YOUTH OPPORTUNITY

STEAM LITERACY KITS

Distributed to children across Southwest Louisiana, each kit includes books and volunteer- designed props or games to make the reading interactive

WRITESTART PROJECT

Provides school supplies, admin fees and necessary support to children and teachers in need. Providing supplies year-round ensures teachers and students can focus on learning

SUMMER OF SERVICE

Specifically designed teen volunteer program has human services projects each summer that focus on community members most in need and illustrate the value of serving

SUCCESS BY 6

Addresses the lack of access to quality early education childcare for working ALICE families by funding a year of learning for the child with goals and objectives for the parents

FINANCIAL SECURITY

VITA - VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

IRS certified United Way volunteers offer free income tax prep for low-income individuals or families in SWLA

CAL-PRI - CALCASIEU PRISONER RE-ENTRY

Vital program links formerly incarcerated individuals and the resources available to help them succeed in the job market and community

MATCHED SAVINGS

Program teaches saving and budget habits for those working toward the purchase of a liquid asset with a dollar match upon graduation

BANK ON SWLA

Partnerships with banks and credit unions work to ensure low-income families have access to safe, affordable financial products or services

EMPOWERMENT THROUGH EMPLOYMENT

Equips low-income workers with the necessary skills and resources for a more successful job placement

ALICE - ASSET LIMITED, INCOME CONSTRAINED, EMPLOYED

Our report on families working and earning above the Federal Poverty Level yet unable to afford basic expenses, rarely qualify for assistance

CASEWORK MANAGEMENT PORTFOLIO

Scalable caseworker program that can address disaster assistance quickly or everyday benefits programs for any government, nonprofit or company's needs

THE PATH HOME

Program matching resources with the individuals and families needing assistance with issues surrounding homelessness

POWER TO CARE

Entergy Louisiana's Initiative aimed at assisting senior citizens during high utility bill seasons

EMERGENCY FOOD & SHELTER PROGRAM (FEMA)

Provides grants to nonprofits supplying basic needs for the unhoused in Calcasieu parish

HEALTHY COMMUNITY

CRISIS CHAT

A confidential online chat operated by licensed crisis counselors for anyone going through a difficult time, having thoughts about suicide or just needs to talk

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Addressing the epidemic of human trafficking in the region through partnerships and Initiatives

This texting platform for teens serves anyone ages 13-22, in any type of crisis. It provides confidential access to 24/7 support from professionally-licensed counselors

UNITED AGAINST CHILD HUNGER

Weekend Food Packs are created for the Summer Feeding Programs in Southwest Louisiana so children have access to easy-to-eat foods over the weekend

BORN LEARNING STEAM TRAIL

Bilingual interactive signs installed on trails or playgrounds that offer engagement and learning opportunities for young children and their families or caregivers

COMMUNITY RESILIENCY

SWLA VOAD - VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATIONS ACTIVE IN DISASTER

Provides a place where governmental, faith-based and non-profit organizations can cooperate, communicate, coordinate, and collaborate in the event of a disaster

BUILD BACK THE BLOCK

Gentrification of ALICE neighborhoods through grants and partnerships with the goal of saving areas decimated by disasters

STRONG HOMES

Proactive effort to prepare the homes of ALICE families for the potential threats caused by inclement weather

EMPLOYEE CRISIS FUND

Allows employers to offer a program that helps employees cope with unexpected hardships while an external nonprofit partner oversees the process

UNITED GULF DISASTER FUND

Assists Gulf of Mexico coastal communities with resources prior to or following a community-wide crisis

United Way Southwest Louisiana uses a competitive grant process to allocate resources to community programs that support **YOUTH OPPORTUNITY**, **COMMUNITY RESILIENCY**, **FINANCIAL SECURITY** and **HEALTHY COMMUNITY**. Local organizations submit proposals, which trained community volunteers review and the board of directors makes the final approval. Funding is awarded to projects with the most significant impact, that meet United Way's identified goals and objectives, maximizing positive outcomes and fostering a stronger sense of community ownership and accountability.

Provides emergency assistance, emergency shelter and meals
