



WILD WATERS

Navigating Nature's Power in the Heart of the Reserve

In late January, an elephant calf tragically lost its life in the floodwaters of the iMfolozi River. The body was discovered at the lowlevel bridge near the Mtubatuba Sugar Mill on a Saturday afternoon, a somber reminder of nature's unpredictability.

The river had been swollen from weeks of heavy rains upstream, and its destructive force was evident as it burst its banks, reaching up to 1 km in width at the N2 bridge near KwaMsane.

Last Monday, the Black iMfolozi River rose dramatically, making the route to Mpila Camp impassable. What was even more concerning, however, was the reckless behavior of some visitors who got too close to the danger. Many left their vehicles to take photos, and some allowed children to

throw sticks into the powerful floodwaters, completely forgetting that they were in a wildlife reserve filled with crocodiles, elephants, lions, and leopards, among other dangerous creatures. While the sight of a flooded river is undeniably interesting, it's an important reminder that this is a wild habitat, and visitors must respect the power and unpredictability of nature. CAUTION

News Update

This week, the bridge between Point 4 and 5 in the Hluhluwe section, on the way to Hilltop Camp from Nyalazi Gate, also succumbed to floodwaters. Visitors had to take a detour through Memorial Gate. Eventually the water receded, leaving behind vast sandbanks.

Though the Zululand rains often bring out spectacular wildlife sightings, like African wild dogs, lions, and cheetahs, and offer photographers a chance to capture the landscape in a new light, it's crucial for visitors to be prepared.

Make sure your vehicle is ready for the unpredictable weather, plan your trip carefully, and always remain cautious both on the roads leading to the reserve and within it. The wonders of the wild are best appreciated with respect for its power and unpredictability.





WEDNESDAY WHY DAY!

Why do Bat-Eared Foxes switch gender roles?

Bat-eared foxes have a fascinating social dynamic that sets them apart from many other species. Firstly, some mammals are monogamous and mate for life, such as the tiny dik-dik. Other mammals have a harem system, with one dominant male getting all the females. Bat-eared foxes are relatively unique in being polygamous. The core of the family is a male and female (think husband and wife) that mate for life. However, after a year or two, the male will often take on a second wife. As the family increases, the male can even get a third longterm mate, although this behaviour has only been observed on a handful of occasions. Bat-eared foxes flip traditional gender roles. Females give birth to 3-6 cubs each year, but the males then perform typical female roles. Males will groom, play, babysit, and rear their young. They will also guard the den against predators. During this time, the females will forage and feast on insects. Females need more nutrition as they have to give milk to the pups. In comparison, the males only need to lie around and play! Researchers found evidence of a direct correlation between childcare and survival. When males stayed longer in the den, the cubs were more likely to survive. It's a brilliant example of how different species adapt their behaviors to suit their environments and improve their chances of survival.

A MISSION OF HOPE

Wilde Tracks and Heroes of Hope Embark on a Conservation Adventure in South Africa A unique team set foot in the wilds of KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa, united by a single mission: to protect rhinos and strengthen bonds across borders.

This was no ordinary conservation trip. Led by Wilde Tracks, a conservation-focused travel organization founded by Chloe Evans, and in partnership with Heroes of Hope, a UAE-based organization supporting children and adults with additional needs, the expedition exemplified the power of diversity and inclusion.

Supported by Wild Connection and Wildlife Solutions Africa, this mission was more than just about saving animals; it was about empowering people from all walks of life to make a difference.

Wilde Tracks, driven by Chloe's vision, operates with a deep commitment to conservation and sustainability.



Through their "travel with purpose" tourism model, the organization strives to bring participants face-to-face with the natural world in meaningful ways, aiming to inspire them to advocate for wildlife conservation and support sustainable futures for communities.

Heroes of Hope, founded by Hollie Murphy, shares a similar ethos of empowerment. As the largest sports academy in the UAE for People of Determination (PODs), Heroes of Hope serves over 800 individuals with special needs and their families.



Their programs offer diverse sporting and fitness activities, from athletics and swimming to functional fitness and tennis, fostering an inclusive community that embraces athletes of all nationalities and abilities.

For five unforgettable days, Wilde Tracks and Heroes of Hope camped in the wild, a family of ostriches their closest neighbors. The group of five brave individuals from Heroes of Hope, alongside Wilde Tracks and wildlife experts embarked on a conservation mission to dehorn two white rhinos and fit a transmitting pod on a black rhino, vital steps in monitoring and protecting these endangered animals.

In one particularly moving moment, they dehorned a young white rhino calf that had never been dehorned before. On processing the DNA, the group and reserve management lovingly named this little calf "Hero" after Heroes of Hope and in honor of the children and young adults whose courage inspired them.

For many of the participants, it was a journey beyond their comfort zones. Living in tents, they spent their days exploring and laughing together, sharing stories, and braving close encounters with wildlife.

Each and every day brought amazing wildlife sightings, and many magical memories. For some, it was their first time away from their parents, and the experience became a profound lesson in independence and self-discovery. The trip was filled with heartwarming and emotional moments - moments of camaraderie, pride, and a newfound appreciation for the resilience of both humans and animals alike.









Chloe Evans, reflecting on the experience, shared, "This is by far the best trip to Africa I've ever had. I'm sure it'll take a lot to top it." The success of this mission underscored the importance of giving everyone equal opportunities to participate in meaningful conservation efforts.

It was a reminder that when people of different backgrounds and abilities unite for a common cause, they can achieve incredible things, bringing hope to the wild places and animals that need it most.



As we entered the Manyoni Private Game Reserve, only a 15 minute drive from Hluhluwe, we were greeted by the playful antics of impalas and buffalos, their figures silhouetted against the distant mountains, still draped in the quiet hush of dawn. Driving along the pristine, wellmaintained roads, we arrived at Luleka Safaris where the Guides welcomed us with warm smiles.

After a quick introduction and a brief rundown of the rules, we ventured into the grassy plains, where bursts of wildflowers added a touch of color to the landscape, offering a fresh, vibrant perspective of the Reserve. Along the way, we passed kudus, gracefully springing into motion with the rising sun, while vultures perched on the riverbed and in the trees. 

A Deep Dive Into the World of Humpback Whales

Get to Know the Humpbacks

The humpback whale (Megaptera novaeangliae), a majestic marine mammal from the family Balaenopteridae, is known for its striking appearance and remarkable behavior. With an average length of 16 meters and weighing between 25 and 40 tons, adult humpbacks have a large head with a pointed snout, a string of fleshy knobs, and jagged leading edges on their enormous pectoral fins.

Their relatively narrow tail stock and broad flukes, with irregular trailing edges, make them easily recognizable. Humpbacks are dark grey on their upper bodies with a lighter-colored chin, throat, and flukes, while their undersides are often a mix of black and white. These incredible whales primarily feed on krill and small fish like mackerel and sardines, and their populations, though slowly recovering from the devasting impact of commercial whaling, remain much smaller than in the past.






Humpback whales are known for their migratory patterns, spending time near coastal areas for breeding and feeding on shallow banks, before migrating across open seas. In their pods of five to ten, humpbacks may work together to herd prey, using a remarkable technique called a "bubble net" to trap zooplankton, which they then consume.

The Migration

Humpback whales are known for their long migrations, primarily driven by breeding needs. As winter sets in, they leave the colder southern waters in search of the warmer northern waters, where they breed. St. Lucia is an ideal destination for whale watchers, offering nearly guaranteed sightings each season. However, the migration is not only lengthy and challenging but also dangerous, especially given the ongoing whaling activities in some countries like Japan.

Humpback whales are known for their playful behavior, often breaching (lifting out of the water) to eliminate parasites, communicate, or simply for fun. These magnificent creatures can live up to 50 years, and one of the longest recorded migrations was a staggering 18,840 km, an impressive feat considering their immense size and weight. Humpback whales are truly beautiful, gentle giants that never fail to captivate those lucky enough to witness them in the wild.

We've all been there - sitting at a picnic site at Mpila Resort or Hilltop Resort in Hluhluwe-iMfolozi Park, enjoying the sounds of nature when suddenly, we're being watched by vervet monkeys (and even Samango monkeys) perched in the trees, eyes locked on our food. The tension builds as they drool over our sandwiches, fruits, or snacks. Time and again, we witness them swiping bananas from the car boot, snatching burger rolls from the picnic table, and even leaping into the car to steal a loaf of bread.

A guest also shared an unsettling experience at Mpila Resort, where a vervet monkey attacked her. Part of the reason the monkeys feel so comfortable around us is because, over the years, some people have been feeding them. While these mischievous monkeys might seem entertaining, feeding them is not only harmful to them but also disrupts the entire ecosystem.

DON'T FEED WILD ANIMALS -A FED ANIMAL, IS A DEAD ANIMAL.

WHY YOU SHOULD NEVER FEED MONKEYS IN GAME RESERVES

Feeding monkeys disrupts their natural behavior. When they are fed by humans, they begin to associate people with food, which encourages them to rely on handouts instead of foraging for their own food. This not only makes them less capable of surviving in the wild, but it also leads them to approach visitors more frequently, increasing the risk of conflict. Human food is also harmful to monkeys.

They are adapted to a specific diet of fruits, seeds, insects, and vegetation, and feeding them human snacks like chips, bread, or sweets can lead to malnutrition, obesity, and digestive problems. These unnatural foods weaken their immune systems, making them more susceptible to disease, and they may even transmit illnesses to other animals and humans.

Feeding monkeys can also escalate human-monkey conflict. As they learn to associate humans with food, they may become more aggressive when they're not fed. This behavior can result in monkeys stealing food from picnic tables, cars, or even guests.


In some cases, monkeys may resort to biting or scratching, creating safety concerns for both people and animals. When monkeys rely on humans for food, it disrupts their role in the ecosystem. In the wild, they contribute to seed dispersal and pest control, but when they stop foraging naturally, they no longer fulfill these important ecological roles.





This imbalance can affect plant life and the overall health of the environment. Lastly, feeding wildlife in Game Reserves is often against the rules. These regulations are designed to protect the natural behaviors of animals, ensure their survival, and preserve the environment. Ignoring these rules can undermine conservation efforts, which aim to keep animals wild and ensure they can thrive without human interference.

RESPECTING THE HIPPOS ROAMING THE STREETS OF ST. LUCIA

Not so long ago, an elderly man in St. Lucia had a narrow escape after a terrifying encounter with a hippo. While filming the hippos grazing along McKenzie Street, he ventured too close for comfort. Without warning, the hippo charged, knocking him to the ground.

Luckily, before it could inflict serious harm, the animal was distracted by the loud cries and screams of onlookers, which caused it to retreat. It's believed that a single bite could have been fatal. While hippos roaming freely in St. Lucia provide an incredibly unforgettable experience for tourists and residents alike, they are still incredibly dangerous creatures.

This incident serves as a vital reminder of the risks involved in interacting with wild animals, emphasizing our responsibility to be self aware and protect ourselves and wild animals that are only trying to survive.



Hippos are unpredictable, and despite their somewhat docile appearance while grazing, they are one of Africa's most aggressive animals.

Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife has issued a strong warning for both tourists and locals to respect the presence of hippos and maintain a safe distance at all times. In St. Lucia, hippo sightings are common, but as Musa Mntambo, spokesperson for Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife, points out, there are over eight signs around the town warning of their unpredictable nature.

Tips & Tricks to stay safe

Safety for both humans and hippos is equally important. To protect these magnificent creatures in their natural habitat, we must take precautions to avoid intruding on their space. By doing so, we help ensure peaceful coexistence, allowing us to enjoy the incredible privilege of witnessing these animals in their natural environment.



Pay attention to hippo warning signs. These signs are placed around the town and should never be ignored.

Don't wander at night on foot. Hippos leave the water at sunset to graze and can travel up to 10 kilometers overnight, often passing through the streets of St. Lucia. They are difficult to spot at night even with a torch light, and many accidents occur when they are hit by vehicles.

Be cautious when walking or cycling between sunset and sunrise. This is when hippos are most active. Ensure any trails or activities are completed before sunset. Respect their space -During the dry months, hippos may wander into residential gardens in search of food. However, never attempt to feed them or provide them with any unnatural water sources.

Don't approach or attempt to interact with hippos. If they feel threatened, they will attack. Hippos are extremely territorial, especially around their young. Avoid the water - Hippos are fast in water and are highly protective of their territories and calves. Never venture into water where they are present.

Tips & Tricks to stay safe

Respecting their space not only keeps us safe but also allows the hippos to thrive undisturbed, offering us peaceful sightings in return. Let's commit to responsible and ethical wildlife encounters, respecting animals like St. Lucia's hippos to ensure their safety and preserve their natural habitats for generations to come.



Don't get between a mother and her calf. This is one of the most dangerous situations, as a mother will fiercely defend her young.

Know the signs of aggression. A hippo's yawn is not a sign of sleepiness - it's a warning. This display of their massive, razorsharp teeth is meant to intimidate and can be a precursor to an attack.

Do not disturb them, tailgate or drive too close towards them. Respect the hippos, keep your distance, and stay at least 30 meters away from them. While St. Lucia's hippos are part of the town's charm, they demand to be treated with caution and care. Always remember, you are a visitor in their wild world, and it's best to admire them from afar.

When admiring hippos in St. Lucia, it's important to be mindful of their comfort. Avoid using flash photography or shining bright torches/car lights directly into their eyes, as this can be disturbing to them and interfere with their grazing. Hippos, like all wild animals, are simply going about their lives, and it's crucial to observe them peacefully and ethically.

With unwavering determination, the team embarked on a race against time, building a secure, welcoming environment for the orphans. Within weeks, a 3.5hectare boma was constructed for two of the oldest orphans, Storm and Nandi.

On March 14th, 2017, the sight of the two black rhinos tentatively exploring their new safe home marked a monumental momenta triumph of hard work, care, and compassion. But this was just the beginning. The team, fueled by dedication, turned their focus to the remaining orphans in need of constant care.



Thanks to the remarkable support of Container Conversions, a facility was quickly set up, complete with a kitchen for milk preparations and cozy sleeping quarters. By April, the two white rhinos, Makhosi and Isomiso, along with their little hippo companion, Charlie, found their new sanctuary, safe from harm.

However, just as the orphans were settling in, a heart-wrenching call came in - another young calf, this time from a neighboring reserve, had survived six days beside the lifeless body of his poached mother. Though their spaces were already filled, the Zululand Conservation Trust team didn't hesitate. They immediately began constructing a temporary living space for the tiny calf, who was named Ntoto.





A beacon of hope


From the great ashes of tragedy, the Zululand Rhino Orphanage was born. But what began as an emergency response to great devastation has blossomed into a story of hope and survival.




Storm's Remarkable Journey to the Wild

In 2015, Storm has been spotted confidently interacting with a female black rhino, a beautiful sign of his return to the rhythms of the wild. This February, sightings of Storm reveal a healthy, independent young rhino, proving just how far he's come.

Thanks to the unwavering dedication of those who believed in him and never gave up, Storm is now flourishing in his natural habitat, embodying resilience and hope for the future of his species. His story is a testament to the power of care, compassion, and a second chance at life.

Last month, we had the privilege of visiting the Zululand Rhino Orphanage - an experience both heart-wrenching and inspiring. Hidden away in a location kept secret for their protection, this sanctuary is dedicated to the survival and recovery of orphaned rhinos. Witnessing these majestic creatures, once orphaned by the cruelty of poaching, is emotional. Yet, what truly leaves an impression is the incredible resilience they've shown, thanks to the unwavering commitment of the staff and volunteers who work tirelessly to nurture them back to health.

As the relentless heat of Zululand beat down, nothing could dampen the spirits of the baby rhinos, who eagerly anticipated their next feed. It's an orchestrated ballet of care -the feeding, the attention, the connection, all executed with precision and purpose. Each staff member is assigned a rhino, and everything unfolds with an almost rhythmic order.

Every step, from feeding to care, is performed with an elegance that mirrors the dedication invested in these remarkable animals. It's a delicate balance between compassion and survival, between the nurturing hands of the caretakers and the dark reality faced by these animals -proof that in the battle between life and death. sometimes the greatest heroes are those who quietly work behind the scenes, one feeding, one day at a time.







It's amazing to think about how much goes into their daily care. For example, the amount of milk needed is staggering: 2,688 milk feeds which adds up to 10,087 liters! The costs are equally impressive:

- **Milk:** R1,900 per 20kg bag, R380 per rhino per day, R11,400 per rhino per month, R136,800 per rhino per year.
- **Teff:** R130 per bale, 1.5 bales per rhino per day, costing R195 per rhino per day, R5,850 per rhino per month, R70,200 per rhino per year.
- Lucerne: R180 per bale, 0.5 bales per rhino per day, costing R90 per rhino per day, R2,700 per rhino per month, R32,400 per rhino per year.
- **Pellets:** R410 per 40kg bag, costing R9 per rhino per day, R270 per rhino per month, R3,240 per rhino per year.

All in all, **food costs total** R674 per rhino per day, R20,220 per rhino per month, and R242,640 per rhino per year.

Then, there are the **medical expenses**:

- Medication & sterilization: R5,000 per rhino per year.
- Basic veterinary care: R5,000 R10,000 per rhino per year.
- Horn trimming: R5,000 per rhino per year.

All **medical costs** range from R15,000 to R20,000 per rhino per year. It's a huge undertaking, but it's clear that the passion and care shown at the orphanage are helping these rhinos overcome immense challenges. The dedication of everyone involved is truly remarkable.

They show that tough moments can either make you or break you if you let them. Embracing your inner animalistic side increases your resilience.

'When you get tired, you wake up the next day and keep going. You don't just quit because things get tough; that would destroy your purpose. Animals are a reminder to keep going, no matter what.'



You have to accept that as much as you love these animals, nature can be brutal and unfair. The best way to cope? Enjoy the moment, love in the moment. Their memory lives on in my heart and the photos I took. Losing animals you love is painful, but it teaches you to accept the circle of life and mortality. It teaches you so much about yourself, and I cherish all the bonds I have with the animals.

As Guides, we're often told not to form bonds with animals, but it's difficult

not to. When you spend so much time with them, you get attached. You learn their behaviors, their mannerisms, and you see their playful side. It's incredible when they trust you. I was obsessed with particular lions and spent hours learning about them. They would come close to the vehicle, and we built a bond. Then, after about six or seven months into my Guiding career, they passed away, and it shattered me.





The reality is that one wrong move with animals like lions can lead to injury or worse. It puts a lot of pressure on you.

The hardest part, for me, is dealing with language barriers. Guests come from all over the world, and when English isn't their first language, you have to adapt. Google Translate becomes your best friend. The long hours are mentally exhausting, and sometimes, people clash in the same environment. You need to learn how to manage conflict.

The unpredictable side of the job is that no two guests are the same & that adds to the

challenge. Safety is always a concern in the bush, especially when something like a pride of lions walks by during the guest's sundowners. Whether its wild animals or people that add to the unpredictable nature of this job -I have learnt that you can't take things personally in this job, or it will break you.

There are moments when you feel overwhelmed and want to give up, but then nature seems to know exactly when you need a boost.

Sometimes it's a dominant bull elephant coming up to the vehicle or a cheetah with one eye getting close to us. There's something magical about seeing a lioness playing with sticks or young leopards resting in trees. As much as we see the ferocity of nature, we also witness its beauty and humbleness. Nature is a coin with two sides, and the pros and cons balance out.

I've had some very dangerous

encounters. Once, while setting up for breakfast, I walked behind the vehicle and saw a lioness on a kill. She roared and growled, however, thankfully, she stayed calm, and our guests had an incredible sighting. Another time, I had a very close encounter with a bull elephant in musth during sundowners. It's a bit nerve-wracking, but you trust your instincts and stay calm. Elephants have this unspoken judgment - they assess you to see if you're a threat. I've also been chased by a troublemaker elephant, only for the matriarch to step in and chase him off.




That was humbling. We also spent two hours stuck behind a breeding herd of elephants on a mountain pass. I had to calm the guests, and the matriarch protected us by pushing another elephant into the bush. Nature will humble you -complacency in this line of work can be dangerous.



My future goal as a Guide is to become a Professional Guide. It requires more studying and practical experience, which is my current focus. I've always dreamed of running an animal rehab center for wild cats and dogs -rehabilitating wild cats and giving them a forever home if they can't be rewilded. I'm also focused on obtaining my professional field guide qualification, learning more about wildlife photography, conservation, animal behavior, and helping endangered species.

My advice to anyone that wants to follow this path is - chase your

dreams, it's never too late. I found the courage to pursue mine at 30, and two years later, I haven't looked back. Life is amazing. The reality of this job is often romanticized. You think you'll just drive off and see incredible wildlife, but that's only the tip of the iceberg. As a guide, you're always learning. When you're not guiding, you're helping around the lodge, hosting guests, setting up trail cameras - there's always something to do.



Expect long hours. My day starts at 4 a.m. and ends at 11 p.m. You just keep going. If you have a passion for wildlife and making a difference, the long hours and tough moments will be worth it. There will be days you question whether you're in the right job, but nature will remind you that you are. Just keep fighting.

Don't go in with rose-tinted glasses - you should expect the unexpected. It will be a rollercoaster, but the best one. Reach out to guides, ask for advice, and learn about different reserves and lodges. Guides are humble and honest, and their advice can help you decide if this path is for you. Never give up, find a good mentor, and you'll be great.

An unforgettable moment: Finally getting to meet the Lions of HluhluweiMfolozi

It's that time of year once again - the perfect moment to unwind as 2024 comes to a close. A chance to enjoy some quality time with yourself and your loved ones before diving back into the hustle and bustle of everyday life. If you've been following our adventures, you likely already know our favorite spot to relax and recharge.

Yes, you guessed correctly, we were at Hluhluwe-iMfolozi Reserve, and this time, we were truly spoiled. It was a very hot weekend, but the animals didn't seem to mind the heat at all. As we transitioned into the summer season, we had to adjust our setup to stay comfortable. During the winter, we keep three blankets and a heated blanket in the camper, along with a mini gas heater, which we use depending on where we're staying. The Midlands in Pietermaritzburg or the Drakensberg can get quite chilly, so it's essential to be prepared.

In contrast, KZN summers can be scorching, so all the blankets and heaters are packed away, and we store them at home. We replace them with a light duvet and pack our rechargeable mini fans and a portable air conditioner to help keep cool. During our weekend in Hluhluwe, temperatures soared to 38 degrees.

Without a pool to cool off in, staying in camp became unbearable. Fortunately, our trusty ice-filled bucket to dip our feet in was a real game-changer. We ended up spending most of our time driving through the park, where we could escape the heat and enjoy the airconditioned comfort of our vehicle. Even with the sweltering heat, we were fortunate enough to spot so many animals, and we crossed an incredible sighting off our bucket list! Before I tell you all about our experience, let me remind you that we've visited the reserve countless times over the past two years. Yet, despite our many trips, we've never been lucky enough to spot the majestic creature we often refer to as the "King of the Jungle" - the Lion. Can you believe that? After so many visits, we still hadn't seen one.

Leading up to this trip, we'd heard that the lions had been spotted on the iMfolozi side of the reserve. We were thrilled, but also realistic, knowing that lions don't stay in one place for long. They travel vast distances, either hunting or patrolling their territory. On the day we arrived at Hluhluwe, we received an update that the lions were still in the area. We were staying at Nyalazi Campsite, so our plan for the day was to enter from Memorial Gate and make our way to Nyalazi Gate.



Unfortunately, this meant we wouldn't have time to go to the iMfolozi side. That night, we couldn't stop thinking: had we missed our chance? The next morning, our game plan was simple: wake up early and head straight for the iMfolozi side, where the lions had last been spotted.

As we made our way up the winding road, our eyes were scanning the surrounding greenery. Slowly, we approached the top of the hill, and then we saw it - several cars had stopped. We couldn't see anything yet due to the rocks and trees blocking our view, so we patiently waited for the other vehicle to move.



Then it hit us - we had arrived at the famous "Pride Rock." This was the iconic rock formation from The Lion King, where Simba was held up by Rafiki. It was home to the King and his pride. We had often driven past this rock, daydreaming about what it would be like to see a lion sitting there one day. As the vehicle ahead of us pulled away, we crept up the hill, finally able to see past the trees. And there they were - not one, but two stunning lions, side by side, taking shelter from the heat in the shade of the rock. It was like a scene straight out of a Disney movie -our dream had come true! We turned off our engine, and the reserve felt quiet around us. We watched them panting gently in the shade, trying to stay cool. We could've watched them for hours, but soon more cars started to gather, so we reluctantly moved on.

But as we were leaving, we saw something incredible: one of the lions had made its way to the top of Pride Rock. There he was, lying majestically with his back to us, gazing out over the horizon. It was the ultimate sighting—truly unforgettable. For us, this was an incredibly special moment. While we've seen lions before, this was the first time we'd encountered them during a self-drive with Bhejane. This experience is something we'll cherish for years to come.

It's worth noting that, according to the WWF (World Wildlife Fund), lion populations are declining due to habitat loss and human-wildlife conflict. It's vital to recognize and share how important lions are to the ecosystem. They help regulate populations of herbivores, which in turn helps maintain the balance of plants and grasslands. So, if you're ever lucky enough to witness a lion sighting, take a moment to truly appreciate their beauty. 






DUMA (2005) Family/Adventure · 1h 40m

Eventually, Xan reaches Duma's home, where the cheetah reconnects with another wild companion.

In a bittersweet moment, Xan bids farewell to Duma, realizing it's time for his friend to live the life he was meant to. The film ends with Xan reunited with his mother, having grown through an unforgettable adventure. The lesson of Duma is about the importance of freedom and letting go. It shows that love means allowing others to fulfill their true potential, even when it's hard, and highlights the bond between humans and nature.



MKUZE GAME RESERVE IS A LITTLE GEM OF A RESERVE IN NORTHERN ZULULAND -

Full of surprises around every corner, with many distinct biomes that cater for the variety that is Africa's wildlife.

My favorite photo depicting a cautious family of white rhino edging out of the bush, while approaching a waterhole was taken at KuMasinga Hide watering point. The hide itself is almost exactly in the middle of the reserve within the beautiful sand forests, one of several habitats that Mkhuze's remarkable diversity presents. The reserve itself stretches from the slopes of the Lebombo mountains down to the Mkhuze river, which meanders into wetlands and pans, including the large iNsumo pan. The reserve is also part of the greater iSimangaliso Wetland Park and a wide variety of vegetation types cater to a diverse cross section of KwaZulu-Natal's wildlife.

To experience Mkuze, means access to the sand forests, grasslands, and woodlands you would expect in most of KZN, including acacia savannah, but the riverine forest is perhaps the most unique with the majestic sycamore fig forest along the banks of the Mkuze river. While all these habitats present unique fauna and flora, there is one uniting factor where everything diverges and that is at watering points.

The KuMasinga hide is well placed, the hide itself stretches over a watering hole allowing visitors to view game almost at water level while at their most vulnerable. I remember my first impression was that it wasn't a watering hole at all, but a huge mud hole. Then upon closer inspection I realized that water was indeed present, but not a lot. The time of year had a lot to do with that, since it was early spring, and summer rain had yet to make its way to Mkuze.

Naturally, the little water that was present was an extremely valuable resource for the animals lives and was highly contested. Some of the animals travelled many kilometers to slurp from the muddy puddles, while churning up the sludge for others to drink later. It was a humble reminder of how fickle life is and how precariously on the edge of a razor these animals lived. I remember there seemed to be an hierarchy. As if the animals had set a timetable for access. Nyala, the first to arrive, timid steps and cautious glances. Gentle souls, they sipped delicately from the edges of the mud pile.

The Ghosts from the bush

Sometimes pressing the advantage between droves of doves and the odd warthog. The only times the warthog moved was to find a log to get a good scratch. After the Nyala came the wildebeest. A trickle at first. Their jouncing heads moving to a rhythm only they knew, but as they neared the mud patch, that beat grew to a crescendo, with snorts and grunts to add to the beatbox tune. Calves bleated, tempers flared and their stick legs began to churn the mud. The water, ever elusive, gained in consistency and viscosity.


It came to pass that the later arrivals would have to go deeper and deeper just for that serendipitous sip of agua liquidium. Zebra arrived shortly after and their boisterous antics forced the wildebeest to move off. The amount of available water becoming less and less. The tension ratcheted and stallions enforced their will. Teeth and hooves flying. Between the MMA cornucopia, a few kudu snuck in between to gather mouthfuls of muddy sludge. Their distrustful glances centered on the hide and the scent of people in the air.

It took a long while before the animals moved off, but eventually the waterhole was empty again. Just as I was about to give up my observations, someone whispered and pointed. I turned my head, wondering what I would see, when slowly, one apparition defined into a rhino, and then two and so on until five could be seen whispering through the trees. Their movements slow and graceful despite their bulk. They edged out to the watery mud pile. Then squelched through it to where they could drink deeply. There must have been ten people in the hide at this point and not a single person made a noise or moved, so spellbound were we by these incredible behemoths that had just appeared like ghosts from the bush.
