With more than 1,000 islands to choose from, Greece is a heavenly summer destination. But it's not all sun, sea, sand and snoozing. Get ready to join the local daredevils who hang off cliff faces, soar like birds over pristine beaches and descend into the depths of the sea where old ships lie dormant. It's all just waiting to be discovered



Carve waves with a surf community in <u>Ikaria</u>

The calm Mediterranean Sea is one of the most unlikely places you'd expect to find a surf community, but this unusual waveriding hotspot is a delightful freak of nature. Waves here are due to what the locals call "meltemi" – a weather system over the Aegean Sea that creates a wind swell ideal for beginner surfers. And there's nowhere better to hit the surf than the island of Ikaria, a short ferry ride from Mykonos.

"We are really proud that we've helped create a surf community here," says Isidoros Plytas, who runs the Ikaria Surf School with his friend Vassilis Missas. Part of Ikaria's pull is its friendly laidback vibe. Much like California in the 1960s, there's a real beachliving scene, with surfers wild camping on Messakti Beach where shady palm trees border glorious mountain views.

"The feeling of surfing with your friends in this beautiful landscape, knowing that when you finish you can chill out at the beach bar listening to nice music and hang out with cool people, is truly unique," says Isidoros. The best time to ride waves here is between June and October. *Surf from* \in 30 with Ikaria Surf School, **ikariasurfschool.com**

Work up an appetite on two wheels in <u>Mykonos</u>



These days it's often called the "new Ibiza", but there's much beyond Mykonos' glitzy clubs. Get off the beaten track – literally – with a mountain bike ride through the island's rugged northeastern landscape. Dimitra Asimomyti set up Yummy Pedals, a bike tour company that takes visitors to the island's lesser-known beaches and finishes with a food and wine tasting at her parents' organic farm and vineyard, seven years ago.

"I've always been into cycling," says Dimitra. "I couldn't believe that there wasn't a cycling tour company here – I knew that people would want to see an authentic side to the island by bike." The most popular route is to secluded Fokos Beach, along a 5km, undulating track past tiny churches, grazing goats and fruit-laden fig trees. After a quick dip in the crystal-clear sea and a gruelling slog back uphill from the beach, a glass of white wine, glistening olives, tangy cheese, ham infused with thyme and pepper, and barley rusk bread will be waiting at Vioma Farm. A 3-hour bike tour is \in 50, **vummypedals.gr**

Learn how to be a mermaid in <u>Corfu</u>

"There's something really magical about embodving a mythical creature of the sea." says aquatic therapist Sophia Michalopoulou from Mermaids Corfu. And where better to learn than on a mermaidshaped island in Greece, where the half human, half fish legend was born thousands of years ago. Sophia's whimsical workshops are the antidote to the stresses of gloomy big city life - participants don a colourful monofin tail and learn to glide through the water like a mermaid or merman. "It's fun, powerful and invigorating. especially when experienced in open water," she says. Sessions from €60 per person. mermaidscorfu.com



Watch freerunners defy gravity in <u>Santorini</u>

The extraordinary cave houses of Oia on the northern tip of Santorini were built two centuries ago, but today these curved white and blue homes are what make this Greek destination so iconic. And not only do they offer a classic Instagram shot, they're also a magnet for parkourists. These athletes do belly-flipping jumps, spins and volts off ledges and over the labyrinthine streets, gliding like Spider-Man across the rooftops.

"The architecture of this island is perfect for this sport, it's like it was built for it," says Alexandros Tziampasis, from local parkour team Arion. "There are so many buildings you can use, in so many ways, with huge gaps and descents, and endless random areas to explore, jump and flip." *Follow @team_4rion on Instagram to see where Arion are freerunning during your visit*

See the universe in <u>Crete</u>

Dominated by its soaring mountain range, and with excellent weather and limited moisture in the air, stargazing in Crete is a mesmeric experience. With the naked eye you can see a carpet of stars and numerous constellations, or travel to other planets via the large 1.3m telescope at the famous Skinakas Observatory. Located on a 1,750m peak in the Ida mountain range, it's accessible via a winding 16.8km drive to the summit from Anogia – an adventure in itself! **skinakas.physics.uoc.gr**

Sample volcano wine in <u>Santorini</u>

Santorini was formed after an enormous eruption on the island of Thera some 3,600 years ago, and its villages were built on the sides of a flooded caldera. As a result, the island has nutrient-rich volcanic soil, and the grapes grown here have a delicious and distinctive flavour. The 18km-long isle has more than 18 wineries where you can try its volcanic tipple. The most famous grape variety is Assyrtiko which produces a dry white wine that dates back to ancient times and goes perfectly with a fresh Greek salad. 4.5 hour wine tours from €135, winetoursantorini.com

Swim into the deep like a fish in Folegandros

Freedivers wax lyrical about the feeling of weightlessness, freedom and serenity as they glide through the glassy waters surrounding Folegandros, a picturesque Greek island that's a short ferry ride from Santorini. This ancient method of diving, with just a fin and a wetsuit, allows you to be more "at one" with the ocean.

And there's apparently more chance of seeing marine life diving this way as you won't have any unnerving bubbles emerging from an oxygen tank. Local freediver and instructor Spyros Sakellariou, from Folegandros' Sea U diving school, has encountered Mediterranean parrot fish, groupers, lion fish, and frequently sees turtles and monk seals in the area when he goes freediving. He teaches novices breath-holding techniques and helps them master the art of swimming underwater.

"Freediving is the most natural and simple way to visit the underwater world," he says. "It's a very beautiful, relaxing and peaceful sport." He also runs elite freediver courses where you can learn to dive to depths of 70m with no tank, using static apnea techniques that allow divers to hold their breath for three minutes and 30 seconds. *Freedives from* €50, sea-u.com

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Scale wild sea cliffs in <u>Rhodes</u>

The craggy landscape above Ladiko Bay on the east coast of Rhodes is a natural playaround for active families and beginner climbers looking to learn the ropes. Tours take groups on a short hill hike, with views out to the Mediterranean Sea, up to the are a number of exhilarating limestone climbs for all abilities. from easy routes to overhands. plus an awesome finale - a 35m rappel down a big cave opening. Or seasoned climbers could go without a tour (and ropes) and try bouldering at Traganou Beach where the sea will catch you if you fall. Climbing tours cost €150 for adults and €110 for children (7-16 years old), children under 7 go free, rhodescape.gr



Soar like a bird over <u>Corfu</u>

They say trust is the most important element in any relationship. Sit in a comfy harness made for two (ahem. you and your instructor) and take a leap of faith by jumping off a cliff in Corfu. Once in the sky, your nerves will subside as vour paraglider stabilises, and the world seems to stop spinning as you fly through the air 400m above verdant hills and the idvllic Glyfada and Kontogialos beaches below. Twisting, turning and soaring in the sky, you'll land with spectacular pictures of the unparalleled views you iust witnessed - a cherished memento from this unforgettable experience. 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In 1925, the Italian steamship Sara was carrying more than a 1.000 tonnes of cement when it ran into perilous weather and met its end. sinking into the waters around the small island of Othoni near Corfu. Today divers can explore this magnificent submerged vessel, complete with portholes and taffrails, plus three other shipwrecks off the coast of Corfu. Each boat has become an artificial reef over the years that now teems with marine life, including shrimps and moray eels. Depths range from 18m at the Theodoros tanker, where you can swim into an engine room, and to 43m at the Agni steamboat wreck, which has two caves to explore. In Abu Dhabi, falcons rule the skies. We meet the experts taking these beloved birds of prey under their wing at the city's Falcon Hospital, and explore the UAE's long relationship with these majestic creatures

here's a popular medi-spa in Abu Dhabi that only the locals know about. The awardwinning establishment offers an assortment of finely tuned services from hi-tech pedicures and deep-soak relaxation pools, to expertly orchestrated diet

plans and five-star accommodation. Well-versed staff treat guests like royalty and often welcome repeat visitors back multiple times a year, with most arriving in a shiny 4x4 or by private jet. Sounds incredible, right? But this isn't a new innovative wellness retreat. Nor are these facilities available to members of the public. This hospital is exclusively for falcons.

The Abu Dhabi Falcon Hospital first opened in 1999 and is now the largest in the world. It's a leader in falcon medicine with a loyal client-base within the UAE as well as other Arab countries such as Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Kuwait and Bahrain. It's here that these birds of prey enjoy regular manis and pedis, a routine feather spruce or some well-deserved rest and relaxation before an important competition or after a gruelling hunting season.

In more extreme circumstances, injured or unwell falcons are rushed to surgery or into a state-of-theart intensive care unit. Dr Margit Gabriele Muller is executive director at the Abu Dhabi Falcon Hospital and known locally as the "falcon whisperer". She has been running the hospital since 2001, and knows exactly what makes these spectacular birds tick.

"Falcons are absolutely fascinating and it's amazing to have worked with them every single day for such a long time," she says. "They are very strong birds, but also very intelligent with a good memory. I look into their little black eyes and all I see is magic. I am always amazed by their strength and mental power."

Abu Dhabi is known for its year-round sunshine, tawny sand dunes and glassy sky-skimming buildings, but here in the desert, falcons are kings. Two particular breeds, the Saqr and the Shaheen, are the most valued in the UAE and can cost up to \$60,000 each. Though falconry has existed in cultures throughout history, it has a central role in the UAE's recent heritage since the country was founded in 1971. In years gone by, Bedouins relied on falcons to hunt for food. With a well-trained falcon, a man could bring home anything from a rabbit to a small gazelle for his family to eat.

"Falcons have had a very big historical impact on Abu Dhabi," says Muller. "Going back 60 years, falcons lived with Bedouins when there was no air-con, no fridge, no electricity, and life was very harsh in the desert. Falcons were essential for survival and treated like a member of the family. They would be positioned with the importance of a son or a daughter."

Falcons can live up to 20 years and many have binocular vision, eight times better than human eyesight. "A falcon can see prey maybe 2km away and dive to catch it at a maximum speed of 384km/h," says Muller. "When a falcon focuses on their prey, they lock their eye muscles, which means they see the prey and nothing else. Whatever it is, it doesn't stand a chance."

To the outside world these birds have been labelled as a status symbol in the UAE – akin to fancy European sports cars or a Rolex – but Emirati Nasif Kayed, the CEO and founder of consulting firm The Arab Culturalist, insists their significance runs much deeper.

"For all of Abu Dhabi at one time, the falcon was our main source of living," he says. "Falcons are not native to the UAE. People had to catch them, train them and hunt with them. Now men have money and life is good, so why do they still bother with falcons in the desert? It's a matter of heritage." **Above** Inside the Abu Dhabi Falconers Club

A falcon undergoes surgery at the Falcon Hospital; falconry in Abu Dhabi goes back generations; custommade hoods keep the birds calm According to Kayed, Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, the founding father of the UAE, was determined to see falconry thrive in the country. "He was emphatic that we should make falconry an important part of modern life here," says Kayed. "It was about our pride, our history and our tradition." Sheikh Zayed was a keen falconer and he opened the Abu Dhabi Falcon Hospital, as well as the Abu Dhabi Falconers Club, while pushing for it to become the main sport in the UAE. Today elite falconers in Abu Dhabi train their falcons to race in the President Cup, a national competition in which the fastest bird can win up to \$7 million in prizes.

During the sweltering summer months, the Falcon Hospital runs an exclusive "five-star" Avian Hotel for the birds to stay when it gets too hot to go outside. Air-conditioned bedrooms are spacious enough for the falcons to fly freely and come equipped with toys, climbing trees and a music system. If they get bored of flying laps listening to music, they can chill out in a spa plunge pool outside.

Far from making falcons the ultimate avian divas, these facilities are vital to balance their wellbeing. "They may look large and majestic but they are very sensitive animals," Muller says. "They can get sick very easily and die within a few hours. It is a constant challenge for me as a vet to be very accurate and fast in my diagnosis."

The Falcon Hospital has a 24-hour emergency facility. Muller recalls a night when a falcon arrived by private jet at 3am with breathing difficulties.

She was ready and waiting to operate immediately. "We have a lot of advanced hi-tech equipment, but our purpose is not just to treat sick falcons, but to keep the healthy ones healthy."

And nutrition is an important step. "The falcon only eats meat like quails, mice and chicks," Muller says. "When a falcon is hospitalised, we prepare a diet plan for the falcon depending on its medical condition and weight." And where do the mani and pedis come in? "The manicures are not like the ones for ladies," she laughs. "The purpose of this pampering is to keep them healthy. If a falcon has long nails they can puncture the soles of their feet and that can be extremely painful and lead to horrible infections."

Working with falcons everyday helps Muller spot the birds' idiosyncrasies, but she's constantly surprised. "They know you and they recognise their owner's voice and can be really affectionate," she says. "They develop a really strong bond with their owners."

What about the small hoods the falcons wear? Kayed says they are custom made to fit the birds' heads snugly. "The covering is very important to keep the bird at ease," he says. "What is amazing about these birds is their eyes are constantly looking out for prey, everything that moves and flies, and it will want to go after it. Without a hood the bird will end up distressed and in pain." Italian jewellers Tiroler Goldschmied crafts diamond-encrusted falcon hoods by hand, adorning them with gold, silver and feathery touches for their customers in the UAE. A tiny hood can sell for anything between \$6,000 and \$55,000.

Falcons are the only animals in the world to have their own individual passports and can sit in a plane seat on an international flight without a transport box.

"They are not flying as cargo or like any other animal, they are flying like you and me, as passengers," Muller says. "This is further proof falcons in the UAE are not considered as a bird or a pet, but as children of the Bedouins. They are so special and truly part of the family."

here's no question that fresh pasta is one of life's little pleasures – silky, doughy goodness that can be transformed into anything from comforting lasagne to fettuccine ribbons tumbled through a luscious ragu. No matter how good you think your pasta is, however, Italian *nonne* (grannies) in kitchens across Italy are taking pasta to the next level, crafting some of the world's rarest varieties.

On the island of Sardinia, grandmother Salvatora Pisano kneads an unusual dough made from semolina flour salt and water, preparing to make *su filindeu* – meaning "threads of God". Made from a recipe passed down from mother to daughter for more than three centuries, it's an intricate pasta that only three women in Sardinia still have the expertise to make.

Salvatora pulls the dough through her hands repeatedly, dividing it into thin filaments, until there are hundreds of fine threads that are layered across a timber surface and left to dry in the sun to form a pasta that resembles tree bark. It's then cooked in mutton stock with pecorino cheese to make a thick, savoury soup and is only served to those who complete the annual religious pilgrimage to Santuario di San Francesco di Paola.

In another kitchen in Sardinia, 95-year-old Giuseppa Porcu crafts *macarrones de ungia*, a small knobbly pasta that is similar to *malloreddus*, which is made only in the town of Ozieri, where she has lived her whole life. Meanwhile, in Piemonte in northwest Italy, 96-year-old Ida Pionzo makes *agnolotti al plin*, tiny, meat-filled ravioli and recalls her life as a *contadina* (farmer).

These are the "Pasta Grannies" – Italian women sharing the family recipes that have been passed down through the generations, and whose stories are captured on film and shared by British author and filmmaker Vicky Bennison. So far, she has interviewed more than 300 women across the country, and their tales have been seen by millions of viewers, eager to learn the secret recipes







It all began six years ago, when Vicky was researching a book in Italy, where her and her husband have a home in Le Marche. "I noticed these women making pasta every day and it felt like something that should be celebrated and recorded as the passing of an era," she says. "So often it's Italian chefs who get all the glory, while the cooking of these women is almost taken for granted. I wanted to put them on centre stage."

While Vicky's background is as an author – including the popular *The Taste of a Place* food guides – she soon realised the best way to capture the "Pasta Grannies" would be video. "Pasta-making is such a physical activity," she says. "I didn't have any experience with video, so I just picked up a camera and kept it simple. I paddled around in obscurity for around three years before the channel took off. Then, you get sucked into the algorithm of YouTube and you have to start taking it seriously."

It was when the video on filindeu went viral in 2017 and the channel was featured in publications such as *The New York Times* that Vicky realised Pasta Grannies could become more than a side gig. Today, Pasta Grannies has over 752,000 subscribers on its YouTube channel, more than 520,000

followers on Instagram, and a full team, including a cameraman and a "granny finder". And that filindeu video? It's been viewed almost 3.5 million times. In 2019, Vicky published a cookbook, *Pasta Grannies: The Secrets of Italy's Best Home Cooks*, which has sold over 100,000 copies, and there's a follow-up due out next year.

"I think I have the best job in the world," says Vicky. "It's a great privilege to meet these women, and people love to hear their stories. Everyone loves pasta and their grandmother or the memory of their grandmother, so the channel is like a virtual warm hug. People often write to me and say that the videos have helped to get them through hard times."

So, what does it take to be a Pasta Granny? Vicky tends to choose women who are home cooks, rather than professional chefs – but makes an exception if they have a good story to tell, or the only ones making a particular pasta. Take 70-year-old Lina Campisi, who runs a small restaurant, Taverna Cialoma, in Marzamemi, Sicily. Despite creating delectable dishes such as

a *taccuna* pasta made from freshly milled heritage durum wheat flour with tuna, artichokes and prawns, she doesn't consider herself a chef. "I do home cooking," she proudly declares. Or, 87-year-old Vanda Soncini who runs Michelin-starred restaurant La Capanna di Eraclio and demonstrates how to make shrimp with tagliolini pasta.

The majority of women featured, however, have been making pasta at home for their entire lives. Giuliani Albertina, a 97-yearold from Bologna, for example, has been making tortellini with a filling of mortadella, prosciutto, pork loin and 30-month Parmigiano for 90 years, and still makes it every Christmas for her family. "As a little girl, I had to start learning to make it," she says. "At that age, my grandmother taught me."

If you want to make the pasta featured on the Pasta Grannies YouTube channel, Vicky often includes a simplified recipe with each video, including tips such as using 00 flour with a dash of semolina flour for a softer pasta. Or the Pasta Grannies cookbook includes detailed recipes and methods. But no matter what, the Pasta Grannies will always come out on top.

"There is a move to record and preserve a lot of these recipes, but the reality is that these women don't worry about the official recipe in the kitchen, they respond to the ingredients they have and the tastes of their families," says Vicky. "And, the muscle memory you have from making pasta from a very early age can never be replicated. So, although you can get fairly competent quite quickly, you will never be as good as these women who have been making pasta for 70 years." *Pasta Grannies by Vicky Bennison* (Hardie Grant, £20), **pastagrannies.com**

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Could Malta's smaller sister become the next green Mediterranean hotspot? We meet the locals leading the way with eco initiatives

ehind The Olives holiday home there's a corn field that runs almost down to the sea. The sound of bees buzzing in the purple heather behind the fence competes with the distant splash of the waves. This is exactly the kind of

ambience you'd expect from somewhere that aspires to be the most environmentally friendly place in the Mediterranean.

This was Gozo, the quiet sister of sunkissed Malta, before the pandemic struck - a time when people were just catching on to the idea that this island could be the antidote to the tourist hotspots elsewhere in these parts. When other holiday destinations were planning to build bigger and brighter, Gozo had an ambition to become completely sustainable – by 2020. There were new solar panels on roofs and a network of eco-farmhouses, like The Olives, powered by Gozo's never-ending supply of sunshine or wind. The island itself was starting to attract people from all around the world who were looking for a more peaceful, gentle way of life.

Then the pandemic happened. And although it was a disaster for people who rely on tourism for their livelihoods, there are those who say that the island was ahead of its time. When tourism bounces back, could it be with a new awareness of green issues and the need to support the environment rather than doing it harm? That's how old the UNESCO World Heritage Ġgantija Temples are in years, which shows that Gozo was one of the first inhabited places on Earth

Green and serene

It was at The Olives that we first met Michelle Bartolo, sitting cross-legged in the garden, presiding over one of the island's many yoga retreats. "It helps so much doing yoga somewhere where you're surrounded by nature," she told me.

And almost everywhere we went on the island, we seemed to find people practising mindfulness and meditation. There were numerous yoga retreats and new vegetarian and vegan restaurants. But at the same time there was a lack of pretension and a connection with the island's traditional way of life. None of this happened by accident. A new government initiative called Eco-Gozo had combined with an influx of people – long-term visitors and tourists – who wanted to live peacefully.

Having lived in Malta for more than 10 years, Michelle said she'd already noticed an awareness of environmental issues on both islands. "Environmentally I've seen huge changes. I did beach clean-ups here for years and I've noticed that they're maintaining them a lot better now. The government are also subsidising solar panels so that's become a big thing." More than 1,100 families on the island

were given subsidies to invest in solar-panel

technology, and many more were visited by consultants advising on water and energy conservation. Certified "eco-farmhouses" and hotels for visitors to stay in also popped up. These are holiday residences that, among other criteria, guarantee to buy at least 75% of their food products locally, take water and energy-saving measures, and eliminate the use of environmentally unfriendly cleaning products.

Blue sea thinking

Where Malta was starting to attract some of the Ibiza crowd with exciting nightlife and new bars, restaurants and clubs, Gozo was making the most of its natural environment and, above all, its crystal-clear waters. The first sight of Gozo from our ferry was the port of Mgarr. There were little blue-andyellow fishing boats bobbing in the harbour, and square, white-washed apartment blocks gleaming on the steep hill, below the spire of Our Lady of Lourdes chapel. The water here, even in the port, is almost absurdly turquoise and sparkling, and as a result Gozo has a reputation as Europe's best place for diving.

Divers tend to see first hand how fragile ecosystems can be. Speaking to one was a good way, then, to assess whether efforts to protect the pristine coastal waters off Gozo were bearing fruit. And, although I didn't know it at the time, it was a great indication of how many eco tourists

might be lured here once all Covid travel restrictions were lifted.

Luke Cassar grew up in St Julian's on Malta. He got his first spear-gun at the age of five and he's loved the water ever since. His life changed when he travelled around Asia in his 20s studying meditation.

Now living in Gozo, Luke teaches freediving, spear-fishing and meditation – and he sees a deep connection between all three. "I got into freediving through meditation," Luke explained. "It's very similar. It's all about relaxation. You relax your muscles and relax your nervous system, there are no thoughts, you just get into the zone. You feel safe then, like the sea is your home."

Luke's favourite area to dive is the protected zone around Dwejra in the northwest of the island. It's the spectacular part of Gozo's coastline where the Azure Window, a great limestone arch over the water, once stood. A storm sent it crashing into the sea early one morning in 2017.

Now divers are the only people who get to enjoy its jagged shapes beneath the waves. But Luke's passion is not just diving but the natural world under the water. Encouragingly, he told me measures to protect marine life were working.

"Some fish you didn't see before have started to return," he revealed. "Dolphins used to be common in the 1960s, but when I was a kid they were really rare. Now they're coming back."

Both Luke and Michelle were sceptical about whether Gozo had become a dream of sustainability. But they were much more optimistic about the work that ordinary people were doing to try and protect the





island in its pristine state. Michelle also said that she still loves the practical, low-key environmentalism of The Olives.

"One thing is the trend of the times, which was Eco-Gozo," she said. "And another thing is the reality. But we have a lot of ex-pats and locals who are creating all sorts of sustainable options." She mentioned Sacred Foods, which collects fruit and vegetables that are about to be thrown away and turns them into soup for the elderly. Another organisation runs a community project, Thrive Garden, with courses on composting and sustainable gardening.

As well as teaching freediving and meditation, Luke also runs courses for experienced divers in sustainable spearfishing. That, too, for him is a form of meditation, inseparable from caring about the environment. "To catch a fish you need to learn to see the fish," Luke said. "You have to get into the zone for that as well. But I can spend all day in the water and catch nothing and it's still enjoyable. And that's as sustainable as you can get!" When I catch up with Luke after the pandemic has

struck he points to a side effect of these difficult times. There is a deep desire to welcome people to Gozo again, but in a new, more conscious way.

"We've learned not to take visitors for granted," he says. "The people of Gozo have always been known for their hospitality and I think the last year, with far fewer people coming, has helped us remember that."

Peter Vasteleki and Octavian Stancu talk to us about how COVID-19 gave them the opportunity for a fresh start in the Mediterranean sunshine

ven though it's been more than 15 months since the COVID-19 pandemic started. most of us still can't comprehend the impact it has had on our dayto-day existence. Will we ever go back to work full-time in offices? Will we always have to wear a mask to go shopping? And when can we start hugging friends and family again? Times of upheaval are always times of change, and many of us have used COVID-19 to re-evaluate our lives. If we can't go back to normal, then maybe it's time for a new normal.

That was certainly Wizz Air Captain Peter Vasteleki's thinking. "Like many people, we went through a very difficult time," he says. "We felt like everything could collapse in an instant. But as the saying goes: 'Every cloud has a silver lining.' In our case, this silver lining flew us to Cyprus."

Peter and his family moved from Budapest to Larnaca in July 2020. As the first wave of the pandemic devastated the travel industry, Wizz Air was one of the few airlines with the guts and resources to not only recognise, but seize opportunities – opening 18 new bases since the start of the pandemic. "As my base in Budapest started to downsize its





flight crew capacity, I knew it was time for me to make a change, too," Peter says. He was offered the opportunity to move to the new Larnaca base and had to decide whether to move with his wife and two young children to an island they had never visited before. "But it was always a dream of ours to move to the Mediterranean and live by the sea," he says.

Dreams can come true. Peter and his family now live in a house with a pool with sea views. "The weather is amazing – even in November you can still go to the beach," he says. "The people are very friendly, and the community here is very international."

A working day is just the same for Peter in Cyprus as it was in
Budapest. He's still in his second home, the flight deck, which he calls, "my office where the wallpaper is drawn by the sky". But downtime is different these days.

"I'll start the day cycling with my seven-year-old son, and then we'll jump into the pool to cool down. After breakfast we'll go to the beach. There are places where you can swim with giant turtles close to us. We'll spend the day there enjoying the sun, sand and sea."

Another WIZZ employee who swapped his home city for a new life in the Mediterranean is Technical Team Observer (TTO) Octavian Stancu. Octavian moved from Bucharest to Bari at the end of March this year after a short stint at the new base in Catania.

"I've always wanted to live by the sea," he says. "But Italy? I never thought of coming here." Octavian joined Wizz Air seven years ago, first as cabin crew before his promotion to TTO. For him COVID-19 was also a chance to re-assess his life. "In Bucharest I had stopped evolving. Since the pandemic I've focused on personal development. I want to invest more in myself to give more back."

Octavian reads and listens to motivational podcasts, but the greatest investment he could make was moving to Italy. "After a month in Catania, I was offered the chance to come here. I said yes immediately. I love outdoor sports, especially water sports."

For Octavian, the time he now spends with his family has more meaning. "Now I know that myself and my relationships are more important," he says.

Your onboard safety

Please consider your fellow passengers and pay attention to the following information. Remember that by purchasing your Wizz Air ticket, you have accepted the Wizz Air General Conditions of Carriage (available in full at wizzair.com)

Safe handling of hand luggage

Ensure hand luggage remains safely stowed in the locker or under the seat in front of you for takeoff. landing, and at any time as instructed by the crew. Take care when opening lockers, as falling items may iniure fellow passengers.

In case of evacuation all baggage must be left on board and the instructions of the cabin crew must be strictly followed.

Safety equipment

It is an offence to tamper with or remove safety equipment, including adult and infant life vests, infant safety belts or extension belts. It is not allowed to remove or damage any onboard informative placards.

Sharp items

To dispose of any sharp items (e.g. hypodermic needles), please contact a cabin crew member. Do not leave your needle or svringe behind.

Turbulence management

Turbulence can occur unexpectedly. Whenever seatbelt signs are switched on, remain seated, keep seatbelts fastened, and stow away large electronic devices.

Safety of infants on board

Wizz Air has a clear procedure for infant (a child who is less than two years of age) restraint systems. Only the use of the single hook infant seatbelt is accepted. Vests/slings cannot be used together with the infant seatbelt. Wizz Air only accepts aft-facing car seats when an extra seat is purchased. However, during take-off and landing, and whenever the seatbelt sign is switched on, infants should sit on an adult's lap with the seatbelt fastened. Life vests for infants are available and are provided whenever flying over water. All lavatories are equipped with a nursing table. Do not leave children unattended in the cabin.

Lithium batteries

Portable electronic devices (PED) such as cellphones, laptops, tablets and cameras can contain lithium batteries. When damaged, faulty or overheated, these batteries can catch fire and explode. Therefore, if you recognise any problem with your device, inform the cabin crew immediately.

Charging electronic devices on board using a portable battery charger is forbidden.

Electronic devices

Some electronic devices can be used during the flight with WLAN/Wi-Fi/Bluetooth turned off.

Larger electronic devices that cannot be held comfortably in one hand, exceed ca. 1kg in weight and do not qualify as handheld devices (e.g. laptops. notebooks etc.) must be stowed in the overhead stowage compartments for takeoff. landing and whenever required by the cabin crew If in doubt, please ask your cabin crew.

Inflight health tips

Read these tips on how to stay fit when travelling.

Before your air travel

Consult your doctor before travelling if you have any medical concerns. Pregnant women and those with heart or respiratory problems, blood diseases or ear. nose and sinus infections should seek medical advice before flying. Crew members are entitled to call for medical assistance pre-flight if they deem it necessary and are in doubt about your fitness for the flight.

Medical supplies on board

Keep any medication you may need in your hand luggage and in its original packaging. Inform cabin crew of allergies or illnesses. If you are seriously ill or travelling post-surgery, you will need a medical certificate confirming that you are fit to fly. If you have limited mobility, are hearing- or sight-impaired, pregnant, or unable to understand/react to safety instructions, you will be unable to sit in the emergency exit rows or the front row.

Nut allergy

During our WIZZ Café service we offer peanuts and some snacks containing peanuts/nuts traces. We strongly encourage those with allergies to take all necessary medical precautions before flying and inform the cabin crew during boarding about your allergy

If you start to feel unwell during the flight, do not hesitate to advise the cabin crew.

It's not just about having a mask you have to wear it correctly*

Putting on a mask may seem like an easy task, but there are certain dos and don'ts that can alter its effectiveness. Since Wizz Air values the health of all our passengers, we require that you wear yours properly to travel with us.

Dos & don'ts

Cover your nose

You can only create a barrier between your respiratory system and the outside world if you cover your mouth *and* nose.

Adjust the mask

Masks need to fit snugly against your face. Use loops or straps to adjust it accordingly.



Have clean hands when you put on and take off your mask and handle it by the ear loops or straps. Don't touch

Aim not to fiddle with your mask once you've put it on. You could contaminate it if your hands aren't clean. If you must touch it, use hand sanitiser first.

Don't take off your mask

Keep your mask on for the entire duration of the flight unless you are eating or drinking.

Don't rely on your mask alone Masks are just one way of protecting yourself and others. Make sure to continue social distancing and hand washing.
