131 Pritchard Street, Bluffton, South Carolina. Here you can live on a property with a rich history, in the



"Heart of the Lowcountry". Here you can walk to a spirited, vibrant, eclectic town where the art scene is alive, the food is fresh and the people friendly. The locals will tell you that Bluffton is far more than a "place", it is a state of mind...it is the "Bluffton State of Mind". Here you can combine the best of the past with modern amenities in a home that traces it's history back more than 135 years and yet surrounds you with comfort and conveniences. Here you can enjoy the river life with easy access to all the Lowcountry attractions.

Bluffton was incorporated in 1852 as a one-square mile river town, residing on the bluff above the May River. Summer homes were built on "The Bluff" to escape the heat, and

Bluffton's high ground and cool river breezes provided that relief. The May River has always been the heart of Bluffton

and it remains the town's centerpiece.

Here you can take advantage of the uncompromising stewardship of past owners. From the original owner, Dr. Paul Pritchard in the mid 19th century through his son, Charles Teft Pritchard and plucky daughter-in-law, Ella Agnes Carney, to the restoration owners in the 1990's and on to the current master gardener owner. All have maintained the culture of The Pritchard House while adding to the graciousness of this incomparable home.

The Pritchard House History

Dr. Paul Pritchard, (born 1819), a successful rice planter and a physician in the lower St. Paul's Parish area of South Carolina built the first Pritchard House on the May River bluff as a summer home for his wife, Martha Catherine Kirk, and their six sons. Like most of Bluffton, the Pritchard House was burned by Union forces in 1863. In the mid-1890's Charles Teft Pritchard, one of Dr. Pritchard's sons, built a Carolina-style farm house with Queen Anne elements on the site of the original home. After being abandoned and overgrown for more than 50 years, the Pritchard House has since undergone remarkable renovation work that saw two wings added to the house along with modern upgrades and amenities.

Peter Lamb and Lucy Scardino discovered the property on their honeymoon in 1995. They acquired the property and restored/renovated the home, including modern amenities while remaining sympathetic to the original. Flanking wings on the east and west were added following guidelines for the restoration of houses listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Beekman Webb of Beaufort, an acknowledged preservation expert, was the contractor for the project.

The entire structure was heart pine with 12-foot ceilings paneled with 6" beadboard. The high ceilings are designed to allow the tropical heat to rise and the cooler air below the pier raised structure to flow in through tall windows that disappear into wall pockets. These windows encourage direct assess onto the front (riverside) porch where views of the river are uninterrupted. Four rooms, each with a fireplace, flanked the grand hall, wide enough at the entrance to be a formal living room. The house was canted to face directly into the prevailing southwest breeze. Also, the back rooms away from the river had been built 4 feet wider than the front rooms. This ingenious concept was copied for the addition of the wings, and each wing is connected to the house by a breezeway preserving the wind catcher flanks of the back room so they capture the breeze and the view.

Other buildings on the property were saved and relocated. The original guest/boarding house was moved, renovated and now functions as a 5-star Airbnb cottage.



Guest Cottage

The cottage was moved from its overgrown location to the current site during the 1990's work on the property. Originally Mrs. Pritchard utilized the cottage as a three-room boarding house, explaining the three front porch doors. Some 10 years after the Pritchard House (c.1890) was built, Mrs. Pritchard found herself widowed with 5 children, and in perilous financial shape. She decided to open a boarding house to support her and her family, and constructed a 3-room cottage with a large porch. Each room opened onto the porch, facing the prevailing WSW wind. The cottage was constructed entirely of Long Leaf Heart Pine.

Boarders took their meals in the big house dining room, prepared in the Summer Kitchen (*what is now the garden shed*). Summer Kitchens were detached from the house and sitting in the lee of the building to prevent kitchen fires damaging the main building. They also helped keep the main house cooler.

Today the Cottage is used as an Airbnb (5 Star Guest Favorite Destination).




















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
