Who we are



We strive to empower elementary school children with the skills they need to read, learn, and succeed. By collaborating with teachers, students, parents, and community stakeholders, we aim to create a brighter future for children, their families, and their communities.

Who We Serve

At Global Learning Exchange Initiative, we serve elementary school children and their teachers in Guatemala using a specially developed literacy curriculum, focusing on those in under-resourced communities. The primary grades have the most influence on a child's future personal development. Primary education teaches children foundational skills that prepare them for life, work, and active citizenship.



Creating a Digital Book Library for GLXi Classrooms

GLXi is thrilled to announce a groundbreaking pilot project aimed at enhancing the educational experience for children in Guatemala. Led by an exceptional team, this initiative leverages the expertise of Matt Pitlyk, Senior Machine Learning Engineer at MedChat, and Jazmin Campos, Digital Experience Designer at 1904Labs. The project's inspiration came from Sean Walsh, former GLXi Board member and co-founder of 1904Labs in St. Louis, whose vision and commitment to education and technology laid the foundation for this effort.

The Team Behind the Innovation

This project is driven by the collaboration of Matt Pitlyk and Jazmin Campos, who bring extensive experience in machine learning and digital design, respectively. Their work with our GLXi Educational Team in Guatemala is key to the project's success.

Leadership and Vision

Our Guatemalan GLXi team, led by Jaime Vielman (Executive Director), Dr. Juan Fernando Porres (Director of Education), and Andrea Tumax (Impact Coordinator), plays a crucial role in developing the digital library. Their expertise ensures that the content addresses diverse learning needs and promotes inclusivity. Books will feature characters with various disabilities, fostering empathy and normalization among young readers.

Importance of Culturally Relevant Books

Culturally relevant books are essential for Guatemalan students to see their lives and experiences reflected in their learning materials. Currently, there are few books that truly represent Guatemalan culture, leading to a disconnect for students. By incorporating culturally relevant themes and characters, we aim to make reading more relatable and engaging. Additionally, producing these digital books is cost-effective, allowing GLXi to expand the program without significant financial burden, ensuring broader access to high-quality educational resources.

Empowering Education Through Technology

Leveraging AI and innovative digital design, this project enriches our OBOM curriculum and sets a new standard for educational content in Guatemala. Each digital book includes teacher resources to enhance vocabulary and critical thinking skills in an interactive learning environment. These free resources ensure equitable access to quality education for all children. Book themes range from social development and communication skills to environmental awareness and cultural heritage, tailored to different age groups.

A Pilot Project for Adding Pre-Primary

While preschool and kindergarten education is fairly ubiquitous in the United States, that is not true in Guatemala. Many Guatemalan students enter first grade without prior educational experience, forcing first-grade teachers to contend with diverse abilities while following a common lesson plan.

We've long heard from our participating teachers what a challenge this is. Student assessments have shown that it hurts student performance, so we wanted to see if our program could help.

We started our Open Books, Open Minds program ten years ago, focusing on grades one through three. But in 2023, after listening to teachers, we responded with an ambitious pilot program that will also bring our curriculum to pre-primary teachers.


We are incredibly excited about this initiative.

Why Pre-Primary? According to UNICEF, "Universal preschool education is a global priority because it:

- · establishes strong foundations for learning,
- increases the effectiveness and efficiency of
- education systems, and
- is an effective strategy for promoting economic growth."

In Guatemala, fostering improved readiness among children for their educational journey is crucial. This is particularly true when you consider the social and economic circumstances that are prevalent in most of the Guatemalan population, where children already have the deck stacked against them as far as the tools and resources needed for quality education.

We believe the educational preparations leading up to first grade are highly beneficial—and, in fact, pivotal—in cultivating skills and nurturing children's learning potential.



This pilot program puts that theory into practice, creating a continuum of early educational opportunities to benefit students and teachers alike.

We plan to make the program's expansion permanent, building upon GLXi's proven successes and bringing literacy tools to even more teachers and students in Guatemala.

Seven preschool teachers from public schools underwent training in three regions: three in Guatemala City, three in Sacatepéquez, and one from Baja Verapaz. They all completed the training program and demonstrated efficient and active performance in implementing the strategies learned in their classes.

Assessment results are even better than we could have predicted!

In 2023, for the first time since the pandemic, students returned to classrooms full time and we were able to administer student assessments at the beginning and end of the year. This gave us a comprehensive read of student progress and an understanding of how GLXi's curriculum is helping classrooms recover from the multi-faceted blows of the pandemic.

Every year, we administer the IDEL test ("Indicadores Dinámicos del Éxito en la Lectura") to get a quantitative measure of how GLXi students are doing with their reading and learning. This researchbased formative assessment includes a series of measures designed to assess the basic early literacy skills of children learning to read in Spanish.

The 2023 assessments showed that GLXi's OBOM curriculum makes a measurable difference in the classroom.

Here are just a few highlights:

- The percentage of GLXi students performing at their expected grade level exceeded our goal for the year.
- GLXi students significantly outperformed control groups of students who were not following the OBOM curriculum.
- GLXi students showed noteworthy gains in their reading levels over the year, proving that we are making a difference in responding to the aftereffects of the pandemic.

These fantastic results show the effectiveness of the GLXi education team in addressing learning issues identified by the teachers, the quality of our training, and the dedication of the teachers to help their students.



NGO Status

A milestone – achieving NGO Status

In 2023, GLXi reached a significant milestone by becoming a recognized nonprofit in Guatemala. This new status enables us to secure more funding, build meaningful partnerships, and provide essential benefits like healthcare to our Guatemalan employees through the Guatemalan Social Security Institute (IGSS), enhancing their well-being and stability.

Our leadership team in Guatemala, including Executive Director Jaime Vielman, Director of Education Dr. Juan Fernando Porres, and Impact Coordinator Andrea Tumax, ensures that our programs are deeply rooted in the community and effectively address local needs. By gaining nonprofit status in Guatemala, we have reinforced our



commitment to our local team, providing them with access to national healthcare services, including medical consultations, hospital care, maternity services, and workplace injury care through the IGSS. Their collaboration with our US Executive Director Ana Schulz exemplifies our commitment to sustainable, community-driven growth.

Being a nonprofit in both the U.S. and Guatemala allows us to tackle educational challenges with greater flexibility and legitimacy. It opens new opportunities for funding and partnerships, helping us make a lasting impact. Additionally, it demonstrates to our teachers, students, and school communities that we are dedicated to their long-term success and well-being.

We are now working to obtain official accreditation from the Ministry of Education for our "Open Books, Open Minds" training program, monthly teacher workshops, and the pre-primary model. Previously, we couldn't apply for this accreditation, even though we were active in the public school system. Accreditation will improve our programs, benefiting both students and teachers through recognized professional development and fostering closer collaboration with local schools.
