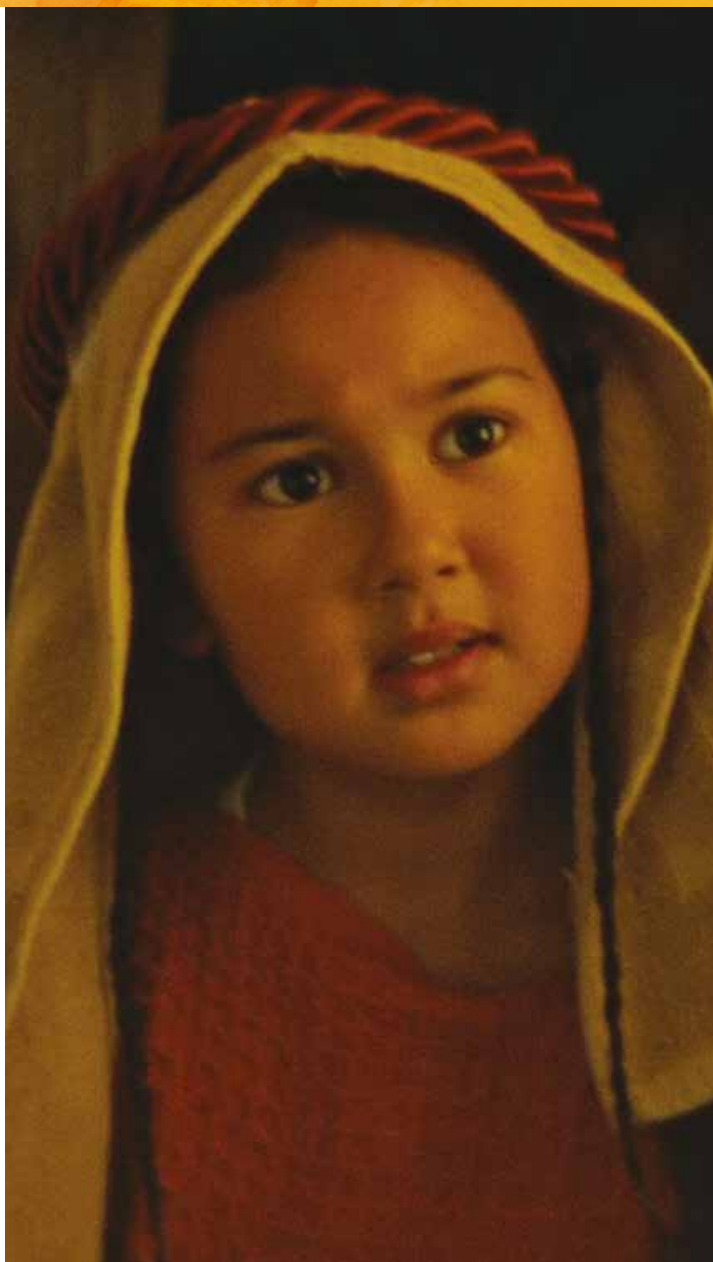

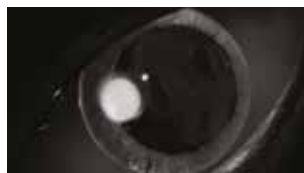
