






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Our Legacy

The American International School Vienna was founded on September 1, 1959. Its predecessor was the Vienna International Community School (VICS), which was founded in August 1955 after the closing of the American and British army schools at the end of the allied occupation of Austria.



1959

The American International School (AIS Vienna) is founded by the Embassies of the United States and Canada at Bauernfeldgasse 40; VICS is dissolved. Enrollment at this time is 234 students representing 17 nationalities.

AIS Vienna is granted access to funding through the Marshall Plan to establish a new campus.

1961

AIS Vienna takes possession of the current 45,000 square meter site on Salmannsdorfer Strasse. Plans for the facilities are in the final stages of preparation.

1964

AIS Vienna begins its first school year on the new campus with 357 students representing 28 nationalities.





1977

AIS Vienna becomes the 72nd IB school in the world, and the first in Austria, to be authorized.

2000

The Stemberg Physical Science Laboratory is constructed thanks to a generous donation from Staples® CEO and owner, Thomas Stemberg (Class of '67).





2012

The Theater (formerly known as the Kino) is reopened after significant renovations, thanks to a successful fundraising campaign and the generous support of community members.

2021

The Elementary School Science & Innovation Lab is constructed thanks to a significant donation from a private donor and generous support from the American International School of Vienna Foundation.





2024

AIS Vienna begins its 65th school year with 800 students representing 80 nationalities.



Revolutionizing the World of Drug Discovery

Since graduating from AIS Vienna, Juliana Hilliard (Class of '11) has embarked on a remarkable journey that is reshaping the future of medical research.

A Foundation Laid at AISV

"I vividly remember the friendships I formed at AISV," Juliana recalls. "It's a unique environment that brought us all together and I remain very close to the friends I made there." Juliana shares that the friendships she fostered back in Kindergarten at AISV have grown into support systems that she still calls upon today.

A Global Pursuit of Knowledge

After graduating from AISV, Juliana pursued higher education in the United States and Germany, earning a graduate degree and building a deep understanding of scientific research. "I then moved back to the United States to experience what it was like to work at a small startup in San Francisco, knowing that someday I would likely want to start my own company. That happened much faster than I expected and I came up with an idea that I felt had to exist in the world and started a company around that idea." Juliana's passion for innovation led her to co-found Parallel Bio, a groundbreaking company that is revolutionizing the world of drug discovery.

Parallel Bio: A New Era of Drug Discovery

Parallel Bio leverages cutting-edge technology to create miniature human organs, enabling researchers to test drugs more accurately and efficiently. As Juliana explains, "Our goal is to replace animal models with human models and dramatically increase the success rate of drug development." This innovative approach has the potential to significantly accelerate the development of life-saving treatments.

When asked how her professional journey led her to this idea, Juliana explains, "I worked in a lab in Vienna during graduate school that invented a way to grow mini 3D human brains in a lab which was a huge leap forward in modeling diseases of the brain. The company I joined in San Francisco asked me to build out their drug discovery platform based on the mini brain technology that I was working on in Vienna. I thought while this approach was great, there was a critical piece missing which was the immune system. It just so happened that my flat mate in San Francisco was working on a similar approach with a group at Stanford, so when COVID hit and the two of us were locked down in San Francisco, we started coming up with ways of fixing the world of drug discovery by combining our backgrounds."

Juliana further explains, "Parallel Bio uses arrays of mini human organs to generate clinical trial-like data on drugs before they reach patients. Currently, creating and testing a new drug costs \$2.8B, takes 12.5 years, and has a 5% success rate. This is mostly because animal models are used to predict human outcomes, but unfortunately animals don't have the same biology or diseases as humans. Our technology uses human systems to solve this problem. We currently work with numerous pharmaceutical companies to design and test drugs in humans from the start. We started with the immune system to fix a critical gap and intend to bring together other organs as well. Our goal is to fully replace animal models with our technology and flip a 95% drug failure rate to a 95% success rate."

Juliana's remarkable achievements are a testament to the power of an AISV education. Her story inspires us all to dream big and follow our passions.

Juliana's advice to future graduates? "Lean into your experience at AISV as you navigate the world ahead. Your experiences with different cultures and different perspectives are invaluable. Stay open to new ideas and new experiences as much as possible. Remember that your ability to connect with different people, adapt to new environments, and communicate across cultures is unique and will set you apart. These are skills that you will be able to use wherever life takes you."

A Lifelong Learner

Thomas Binder (Class of '78) fondly recalls his formative years at AIS Vienna. "I vividly remember all the friendships I made," he shares, emphasizing the enduring impact of those connections. For Thomas, AISV was more than just an educational institution; it was a place where he developed the foundation for his future.

"AISV was a defining part of my life," he says. "It laid the foundation for my career and shaped who I am today." He fondly reminisces about field trips, class projects, sports events, and the camaraderie of the soccer team. "As an Austrian, attending AISV felt like a privilege," he adds. While he may not have been the top student, the school's emphasis on effective learning and social skills proved invaluable. "I always felt that the teachers truly cared about us and gave us the space to grow without too much pressure," he recalls.

After his time at AISV, Thomas pursued a career in medicine. His work at the Medical University of Vienna exposed him to the cutting edge of cardiology and ignited his passion for ultrasound technology. This passion, coupled with his desire to share knowledge with fellow medical professionals, led him to establish 123sonography.

123sonography provides online educational content for doctors and sonographers worldwide, specializing in diagnostic medical ultrasound. The platform aims to democratize access to knowledge and empower healthcare professionals globally.

When asked for advice for current AISV seniors, Thomas offers a thoughtful perspective. "Don't give up on your dream to live on Mars!" he says. However, he cautions against blind perseverance. "Perseverance, or GRIT, is crucial, but it only makes sense if the goal you're pursuing is truly worthwhile, if you have the capability to achieve it, and if there aren't better paths available." He emphasizes that giving up doesn't always equate to failure; sometimes, it's about redirecting energy towards more meaningful pursuits.

A Global Visionary

Shabnam Rezaei (Class of '91), carries fond memories of her time at the school. As she recalls, "My best childhood memories in Vienna are from AISV. I remember the warm feeling of the school, the kindness of the teachers, the vast friendships and fun times with friends on sports trips, speech and debate, math team and hiking trips."

After moving to Vienna from Tehran, AISV became a sanctuary for Shabnam, providing a sense of community and belonging. "Being away from home, family, friends, and familiar foods was very difficult but AISV took the place of all of that for me," she shares. "I learned so much there and made friends for life. I cherish them every day."


Following her graduation, Shabnam pursued higher education in the United States, attending the University of Pennsylvania and later earning an MBA from NYU. Her career took her to Wall Street, where she worked in finance. However, the tragic events of September 11 profoundly impacted her life, inspiring her to embark on a new path.

Driven by a desire to challenge stereotypes and promote cultural understanding, Shabnam founded Big Bad Boo Studios. This animation studio produces children's TV series with purpose, aiming to educate and entertain young audiences while addressing important social issues. As Shabnam explains, "After 9/11, where all Middle Easterners were labeled terrorists, I wanted to affect change and shine a light on cultures that are othered. I first started an online magazine to showcase Iranian culture in a positive way, which led me to animate a film for kids about the Persian New Year, Norooz. This led to the start of Big Bad Boo Studios."

Their shows, including 1001 Nights, 16 Hudson, The Bravest Knight, and Galapagos X, have been featured on major networks like Hulu, CBC Kids, Discovery Kids, Disney, and PBS Kids. "At Big Bad Boo Studios, we produce animated children's TV series with purpose," Shabnam says. "Our latest TV show, Galapagos X, teaches kids about climate change through an action-adventure series where four kids from the future come to the present to prevent disasters from happening."

Shabnam's advice to current AISV seniors is to seize the day and embrace every opportunity. She encourages them to live life to the fullest and make the most of their time at AISV. "You've got one life: enjoy every minute of it!"

From AISV to the Milky Way and Beyond

Grant Allan Anderson (Class of '81) vividly remembers his time at AISV as a period of immense growth and personal freedom. "Freedom and friends, and sports trips," Grant reminisces. This freedom stemmed from the ability to navigate Vienna independently using public transport. "Starting in 7th or 8th grade I could hop on a bus or tram and be anywhere in the city," he recalls, "It helped me grow and become self-reliant." Another defining aspect of his AISV experience was the incredible diversity of his classmates. "Friends, because with social media, I've been able to keep up with them all over the world," Grant shares. "Israelis, Lebanese, Egyptians, Kenyans... the list goes on! It's amazing getting birthday wishes from New Zealand to Mexico, a testament to the global connections formed at AISV."

Sports also played a significant role in Grant's school life. "Sports trips!" he exclaims. "How many kids can think back on trips to Paris, Frankfurt, London, Brussels – and that was just one season?" These experiences provided him with a rich foundation for a life filled with adventure.

When asked about the word that comes to mind when he thinks of AISV, Grant replies simply, "Growth." He credits the school with fostering his independence, global perspective, and passion for exploration.

Life after AISV took Grant on a remarkable journey. After graduation, he pursued his love of engineering at Stanford University, earning degrees in both Mechanical Engineering and Aeronautics & Astronautics. His fascination with aviation began during his first flight across the Atlantic in 1971, and never wavered. While still a student, he gained practical experience working on airline startups and supporting overseas corporate aircraft.

Grant then embarked on a fulfilling career at Lockheed Missiles and Space (now Lockheed Martin), working on classified programs he still can't discuss today. He later transitioned to the Space Station program, eventually becoming the Lead Design Engineer for the Space Station Solar Array Program. "It's nice to watch my work go by high in the sky on a clear night," he remarks with pride.

A pivotal moment was attending the International Space University summer session in 1991. Inspired by the future of space exploration, he co-founded Paragon Space Development Corporation (<u>ParagonSDC.com</u>) in 1993, while still at Lockheed Martin.

Paragon's mission resonated deeply with Grant. "The desire to work in a multidisciplinary environment, requiring all engineering disciplines, biology, chemistry, and innovation," he explains. The company also fosters a unique culture, prioritizing a healthy work-life balance and respect for women in STEM fields.

"Paragon's business territory is the Milky Way Galaxy (for now!)," Grant declares with a touch of humor. They have become a leading innovator in the space industry, contributing to every US human spacecraft design since the late 1990s, including Orion, Dragon, Starliner, and Dreamchaser. They've collaborated with leading figures like Elon Musk and Jeff Bezos, and even helped break the skydiving altitude record.

Grant's experiences have shaped his advice for current AISV seniors. He emphasizes living a life of purpose and fulfillment: "Life is about finding out what you want to do, developing the skills to DO what you want to do, and finding a way to make a life out of those two things."




At AIS Vienna we take pride in our diverse international community, which includes students, teachers and staff of many ethnicities, languages, religions, and nationalities. We celebrate diversity and difference throughout the year at many school events, from International Day to the International Food Festival, to concerts, art shows and more. All in all, 80 countries are included in the makeup of our 2024-2025 student body.



Faculty & Staff

The core of excellence at AIS Vienna is our talented faculty and administration. Each of the three academic divisions (Elementary, Middle, and High School) is headed by an experienced principal with a record of excellence. In addition, our Senior Leadership Team includes the School Director, the Director of Teaching & Learning, the Director of Events, the Director of Technology, the Director of Admissions, the Human Resources

Manager, and the Business Manager. There are also trained and experienced counselors in each of the three divisions, resource staff, and librarians for the Elementary School, and the Middle and High School. A full-time nurse practitioner oversees the school's health unit.

The AIS Vienna Faculty numbers over 100 individual teachers. More than 80% hold advanced degrees, with several having earned doctorates. A substantial majority are U.S. citizens, though the rest hail from around the globe. All AIS Vienna teachers are dedicated professionals who are committed to each student, providing them with extraordinary and personalized care. Each faculty member devotes time to their individual, ongoing development, attending regional and international conferences, IB training, and subject-specific workshops. AIS Vienna employees range in age from 26-67, with an average and median age of around 47. The average stay of a staff member at AISV is over 10 years, which greatly enhances the school's stability and continuity.

Twenty-six countries are included in the makeup of our 2024-2025 faculty and staff.

Please note: As with many international schools, AIS Vienna has a significant number of students and staff with more than one nationality. Our community members' origins are clearly more complex than our data can capture. (Data as of October 2024).

Welcome to the Extraordinary

As guided by our Strategic Plan, AIS Vienna is committed to continuously investing in spaces that support innovative learning. We are excited to be preparing for a new project that will optimize numerous areas across our campus for future generations of Knights.

Over the coming years, AIS Vienna will begin construction on a completely reimagined heart of campus, which we will gain access to through the development of a new Athletic Center.

Throughout the 2023-2024 school year, we participated in a thorough feasibility study to gauge community interest in such an ambitious project. Thanks to feedback from current and former families, AISV's capital campaign will prioritize learning spaces, specifically the expansion of Middle School and High School classrooms, labs and common areas. These upgrades will include a spacious gathering area for the entire school and an upgraded Cafeteria. Moreover, replacing the existing Sports Hall ("Bubble") with a purpose-built Athletic Center will enable us to repurpose both on-campus gyms to create additional learning spaces for students.

Bringing this project to fruition will be a collective endeavor. We intend to garner support from the entire AISV community. While a portion of our funding will stem from reserves and financing, we also aspire to conduct a fundraising campaign to secure generous contributions. 
