Greetings from AISV

A Letter from the Director

An outstanding school not only continually improves educational programs and practices, but also reinvests in its facility to renew and repurpose space and improve access to technology to maximize student learning. Check out some of our most recent renovations!

Thanks in part to the generous support of an anonymous donor, we were able to completely renew our Early Childhood Discovery Garden over the summer. This new space was designed for Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten students to engage in scientific learning of physical, life, and earth sciences through direct manipulation and exploration of natural materials and phenomena such as sand, water, leaves, plants, insects, etc.; and develop fine motor and gross motor skills through climbing, digging, art, and music activities.

The AISV Annual Fund allowed us to furnish the new Middle School Learning Commons, a flexible multipurpose learning space, shared by Middle School faculty, students, staff, and the wider community. It improves upon the previous configuration, increasing flexibility, usability, and aesthetics. It serves as a large group gathering space, facilitates student solo or group work, and offers breakout areas for classroom projects, among a host of other possibilities.

Our renovated Grade 2 and Kindergarten classrooms include major structural changes to create more flexible multipurpose learning spaces, along with important updates to furniture, flooring, lighting, and temperature regulation. The Kindergarten classrooms and Early Childhood Discovery Garden were

purposefully designed together to integrate the indoor and outdoor learning experience.

Thanks to support from the AIS Vienna Foundation, our students are now benefiting from a new cutting-edge LED stage lighting system in the Theater. This transformative upgrade from our previous halogen system is not just a leap in technology but a commitment to sustainability and artistic excellence. The LED system ensures a cooler and more comfortable environment for both performers and the audience. This new modern lighting system not only reduces our electricity consumption in this area by an estimated 75%, but enables students to experiment with color theory in all of our theater and musical performances. It provides opportunities for students who may not be inclined to perform, but are interested in the technical side of the industry, to participate in the arts.

We are thrilled with our recent renovations and improvements to our facility, which have resulted in a more personalized and collaborative approach to student learning. With a number of alumni reunions already in the works for this year and next, I hope many of you find an excuse to come to campus and see all of the exciting developments underway!

Celebrating Achievement: Our IB Results


Congratulations to the 48 students who completed their International Baccalaureate (IB) exams and coursework this past spring!

In September, our Grade 6 STEM elective students traveled to Währinger Skatepark to gather information and ideas on what type of elements they might include in their own skatepark designs. While there, they were extremely lucky to have met Kristopher, a local skater and skatepark fanatic. He spoke with the students about what makes a superior skatepark: a variety of elements made with different types of materials, a prepared flow, and of course it should be challenging and fun. The students really enjoyed their time there and will now incorporate their experience into their designs. This is just one of the many ways the city of Vienna makes up our extended campus and allows us to create authentic learning experiences. We can't wait to see what they come up with!



Visiting Author Ying Chang Compestine

We were delighted to welcome multiple award-winning author Ying Chang Compestine to AIS Vienna this past September. Ms. Chang Compestine discussed her life, books, and writing process with students in Elementary School, Middle School, and High School.



Sparkling Science: Wildlife Crime

Forty-one students are participating in an exciting new program as part of the HS Environmental Science class. Sparkling Science: Wildlife Crime is sponsored by Austria's Agency for Education and Internationalisation and organized by the Natural History Museum Vienna to sensitize students to the topic of illegal wildlife trade and its importance for international species protection.

Throughout this school year, students will visit the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), the Austrian customs office and the Vienna Open Lab. They will also have a virtual meeting with the Snake Farm of the Queen Saovabha Memorial Institute Bangkok and a campus visit from the Crocodile Specialist Group of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN). Students attended a kick-off meeting at the Natural History Museum Vienna on September 21, which included hands-on exercises to learn about international uses of protected species as "medicine", fingerprinting, identifying real vs. imitation specimens, CITES (a multilateral treaty to protect endangered plants and animals from the threats of international trade), and Austria's most vulnerable species.

Special thanks to our students for being engaged and respectful representatives of our community, and to Dr. Hanrahan for enabling us to offer such an innovative learning opportunity.

This is just one of the many ways the city of Vienna makes up our extended campus, with its many cultural offerings.

AIS Vienna Quiz

Here is a bit of background on the AISV Salmannsdorf campus: Mr. Rudolf Hörandner bought this piece of land from Mr. Josef Obrist, who was the former mayor of Salmannsdorf before the turn of the 20th Century. A year later he started construction on the Villa, which cost 1.000.000 Gulden (Mr. Hörandner was a real estate trader). In 1913, he sold the Villa and the gardens around it to Mr. Alfred Heinsheimer, who was a respected banking expert and the general manager of the Austrian Creditanstalt (the biggest bank of the nation back then). In 1926, Annemarie, the only daughter of the Heinsheimer family, married Mr. Paul Imhof von Geisslinghof, a section council member in the Treasury. The pair moved into the Villa after the death of the father. During the hard World War I and II years, Annemarie's heartfelt concern was to help many fellow human beings who had

been persecuted for religious, political, and racial reasons. She was active with advice and action, through housing them on the premises. In 1960, her mother Hildegard sold the property to the "American International School" (founded by the American and Canadian Embassies together in 1959). The construction of a modern campus was finalized in 1964 and classes began.

Question: The main part of the AISV campus is located in the 19th Viennese district, but a small portion (i.e. the Soccer Field and Sports Hall) falls into another district. Which one?
