ANNUAL REPORT



“The only constant in life is change” said Heraclitus, a Greek philosopher who would have thought 2020, a symmetrical number would bring desperate and radical changes with our free flowing way of life, but it happened quickly without leaving us with any other alternative.

Life took a 360 degree turn in March 2020 when the World grappled with an invisible, deadly enemy trying to understand how to live with the threat posed by the tiny virus.

Lockdown 2020: The first step to control Covid 19 by most countries was a lock down. On March 24, when India had reported only 500 cases, the country went into one of the unforgettable episodes in the history of the world that is Lockdown. Covid 19 pandemic and lockdown measures throughout the world and specifically in India have several ramifications on the education system. Schools were closed. There is a sudden unexpected shift from the traditional classroom based education system to an online based education system. The lockdown has given a good opportunity and ample amount of time for the young students to acquire new skills

through digital platform, to learn moral and family values through frequent family interactions and being more hygienic in addition to attending the online classes conducted by educational institutions. On the contrary there are various challenges with online education system and closure of the educational institutions. This situation requires quick reforms in the education system to embrace digital technology and encouraging personal development of the student fraternity.

Alternative Academic Calendar 2020-21: In this period of Covid-19, which is declared as a global pandemic, when teachers, parents, and students had to remain at homes to prevent its spread in the community. Multiple alternative ways of learning at home through interesting activities were planned by CBSE. It was necessary because in the present environment of stress we had to not only keep our children busy but also to maintain continuity of their learning in their new classes. In this context, NCERT developed an Alternative Academic Calendar for all the stages of school education. The interruption in normal functioning of schools due to lockdown imposed to contain this disease will continue for some more time in near future. As it is a well-researched fact that the protracted suspension of schooling not only disrupts continuous growth of students, but also causes a rapid loss of previous knowledge and skills gained earlier, it is, thus, imperative that we must engage with students through online or teleconferencing means to maintain their rhythm of learning. Our students read news daily, engaged in dance, music, drawing, yoga, cooking, gardening etc. These alternative calendars for classes I-X intended to retain continuity of learning in new classes and provide multiple ways of learning at home through interesting activities. The themes/topics were selected from syllabus and linked with the learning outcomes. Guidelines were developed for conducting interesting activities based on these learning outcomes.

Online Teacher Training Programme: “Technology never replaces teacher, but technology in the hands of the teachers lead to transformation”.

When all the people were still learning to accept the truth, we teachers had already picked up our life jackets and had started preparing for the online classes. We explored various tools, with a strong determination to improve our teaching styles and to make our children ready for the practical and innovative ways of learning. The teachers of HPS focused on the development of all their peers. A schedule was prepared for training and creating awareness among the teachers about the changing situations, where technology was eventually going to take up the major role in the teaching and learning process. Teachers took up the responsibility of training other teachers with one online tool everyday, to be incorporated in the teaching process. All our teachers attended a one day training by CBSE on Happy Classrooms in February taken by Ms. Dr. Vasanthi Thiyagarajan, Sr.Principal & Correspondent, Sishya School, Hosur. Moreover, they attended a 7 days training programme conducted by the Principal in May. All the teachers attended many CBSE online programmes and completed many courses in Coursera and Diksha. They attended sessions on ‘Teaching styles’ by Ms. Srividhya Mouli, Principal, TVS School Hosur and Art Integration by Ms.Vasanthi Thiyagarajan, Sr.Principal & Correspondent, Sishya School, Hosur

In HPS, we too very quickly shifted our base to virtual platforms to conduct online classes catering to the needs of all levels of children from pre-primary to Gr 12. In April & May our students showcased their talents. I would prefer to call my Teachers, Parents and Students as Covid warriors who took up the challenges, stood with me and fought against the adverse conditions.

2020-21 is the 8th year of this great institution. HPS aims to give to our society responsible, honest, dedicated, passionate, committed and upright citizens any nation would be proud of.

Hosur Public School is run and managed by Chandira Choodeswarar Educational Foundation founded and established in 2013. We have nearly 1000 students from Kinder Garten to Gr XII under the stream of CBSE. We provide a nurturing ground for the students, holistic development to feel confident and competent to face the challenges of an ever changing society. Life is not just about gathering information and knowledge. Besides it must be rich with values which I am sure have been ingrained into the children in ample measure here.

Our School offers all the facilities to create the right environment and ambience for growing minds. Spacious classrooms, fully equipped labs, library, counseling cell, kids park, basket ball court, seminar hall, Indoor and outdoor sports facilities. We have 14 own buses plying for the convenience of students. The creativity is awakened through CCA like Yoga, Taekwondo, Guitar, Keyboard, Classical and Western Dances, Abacus etc. Training is given in sports and games like Badminton, Cricket, Kabbadi, Kho-Kho, Foot ball, Volley ball, Rugby, Chess and Carom. We have unique life skill programs, hand writing lab and school cinema. The all round development is possible only through the balanced development of scholastic as well as co-scholastic aspects. To serve this purpose Inter –house competitions are frequently arranged in the sphere of games, art, quizzing, seminars, debates and other co-curricular activities. We have arranged evening NEET & JEE coaching & Holiday classes by Pinnacle a premiere entrance coaching centre and professional training for CA, CMA, CS, ACCA, US- CMA by College of Commerce for the interested students of Grades 9,10,11 &12

AISSE, AISSCE (2020-21)

We have presented the 4th batch of class X students and the 2nd batch of class XII students in March 2020. Our students have performed remarkably well this time as well and secured 100% pass result. The toppers were Nidharshana.R (96%), Niranjana.V (96%), Naren Sridharan (94.6%) and Keerthi Sri.S(92.6%). Among 35 students, 17 got distinction, 15 first class and 4 first class in the AISSCE also, Our students came out with flying colours. S. Vishnu was the school topper with 95%, A. Shabana got second place with 92% and S.Latangi Gowri became third with 85.4% in the science stream.

School reopened virtually for KG to Grade 12 on 1st June 2020. We had many challenges to face. But we didn't stumble. We continued our journey in the online platform with added energy and enthusiasm.

World Environment Day was celebrated by children planting saplings in their homes and neighbourhood. Teachers have been taken to their garden virtually and they discussed the importance of trees and the necessity to protect them.

International Yoga Day was celebrated online. There were speeches by teacher, students and parents. Students sent videos of them doing yoga and they gave awareness on the benefits of practicing yoga everyday.

They applied what they learnt from text books and this was highly appreciated by the Parents. On the last day class wise they were taken virtually to wax museums, planetarium and other places.

A TOUR TO JAMMU & KASHMIR

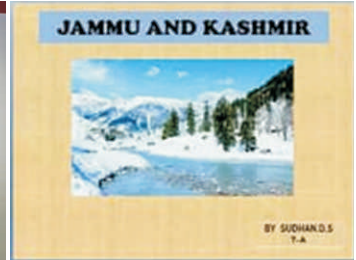
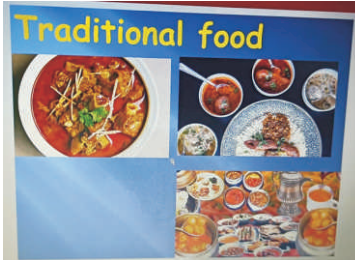
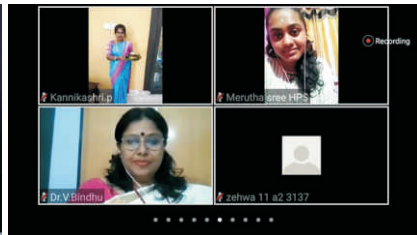
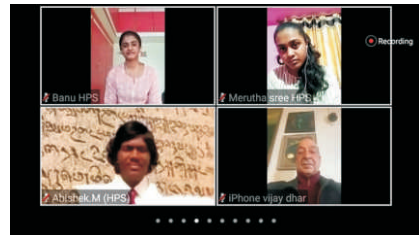

1 CV Raman

Chandrasekhara Venkata Raman won the Nobel Prize for Physics in 1930 for his pioneering work on scattering of light. Born in Tiruchirappalli on November 7, 1888, he was the first Asian and first non-White to receive any Nobel Prize in the science. Raman also worked on the acoustics of musical instruments. He was the first to investigate the harmonic nature of the sound of the Indian drums such as the tabla and the mridangam.

He discovered that, when light traverses a transparent material, some of the deflected light changes in wavelength. This phenomenon is now called the Raman scattering and is the result of the Raman effect.

In October 1970, he collapsed in his laboratory. He was moved to a hospital and the doctors gave him four hours to live. He survived and after a few days refused to stay in the hospital as he preferred to die in the gardens of his Institute (the Raman Research Institute in Bangalore) surrounded by his flowers. He died of natural causes on 21 November 1970.


Before dying, Raman told his students,
Do not allow the journals of the Academy to die, for they are the sensitive indicators of the quality of Science being done in the country and whether science is taking root in it or not.



Homi J. Bhabha

Born on October 30, 1909 in Bombay, Homi Jehangir Bhabha played an important role in the Quantum Theory. He was the first person to become the Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission of India. Having started his scientific career in nuclear physics from Great Britain, Bhabha returned to India and played a key role in convincing the Congress Party's senior leaders, most notably Jawaharlal Nehru, to start the ambitious nuclear programme.

Bhabha is generally acknowledged as the father of Indian nuclear power. But few people know that he was absolutely against India manufacturing atomic bombs, even if the country had enough resources to do so. Instead he suggested that the production of an atomic reactor should be used to lessen India's misery and poverty. He died when Air India Flight 101 crashed near Mont Blanc on 24 January 1966. Many possible theories of the crash came up including a conspiracy theory in which the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) is involved in order to paralyze India's nuclear program.




APJ Abdul Kalam

Ayul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam, born on October 15, 1931 is an Indian scientist who worked as an Aerospace engineer with Defense Research and Development Organization (DRDO) and Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO).

Kalam started his career by designing a small helicopter for the Indian Army. Kalam was also part of the INCOSPAR committee working under Vikram Sarabhai, the renowned space scientist. In 1969, Kalam was transferred to the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) where he was the project director of India's first indigenous Satellite Launch Vehicle (SLV-III) which successfully deployed the Rohini satellite in near earth's orbit in July 1980.

He also served as the 11th President of India from 2002 to 2007. Kalam advocated plans to develop India into a developed nation by 2020 in his book India 2020. He has received several prestigious awards, including the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian honour. Known for his love for children, did you know that Kalam had set a goal of meeting 100,000 students in the 2 years after his resignation from the role of scientific adviser in 1999? May he continue to inspire millions.




Visvesvaraya

Born on 15 September 1860, Sir Moksha Gundam Visvesvaraya was a notable Indian engineer, scholar, statesman and the Diwan of Mysore during 1912 to 1918. He was a recipient of the Indian Republic's highest honor, the Bharat Ratna.

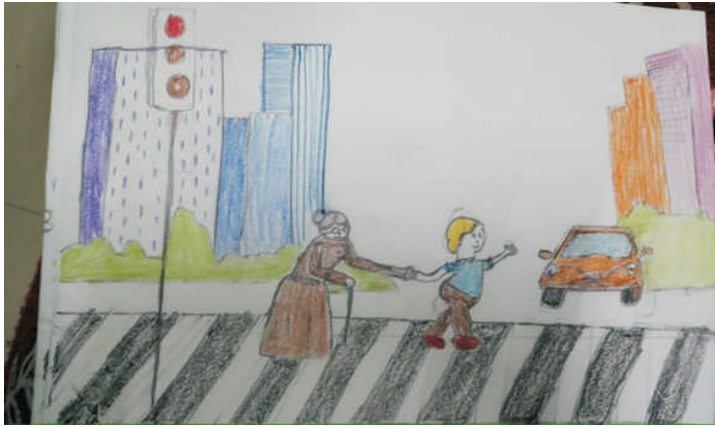
Sir M V suggested that India try to be at par with industrialized nations as he believed that India can become developed through industries.

He has the credit of inventing 'automatic sluice gates' and 'block irrigation system' which are still considered to be marvels in engineering. Each year, his birthday 15 September is celebrated as Engineer's Day in India.

Since river beds were costly, he came up with an efficient way of filtering water through 'Collector Wells' in 1895 which was rarely seen anywhere in the world.

INTERVIEW WITH MR. M. PRAKASH



1. ஐயா, மாணவர் வாழ்க்கையில் தடகள விளையாட்டு என்ன பங்கு வகிக்கிறது?

பொதுவாக விளையாட்டு என்றால் ஒழுக்கம் நலம் தேவை. மாணவ மாணவிகள் வாழ்க்கையில் தடகள விளையாட்டு என்பது உடற்தகுதியை குறிக்கும். நீங்கள் விளையாட நினைக்கிறீர்கள் என்றால் உடற்பயிற்சியும் ஒழுக்க நலமும் மிக அவசியமான ஒன்றாகும். சில நாட்களுக்கு முன்பு தேசிய விளையாட்டு வந்தது. எனது உடற்தகுதி காரணமாக என்னால் பங்கேற்க முடியவில்லை

2. ஐயா, நீங்கள் பல விதங்களில் வீழ்ச்சிகளை சந்தித்து எவ்வாறு தேர்ச்சி பெற உங்களை தயார் படுத்திக்கொண்டீர்கள்?

என் பள்ளி பருவத்திலிருந்தே விளையாட்டின் மீது ஆர்வம் கொண்டவன் நான். குறிப்பாக குண்டு வீசுதல், பூப்பந்தாட்டம் போன்ற விளையாட்டுகளில் மிகுந்த ஆர்வம் கொண்டிருந்தேன். நான் பள்ளி அளவில் விளையாடும் போது என் உயரத்தின் காரணமாக யாரும் என்னை ஒரு விளையாட்டு வீரனாக ஏற்றுக்கொள்ளவில்லை. இருப்பினும் நான் என் விடாமுயற்சியினாலும் அர்ப்பணிப்பினாலும் மற்றும் கடவுளின் அருளினால் ஒரு விளையாட்டு வீரனாக அனைவராலும் பேசப்பட்டேன். முதலில் அனைவரும் என்னை எதிர்மறையாகவே கருதினர். பின்னர் நான் சாதிக்க வேண்டும் என்று நான் நினைக்க ஆரம்பித்தேன். நான் சிறிய வயதிலிருந்தே ஆதரவு இல்லாமல் இப்போது வரை கடவுள் ஆசீர்வாதம் மூலமாக முன் வந்தேன். எனவே நான் விளம்ப வருவது என்னவென்றால் முதலில் கடவுளின் அருள், பின்னர் கடின உழைப்பு, அர்ப்பணிப்பு, மனநிலை ஆகியவை ஒவ்வொருவரின் வாழ்க்கையிலும் தங்களை ஊக்குவிக்க மிக முக்கியம்.

3. ஐயா, நீங்கள் மனச்சோர்வடைந்தவர்களுக்கும் மாற்று திறனாளிகளுக்கு என்ன சொல்ல விரும்புகிறீர்கள்?

மனச்சோர்வு என்பது எல்லா மனிதர்களிலும் பொதுவான ஒன்று. ஏனெனில் ஒவ்வொரு நாளும் நான் மனச்சோர்வடைந்த மக்களை பார்க்கிறேன். எனவே மக்களிடையே மாற்றங்கள் இல்லாமல் மனச்சோர்வுக்கான தீர்வை தீர்க்க முடியாது. எந்த ஒரு ஆதரவும் இல்லாமல் பின்னணியின் தேவையை அடைவது மன அமைப்பை பொறுத்தது. தத்தம் மனம் ஒன்றிணையாத போது மனச்சோர்வு தொடங்கும்.

எனவே நீங்கள் நினைவில் கொள்ள வேண்டிய ஒன்று என்னவென்றால், எதிர்மறையாக இருப்பதையும், நேர்மையாக இருப்பதையும் சிந்தித்தல், மாற்றவோ அல்லது நேர்மையாக மாறவோ முயற்சித்தால். இதை நான் ஏன் கூறுகிறேன் என்றால் யாரும் என்னை முழுமையாக ஆதரிக்கவில்லை என்று வெளிப்படையாக தெரிவிப்பதற்கு.

4. ஐயா, ஒரு தடகள விளையாட்டு வீரரின் நெகிழ்வான அட்டவணையை எவ்வாறு பராமரிக்க முடிந்தது?

நான் கால அட்டவணையை எல்லாம் பின்பற்ற மாட்டேன். ஏனென்றால் நான் பள்ளி மாணவனோ அல்லது கல்லூரி மாணவனோ அல்ல. நம் பள்ளி அல்லது கல்லூரி படிப்பிற்கு பிறகு நேரம் வேறுபடும். காலமும் நேரமும் மாறுகையில் நிலையான கால அட்டவணையை நம்மால் எப்போதும் வடிவமைக்க இயலாது.

5. ஐயா, உடல் ரீதியாக விளையாட்டு கை, கால் வலியை தடுக்கிறது மற்றும் எலும்புகளை கூட வலுப்படுத்துகிறது என்று கூறுவர். ஆனால் விளையாட்டு மனரீதியாக நமக்கு எவ்வாறு உதவுகிறது?

ஒரு விளையாட்டை விளையாடுவதற்கு முன்பு நாம் பொதுவாக ஆயத்த பயிற்சி செய்வோம். இவற்றிற்குப் பிறகு செய்ய வேண்டிய முக்கியமான ஆயத்த பயிற்சி மனதை சார்ந்தது (அதாவது தியானம்). குறைந்தது 10-20 நிமிடங்கள் நாம் தியானிக்க வேண்டும். அப்போதுதான் நமது நுரையீரல் சரியாக செயல்படும், மன அழுத்தம் இல்லாது நாம் நம் செயல்களில் கவனம் செலுத்துவோம். இதன் விளைவாக உடலின் சரியான செயல்பாடு மற்றும் நல்ல ஆரோக்கியம் கிடைக்கும். இரண்டில் ஒன்று இல்லாமல் நாம் சீருடற்பயிற்சி, மட்டைபந்து போன்ற எந்த விளையாட்டையும் விளையாட முடியாது.

6. ஐயா, உங்களுக்கு பிடித்த விளையாட்டு எது? ஏன்?

மட்டை பந்து, குண்டு எறிதல், இறகுப்பந்தாட்டம். இவையெல்லாம் எனக்கு பிடித்தமான விளையாட்டுகள் ஆகும். மூன்று பிரிவுகள் இருக்கும். எனது பிரிவு உயரத்தை அடிப்படையாகக் கொண்டது. சாதாரண மட்டை பந்து வீரர்களைப் போலவே அமைந்து இருக்கும். நாங்கள் வெளிநாடுகளுக்குச் செல்லும்போது போட்டி அதிக அளவில் இருக்கும். நாங்கள் தேசிய அளவில் வெல்லவில்லை என்றால், சர்வதேச அளவில் வெற்றி பெறுவது மிகவும் கடினம். நாம் வெல்ல முடியும் என்ற நம்பிக்கை நமக்கு இருக்க வேண்டும். ஆனால் ஆணவம் இல்லை. ஆணவம் மனிதர்களை வேறோடு அழித்துவிடும்.

7. ஐயா, உங்கள் முதல் விருதைப் பெற்றபோது நீங்கள் எவ்வளவு மகிழ்ச்சியாக இருந்தீர்கள்? நீங்கள் எப்படி உணர்ந்தீர்கள்?

எனது முதல் விருதை 2008 ல், சென்னையில், ரீலா விளையாட்டு மற்றும் நிறுவனத்தில் பெற்றேன். இந்தியாவின் ஒவ்வொரு பகுதியிலிருந்தும் என்னைப் போன்றவர்கள் கிட்டத்தட்ட 70 பேர் இருப்பதை நான் பார்த்தபோது, அவர்களே விளையாடுகிறார்களானால், நான் ஏன் வெல்ல முடியாது, என்ற ஒரு நம்பிக்கை கிடைத்தது. பின்னர் மூன்றாவது கட்டத்தில் வெண்கல பதக்கம் வென்றேன். அன்புமனி ராமதாஸ் மற்றும் அவரது கட்சி உறுப்பினர்கள் எனக்கு பதக்கம் வழங்கியபோது நான் மிகவும் மகிழ்ச்சியடைந்தேன். அன்றிலிருந்து இப்போது வரை எந்த சின்னத்தையும் நான் பார்த்ததில்லை. நான் இதுவரை 22 நாடுகளுக்கு சென்றுள்ளேன். ஆனால் விளையாட்டு நாள் போன்ற விளையாட்டு நிகழ்வுகளின் போது நாங்கள் பார்வையிடும் நாடுகளை நாங்கள் கணக்கிட மாட்டோம். நாங்கள் பங்கேற்ற நாடுகளை மட்டுமே எண்ணுகிறோம்

8. ஐயா, இந்த உலகத்திற்கு நீங்கள் என்ன சொல்ல விரும்புகிறீர்கள்?

நான் உலகுக்கு எதுவும் சொல்லவில்லை. நீங்கள், நான், அவர்கள் உலகிற்கு ஏதாவது சொன்னால் உலகம் மாறாது. மாற்றம் நடக்க வேண்டுமென்றால் மனிதர்கள் மாற மாட்டார்கள். எனவே உங்களுக்கு ஏதேனும் துக்கங்கள் இருந்தால் கடவுள் அல்லது இயற்கையுடன் பகிர்ந்து கொள்ளுங்கள் அதாவது நான் வானிலையை குறிக்கிறேன். ஏனென்றால், நம் பிரச்சினைகளை அவர்களால் புரிந்து கொள்ள முடியுமா இல்லையா என்பது எனக்குத் தெரியவில்லை. ஏனென்றால் அவர்களில் பெரும்பாலோர் நம்மை நோக்கி விரல்களைக் காட்டுவர். இதுதான் நம் நாட்டில் நடக்கிறது. அதனால் தான் நம் உணர்வுகளை இயற்கையுடனோ அல்லது கடவுளுடனோ பகிர்ந்து கொண்டால் நல்லது. இதுதான் நான் கூறுவது.

9. ஐயா, நீங்கள் 22 நாடுகளுக்கு சென்றிருக்கிறீர்கள் என்று பகிர்ந்திருக்கிறீர்கள். எந்த நாடு உங்களுக்கு மறக்கமுடியாத அனுபவத்தை அளித்தது?

நான் 22 நாடுகளுக்குச் சென்றிருந்தாலும், சில நாடுகளில் மட்டுமே பங்கேற்பாளராக பங்கேற்றேன். மற்ற நாடுகளில் நான் ஒரு விளையாட்டு நபராக அழைக்கப்பட்டேன். ஏனென்றால் எங்களுக்கு ஒரு முறை மட்டுமே அயல்நாட்டு நுழைவுச்சான்று கிடைக்கிறது. 2009 ஆம் ஆண்டில் ஐயர்லாந்திற்கான எனது பயணம் ஒரு சிறந்த நிகழ்வு. ஐயர்லாந்து இரவு அனுபவித்தபோது இந்தியா நாள் அனுபவித்தது. அப்போது நமக்கு தூக்கம் வரும். நான் பெங்களூரிலிருந்து ஸ்ரீலங்கா, ஸ்ரீலங்காவிலிருந்து லண்டன், பின்னர் லண்டனிலிருந்து வட அயர்லாந்து வரை நீராவி விமானம் வழியாக பயணம் செய்தேன். பின்னர் இறுதியாக நான் முதல் வெளிநாட்டை அடைந்தேன். நான் மிகவும் மகிழ்ச்சியாக உணர்ந்தேன். அது பெல்ஃபாஸ்ட், வடக்கு அயர்லாந்து, யூரோபா

10. ஐயா, ஐயர்லாந்தில், உங்கள் அனுபவம் எப்படி இருந்தது?

ஆபத்தாகவும் கடுமையாகவும் இருந்தது. ஒரு விளையாட்டு நபர் ஒரு விளையாட்டில் கவனம் செலுத்தினால், அவர்களுக்கு பயிற்சியாளர்கள், ஆதரவாளர்கள் இருப்பார்கள், அவர்கள் நாட்டிற்காக விளையாடினால் எதையும் செய்யத் தயாராக இருப்பார்கள். ஆனால் என்னிடம் பயிற்சியாளரோ, ஆதரவோ, பின்னணியோ, ஞானபிதாவோ இல்லை. எனக்கு இருந்ததெல்லாம் கடவுளின் அருள் மற்றும் என் சகோதரியின் ஆசீர்வாதம். நான் கடினமாக உழைத்தேன் பலனை பெற்றேன். அவ்வளவுதான்.

11. ஐயா, எங்கள் கேள்விகளை உங்களிடம் கேட்பதற்கு முன், மாணவர்களுக்கு சில செய்திகளை நீங்கள் தெரிவிக்க நினைத்திருக்கலாம். எனவே நீங்கள் மாணவர்களுக்கு தெரிவிக்க விரும்பிய செய்தி என்ன?

நீங்கள் எந்த வயதிலும் ஏதாவது சாதிக்கவேண்டுமென்று விரும்பலாம். நீங்கள் மகிழ்ச்சியாக, சோகமாக இருக்கும்போது அல்லது நீங்கள் ஒரு நல்ல நிலையில் இருக்கும்போது மக்கள் உங்களை ஒவ்வொரு முறையும் தூற்றினால், அவர்களின் முதிர்ச்சி நிலை அவ்வளவுதான் என்று சகித்துக்கொள்ளும் மனநிலையை வளர்த்துக் கொள்ளுங்கள். நம்மை யாரும் தெளிவாக புரிந்து கொள்ள முடியாது. அது நடந்தால் அவர் உங்களை விட்டு நீங்க மாட்டார்கள். அதுவே நட்பாகும். முதிர்ச்சி என்பது மனித வாழ்க்கைக்கு மிக அவசியமான பொருளாகும்.

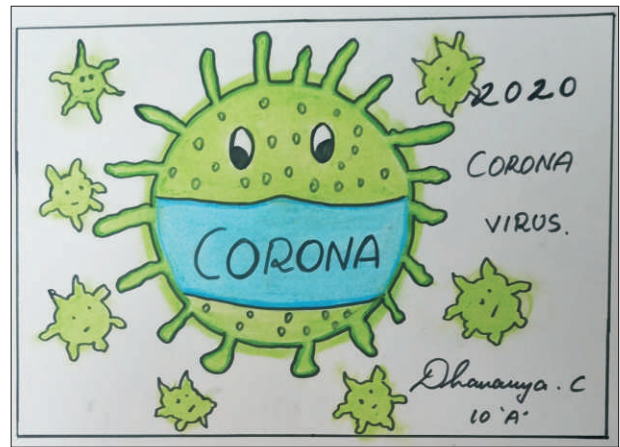
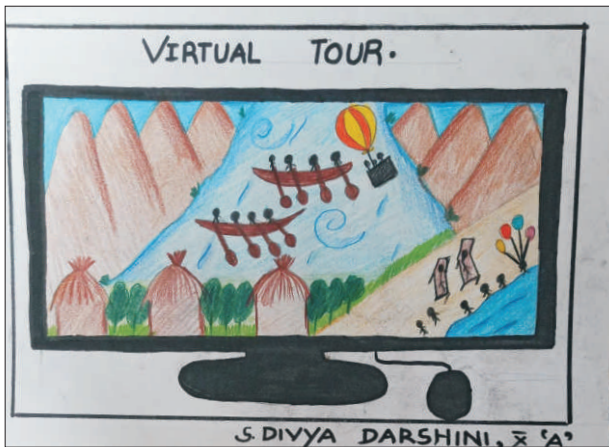
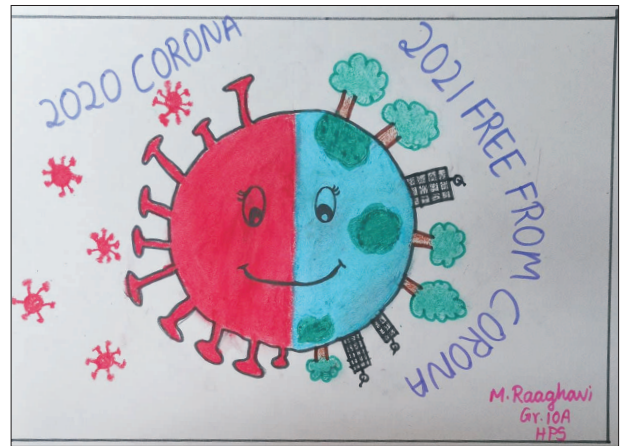


HAVE PATIENCE IN DIFFICULT TIMES


