as part of the Southeast Asia One Health University Network (SEAOHUN). MyOHUN at present comprises of 17 universities and 3 ministries under it wings.

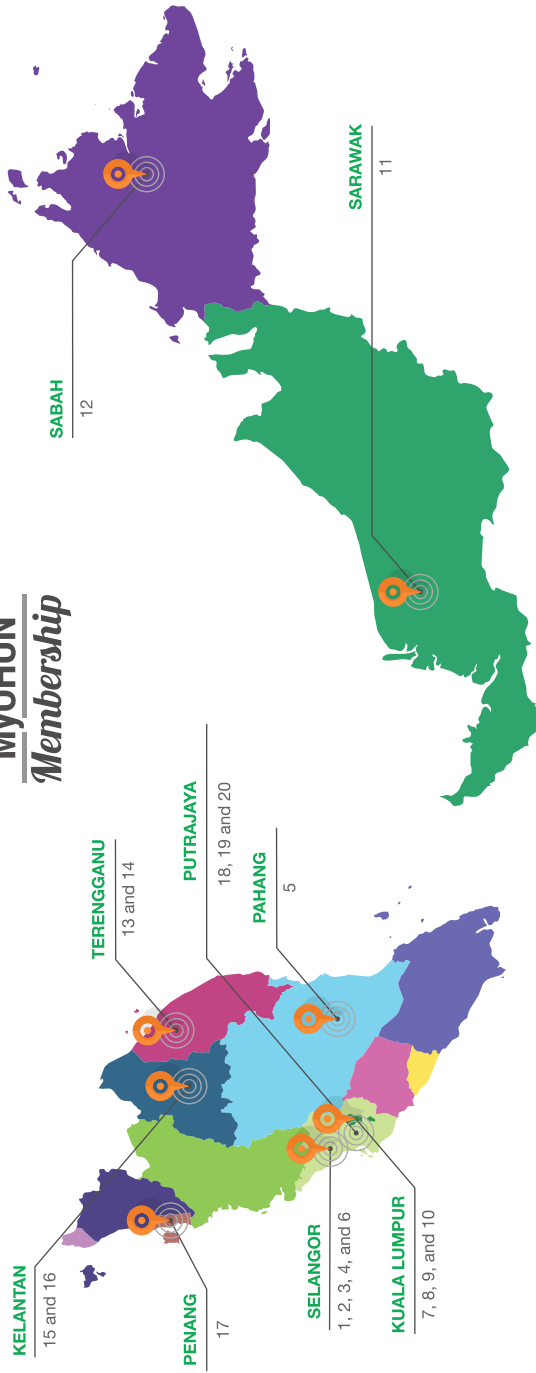

ACTIVITIES





The One Health Disaster Front Liners Module Development Workshop was held from 16th to 19th January 2018 in Ramada Plaza Melaka led by the project leader, Dr. Rosnah Ismail from UKM. A total of 25 balance mixture of academicians and field experience officers from Ministry of Health, National Disaster Management Association (NADIM), National Disaster Management Agency (NADMA), UPM, UKM, Hospital Serdang and Hospital Sultan Ismail Johor Bahru attended the activity. This 4-day training aimed to develop the basic One Health Disaster Front Liner Module covering the four phase of emergency management. A trial-run session to test the module developed previously during the workshop was held on 1st March 2018 at the State Health Department Negeri Sembilan with 16 medical practitioners pass the competency test. Another workshop was held in Le Meridien, Putrajaya from 20th to 21st March 2018 for the refinement of the module. Twenty-one academicians and field experienced officers from ministries, agencies, hospitals, and universities attended the activity to refine the module based on the result of the trial-run session.

The objective of the activity is to improve understanding of the role and prudent use of antibiotics among all related personnel on the significance and importance of AMR. Five hundred ministerial officers and academician attended the activity that started with the seminar on AMR before the launching ceremony of Malaysian Action Plan on AMR. The ceremony was officiated by YB Dato' Sri Ahmad Shabery Cheek, Minister of Agriculture & Agro-Based Industry and YB Datuk Seri Dr. S. Subramaniam, Minister of Health.

The meetings were held to approve and endorse the activities for Year 4 on One Health Workforce Project and discussed MyOHUN future direction after Year 5 of One Health Workforce (OHW) Emerging Pandemic Threat (EPT) II project ended.

Pilot Problem-Based Learning

with Medical, Health Sciences, and Veterinary Undergraduates Students

Prof. Dr. Siti Suri Arshad from UPM led the Pilot Problem Based Learning with Medical, Health Sciences, and Veterinary undergraduates students were held in Faculty of Veterinary Medicine on 6th March and 23rd March in the Office of the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research & Innovation), UPM. A total of 180 students from various disciplines gathered as participants on One Health PBL cases for both sessions which consequently help them to understand the

importance of transdisciplinary network on One Health issues. Forty-five facilitators were involved in both sessions to inculcate the One Health concept among undergraduate students and to assess the comprehensibility of the developed book on the students while creating the opportunity for medical, health sciences and veterinary undergraduate students to work together on One Health cases.





Community Education & Field Training

Among the Jahai School Children in Sungai Tiang on Zoonotic Disease Transmission

Three sessions of Community Education and Field Training on Diseases Transmission Among Jahai School Children were held from 30th March to 1st April, 13th to 15th April, and from 27th to 29th April 2018 at Sungai Tiang in Belum forest located in the state of Perak, Malaysia. This activity led by Prof. Dato' Dr. Abdul Rashid from RCSI & UCD Malaysia Campus (RUMC)

focuses on creating awareness on the risks of zoonotic infections involving the children of the indigenous Jahai people from Sungai Tiang. Each session more than 30 students from UPM, UKM, USM, UTAR, CUCMS, and USIM that came from various background become the facilitators to more than 70 Jahai school children from the age of 6 to 12 years old.





National One Health Workforce Strategic Planning Meeting

MyOHUN National One Health Workforce Strategic Planning Meeting was held in Shangri-la Golden Sands Resort, Penang from 31st March to 1st April 2018 chaired by MyOHUN Chairman, Prof. Dr. Mohd Hair Bejo. This meeting was held to pre-plan the activities to be executed in Year-5 of One Health Workforce project. Forty-seven MyOHUN members attended the meeting and divided into several groups to brainstorm activities and its programme. The groups then presented their plan and submitted pre-planning activity form to the NCO for refinement and follow up.





One Health Field Epidemiology Training

One Health Field Epidemiology Training combining officers and academicians from various disciplines was held from 9th to 13th April 2018 in Miri, Sarawak. Forty-three participants attended the training led by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Razitasham from UNIMAS. This 5-day training aimed at training One health workforce to respond competently to the infectious disease outbreaks using One Health competencies. The activity aimed to produce a training module on field epidemiology using One Health approach. Hence another session of the activity was held from 28th April to 1st May 2018 with six academicians from UNIMAS, UKM, USM, and UiTM gathered together at Hatten Hotel, Melaka to solely focused on developing One Heath Field Epidemiology Module.





Development

of Table Top and Field Simulation Teaching Module

From 20th to 24th July 2018, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Rozita Hod from UKM together with Assoc. Prof. Dr. Razitasham from UNIMAS led the Development of Table Top and Field Simulation Teaching Module in The Puteri Pacific Hotel, Johor Bahru. Twelve participants attended the workshop were the trainers or future trainers for the One Health Field Epidemiology Training Program (FETP) and Table Top activities. The workshop aimed to highlight and develop several important scopes related to the One Health FETP. This 3-day workshop had successfully

developed 12 modules for the FETP consist of Introduction to One Health Field Epidemiology, One Health Concepts and Competencies, Fundamentals of Zoonotic Diseases, Zoonotic Diseases Control and Prevention, Ecosystem and Health, Laboratory Intelligence in Zoonotic Diseases, Surveillance of Zoonotic Diseases, Outbreak Investigation and Management, Risk Assessment, Management & Analysis, Risk Communication, and Special Issues Section. Each module consists of the instructor's guide, teaching materials, teaching notes and references.

Regional Training of Trainers

One Health Problem-Based Book II

Regional Training of Trainers (ToT): One Health Problem-Based Book II was held in Hotel Perdana, Kota Bharu, Kelantan from 29th June until 1st July 2018. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Jalila Abu from UPM led the activity that aims to train facilitators on the use of One Health PBL book 1 and 2 in teaching undergraduate students, as well as to improve the quality of PBL cases from both books based on

feedbacks. Twenty-eight academicians that have different disciplines and from different universities such as UniSZA, UPM, UNIMAS, UMK, IIUM, and UKM attended the activity. Dr. Hellen Amuguni from Tufts University, United States was again invited as the trainer for the activity.





One Health Field Training

for Emerging Zoonoses

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Rozita Hod and team led the One Health Field Training for Emerging Zoonoses that was held in Tenera Hotel, Bandar Baru Bangi and Lipiz Plaza Hotel, Kuala Lipis between 2nd to 5th July 2018. Seventy participants consisting of officers, academicians, and postgraduate students from UKM, UNIMAS, UPM, and UITM with various background participated in this activity along with the active contribution of experts from Sabah State Health Department and Department of Veterinary Services as well as Kuala Lipis District Health Office. Outdoor residue spray and treated bed net as methods of preventive action from malaria and extracting larvae sample from natural habitat were demonstrated by officers from District Health Office while visiting Felda Kechau.





The Problem-Based Learning Training on Wildlife Zoonoses and Ecosystem Health was held in Livingston Hotel and Sepilok Orang Hutan Rehabilitation Centre Sandakan, Sabah from 9th July until 13th July 2018. Dr. Tengku Rinalfi Putra Tengku Azizan from UPM and his team of facilitators from multiple MyOHUN universities trained

40 participants from UPM, UKM, UNIMAS, UMS and Ecole Nationale Veterinaire de Toulouse from medical, veterinary, and environmental background attended the training. Dr. Chris Whittier and Prof. Dr. Stanley Fenwick from Tufts University, United States were invited to become speakers and to facilitate the activity.

Young Leaders and Communicators

One Health Young Leaders and Communicators was held from 16th to 19th July 2018 in Eagle Ranch Resort, Port Dickson. Prof Stanley Fenwick of Tufts University, United States was invited as a speaker and to facilitate the activity along with Dr. Faizal Ghazali as the project leader and his team. The activity trained a total of 49 students from six local universities; UPM, UKM, UTAR, CUCMS, IIUM, and USIM, and four students from three Cambodian universities have the opportunity to participate in the five-day activity. Miss Marilyn Crane from USAID and Mr. Sophea Pech from Cambodia were also present as observers of the activity. The program gathers students from a variety of different fields with the objective to introduce students to the concept of One Health and to provide knowledge on the competencies required in the One Health practice.





National Rabies Simulation Exercise 2018

National Rabies Simulation Exercise 2018 was held from 24th to 26th July 2018. MyOHUN collaborated with DVS Sabah organized the activity in Tawau, Sabah. In this regard, the simulation exercise of rabies is very useful in streamlining contingency plans and regular operating procedures, as well as building a team that acts fast and efficiently in dealing with the epidemic. Fifteen MyOHUN members attended as observers during the simulation exercise.




National Avian Influenza Simulation Exercise 2018

The Ministry of Health in close partnership with DVS and MyOHUN collaborated to organize the National Avian Influenza Simulation Exercise from 14th to 16th August 2018. The focal point of the exercise was the field simulation exercise on 15th August 2018 in which 14 groups were dispatched to 7 locations across Negeri Sembilan. The

simulation exercise was very successful, and MyOHUN looks forward to continuing its involvement in this interagency collaboration. More than 120 officers, health practitioners, and academicians involved with the exercise came from different ministries, departments, hospitals, clinics, and also universities.





The IN-SITU One Health Problem Based Learning for Animal and Human Health was held from 14th to 16th September and from 21st to 23rd September 2018. The program was held at the Deer Breeding Centre, DVS, Lenggong and Matang Mangrove Forest, Kuala Sepetang, Perak with Assoc. prof. Dr. Mohd Hezmee Mohd Nor as the project leader. A total of 174 students from various backgrounds such as biomedical science, medicine, forestry, environmental health, and veterinary participated in the activity. Participants also visited the Matang Mangrove Forest in Kuala Sepetang, Perak to observe the ecosystem health in the forest on the last day of the activity.

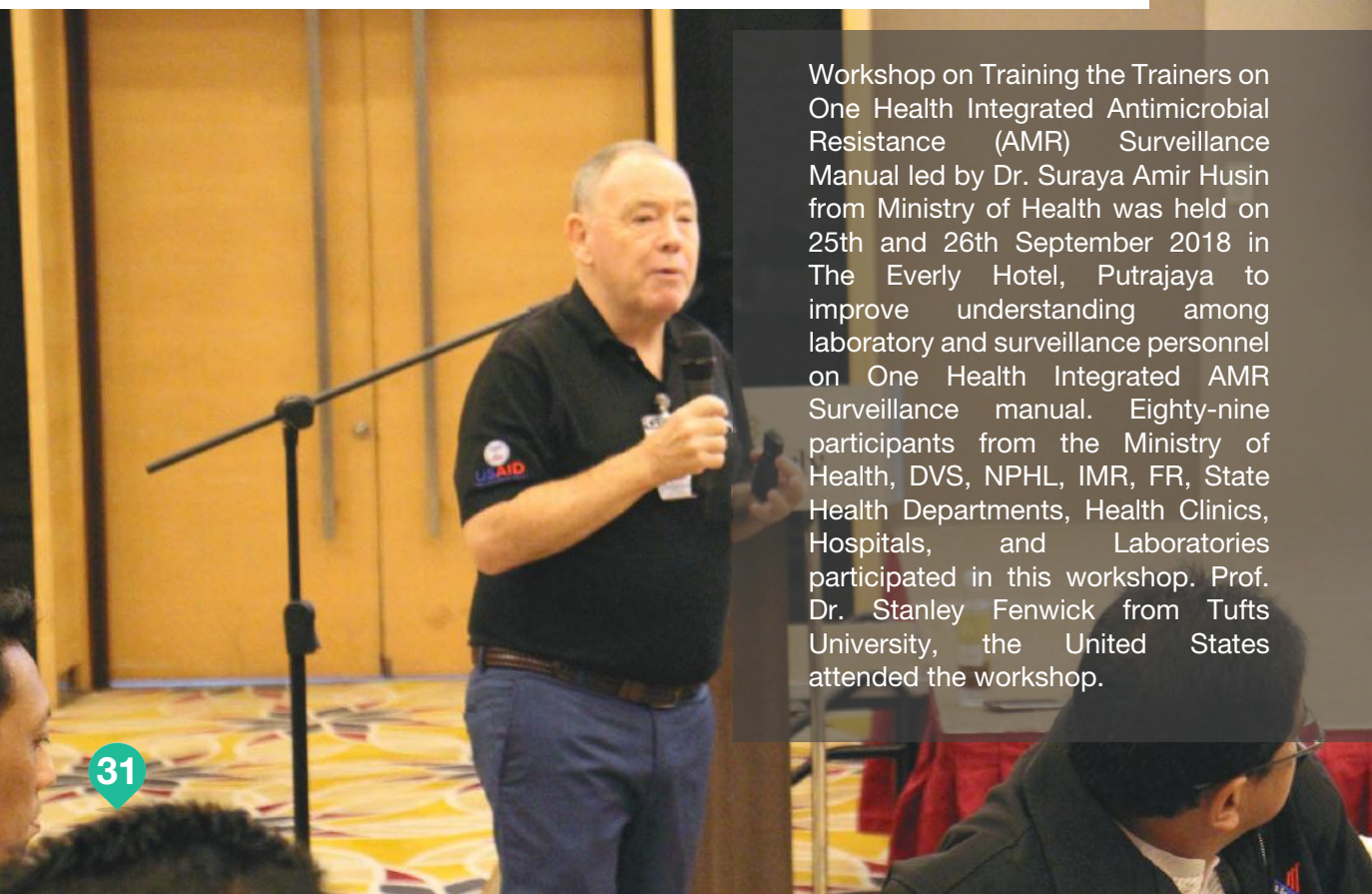
