

From the Principal's Desk... Academic Journey 2024-25

It is with a sense of pride that I share the Annual Report for the academic session 2024-25. This year has been an eventful and productive one with many new milestones. A glimpse of DFL's academic journey of 2024-25, which is the sum of a series of small efforts, is lettered here.

The year began with the celebration of the achievements of class 10 students of the batch 2023-24, who had made this school proud with 01 centum in Mathematics and 03 centums in Information Technology. The school topper Ms. Pavithra achieved 98.4%.

The school welcomed class 6 to 10 students on 27.05.2024 and classes 1 to 5 on 03.06.2024. An Orientation Programme was organized exclusively for parents of class 1 students and parents of newly admitted students on 01.06.2024.

In the month of June, PA1 was conducted for class 10 students. International Yoga Day was organized on 21.06.2024 which was also observed as the 1st 'No Bag Day'. The co-curricular event 'Kalaprathibhe' was organized to tap the innate talents of all the students. The fact that it was just an event and not a competition, added more charm to it.

On 12.07.2024, the 2nd 'No Bag Day' was organised, during which the co-curricular competition 'My Country, My Pride', Inter-house English Debate, Inter-house Football (Juniors) tournaments were organised. PA1 for classes 1 to 9 and PA2 for class 10 were also conducted in month of July.

'Joy of Sharing' was held on 03.08.2024 as a School Social Responsibility initiative. I would like to place on record that the students were able to raise funds of Rs.3,02,612 which was donated to the following organizations.

A few members of the DFL faculty, along with different groups of students, visited these organisations to hand over the proceeds, which was an enriching experience for the Daffoddillians.

The school had the privilege of adopting an Indian Leopard from Bannerghatta National Park. Collaboration with NFI & Bannerghatta National Park have been significant **milestones** for this academic session.

On 09.08.2024, Founder's Day was celebrated during the morning assembly. The academic toppers and students with 100% attendance were felicitated on that day.

On 15.08.2024, DFL hosted the Independence Day with great pomp and show. 'Academic Awards' for the class 10 toppers of the academic session 2023-24 were presented as a part of the celebration. On 29.08.2024, the 3rd 'No Bag Day' was observed during which the Inter-house Football finals (Juniors), Inter-house Hockey finals (Seniors) were conducted to commemorate the National Sports Day.

On 31.08.2024, the school organised INSPIRIT 2, the cultural extravaganza based on the theme 'A Tale of Technology'. The students of classes 6 to 10 presented the programme. Choreography was done by ASDA, and the SaPa instructors assisted in training the choir students. It was well received by parents. A small documentary on 'Genesis of DFL' was unveiled during the event, which is another milestone of this academic session.

A new initiative to help the underprivileged neonates in collaboration with Neonates Foundation of India, an NGO which has national presence, was taken up by DFL. For the first time the staff and students had an opportunity to partner with an NGO. DFL is proud that it has pioneered a new movement, Children for Neonates Foundation of India (CfNFI) which promotes charity-based activities going on throughout the year, creating yet another milestone.

In the month of September, Teacher's Day was decorously celebrated. The student council presented a programme as a mark of respect towards teachers' services. Half-yearly assessments for classes 1 to 9 and I Preparatory examination for class 10 were also conducted during this month. Alongside, Inter-house Cricket (Seniors) and Inter House Special Events were organised too.

The school reopened on 14.10.2024 after midterm vacations. 15.10.2024 was observed as the 4th 'No Bag Day' when athletics and field events were held for classes 4 to 10. The co-curricular competition 'Bhasha Surabhi' was organized on the same day.

Kannada Rajyotsava was celebrated on 01.11.2024 in the presence of students and staff. 14.11.2024 was observed as the 5th 'No Bag Day' and Ethnic Day. Children's Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm on that day. The cultural programme presented by the teachers was the icing on the cake. Inter-house Kannada Debate finals was also conducted. On 16.11.2024, the Annual Sports Meet, 2024 was organised. The II Preparatory examination for class 10 was conducted between 25.11.2024 and 06.12.2024 and PA3 for classes 1 to 9 was conducted in the month of December.

20.12.2024 was observed as the 6th 'No Bag Day'. The CCA competition Ganitotsava and the finals of Rapidata, a quiz-based competition were conducted. An Art & Craft exhibition was organized as a part of the 5th PTM on 11.01.2025. The III Preparatory examination for class 10 students and annual examination for class 9 students were conducted in the month of January 2025.

On 26.01.2025, Republic Day was celebrated in the school premises. Ms. Veda C. Nair of DFL was the privileged 'Guest of Honour'. The students eligible for 'Sports Scholarship' were felicitated during the event. Introduction of 'Sports Scholarship' by DESA management for the deserving students is yet another milestone of this academic session.

It is with immense pleasure that I share this information regarding a significant accomplishment of a few musically gifted students of 'Mission Melody', the music club of DFL. As a part of the CfNFI initiative, the students penned an anthem for NFI, programmed, composed music for it and sang at a grand ceremony organized by NFI on 26.01.2025 in the evening at Hotel Taj. This was a euphoric moment for DFL. The NFI anthem presented by our Daffoddillians was highly appreciated by the NFI team and the esteemed guests who were present at the event. It is one more significant milestone for DFL in the current academic year.

On 31.01.2025, the Investiture Ceremony was organized. The Student Council members, Discipline Squad and House Mistresses of 2024-25 were congratulated and thanked. The new Student Council was installed and they were ceremoniously welcomed along with the new Discipline Squad members and the new House Mistresses/Masters who took charge for the academic session 2025-26.

On 05.02.2025, Student's Memorable Insight into Learning Experiences (SMILE) was organized for class 10 students and parents. It was followed by an orientation programme on 'Examination Ethics' after which Admit Cards were distributed by the Principal Dr.Sujatha Girish, Vice Principal Mrs. Prathibha Rao and Senior Academic Coordinator Mrs. Triveni.

On 06.02.2025, a 'Talent Show' was organized for the students of class 10 where they got a platform to exhibit their talents in front of their classmates and teachers. On 07.02.2025 Saraswati Pooja and Graduation Ceremony were held. On 08.02.2025, SMILE and Orientation Programme were organized for the students and parents of class 9. In the evening 'La-Fiesta' 2025, the farewell ceremony for class 10 students was organized in an impressive manner. The students were handed over their photographs with graduation caps as mementos from the school. The outgoing batch of class 10 students presented a digital clock as a memento to DFL. A few interesting experiences of my interaction with students as the principal have taught me insightful lessons and one of them is that 'we need to use different strokes for different folks.'

One day, when I visited 2 standard classroom, a student walked up to me and with a sad tone which also sounded frustrated said, "Ma'am, my head is aching; I am unable to sit in the class!" He held his head in both his hands and looked worried. Instantly I held his hands and said, "Hey, I know magic! Come along with me. With my magic, I will set you free from your headache." He took away his hands from his head, started looking at me with a sparkle in his eyes. He looked at me with disbelief and asked, "Ma'am, are you a magician?" I replied dramatically, "Yes! I am." I walked him to the admin office and told Ms. Shweta, "Give me my magic wand which I have kept safely inside that treasure chest!" Shweta guessed the context and without any questions, wrapped a stick which was available there with a golden wrapper and handed it over to me. The boy stood stunned. I sat on a chair and made him stand in front of me. I held his hands, asked him to close his eyes and smile. I took the magic wand and moved it in circles three times and uttered the most familiar magical words, 'abracadabra' a couple of times. He was completely engrossed in the act. I told him to open his eyes slowly and asked, "Child, are you feeling better now?"

What happened after that was truly magical! He shouted euphorically, "Wow, the magic has worked!" with both his hands up in the air he ran back to his classroom.

He narrated the entire incident to his teacher and classmates with excitement and announced, "Our principal is a magician!" In the next five minutes there were six students lined up in front of me to experience the magic!


The other instance which is imprinted in my mind is my experience with a newly admitted student of class 5. This student took some time to adjust and there were constant complaints about him from his peers.

Fortunately, I get to spend some time with the students during their lunch break at times. Once I was interacting with him during the lunch break and told him with a stern face and firm voice, "If you continue to trouble your friends in the classroom and create mischief, I will arrange for a meeting with your mother and inform her." He stared at me and replied, "Okay!" Looking at his callous response I changed my strategy immediately and with a smiling face said, "Hey, your class teacher spoke to me this morning and she mentioned that you are very well behaved in the class! I am proud of you, let me give you a high five." I was thrilled to see the change in his expression. He responded with a grin and as we both did high five and laughed, his peers looked amazed! Surprisingly, complaints against him started reducing and now I see him happily mingling with his classmates.

As I recall both these enriching experiences, I realise that 'empathy' is the key word. Preaching or reprimanding students are not the solutions always. We need to try out 'different strokes.'

Meet the Counsellor

Behind every confident student is a strong support system, and at DESA, our school counsellor, Mrs Usha Ravi, is at the heart of it. In this exclusive interview, the student editors Smrithi B and Dhruv Anirudh of class 10 explore to gain insights on mental health and the importance of guidance in shaping young minds.



Dhruv: Nowadays CBSE schools have made it mandatory that every school should have a counsellor. What is your opinion about it and how do you think it helps the students?

Mrs Usha: Nowadays the society is not as much cushioned as it was earlier. Both the parents are working and children do not get much attention. In many such cases, an external intervention is required which helps the students to cope with their mental issues. That is when the role of a counsellor becomes important.

Smrithi: Ma'am, you were previously working as the principal of DES and now you are the counsellor of DESA. What made you change your line of work and how would you compare the two of them?

Mrs Usha: I worked as a principal for 5 years. It was a difficult decision to give up that role to take up counselling. But then, I realised that children needed help and attention. I also wanted to extend my services in that direction and provide people with that much-needed solace. Both the roles have been rewarding!

Dhruv: What are the strategies that you employ when you interact with students?

Mrs Usha: I often see students or parents coming up with various issues regarding social media. I, therefore, try to keep myself updated on the social media trends which makes it easy for me to understand the background of the problem and mainly, build a rapport with the students. I keep a smiling face as it constantly puts someone at ease.

Smrithi: Generally, adults as well as students are hesitant to approach a counsellor. How can this be overcome?

Mrs Usha: Well, this fear cannot be overcome overnight. They need to understand that a counsellor can just be met to talk. The societal taboo of hiding the mental health status needs to be addressed on priority. At my level, I take an initiative to meet all the 9th and 10th class students in order to make them understand that there is someone who can provide them with support. The students have an easy access to me.

Dhruv: What is your advice to the students who wish to take up this profession?

Mrs Usha: I would say, 'Please do so.' According to WHO, India is one of the top most countries in cases of depression. We need more counsellors, as younger generations are lonelier than others. Out of 1.4 billion people in India there are only 4,500 mental wellness professionals. A healthy society is very important.

Smrithi: How has this profession helped you evolve as a person?

Mrs Usha: This profession has made me more empathetic, sober, and grateful. When I see people come up with different problems, it teaches me to be grateful for what I have. I have also stopped being judgemental.

Dhruv: What would be your closing remark for all students in general?

Mrs Usha: Be kind, because you never know what the other person is going through. It is easy to be rude but it takes a lot of effort to be kind so always choose to be kind.

Dhrutay: Welcoming changes is an integral part of our school's culture. From that perspective, do you have any suggestions that can bring about any changes?


Ayush: The school is definitely giving us an all-round experience. Increased participation in interschool tournaments may help the students gain more exposure.

Tata History & Contribution Towards India

TATA is a company that everyone knows because it's in our everyday life, like in tea, salt, cars, televisions, etc. The story begins on 3 March 1839 when Nusserwanji Tata was born into a Parsi family. He married at a young age, as child marriage was common in those days, and had a son, Jamsetji. Nusserwanji moved to Bombay to give his family a good life. He also wanted to give his son the best education. Jamsetji Tata established many cotton mills, including Empress Mill, in the year 1877 in Nagpur after purchasing 10 acres of land. When the mill started, the workers would not come to work regularly, so for them, Jamsetji gave them a pension after they retired and kept family days and sport days for them. His dream was to provide middle-class and poor people with good facilities that they could afford, so in his life he was able to make the famous Taj Hotel in Bombay; it was the first hotel in Bombay that had electricity. Jamsetji Tata's dream was to establish an iron and steel company in India to help the country become economically prosperous and industrialized. Before he died in the year 1904, his dream project work had started by his son, who was the new chairman of the TATA group, named Dorabji Tata.

The Tata Iron and Steel Company (TISCO) was founded by Jamsetji and established by Sir Dorabji Tata on 26 August 1907 and TCS in 1968. Dorabji was a strong supporter of sports and the Olympics. He helped establish the Indian Olympic Association in the year 1927. Dorabji established the Indian Institute of Science in Bangalore. When Dorabji Tata died on 3 June 1932, the new chairman of Tata Group was Sir Nowroji Saklatwala, who helped channel the funds at the disposal of the trust to help the needy. After Sir Nowroji, the next chairman of the Tata Group was J.R.D. Tata, who contributed a lot to the Tata Group, and the biggest thing he contributed to India was Air India. Then Air India came under government control after the independence, and he died on 29 November 1993. Sir Ratan Tata was the new chairman of the Tata Group. He acquired many international companies like Tetley, Jaguar, Land Rover, Ford, etc. And in the airline business, well-known Vistara Airlines and Air India, under the TATA group. He had manufactured the first affordable mini family car for the middle-class range, introducing a car named Tata Nano, and its cost was one lakh Indian rupees.



Tata regularly donates 66% of the income from his business group, Tata Sons. Sir Ratan Ji Tata is a super visionary and an unforgettable real role model for everyone in the world. Sir Ratan Tata is an unmarried man who died at the age of 86 on 9 October 2024 from old age conditions at Mumbai's Breach Candy Hospital.





Bioluminescence

Bioluminescence is defined as the wonder phenomenon through biochemical reactions where in living organisms produce light. This of course, is naturally visible in several species that are marine and terrestrial in nature - so they range from some kinds of algae to jellyfish, fungi, and even fireflies in insects.

MECHANISM

Bioluminescence is formed by the light emitting molecule known as luciferin when it combines with oxygen in the presence of an enzyme known as luciferase. It generates light with little to no heat, hence its name "cold light".

MARINE BIOLUMINESCENCE

Bioluminescence occurs frequently in the ocean. Some of the most common uses include the following.

Predation: Most deep-sea animals, such as the anglerfish, use bioluminescence as some sort of prey attractor. The glow can take on the form of small organisms and has unaware fish swim into its field of vision.

Defence Mechanism: Many species, such as squid and shrimp emit light to confuse predators, allowing them to escape.

The state of the s



Communication: Bioluminescence may be used for signalling among species, such as in mating displays, of various jellyfish and other marine animals.

Terrestrial Bioluminescence

On land, bioluminescence is not so common but still amazing

Fireflies: These insects make use of light to attract each other. In every species, there is a particular flashing pattern that needs to be identified.

Fungi: Some fungi, such as Amrillaria Mellea, even though they are not a bioluminescent body, its mycelia and rhizomorphs are parasitic or woody plants of many species and glows with a bright green light. This might attract insects to aid in the spore dispersal process.

APPLICATION AND RESEARCH

Scientists keep investigating bioluminescence for many uses such as:

Medical Research: Bioluminescent proteins serve as markers for genetic or cellular studies to track biological processes.

Environmental Monitoring: Bioluminescent organisms can serve as indicators of changes in water quality and levels of pollution.

Conservation Concerns: Most bioluminescent species are easily threatened by habitat destruction and pollution. Proactive conservation of these ecosystems will therefore be essential in preserving the subtle intricate web of life reliant on bioluminescence.

Bioluminescence is an absolute fascinating are of study, bringing out the amazing versatility and diversity in life on this planet. Its beauty and utility are only stimuli for scientific curiosity as well as greater ecological awareness.




Marine Wonders

Anglerfish have a bioluminescent head to attract prey in the depths of the ocean, since these animals live in the bathypelagic zone also known as midnight zone (third zone). It is called midnight zone because no sunlight reaches this zone, making it a place of complete darkness. it is amazing how creatures adapt to such extreme conditions. However, this is not the last zone of underwater. The hadalpelagic zone also known as the hadal zone (last zone) is home to certain types of fish, jellyfish and microorganisms. The underwater world is not only home to such fascinating animals, but plants too. Corals, seaweed and algae are some of the amazing creatures that live here.

Epipelagic zone (sunlight zone) is the first layer underwater. Mackerel, clownfish and other small fish live here. The second zone is the mesopelagic zone where many species of bioluminescent fish live. Abyssopelagic zone (Abyss) is the fourth zone. A lot of zombie worms, eels and dragonfish live here. It is our job to protect this magnificent world.

Anglerfish

The anglerfish is a predator that lives in some of the darkest and most high-pressure environments on Earth. They are named for their distinctive "fishing rod" feature, a fleshy growth called an esca on their heads. The esca emits light through a process called bioluminescence, which is produced by symbiotic bacteria that live inside it. This light helps lure prey close enough for the anglerfish to capture with its enormous, sharp-toothed mouth.

Anglerfish possess flexible jaws and highly expandable stomachs. Therefore, they can swallow up prey nearly twice their size. They have adapted well to life at extreme depths where food is scarce and the pressure is immense. The dark often muddy-brown coloration provides an effective camouflage for these fish within the dim surroundings of the ocean floor.

Anglerfish can be found at depths ranging from 200 to over 2,000 meters (650 to 6,600 feet). Their ability to survive in such a hostile environment makes them a fascinating subject of scientific study.

Kolkata's first Underwater Metro

The underwater metro in Kolkata is part of the East-West Metro Line and is the first and biggest underwater river tunnel in India spanning 10.8km in length and 5.5 metres in width. An incredible engineering marvel, this metro line was constructed in 2021 by Afcons Infrastructure (underwater section) and inaugurated in 6th March 2024. Commercial operations started on and from 15th March 2024.

The section between <u>Sealdah metro station</u> and <u>Mahakaran metro station</u> was realigned due to the inability of Govt of West Bengal to provide land on the surface along the original route. The project faced many other challenges including the need to drop a station planned at Wellington as Government of West Bengal was unable to provide the required land on the surface. Work at Howrah Maidan started in March 2016.

The section between Howrah Maidan metro station and Esplanade metro station has been built by Afcons – Transtonnelstroy JV team. Tunneling 13 metres below the river Hoogly was a big challenge and two tunnel boring machines from Herrenknecht have been used to perform this daunting task.







This method emphasizes learning through doing, allowing students to engage directly with mathematical concepts rather than passively absorbing information. ABT transforms the classroom into a space where students actively explore, experiment, and apply mathematical ideas, making the subject more accessible and enjoyable. This approach moves away from rote memorization and encourages learners to discover mathematical principles on their own, promoting deeper understanding and long-term retention.

Principles of Activity-Based Teaching in Mathematics

Learning by Doing: ABT focuses on the principle that students learn best
when they are actively involved in the learning process. For example,
geometric concepts might be taught by having students physically
manipulate shapes or build models, while algebraic ideas can be
explored through interactive graphing software or dynamic activities.



- Concrete to Abstract: One of the main challenges in mathematics education is bridging the gap between concrete experiences and abstract thinking. ABT facilitates this by first introducing students to hands-on activities, like measuring objects or plotting data points, and gradually guiding them towards the underlying abstract mathematical principles. This helps students to visualize and comprehend complex concepts in a more accessible manner.
- Collaboration and Peer Learning: Activity-based learning often involves group work, where students discuss their thought processes, share solutions, and learn from one another. Collaborative problem-solving also builds communication skills and allows students to approach problems from multiple perspectives.
- Integration of Technology: In modern classrooms, technology plays a significant role in facilitating ABT. Interactive simulations, educational apps, and dynamic geometry software enable students to experiment with mathematical ideas in a virtual environment. Tools like graphing calculators, spreadsheets, and coding platforms allow learners to explore patterns, analyze data, and test hypotheses in a hands-on way.
- **Student-Centered Learning:** In ABT, the teacher serves more as a facilitator, creating a learning environment where students explore, ask questions, and develop their own solutions.

Examples of Activity-Based Learning in Mathematics

- **Geometry through Paper Folding (Origami):** Using paper folding (origami) as an activity, students can explore geometric properties such as symmetry, angles, and shapes in a tangible way.
- Data Handling with Real-Life Contexts: Activities that involve collecting, analyzing, and interpreting data can make statistics and probability more meaningful. For example, students can gather real-world data (such as rainfall measurements or class survey results) and use it to create graphs, calculate averages, or determine probability distributions.





 Mathematical Games and Puzzles: Games like Sudoku, logic puzzles, or strategy-based board games encourage students to think analytically and apply mathematical reasoning in a fun and engaging context.









- Exploring Fractions with Food: A popular activity involves using pizza or pie models to teach fractions. Students can divide the food into equal parts to visualize how fractions work.
- Algebra with Tiles: Algebra tiles are a useful tool for visualizing algebraic equations and expressions. Students can use these tiles to represent variables and constants, making it easier to understand concepts like solving for 'x' or expanding expressions. Manipulating the tiles helps students grasp algebraic concepts in a visual and interactive way.

Conclusion: By adopting hands-on activities, students with different learning styles can be gainfully engaged in the teaching-learning process. They understand the concepts and develop the necessary skills to do well. So, they develop a love for the subject rather than fear. Day 2: A Dive into History





Oh, I Forgot! But Why?

I had gone to the ATM a couple of days ago. I inserted my card, mechanically followed the instructions and drew the cash. I collected the money and stepped out, only to realize that I had not taken my card back. I rushed in for my precious card. This set me wondering how I could be so careless or forgetful!

You too may have experienced something similar. It could be opening the door and leaving the key in the keyhole or leaving behind the writing pad in the exam hall on the last day of the assessment.

Why do these things happen? The answer lies in what psychologists call the Zeigarnik effect. According to the Lithuanian-Soviet psychologist Bluma Zeigarnik, people remember unfinished or interrupted tasks better than completed tasks. This is because a task that has already been started establishes a task-specific tension, which improves cognitive accessibility of the relevant contents. The tension is relieved upon completion of the task.

So, when we go to the ATM to draw cash, our brain senses that the task is completed once we draw the money, and the tension is relieved. We forget to take the card back. Similarly, when the task of opening the door is finished, the key momentarily loses its utility and after the exam, the writing pad has no requirement. So, they are easily forgotten.



How can you use the Zeigarnik effect to your advantage? If you want to remember something, leave the last bit of it undone. For example, if you are studying a topic, stop a line or two before the conclusion or it could just be short of a full stop. Trick your brain into believing that there is something more to come. In other words, interrupt the task, then see the magic! Your brain will keep reminding you to get back to finish the task. So, you will not forget the content. Mission accomplished!

Soaring over the Valley of Kings on a hot air balloon: A lifetime experience



Parenting means constant learning, and all of us have our own style of parenting, which is great in its own way. Sometimes, we need to get to their level to bring them up. Here are a few things to help us sail smoothly. We all are in the same boat, but the water current may be different.

One at a Time

Spending time as a family or with extended family is very important for a child, but spending time with only one parent or with only one child at a time is equally important. The child needs its own undivided time with a parent or parents. The talks with a mother can be different from those with a father, and they open up as per their comfort level, which may not be possible with siblings around. Going on a short holiday or long drives with the child helps in bonding, as there is more time to open up.

Walk Together Often

Having a special dinner with your child, going out shopping or to concerts, playing, or just sitting in the park makes the child feel like we enjoy their company. A simple gesture like holding their hand while going on walks says a lot without words. Regular physical touch is very important; no matter how hurt they are or we are, just one hug will help it heal.

Listening

A stressed or angry child is not in a position to understand anything or even listen, and us telling them anything will only make them more furious. So, it is better to just listen to them and react in a subtle way at that point. Give them and ourselves time to process and talk to them when they are ready to listen.

Decision Making

Considering their view, involving them in decision-making, giving them responsibilities, and including them in every small and big decision makes them feel trusted and included, so they in return treat us the same way.

Trying Something New

It is good to once in a while try something new together because the excitement and enthusiasm will be at the same level for both. Even something as simple as trying a new or unexplored road or place, watching a kids' show with them, or playing a new sport or doing an experiment or art. Doing some activity together routinely and regularly helps in maintaining the bond, even if there are any issues.

Feedback

It is good to find out indirectly about how we are doing as parents, or what kind of parenting or parents our kids expect or wish for. Times are changing, and we too need to upgrade constantly. We sometimes think about how things would be different if our parents were different in their ways of parenting, so it becomes easy when we become the parents our children need. It doesn't mean we change completely; a slight change in attitude or thinking will make a lot of difference.

Mutual Respect

Every human being needs to be respected, even our children do, no matter how old they are. Something they share might look silly to us, but for them, it is huge, and we should respect that and give their silliest talk a big ear. When they feel respected, they too will show the same behaviour with us. Just because they are younger doesn't mean their world is small. Talking to them respectfully, asking their consent if needed, respecting their privacy, their needs, their work, and their time is important.

Apologizing

It is difficult for adults to say sorry to someone younger than them, especially us parents. Sometimes, we just try to prove ourselves right, but apologizing is not bad. In fact, it will teach our children to do the same with someone younger than them and will also increase their respect for us. But it should be done mindfully and not as surrendering to them.

Explaining

Many times, we go on loop telling children what to do. Their brain is yet to develop, and we may have to repeat the same thing every day, and yet they don't get it. Though they might take time to understand, they will get it when we explain. Instead of just saying 'go to bed early' or 'don't eat this,' we could try explaining why they need to sleep early, what the circadian rhythm means, how our body heals and repairs itself, and what happens when we rest or eat unhealthy food.

Give and Take

Some children want to be treated as adults, and some like children. When we treat them the way they like, they will let us do what we like with them. There is give and take in a parent-child relationship as well. They are under our care; we don't own them.

They are fast and already going through a lot inside and out. We can add to it or make it lighter by just being patient. As adults, we need to take the first step and not wait for the children, who are not designed to understand us yet. Accepting them the way they are will help us deal with them better. Our children are our shadows, but only the silhouette is ours. The person inside is different; we cannot change them to be what we expect of them. We can only inspire, encourage, and support them to be the best version of themselves.

He smiled and said, "One item from your dream list will be ticked off."


I was overwhelmed with emotion when I realized they had booked a scuba diving session for the next morning.

Under Water World

Our planet earth comprises of land and water bodies called oceans. Oceans cover 70% of earth and give us shades of blue when viewed from space. Different parts of Oceans

Life in oceans are mesmerizing and unique from the flora and fauna we find on land. The ocean waters close to land are called reefs. Reefs are the shallow parts of the ocean which we find near to beaches. The reef is very important part of earth ecology. The reefs consist of tiny organisms called coral polyps. Corals are reef builders whose main objective is to support ocean plants and coral polyps. Because of the diversity of life found in the habitats created by corals, reefs are often called the "Rain forests of the sea." Coral reef provide an ecosystem for fishes, plants and other organisms which help in maintaining ocean waters clean, provide a tough coastline to protect coastlines from storms. Similar to plants on land, corals support unique algae which help absorb carbon dioxide from atmosphere and release oxygen and help maintain the level of carbon dioxide in atmosphere. This important feature helps control the raising global warming situation.

Deeper part of oceans does not get sufficient sunlight for the plants to survive. Thus, at deeper part of the oceans, there is no or very minimal life. Most of the ocean floors are deep and do not have any life.

Explore Ocean Reef

One of the most fascinating and beautiful ecosystem under water is the reef ecosystem. The vivid colored fishes, beautiful corals, snails, shrimps, octopus, sharks and many organisms make life at reef a visual orchestra. There are schools of fishes like fusiliers, bat fish, parrot fish which are sometimes found in thousands. One of the astonishing organism found in reef is Octopus. The Octopus has three hearts and research has shown that they can think and solve small problems. Octopus and cuttlefish have a unique mechanism of camouflaging (changing color and pattern of their skin to gel with the surrounding environment). This extraordinary ability allows the cuttlefish to mirror its visual environment on its own skin. This ability helps cuttlefish and octopus hunt for food in the ocean.



The reef is like a city and every organism has a role for itself in this ecosystem. Some organisms like sea cucumbers help keep the reef clean by recycling the waste of others whereas group of parrotfish help bite the coral chunks and release a fine dust of sand which we know as white sand. Millions of years of deposit of these white sand by parrot fish wash on the shores which we know as white sand beaches.

Nemo fish is one good example of how ocean animals help each other. Nemo fish stays at a special soft coral called sea anemone. Sea anemone has poisonous tentacles which protect the fishes from other sea animals while the Nemo fish eats the unwanted algae growth on the sea anemone and keep it clean. This mutual helping behavior keeps both the animals in their survival on the reef.

Scuba Diving and exploring the ocean

Ways to explore life below ocean surface. Scuba diving also helps us understand nature, give us a glimpse of the colorful fishes and other organisms which reside in the ocean. It also helps us protect & preserve the oceans by keeping them free of plastics and not allowing harmful chemicals or industrial waste which we dump in oceans.

Scuba diving allows us to be a step close to the ocean world, understand the aquatic animals, their habitat and protect them. It also guides people to educate kids about the importance of oceans, corals and fishes and the impact of over fishing.

I did scuba diving in the Andaman Sea. It was an experience of a lifetime. There were so many different fishes and aquatic animals. I was able to get firsthand information from experienced staff on how fishes catch their prey or protect themselves from bigger fishes. From turtles to corals, the life below oceans is amazing.

Our Responsibility - Protecting Oceans

Oceans are very important for human life to sustain on earth. Oceans play an important role in capturing excess of carbon dioxide released by industries and help protect environment against global warming. Oceans are the main source for fishing. If oceans are polluted from excessive fishing or from releasing all the industrial waste into oceans, it will lead to destruction of habitat in oceans. It will have a catastrophic impact on the climate which will impact every living organism on land.

I request everyone to be responsible towards ocean protection. Please avoid using plastic in daily life. The lesser the usage of plastic, lesser the amount of plastic which will be discarded into oceans. We should stop dumping industrial waste into ocean. If we dump all the chemical waste into ocean, it will be consumed by ocean organisms like fishes. During fishing, these fishes will be caught and will be available in market for human consumption. Consumption of these chemical infested fishes by humans will result in dangerous health issues.

ನಿರ್ವಿ ಶೆಟ್ಟಿ: ನೀವು ಬೋಧನೆಯಲ್ಲಿ ಯಾವ ವಿಷಯಗಳನ್ನು ಕಲಿಸಲು ಇಷ್ಟಪಡುವಿರಿ?

ಮೀನಾಕ್ಷಿ: ನನಗೆ ಭಾಷಾ ವಿಷಯವನ್ನು ಬೋಧಿಸಲು ತುಂಬಾ ಇಷ್ಟ. ವಿಶೇಷವಾಗಿ ಕನ್ನಡ ಮತ್ತು ಹಿಂದಿ ಭಾಷೆಗಳನ್ನು ಕಲಿಸಲು ಹೆಮ್ಮೆಪಡುತ್ತೇನೆ. ಏಕೆಂದರೆ ಇದರ ಮೂಲಕ ಮಕ್ಕಳಲ್ಲಿ ಭಾಷೆಯ ಬಗ್ಗೆ ಒಲವು ಮೂಡಿಸಿ, ಮೌಲ್ಯಗಳನ್ನು ಬೆಳೆಸಲು ಬಹಳಷ್ಟು ಅವಕಾಶಗಳಿವೆ.

ಅವ್ಯುಕ್ತ್ : ಉತ್ತಮ ಶಿಕ್ಷಕರಾಗುವ ಹಾದಿಯಲ್ಲಿ ನೀವು ಮಾಡಿರುವ ತ್ಯಾಗಗಳೇನು?

ಮೀನಾಕ್ಷಿ: ತ್ಯಾಗಗಳನ್ನು ಮಾಡಿಯೇ ಉತ್ತಮ ಶಿಕ್ಷಕಿಯಾಗಬೇಕೆಂದು ಇಲ್ಲ. ನಮ್ಮ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳ ಏಳಿಗೆ ಬಗ್ಗೆ ಯಾವಾಗಲೂ ಯೋಚನೆ ಮಾಡಿ, ಅದಕ್ಕಾಗಿ ಹೊಸ ಹೊಸ ಯೋಜನೆಗಳನ್ನು ರೂಪಿಸಬೇಕಾಗುತ್ತದೆ. ನಮ್ಮ ಕೆಲಸವನ್ನು ಶ್ರದ್ಧೆಯಿಂದ ಮಾಡಬೇಕು. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳಿಗೆ ಎಲ್ಲಿ? ಯಾವಾಗ? ಯಾವ ರೀತಿ ನಮ್ಮ ಅವಶ್ಯಕತೆ ಇದೆ ಎಂದು ತಿಳಿದುಕೊಂಡು ಅವರಿಗೆ ಹೆಚ್ಚು ಸಮಯವನ್ನು ಕೊಡಬಹುದು. ಮಕ್ಕಳಿಗೆ ಅನುಕೂಲವಾಗುವಂತೆ ಸಂಪನ್ಮೂಲ ತರಗತಿಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಹೆಚ್ಚು ಸಮಯವನ್ನು ಕೊಡುತ್ತೇನೆ.

ತೇಜಲ್ ಮಹಾಲೆ: ವೈಯಕ್ತಿಕವಾಗಿ ಹಾಗೂ ವೃತ್ತಿಪರವಾಗಿ ಈ ರಾಜ್ಯಪ್ರಶಸ್ತಿಯ ಬಗ್ಗೆ ನಿಮ್ಮ ಅಭಿಪ್ರಾಯವೇನು? ಮೀನಾಕ್ಷಿ: ವೈಯಕ್ತಿಕವಾಗಿ ನಾನು ಯಾವುದೇ ಪ್ರಶಸ್ತಿ ಸಿಗಬೇಕೆಂದು ಕೆಲಸವನ್ನು ಮಾಡಿಲ್ಲ. ನನ್ನ ಕರ್ತವ್ಯವನ್ನು ನಾನು ನೂರಕ್ಕೆ ನೂರು ಪಟ್ಟು ನಿಷ್ಠೆಯಿಂದ ಮಾಡಿದ್ದೇನೆ. 'ಕಷ್ಟ ಪಟ್ಟರೆ ಫಲವುಂಟು' ಎನ್ನುವಂತೆ ನನ್ನ ಕೆಲಸವನ್ನು ಗುರುತಿಸಿ ಪ್ರಶಸ್ತಿಯನ್ನು ಕೊಟ್ಟಿರುವುದು ನನಗೆ ಬಹಳ ಸಂತೋಷದ ವಿಷಯ. ಹಾಗಾಗಿ ಯಾವುದೇ ಕೆಲಸವನ್ನಾದರೂ ಬಹಳ ನಿಷ್ಠೆಯಿಂದ, ಪ್ರಾಮಾಣಿಕತೆಯಿಂದ ಮಾಡಬೇಕು. ನಾವು ಮಾಡುವ ಕೆಲಸದಲ್ಲಿ ಆಲಸ್ಯ ಇರಬಾರದು.

ನೀರಜ್: ನೀವು ಶಿಕ್ಷಕಿಯಾಗಿರುವ ಪ್ರಯಾಣವನ್ನು ನಮ್ಮೊಂದಿಗೆ ಹಂಚಿಕೊಳ್ಳಬಹುದೇ?

ಮೀನಾಕ್ಷಿ: ನಾನು ಚಿಕ್ಕವಳಿರುವಾಗ ನನಗೆ ಭಾಷಾ ವಿಷಯಗಳ ಅಭ್ಯಾಸ ಬಹಳ ಇಷ್ಟವಾಗುತ್ತಿತ್ತು. ಆಗ ನಾನು ನನ್ನ ಶಿಕ್ಷಕರನ್ನು ಬಹಳ ಗೌರವಿಸುತ್ತಿದ್ದೆ. ನನಗೆ ಮಕ್ಕಳಿಗೆ ಬೋಧನೆ ಮಾಡುವುದೆಂದರೆ ತುಂಬಾ ಇಷ್ಟ. ಹಾಗಾಗಿ ನಾನು ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳ ಭಾಷಾ ವಿಷಯದ ಸಂದೇಹಗಳನ್ನು ಪರಿಹರಿಸುತ್ತಾ ಅವರಿಗೆ ಬೋಧನೆ ಮಾಡುತ್ತಾ ಬಂದಿದ್ದೇನೆ. ಆದ್ದರಿಂದ ಈ ಒಂದು ಪ್ರಯಾಣ ನನಗೆ ಒಳ್ಳೆಯ ಅನುಭವಗಳನ್ನು ತಂದುಕೊಟ್ಟಿದೆ.

ನಿರ್ವಿ ಶೆಟ್ಟಿ: ನಿಮ್ಮ ಭವಿಷ್ಯದ ಗುರಿಗಳೇನು?

ಮೀನಾಕ್ಷಿ: ನಾನು ನನ್ನ ವೃತ್ತಿಯನ್ನು ಬಹಳ ಪ್ರೀತಿಸುತ್ತೇನೆ. ಆದುದರಿಂದ ನಿರ್ದಿಷ್ಟವಾಗಿ ನನ್ನ ಗುರಿ ಎಂದರೆ ನಾನು ಇರುವಷ್ಟು ಕಾಲ ಕೆಲಸ ಮಾಡುತ್ತಾ, ಮಕ್ಕಳಿಗೆ ಉತ್ತಮ ಶಿಕ್ಷಣ ನೀಡುತ್ತಾ, ನಮ್ಮ ಶಾಲೆಗೆ ಉತ್ತಮ ಫಲಿತಾಂಶ ತಂದು ಕೊಡುವುದು.

सबसे लंबा शब्द: हिंदी के सबसे लंबे शब्दों में से एक है `किंकर्तव्यविमूढ' (किंकर्तव्यविमूढ़), जिसका अर्थ है "भ्रमित हूँ कि क्या करूं।"

• साहित्यिक इतिहास: हिंदी में छपी पहली पुस्तक 'प्रेम सागर' थी, जिसे 1805 में लल्लू

लाल ने लिखा था।

• अंतर्राष्ट्रीय लोकप्रियता: दुनिया भर के 175 से अधिक विश्वविद्यालयों में हिंदी पढाई जाती है, जिनमें ऑक्सफोर्ड, हार्वर्ड और कैम्ब्रिज जैसे प्रतिष्ठित संस्थान शामिल हैं।

• साहित्य में विश्व रिकॉर्ड: मुंशी प्रेमचंद की हिंदी में रचनाएँ, जैसे गोदान, कालजयी क्लासिक्स मानी जाती हैं और विश्व स्तर पर कई भाषाओं में अनुवादित की गई हैं।

• पहला हिंदी समाचार पत्र: पहला हिंदी समाचार पत्र, उदंत मार्तंड (द राइजिंग सन), 30 मई, 1826 को कोलकाता में पंडित जुगल किशोर शुक्ल द्वारा प्रकाशित किया गया था।

• वैज्ञानिक अनुकूलन: 2018 में, नासा ने अपनी अंतरिक्ष प्रौद्योगिकी के एक भाग के रूप में हिंदी का उपयोग किया, जिसमें भारतीय अंतरिक्ष यात्रियों के लिए उनकी मूल भाषा में प्रशिक्षण सॉफ्टवेयर भी शामिल था।

• अनुकूलन क्षमता: हिंदी फ़ारसी, अरबी, तुर्की और पुर्तगाली जैसी भाषाओं के उधार शब्दों को शामिल करने के लिए जानी जाती है, जो बदलते समय के साथ सहजता से अनुकूलन

करती है।

• डिजिटल उपस्थिति: हिंदी भाषा की वेबसाइटों, ब्लॉगों और सोशल मीडिया के उपयोग में वृद्धि के कारण, अंग्रेजी और चीनी के बाद हिंदी इंटरनेट पर तीसरी सबसे अधिक इस्तेमाल की जाने वाली भाषा है।

• बॉलीवुड का प्रभाव: मध्य पूर्व, अफ्रीका और दक्षिण पूर्व एशिया जैसे गैर-हिंदी भाषी क्षेत्रों में बॉलीवुड के माध्यम से हिंदी के प्रति गहरा प्रेम है, वे अक्सर गानों और फिल्मों से यह भाषा सीखते हैं।

• दिन-प्रतिदिन उपयोग: हिंदी में सामान्य शब्द, जैसे 'गुरु,' 'कर्म,' 'योग,' और 'निर्वाण',

ये एआई के बहुत कम उदाहरण थे, एआई के हजार से अधिक उपयोग हैं। इसलिए मेरे हिसाब से एआई इंसानों का सबसे अच्छा और सबसे खतरनाक आविष्कार है। बहुत से लोग कहते हैं कि एआई बहुत उपयोगी है लेकिन वे इसके दुष्प्रभावों के बारे में बात नहीं करते हैं जैसे कि व्यक्ति अपने दिमाग का उपयोग करने में आलसी हो जाता है और कई समाचारों में समाचार एंकर भी एआई द्वारा विकसित किए जाते हैं जो समाचार प्रस्तुत करते हैं इसका एक उदाहरण है एक भारतीय समाचार चैनल से सना, इस तरह इंसान इस तकनीक पर निर्भर होता जा रहा है और लापरवाह होता जा रहा है। आजकल, मनुष्य ऐसे रोबोट बना रहे हैं जो बोल सकते हैं और बहुत बुद्धिमान हैं, कई ए.आई मानवीय भावनाओं या भावनाओं को नहीं समझ सकते हैं, लेकिन इन रोबोटों को इस तरह से डिज़ाइन किया गया है कि वे मानवीय भावनाओं को समझ सकते हैं। अगर ऐसा ही चलता रहा तो इंसान उनसे सारे काम करवाएंगे फिर चाहे वो ऑफिस जाएं और काम करें। भविष्य में ए.आई से स्वास्थ्य सेवा, विनिर्माण आदि जैसे उद्योगों में सुधार होने और सेवा की उच्च गुणवत्ता को बढ़ावा मिलने की उम्मीद है। मनोरंजन उद्योगों में वे बेहतर संगीत गुणवत्ता के लिए एआई संचालित टोन्ड और पृष्ठभूमि संगीत का उपयोग करते हैं और फिल्मों में वे बेहतर अनुभव के लिए एनीमेशन, वीएफएक्स और आदि का उपयोग करते हैं, ये कुछ और उदाहरण हैं जिन्हें हम अपने दैनिक जीवन में एआई का उपयोग करके देखते हैं, हमारा मनोरंजन विकसित हुआ है और हम इसे देखकर आनंद लें और एक और उदाहरण है जिस पर मैं टाइप कर रहा हूँ वह भी एआई की मदद से है।




'My Country My Pride'- a Report
