MESSAGE

During 2024, we participated in more mission trips, hosted visits to the region, and engaged in more in-person meetings which resulted in a successful year of announcements and developing projects.

We had 13 announcements this past year, which represented the creation of over 490 new jobs and over \$160 million in capital investment.

We are pleased that the State of South Carolina was awarded the prestigious Platinum Shovel Award in the Annual Area Development Gold and Silver Shovel Awards, which is a testament to our state's outstanding economic development accomplishments.

Within our region, the Myrtle Beach MSA was ranked third for prime workforce in the U.S. by *Area Development Magazine*.

Throughout 2024, average employment in the NESA region increased about 1.6% year-over-year. We continue to see historically low unemployment levels, with an unemployment rate of 5.4% as of November 2024.

Over the course of the year, we were able to generate 64 new projects that represent substantial economic growth opportunities for the region.

We appreciate each of our member counties and investors who collaborated to develop great opportunities for our region and communities over the past year. We are excited to continue working with you and seeing another wonderful year in 2025.







STAFF & SERVICES

NESA works with our public partners to support their efforts recruiting new industry and facilitating existing industry expansions throughout our nine-county region. We achieve this by providing the expertise of our staff through business development, marketing, research, and more.

The NESA team supports our public and private allies throughout the economic development process—assisting their product development endeavors to recruit new companies and help existing industry expansion efforts.



ATTRACTING INDUSTRY

NESA conducts domestic and international business development missions throughout the year to recruit new industries to the region. These missions are planned, organized, and executed by NESA staff with opportunities for our local economic developers to participate.

In addition, NESA showcases the region through direct marketing campaigns to companies and site selection consultants; through luncheons designed to inform brokers, site selection consultants, and others about the NESA region; and through traditional advertising methods.



PREPARING OUR PRODUCT

NESA supports our county partners and allies with our expertise when it comes to identifying new industrial sites and improving upon existing sites to make them more attractive to prospective buyers. NESA's County Grants and High Impact Grant programs—which are geared specifically towards improving product across our region—are available to our county partners and allies.

partners draw the interest of a company, we provide a wealth of services to support our counties and their efforts to ultimately land that company. business development, marketing, and research teams respond to requests for information (RFI) by providing economic data, site information, marketing materials, and more. We also help facilitate meetings with all interested parties and organize regional, county, and site tours as needed.



RETAINING & EXPANDING

Existing industries are the backbone of our region and we provide them with the support they need to continue excelling. We work with our county partners to identify additional workforce solutions, research, and additional incentives they can utilize. Additionally, we have an economic data resource tool on our website that provides demographics, force characteristics, wages, and spending data. NESA is also here to assist our existing industry with analyzing that data as needed.





REGIONAL ECONOMY


The regional economy proved to be resilient again in 2024. The sustained low unemployment rate, coupled with stable employment figures, modest GDP growth, and increasing wage levels, suggests the region as a whole is poised for continued prosperity. The research team at NESA will continue to monitor the regional economy and keep our partners informed on key economic data and trends as we move into 2025.

Average Annual Wages

Average annual wages in the NESA region was \$47,776 per worker in 2024 as of the second quarter. This was a 2.5% increase from the same quarter a year prior, and a 28.7% increase since 2019Q2.




Real Gross Domestic Product

As of 2023 (the most recent data available), regional Real GDP grew by 2.4% year-over-year, reaching \$33.2 billion.


Regional Unemployment Rate





BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT


NESA's business development initiatives are designed to promote job creation and attract significant capital investment to our nine-county region. These efforts focus on building strong relationships with companies, consultants, brokers, the South Carolina Department of Commerce, and other key allies. In 2024, our business development team engaged with hundreds of company executives, brokers, and consultants through multiple targeted marketing missions.

Over the course of the year, NESA added 64 projects to its pipeline. Collectively, these projects represent more than \$20 billion in potential capital investment and over 13,100 potential new jobs. While the total number of verified projects in the pipeline was slightly lower than the previous year, the average scale of each project remained impressively robust.


These efforts culminated in 13 announcements across the region in 2024, resulting in \$164.7 million in new capital investment and the creation of nearly 500 new jobs. These achievements highlight the region's ongoing commitment to fostering economic growth and opportunity.

PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT

The NESA Executive Committee annually authorizes grants to our county partners and allies to maximize the regional impact of key projects which align with NESA's mission and that help to impact other economic development efforts throughout the region. Our county partners each have the opportunity to submit grant applications for both our County Grants and High Impact Grant programs each year. In 2024, the NESA Executive Committee approved grants totaling \$459,000. The following represents the grants that were awarded:



FLORENCE COUNTY

was awarded a NESA High Impact Grant to assist with funding towards a new two-mile boulevard road.



DARLINGTON COUNTY

was awarded a NESA County Grant to assist with the overall cost of strategic planning. for economic development.



HORRY COUNTY

was awarded a NESA County Grant to assist with the cost of lead generation services and website traffic.



WILLIAMSBURG COUNTY

was awarded a NESA County Grant to assist with the cost of updating their strategic plan.

RESEARCH

NESA continues to position itself as a key data resource. NESA has access to numerous information sources providing demographic, workforce, and economic data, among others. The data NESA can provide is useful for a variety of applications: industry recruitment, industry expansion and retention, and community development. These efforts proved vital to our county allies in particular, as the research department completed over 334 activities in 2024 alone with the majority of efforts focused in data analysis and business development.

We held our annual fall conference at the Marina Inn at Grande Dunes with presentations by Bethany Greene, a Regional Economist at the Charlotte Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, and Al Simpson, the Managing Partner at Due South Advocacy. The conference was wrapped up with an evening of networking, dinner, and jazz band music from Coastal Carolina University's Music Department.

Our fusion lunch experiences provided opportunities for investors and developers to connect in a more relaxed and conversational setting, and explore state and regional offerings such as SC Ports Authority Charleston, Inland Port Dillon, Honda Manufacturing of SC, Lift Academy, and Robinson Nuclear Plant.

We look forward to having a full calendar of events this year that will provide updates on current affairs and connect our county allies and investors.
