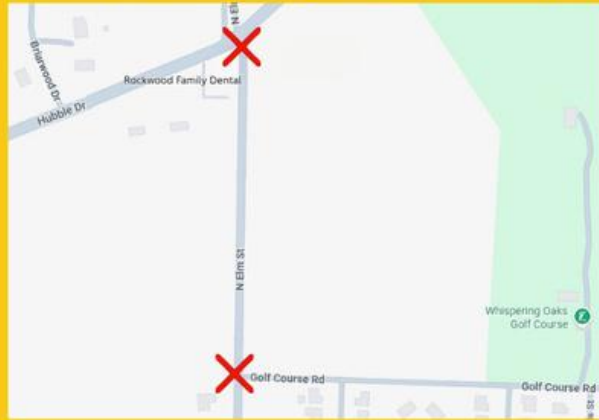

## **ROAD CLOSURE NOTICE**

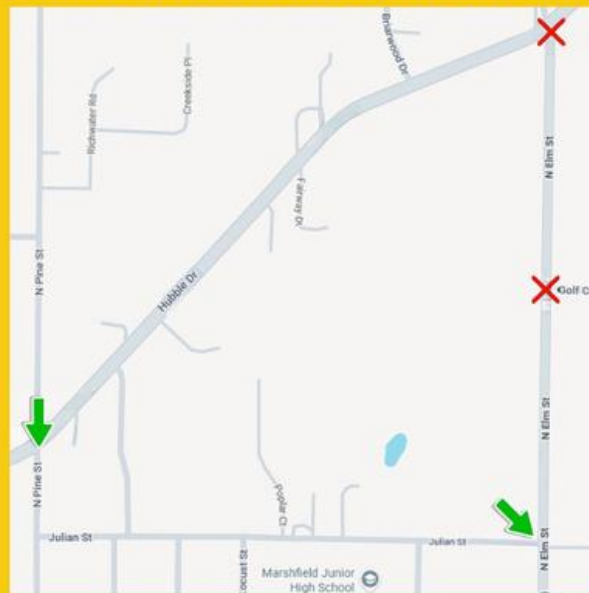
Elm Street will be **closed for two weeks** from Hubble Drive to Golf Course Road **starting Monday April 6<sup>th</sup>**.

On Sunday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, 1880 the town of Marshfield Missouri was nearly blown off the map. In less than a minute the town was almost totally destroyed and 99 people were killed, with 200 more being injured, some left with lifelong disabilities.
