#### Pastor's Corner

- In this season of shutdown and uncertainty, churches must rise as sanctuaries of compassion, not spectators of crisis. The mission of the church is not to wait for government solutions—it is to embody Christ's call to care for the poor, the hungry, and the forgotten.
- The wilderness is never easy. It's dry, uncertain, and often frightening. The Israelites knew this well. After escaping Egypt's oppression, they found themselves furloughed from Pharaoh's economy—no wages, no homes, no food. They panicked. They grumbled. They feared they had been forgotten. But God had not forgotten them. In Exodus 16, the people cried out in hunger, and God responded with provision: "I will rain down bread from heaven for you." Manna appeared each morning. Water flowed from rocks. Leadership was raised up. God made a way where there was none.
- Today, we are witnessing a modern wilderness. The government shutdown has left millions in limbo. Federal employees are working without pay. SNAP benefits are suspended. Healthcare access is disrupted. And while the President tests long-range nuclear missiles, families are testing their limits just to survive. The rich grow richer, the poor grow sicker, and the marginalized slip deeper into the margins.
- It's hard to understand hunger when you've never had to wonder where your next meal is coming from. But for 1.6 million Georgians, that question is no longer theoretical—it's urgent. And while food banks scramble to fill the gap, Governor Brian Kemp has rejected calls to Georgia's \$14.6 billion surplus to fund SNAP, stating, "We're not to bail the federal government out. We don't have enough continued funds to be able to do that."

#### Pastor's Corner



- This moment reveals something deeper: the government was never meant to carry the full weight of caring for the poor. That mantle belongs to the church. Jesus didn't say, "Let Caesar feed the hungry." He said, "You give them something to eat." The mission of the church is not to outsource compassion—it is to live it. And in this season, churches must position themselves to serve. Some of the ways include:
- Designate a portion of monthly giving to help families with utilities, rent, and mortgage payments.
- Increase canned goods and staples in food pantries.
- Donate coats, socks, hats, and gloves to local schools.
- ▶ Collect grocery gift cards to distribute to those in need.
- Provide warm meals to those experiencing food insecurity.
- Commit to advocacy and presence, not just charity.
- But this call goes beyond in-reach. We must be just as intentional about *outreach*. The church cannot afford to operate with an "us" and "them" mentality. We are not a gated community of the blessed—we are a mobilized body of believers called to be a blessing. We must embrace the spirit of "I am my brother's keeper." That means seeing the pain of others as our own, and responding not with pity, but with partnership.
- Politics may polarize, but the gospel unites. While leaders debate, the church must deliver. We are called to be the hands and feet of Christ—not just in worship, but in action. So let us not panic. Let us pray. And let us position ourselves—not for comfort, but for compassion. Because in every wilderness, God still makes a way. And often, we are that way.


#### **Believer's Baptism Opportunity**

#### What is Advent?

The season of Advent, which comes from the Latin word *adventus* meaning "coming" or "visit," begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. Advent is the beginning of the church year for Christians.

During Advent, we prepare for and anticipate the coming of Christ. We remember the longing of Jews for a Messiah and our own longing for and need of forgiveness, salvation and a new beginning. Even as we look back and celebrate the birth of Jesus in a humble stable in Bethlehem, we also look forward anticipating the second coming of Christ as the fulfillment of all that was promised by his first coming.

Although we are accustomed to celebrating Christmas on a single day, in both Christian tradition and on the church calendar, the Christmas season lasts from sundown on Dec. 24 (Christmas Eve) through Epiphany of the Lord (Jan. 6). This is sometimes referred to as "the 12 days of Christmas."

Advent begins with the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day. *This year Advent will begin on Sunday, November 30th and last four full weeks*.

The color for Advent has traditionally been purple, although some churches have adopted blue. In practice, however, as churches increasingly incorporate the symbols and decorations of Christmas during Advent, more and more red, green and gold are appearing. *The United Methodist Book of Worship* upholds the traditional color of purple for Advent, signifying penitence and royalty, but also allows blue, the color of hope."
