
RAMADAN KAREEM & SALAM RAMADAN AL-MUBARAK

The project involves the development of research instruments, as well as evidence-based data collection and analysis to evaluate the economic, social, and business impacts, thereby supporting a comprehensive and structured assessment of the effectiveness of LIMA 2025.

The impact evaluation project for LIMA 2025 provides an evidence-based analytical foundation to assess the event's contribution to local community development and exhibitors' return on investment.

The findings support organizers and policymakers in understanding the resulting economic and business impacts, while identifying areas for improvement to enhance the effectiveness of future editions. Additionally, the study strengthens accountability, supports strategic planning for large-scale events, and maximizes economic benefits at both the local and national levels.



The Business Valuation Principles and Practice Workshop conducted at SBE Digital Nexus Lab, aimed at guiding and introducing academic officers to the definition and explanation of key valuation concepts and fundamental principles of value. The workshop focused on strengthening participants' theoretical understanding and practical application of business valuation methodologies.

The workshop supported academic officers, particularly those in the fields of Finance and Accounting, in identifying, assessing, and managing potential biases in valuation practices. It also enhanced their capability to document, prepare, and present valuation reports in accordance with the International Valuation Standards Council standards (IVS), thereby improving professional rigor and compliance with international best practices.

On 12 June 2025, an interactive program with the Form Five students of Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Seksyen 1 Bandar Kinrara began with an ice-breaking session, followed by a briefing on the subject of Auditing as covered in the secondary school syllabus. Students were introduced to the differences between auditing and accounting, as well as the ethical responsibilities of an auditor. Key issues relating to fraud elements were emphasized to educate students understanding the ethical and unethical practices in business environment.



Quizzes and group activities were conducted to encourage active participation, allowing students to ask questions and express their views. The group activities were also designed to foster teamwork, collaboration, and critical engagement among the students.

On 3 February 2025, a comprehensive Cybersecurity Awareness Workshop was organized at Pusat Aktiviti Warga Emas (PAWE), Putrajaya. The workshop was designed to enhance digital literacy and online safety awareness among senior citizens. The programme featured four invited speakers who addressed key topics related to cybersecurity and digital protection.

As an academic representative from Universiti Putra Malaysia, Dr. Farahdilah Ghazali was invited to deliver a session titled “Privacy and Personal Information.” The session focused on raising awareness of personal data protection, highlighting common cyber threats, and providing practical guidance to help senior citizens safeguard their information in today’s increasingly digital environment.

The workshop equipped participants with practical knowledge and actionable steps to protect their personal information when using mobile devices and social media platforms, and build confidence among senior citizens in rejecting suspicious requests for personal information received online or via telephone.

The workshop was conducted to introduce the PSM Simpankira board game as an innovative tool to enhance the teaching, learning, and assessment of bookkeeping. The game was developed in accordance with the DSKP syllabus issued by the Ministry of Education Malaysia and has received approval from the “JK Penilaian Bahan PdP – Produk Swasta, KPM” for implementation in schools.

The game-based learning approach simplifies complex and comprehensive accounting concepts, making them more engaging and accessible for students. It aims to improve students’ understanding and motivate them to develop greater interest in the Principles of Accounting subject.


Through the workshop, teachers from the participating schools were introduced to the application of serious games in the teaching and learning (PdPc) of Principles of Accounting. A demonstration session was conducted by the project team, during which teachers had the opportunity to experience and play the board game using the structured module developed.

Each participating school was provided with one set of the Simpankira Board Game. The knowledge and skills acquired during the workshop were subsequently transferred by the teachers to their respective students, ensuring wider dissemination and sustained impact of the initiative.


